Constituting the Town District of Otaki, in the County of Horowhenua.

#### ISLINGTON, Governor. (L.s.) A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS is it enacted by the Town Boards Act, 1908, that the Governor may declare that any locality outside a borough wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act. 1908.

HEREAS by Order in Council dated the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twelfth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, the boundaries of the Borough of Wanganui East were altered by excluding therefrom the area described in the First Schedule hereto: And whereas it is desirable that part of the area so excluded should be added to the Kaukatea Riding and the remainder to the Mangawhero Riding of the County of Wanganui:

Regulations for the Appointment of Staff and Enrolment of Boys in New Zealand Training-ships.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by section four of the Training-ships Act, 1908, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of the said Act, and do hereby declare that such regulations shall come into force on the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and shall then supersede all existing regulations made under the said Act for the purposes aforesaid.

#### SCHEDULE.

1. In these regulations, where not inconsistent with the

"The Minister" means the Minister of Marine for the

time being:
"The training-ship" means any ship or vessel declared
to be a training-ship under the Training-ships

2. Applications for enrolment in the training-ships must be made in writing on the form laid down, and addressed to

be made in writing on the form laid down, and addressed to
the Secretary, Marine Department, together with the medicalinspection form duly filled in and certified to by a medical
practitioner, also two certificates as to character, one of
which must be from a Justice of the Peace or a clergyman.

3. Applications must be made by the parent or guardian of
the candidate, accompanied by a written consent to his
enrolment, and on the candidate being finally enrolled an
undertaking must be given that he will not be removed from
the vessel (unless discharged) for a period of two years, or for
such other period as the Minister may determine.

4. The application by a parent or guardian of a candidate for enrolment in the training-ship shall be accompanied by an agreement, signed by the parent or guardian, in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

This agreement, made the day of 19, between parent [or guardian] of [Candidate] of the one part, and His Majesty the King of the other part, witnesseth that, in consideration of the said [Candidate] being enrolled in a training-ship, the said parent [or guardian] hereby agrees with His Majesty the King that:—

(a) If on the discharge and the said parent [or guardian] hereby agrees with His Majesty the King that :—

that:—
(a.) If on the discharge of the said [Candidate] from a training-ship, the Marine Department can procure employment for him at sea, and he does not take that employment and remain in it for at least six months, or if the said [Candidate] leaves the training-ship before the period for which he is enrolled has expired, then and in either of such cases he, the said parent [or guardian], will pay to the said Marine Department the cost incurred by the Department in maintaining and training the said [Candidate] on the training-ship, the amount to be fixed by the Minister of Marine, but not to exceed fifty pounds, and the said amount shall be deemed to be a debt due to the Crown; and

and
(b.) If the said [Candidate] deserts from a training-ship, he, the said parent [or guardian], agrees that the Marine Department may have him brought back, and further agrees that in such case he will refund to the Department the costs incurred by it in bringing the said [Candidate] back to the ship

5. In the case of boys joining a training-ship under the last-mentioned regulation, and for whom, on completion of training, employment is found by the Marine Department in other ships, the amounts of pay standing to their credit from the training-ship will be retained by the Department until the Department is satisfied that at least six months' sea service has been performed since leaving the training-ship, evidence of such service being shown by the discharge or discharges relating to the ship or ships on which such service has been performed since leaving the

training-ship.

The foregoing will not relate to boys who may be allowed to leave the training-ship finally through any other cause whatsoever, or when transferring from the training-ship to His Majesty's Naval Service, and in which cases such amounts of pay will not be retained, notwithstanding that the six months' sea service since leaving the training-ship

has not been performed.

6. A candidate who is selected for enrolment must report 6. A candidate who is selected for enrolment must report himself to the Commander for the time being of the training ship at Wellington within ten days from the date specified in the notice which will be sent to him, when he will be placed on probation for one week; on the expiry of which he will, if found suitable, be finally enrolled.

7. Boys will, on acceptance, be received on probation on head the training ship.

board the training-ship.

The period of probation will be one week, when, should the boy then be found unsatisfactory in any respect, he will

be immediately discharged.

8. Boys found satisfactory will then be enrolled and the necessary kit issued, the civilian clothing being returned, if it is, in the opinion of the Commander for the time being of

it is, in the opinion of the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, worth returning, to the boys' parents or guardians, otherwise it will be destroyed.

9. No boy will be allowed, while in the service, to wear clothing other than that supplied to him on the training-ship. This condition will also apply to boys when on leave.

10. A free pass (second by railway and steerage by steamer) will, where necessary, be granted to boys attending for enrolment, also to their homes in the Dominion on the occasion of their annual leave. occasion of their annual leave.

11. In the case of boys failing to pass the official medical examination, which takes place either before or during pro-bationary period, or are rejected after probation, similar passes will also be granted back to their homes in the

Dominion.

12. In order to qualify boys to take service in either the British navy or the mercantile marine on completion of their training in the training-ship the minimum age at entry is fixed at thirteen years and a half, and the maximum at fifteen years: both these limits of age may be varied at the discretion of the Minister. The period of service on the training-ship shall be not less than eighteen months

nor more than two years, at the discretion of the said Minister.

13. No officer or member of the staff or crew, other than the Commander for the time being of the training ship, or any officer or member of the staff or crew permanently appointed under the provisions of section fifteen of the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Act, 1908, where the property of the prop shall be deemed to be a Civil servant within the meaning of the Acts regulating the Civil Service of the Dominion.

#### PAY AND EMOLUMENTS.

14. On enrolment every boy will be rated as a "second-class boy." The sum of 1d. per day will be placed to his credit on the books of the training-ship from the date of

final acceptance.

15. On his being raised to the rank of "first-class boy," which may not take place until he has completed at least six months' service, his pay may, if the Minister so approves, be raised to the amount of 2d. per day.

16. On receipt of one "good conduct" stripe, which should not take place until he has completed at least one year's service, his pay may, if the Minister so approves, be further increased to the amount of 3d. per day.

17. On being promoted to the rank of "petty officer," which should not take place until he has completed at least fifteen months' service, his pay may, if the Minister so approves, be further increased by an additional 1d. per day. day.

#### DISCIPLINE (BOYS).

18. Boys who are disorderly or dirty in their behaviour, or disrespectful to the staff or crew, or who may make away with, destroy, or damage any portion of the equipment of the training ship, or the property on issue to them, may, on a first offence, be reported by the Commander for the time being of the training ship to the Minister for decision in accordance with these regulations.

in accordance with these regulations.

19. Breaches of discipline, carelessness, disobedience of orders, bad conduct, &c., on the part of boys will be punished as may be directed by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, unless of such serious nature as to require the decision of the Minister.

20. Money placed to the credit of a boy is subject to fines and forfeiture, and will affect the credit of any such boy however concerned

however concerned.

21. Shortages of, or destruction of, any portion of kit or other Government property will affect the credit of the boy or boys implicated to the value of the articles or property so lost or destroyed.

22. Should any continued breaches of discipline or other unsatisfactory conduct occur on the part of a boy or boys, the Commander for the time being of the training-ship will at once report the matter to the Minister for consideration as to what punishment is to be inflicted, or whether the boy is to

23. Any boy or boys absent from the ship, or his duty (if on shore), without leave shall be dealt with by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship; on a second offence occurring the matter shall be reported to the Minister

for decision.

24. Should any boy be absent without leave for more than six hours he is to be suspended, and the matter may be reported to the Minister.

25. The Minister may, where not provided for or not repugnant to these regulations, make and issue such standing orders as may be found necessary for the daily routine

and efficient government of the training-ship.

26. In all the foregoing regulations pertaining to discipline, and numbered 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, and 24, the decision of

the Minister is to be final.

#### DISCIPLINE (STAFF).

27. In all cases when and where practicable, and when not provided for otherwise in these regulations, the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions may be taken as a guide and as forming part of these regulations in so far as the maintenance of discipline on the training-ship is concerned.

28. All members of ship's staff shall conduct themselves in a temperate and orderly manner; they shall show an unremitting attention to duty, which must be performed with alacrity and cheerfulness, both of which are conducive to the harmony of the ship.

29. The Commander for the time being of the trainingship, while upholding the authority of the various members

ship, while upholding the authority of the various members of the ship's staff under his control, will check by timely reproofs any tendency he may notice to abuse of power, recommending by his example that firm but conciliatory manner of conducting duty which is the surest way to gain the confidence of the boys.

30. Any member of the staff who is desirous of lodging a complaint regarding the conduct of a boy or boys is to lay

the matter before the Commander for the time being of the training-ship as soon as possible after the occurrence has taken place. On this being done the Commander will at once advise what steps are to be taken to prevent a recurrence of the traphle.

31. Alcoholic liquors will not be allowed to be brought on board without the permission of the Commander for the time being of the training-ship. Any member of the staff or crew found to be under the influence of liquor will be liable to suspension and be sent on shore. A report of such conduct is to be sent to the Minister, who shall decide what action is to be taken in the matter. On a second similar offence within six months the offender will be dismissed. If the offence is committed at a greater than six months' interval from the first offence the offender shall be fined £1. Such fine may be recovered from the offender in any Court of competent jurisdiction, or may be deducted from any pay due to the offender: Provided that no such deduction shall be made except on the written permission or direction of the Commander for the time being of the training ship first obtained. In case of a third offence the offender shall be dis-

32. Smoking will not be allowed on deck whilst any duty

is being performed, either by the staff or crew.

33. When any member of the staff or crew is convicted of any serious offence by the civil power, the offender is to be suspended and reported by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship for the consideration of the Minis-

34. Members of the staff or orew against whom debts are recovered in a civil Court will have the fact recorded in their defaulters' sheets, and entries of this description shall be a bar to all promotion or advancement, if not otherwise more

severely dealt with, as may be directed by the Minister.

35. Any member of the staff or crew shall, unless otherwise decided by the Minister, forfeit the whole of his day's pay for every day he is absent without leave or under suspension.

36. A member shall be regarded as absent for one day-

(a.) When he is absent without leave for six consecutive hours.

(b.) When, owing to his absence without leave, he has been prevented from performing any of the duties apportioned to him, and which duties were thereby, owing to his absence, thrown on some other person.

37. If a member of the staff or crew is absent for twentyfour hours without leave, he shall be suspended by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, who will at once report the case to the Minister, who shall thereupon decide whether the member is to be fined, reduced, or dis-

missed from the ship.

38. In case of breaches or non-fulfilment of duty on the part of any member of the staff or crew, the offender is to be suspended by the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, who shall report the matter to the Minister, whose decision in the case shall be final.

## HOLIDAY LEAVE (BOYS).

39. Leave will be granted twice a year—i.e., twenty-one days at midsummer and fourteen days in midwinter, in all thirty-five days—subject to good conduct.

40. Parents or guardians will be notified at least ten days before leave is to be granted, and will be required to reply by letter to the Commander for the time being of the training-thin etation that they will account such be provided for each ship stating that they will accept such boy, provide for and maintain him until the expiration of his leave of absence; that they will meet him on arrival, take charge of, be responsible for, and on the expiration of his leave of absence see him and his effects safely away on his return journey to the

him and his effects safely away on his return journey to the training-ship. Should this assurance not be received, then the boy shall remain on board.

41. No boy or boys will be allowed leave, other than the half-holiday leave, until he has served at least three months on board the training-ship (since enrolment).

42. Allowance when proceeding on Holiday Leave.—When going home on leave each boy may, at the discretion of the Commander of the training-ship, and provided that he has sufficient to his credit, be allowed to draw for spending purposes during leave as follows (according to length of service):—

44. Holiday Kit.—Sufficient kit for use whilst on holiday leave will be allotted to boys when proceeding on such leave; such kit will be inspected and counted on the boy's departure and return. Parents or guardians of such boy will be held responsible should any shortages of clothing occur on the boy's return to the training-ship at the expiration of such leave.

#### HALF-HOLIDAYS (BOYS).

Half-holidays will take place twice each week-viz. on Wednesdays and Saturdays, between the hours of 1.30 p.m. and 5 p.m. Leave will be granted to all boys (subject to good conduct) with the exception of one boat's

46. Friends or relatives of boys will be allowed to visit the ship on the Wednesday half-holiday only; other visitors will be allowed on board on production of passes, which are to be obtained by application to the Secretary, Marine Department.

47. On half-holidays each boy may, at the discretion of the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, be allowed to draw money (provided he has sufficient to his credit) to the extent of 3d. per week for spending purposes.

#### DISCHARGE.

48. Boys who have completed training, and for whom employment has been found by the Department, and who have performed at least six months' sea service on a ship or ships since leaving the training ship, will then be finally discharged, and will have issued to them a certification. cate on the prescribed form, on which shall be stated the standard of education attained by the boy, his efficiency, length of service in the training-ship, and character. On being allowed to leave the training-ship finally through any other cause whatsoever, or when transferring from the training-ship to His Majesty's Naval Service, final discharge will then be given, notwithstanding that the six months' sea service since leaving the training-ship has not been performed.

The regularity of the boys messing is of the first importance, as their health, good order, and comfort in a great messure depend upon it; the strictest attention of officers is therefore demanded to this. Two officers will always be present on the mess-decks during meals to ensure that all matters

relating to messing are satisfactory.

57. If any complaints as to the food, &c., are made by the boys the officer will at once report it to the Commander for the time being of the training-ship, who will take steps to prevent a recurrence, and, if necessary, report the matter to the Minister.

58. All members of the staff or crew (excepting boys) shall, whilst on duty, wear the uniform laid down.
