Defining the Middle-line of a Portion of the East Coast Main Trunk Railway (Gisborne southwards).

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS a portion of the East Coast Main Trunk Railway from Gisborne southwards, for a distance of twenty-six miles (hereinafter termed "the said rail-

way"), is a railway the construction of which is authorized by the Railways Authorization Act, 1910: And whereas it has been determined to construct and maintain the portion of the said railway described in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section one hundred and eighty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1908, and in pursuance and exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of the said portion of the said railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

*Declaring the Bank of Portion of the Akitio River to be protected.*

#### A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by section one hundred and eighty-three of the Public Works Act, 1908, that where it is desirable for the safety or proper maintenance of any public work to protect the banks of, or to alter or divert, either wholly or partially, any river, the Governor may, by Proclamation publicly notified, declare that the banks of such river shall be so protected or its course so altered or diverted, and thereupon the protection of the banks or the alteration or diversion of such river, stream, or watercourse shall be a public work within the meaning of this Act:

And whereas the Akitio County Council has applied for the issue of a Proclamation in terms of the Public Works Act, 1908, protecting the portion of the western bank of the Akitio River described in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is found desirable for the safety and proper maintenance of the Akitio Bridge and the southern approach thereto to protect the portion of the western bank of the Akitio River described in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section one hundred and eighty-three of the Public Works Act, 1908, and the Counties Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the western bank of the Akitio River described in the Schedule hereto is hereby protected, altered, or diverted as required for the proper safety and protection of the Akitio Bridge and the southern approach thereto.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and seventy-eight of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, it is, *inter alia*, provided that where the configuration of any borough is such as that within any particular area or areas thereof it is difficult or inexpedient to construct streets of a width of sixty-six feet, as required by the said Act, the Governor may, by Order in Council defining the limits of such particular area or areas, authorize the Council to permit within such area or areas the construction of streets and private streets of a width of less than sixty-six feet, but not less than forty-five feet:

And whereas the configuration of part of the Borough of Parnell is such that within the area described in the Schedule hereto it is inexpedient to construct a street of sixty-six feet in width:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby authorize the Parnell Borough Council to permit the laying-off of a street of a width less than sixty-six feet, but not less than forty-five feet, within the area described in the Schedule hereto.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twelfth day of August, 1912.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS subsection three, section fifty, of the Native Land Act, 1909, enacts that at any time and from time to time, on application, made *ex parte* or otherwise, by any person interested, the Chief Judge may, if he thinks fit, on being satisfied that the applicant has

shown a *prima facie* case of error, whether of fact or law, in any final order of the Appellate Court, make an order for the rehearing, whether complete or partial, of the appeal or matter in which that order was made; and the Appellate Court shall thereupon rehear the same accordingly, and may affirm, annul, or vary its previous order:

And whereas a Commissioner was appointed for the purpose aforesaid, and an inquiry was duly held:

And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor, after due inquiry, his opinion thereon:

And whereas the Governor is of opinion that it is equitable that the cost of maintaining the street mentioned in the Schedule hereto should be provided and paid in the manner and in the proportion hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby direct that, from and after the date of this Warrant, the cost of maintaining the street described in the Schedule hereto shall be borne in the following proportions, viz.: The Grey Lynn Borough Council to bear sixty per centum, the Point Chevalier Road Board to bear twenty per centum, the Avondale Road Board to bear fifteen per centum, and the Mount Albert Road Board to bear five per centum of such cost respectively: Provided, however, that if the Borough of Grey Lynn is amalgamated with the City of Auckland the apportionment made herein shall cease and determine.

And I do hereby direct that any contributions hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Point Chevalier, Avondale, and Mount Albert Road Boards shall be paid from time to time out of the funds of the said Road Boards within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Council of the Borough of Grey Lynn; and such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the said Borough Council for and on account of such Road Boards.
