*Districts constituted under the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908.*

(L.S.) **ISLINGTON, Governor.**  
**A PROCLAMATION.**

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration district known as the Auckland District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two registration districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

**DEVONPORT DISTRICT.**

All that area bounded towards the north generally by Sections Nos. 8 and 7, Parish of Takapuna, from the sea to Lake Road; thence across that road and by Old Lake Road and the southern side of the last-mentioned road produced to the sea at Narrow Neck; and thence towards the north-east by the sea to North Head; thence towards the south and west generally by Waitemata Harbour to the place of commencement.

**AUCKLAND DISTRICT.**

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-east generally by the sea from the Okura River to the Tamaki River; thence towards the south-east generally by the Tamaki River to the north-eastern corner of Subdivision No. 12, Hamlin's Grant; thence by that subdivision, Subdivisions Nos. 11, 10, 9, across a road, Subdivision No. 1, Hamlin's Grant, and Allotment No. 29, Section 12, Suburbs of Auckland, to the Great South Road; thence by the Great South Road to the north-eastern corner of Allotment No. 1, Section No. 17, Suburbs of Auckland; thence by the said Allotment No. 1 and Allotments Nos. 13, 11, and 12, Section No. 12, Suburbs of Auckland, and across a road to the northernmost corner of Allotment No. 39 of Section No. 10, Suburbs of Auckland; thence by Allotments Nos. 39 and 40 to a point opposite the easternmost corner of Allotment No. 41; thence across a road and by Allotments Nos. 41, 56, 55, 54, and 53, Section No. 10 aforesaid, to Mount Albert Road; thence by that road to the north-western corner of Allotment No. 5, Section No. 13, Suburbs of Auckland; thence by Allotments Nos. 5, 4, and 8, Section No. 13 aforesaid, to Manukau Harbour; thence by Manukau Harbour to North Head; thence towards the south-west by the sea to the north-western boundary of Taupaki Block; thence towards the north-west generally by the north-western boundary of the said Taupaki Block to the Kumeu Stream; thence by

a right line to the south-eastern corner of Ararimu Parish; thence by Ararimu and Pukeatua Parishes to Section No. 49, Okura Parish; thence by Sections Nos. 49 and 1, Okura Parish, to the Okura River; and thence by that river to the sea, the place of commencement, including Waiheke, Ponui, and adjacent islands, and also the Little Barrier Island: excepting the Devonport District hereinbefore described.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

**A PROCLAMATION.**

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the River Boards Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), as amended by the River Boards Amendment Act, 1910, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the date hereof, that part of the said Dominion described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby constituted a district under the said Act, and shall be known by the name of the Opio River District; and, further, that the number of members who are to constitute the Board of the said district shall be five. And I do also proclaim and declare that John Fisher, of Otautau, shall be the Returning Officer to conduct the first elections of the aforesaid district; that Friday, the sixteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, shall be the day, and the Standard Buildings, at Otautau, shall be the place, for holding such first elections; and that Friday, the twenty-third day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, at half past nine o'clock in the forenoon, shall be the time, and the Standard Buildings, Otautau, shall be the place, at

which the first meeting of the members of the Board of the said river district shall be held. And, lastly, I do proclaim and declare that the aforesaid John Fisher shall be the person to make a roll of electors for the purposes of the aforesaid first elections, in the manner prescribed by section eight of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-ninth day of July, 1912.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS in exercise of the powers conferred by section sixteen of the Counties Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), the Clifton County Council and the Stratford County Council respectively did, by an instrument bearing date the seventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, formally agree that the boundaries of the said counties should be altered to the extent set forth in the said instrument and also in the Schedule hereto: And whereas it is expedient that such alteration of boundaries be approved by the Governor in Council, and that such altered boundaries be defined in terms of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that, on and after the publication of these presents in the *New Zealand Gazette*, the boundaries of the Counties of Clifton and Stratford respectively shall be those set forth under their respective headings in the Schedule hereto.

CLIFTON COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded towards the north generally by a line along the middle of the Mokau River from the sea to a point in line with the western boundary of Mokau-Mohakaitino No. 1H Block; thence towards the east generally by a right line to and by the said western boundary of Mokau-Mohakaitino No. 1H Block to Trig. Station Tawhitiraupeka; thence by Section No. 3, Block III, Waro Survey District, to the Mohakaitino Stream; thence by that stream to its confluence with a stream which intersects the Mohakaitino-Parinihi No. 1D East Block, the said confluence being near the westernmost corner of Section No. 1, Block III, Waro Survey District; thence by the said stream, intersecting the Mohakaitino-Parinihi No. 1D East Block, to the Mohakaitino Road; thence by that road to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 6, Block VI, Waro Survey District; thence by Sections Nos. 6, 5, 4, and 3, Block VI, Waro Survey District, to the road forming the northern and western boundaries of the last-mentioned section; thence by that road to the Tongaporutu-Mangaroa Road; thence by that road to where it intersects Section No. 3 aforesaid; thence by that section to the Mangatawa Stream; thence by that stream to its confluence with the Kotare Stream; thence by the said Kotare Stream to the Tongaporutu-Mangaroa Road; thence by that road to Section No. 3, Block VI, Waro Survey District; thence by that section and Section No. 1, Block VII, Waro Survey District, to the Kotare Road; thence by that road to the Waitanga Stream; thence by that stream to the confiscation boundary-line; thence by the confiscation boundary-line to the western boundary of Block XVI, Waro Survey District; thence by Block XVI aforesaid and Block IV, Pouatu Survey District, to Whangamomona County as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 26, of the 30th March, 1911; thence towards the south and south-east generally by the said Whangamomona County to Te Wera Road; thence towards the south generally by that road to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 43, Block VI, Ngatimaru Survey District; thence by that section to Mohakau Road; thence by that road to Section No. 17, Block X, Ngatimaru Survey District; thence by the last-mentioned section and Sections Nos. 15, 14, and 10, Block V, to the Waitara River; thence to and by a line along the middle of that river to a point opposite the easternmost corner of Section No. 18, Block V, Ngatimaru Survey District; thence by a right line to the easternmost corner of that section; thence by the said Section No. 18 and Sections Nos. 13 and 9, Block VIII, Huiroa Survey District, and the western boundary of the last-mentioned section produced to the middle of the Waitara River; thence towards the south-west by a line along the middle of that river to the Borough of Waitara; thence by the Borough of Waitara and again by the Waitara River to the sea; and thence towards the north and north-west generally by the sea to the mouth of the Mokau River, the place of commencement.

Station B, Pahui; thence by a right line to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 48, Block VI, Ngaire Survey District; thence by the southern boundaries of Blocks VI and V, Ngaire Survey District, to the middle of the Wainongoro River; thence by a line along the middle of that river to the middle of Finnerty Road; thence by a line along the middle of Finnerty Road to Hastings Road; thence by a line along the middle of Hastings Road to a point opposite the northern boundary of Section No. 32, Block VIII, Kaipokonui Survey District; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of that section; thence by Sections Nos. 32 and 31, Block VIII aforesaid, to Duthie Road, across that road, and by Section No. 29, said Block VIII, and the production of the northern boundary of that section to the middle of Palmer Road; thence by a line along the middle of that road to the north-eastern corner of Block XI, Kaipokonui Survey District; thence by Blocks XI and X to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 1, Block VI, Kaipokonui Survey District; thence towards the west generally by the last-mentioned section to Opunake Road, and by the southern side of that road to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Section No. 16, Block VI aforesaid; thence across the Opunake Road, and by Sections Nos. 16, 13, and 11, Block VI aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; and thence by a right line to the summit of Mount Egmont, the place of commencement: excepting the Borough of Stratford.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 677, against 685 in May—a decrease of 8. The death in June were 252—an increase of 25 as compared with last month. Of the total death, males contributed 141, females 111. Forty-seven of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 18.65 per cent. of the whole number; 36 of these were under one year of age.

There were 107 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, against 83 in May. The following table shows the classification:—
