*Union of Boroughs of City of Dunedin and Roslyn.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the respective Councils of the City of Dunedin and of the Borough of Roslyn, by petitions under the respective common seals of the Corporations of such city and borough, as provided by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, have prayed the Governor that such city and borough (forming one continuous area) be constituted one united borough:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, do hereby proclaim that the said City of Dunedin and the said Borough of Roslyn are hereby constituted one united borough, and also that the said borough so constituted is a city by the name of the City of Dunedin, and also that the boundaries of the said city so constituted and named shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto:

And I do hereby appoint George Arthur Lewin (the Town Clerk to the existing City of Dunedin) to be the Town Clerk and Returning Officer temporarily of the said united borough:

And I do also proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and from the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

CITY OF DUNEDIN.

tion No. 84 aforesaid, and the production of the south-western boundary of that section to Section No. 2 of 4, Block IX, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; and thence by that section to the most northerly corner of Section No. 2 of 5 of said block and district; thence towards the south-east generally by a right line to Trig. Station E, Block IX, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; thence by a right line to the southernmost corner of Section No. 51 of Block IX aforesaid; thence towards the south-west by the southern boundary of said Section No. 51 to the original high-water mark of Pelichet Bay; thence by said high-water mark for a distance of 2900 links to the south-eastern boundary-line of the area vested in the Otago Harbour Board; thence by aforesaid south-eastern boundary-line to a point in line with the southern boundary-line of Park Street, Township of Kensington, distant 1000 links, more or less, from the northern corner of aforesaid street; thence by a right line to a point in line with the north-western boundary-line of Cargill Road, distant 1000 links, more or less, from the south-eastern corner of said road; thence again towards the north-west by a line being the production of the north-western boundary-line of Cargill Road, distant 3000 links, more or less, from the south-eastern corner of Cargill Road, to low-water mark; thence again towards the north-east by said low-water mark for a distance of 4180 links, more or less; thence again towards the south-east by a line, 3600 links, more or less, to the junction of the south side of Bay View Road with Anderson's Bay Road; thence again towards the north-east along Anderson's Bay Road to the middle of Bay View Road; thence again towards the south-east and north-east by the Borough of St. Kilda, and the south-western boundary of that borough produced to the ocean; thence again by the ocean to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section No. 32, Ocean Beach Survey District; thence towards the south-west by a right line to and by the north-eastern side of the road forming the south-western boundaries of Sections Nos. 32, 31, 30, 29, 28, 27, 26, 25, and 24, Ocean Beach Survey District, and across a road to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 77; thence by Sections Nos. 77, 102R, and 78, aforesaid district, to Corstorphine Road; thence to and along the middle of that road to its junction with the road which runs northerly intersecting Sections Nos. 36 and 39, Block VI, town district, to the main South Road; thence along the middle of that road to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Section No. 45, Block VI aforesaid; thence to and by said Section No. 4 to the south-western corner of the Borough of Mornington; thence towards the north and west generally, and towards the south-west and south-east by that borough to Section No. 18, Block V, Lower Kaikorai Survey District; thence again towards the south-west generally by the last-mentioned section to the right bank of the Kaikorai Stream; thence by

the right bank of that stream to Section No. 19, Block V, Lower Kaikorai Survey District; thence by said Section No. 19 and Sections Nos. 1 of 49 and 2 of 49, Block VI, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District; thence by Sections Nos. 68 and 57, Block VI aforesaid, and by the eastern boundary-line of the last-mentioned section produced across a road to Section No. 144, Wakari Survey District; thence by the road forming the northern boundaries of Sections Nos. 57, 56, 55, and 54, Block VI, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District, and across a road to the southernmost corner of Section No. 155, Wakari Survey District; and thence again towards the north-west by Sections Nos. 155, 156, 157, 158, 159, across a road, and by Sections Nos. 160, 161, 162, 49, 48, and 47 to a point in line with the southern boundary of Section No. 50, aforesaid district; thence across a road and by the last-mentioned section to the westernmost corner of Section No. 21, aforesaid district; thence by the northern boundary-line of that section to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 32, aforesaid district; thence by part of said Section No. 32, by Allotment No. 10, Block II, Chalmers-ton Township, across a road, and by Allotments Nos. 16 and 10, Block I, Chalmers-ton Township, to the main North Taieri Road; thence across that road and by Section No. 31, aforesaid district, to Section No. 1 of 32, Block V, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District; thence again towards the north-east by that section to its south-eastern corner, by the abutment of a road, Section No. 57, a road, and Sections Nos. 56 and 59, Block V aforesaid, to the westernmost corner of Section No. 53, Wakari Survey District; and thence again towards the north-east, south-west, and west generally by the Borough of Maori Hill to the middle of the road at the northernmost corner of Section No. 68, Block XI, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District, the place of commencement.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883, the Rangiora Timber Company (Limited) (hereinafter called "the company"), did, in the year one thousand nine hundred and two, apply to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at the Narrows in Hokianga Harbour in order to erect a wharf thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fifty-sixth section of the said Act, deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 2505), showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark proposed to be occupied and the manner in which it was proposed to erect the said wharf: And whereas the Governor in Council did, on the third day of April, one thousand nine hundred and two, approve of the purpose for which the said foreshore and land below low-water mark were to be occupied, and granted a license for the purpose aforesaid on the terms and conditions therein expressed: And whereas the company has applied for authority to make an extension to the said wharf in Hokianga Harbour described in the said plan M.D. 2505; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), has deposited a plan in the office of the said Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 3896), showing the additional foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be so occupied, and the nature and extent of the said extension intended to be made: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan (marked M.D. 3896) has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the company under the said Act for the purpose last aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said extension to the wharf in Hokianga Harbour is to be erected, as shown on the plan M.D. 3896 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said extension to the said wharf in Hokianga Harbour, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Sea-



men Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the extension of the said wharf, as shown on plan marked M.D. 3896.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1, payable in advance, dating from the 1st day of April in each year, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council: *Provided that for the period from the date hereof to the 31st March, 1913, a proportionate part only of such annual sum of £1 shall be payable.*

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf-extension and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf-extension without payment.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf-extension in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit from the wharf and wharf-extension and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: *Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.*

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf-extension and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf-extension, requiring it within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, by the Harbourmaster at Hokianga, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force until the 3rd day of April, 1916, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company in New Zealand.

12. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf-extension may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

13. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf-extension for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sums mentioned in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. The erection of the said wharf-extension shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the company of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

WHEREAS by subsection one of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, it is, *inter alia*, provided that the said section shall not apply in any case where the local authority having control of a road or street by resolution declares that the provisions thereof shall not apply to any specified road or street, or any specified part hereof, and such resolution is approved by the Governor in Council :

And whereas by subsection two of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, and clause (b) of subsection one of section thirteen of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that such approval may be either absolute or subject to such conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit to impose, and may refer to one or both sides of the road or street :

And whereas the Taieri County Council, the local authority having control of the portion of road described in the Schedule hereto, did by resolution declare that the provisions of the said section one hundred and seventeen should not apply to the said portion of road :

And whereas it is deemed expedient that such resolution should be approved in so far as it refers to the south-eastern side of the portion of Gladstone Road described in the Schedule hereto, subject to the conditions hereinafter mentioned :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the above-in-part-recited Acts, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the said resolution to the extent hereinbefore mentioned in the last preceding paragraph hereof, subject to the conditions that no building or part of a building shall be erected at any time on the south-eastern side of that part of Gladstone Road described in the Schedule hereto within a distance of thirty-three feet from the centre-line of that portion of road.

THE HONOURABLE W. F. MASSEY PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act :

And whereas the Wellington Steam Ferry Company (Limited) (hereinafter referred to as "the company") desires to erect electric lines from its power-house at Day's Bay to and along the water-front, and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the

conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the said company to erect and maintain electric lines for the purpose of lighting a part of the water-front at Day's Bay, Harbour of Wellington, such electric lines being indicated by a red line on the plan marked P.W.D. 31951, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS.

1. The conductors shall be at minimum height of 18 ft. above the surface of the ground, and may be uninsulated.

2. The conductors shall be composed of stranded copper or aluminium. The size of the strand shall not be less than No. 20 standard wire gauge, and the number of strands shall not be less than seven.

3. The potential difference between the two wires, or between either wire and the earth, shall not exceed 100 volts direct current.

4. Every support for an aerial line shall be of durable material and properly strengthened against forces due to wind-pressure, change of direction of the line, and unequal length of span. The factor of safety of such supports shall be at least four, taking into consideration all possible stresses, including wind-pressure at 30 lb. per square foot on plane surfaces and 18 lb. per square foot on cylindrical surfaces. The stress in the aerial conductors shall not exceed 28,000 lb. per square inch for copper and 15,000 lb. per square inch for aluminium in the extreme case of a temperature of 12° Fahr. and a wind-pressure of 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane occurring simultaneously.

5. Where the conductors cross telegraph or telephone wires, or if any telegraph or telephone wire is hereinafter installed so as to cross the conductors, substantial guard-wires shall be erected by or at the cost of the company. Such guard-wires shall consist of two stranded galvanized steel wires, carried on substantial supports, at a height of 2 ft. above the conductors if the telegraph or telephone wires pass over the conductors, or 2 ft. above the telegraph or telephone wires if they pass under the conductors.

6. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of September, 1912, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of December, 1913.

7. The company shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

8. The company shall not use the said electric line, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the company that he has received from the Engineer appointed by him to inspect the works a certificate that they have been satisfactorily carried out.

9. This license and the benefits and obligations hereunder shall not be assigned by the company without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained ; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

10. The electric-light line shall occupy the other side of the road to that taken by the existing telegraph line.

11. If the company fails to comply with any of the above conditions of this license the Minister may by notice in writing require the company, within thirty days, to remedy the default specified in that notice ; and if the company fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period it shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recovered by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.

12. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the company fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

13. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the company the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands or works and inspect the same.

14. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public work, nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the company for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the twenty-first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and seven, the fourteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine, the thirtieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 92, of the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and seven, No. 105, of the sixteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine, No. 1, of the thirteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and No. 96, of the third day of November, one thousand nine hundred and ten, respectively, regulations were made governing the netting and sale of trout in the New River Estuary :

And whereas it is desirable to make additional regulations for the purpose aforesaid :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following additional regulations ; and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall have force and effect in such of the waters of the New River Estuary and the mouth or entrance thereof, and in such of the rivers and streams running into the estuary, as are not within the boundaries of the "netting prohibited areas."

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to net trout shall be granted to *bona fide* fishermen only. The definition of "*bona fide* fisherman" shall mean a person who has earned his sole living by taking fish for sale during a period of not less than nine months in the twelve months immediately preceding the date of his application for such license.

2. It shall be unlawful for the owner or lessee of any licensed fishing-boat or person who holds a trout netting or selling license to take trout from any unlicensed person or unlicensed boat. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a fine of not less than £2 nor more than £25, and on conviction for such breach the netting or selling license granted to such person shall be forfeited.

*Regulations for Trout-fishing, Rotorua Acclimatization District.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-eighth day of October, 1912.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the Rotorua Acclimatization District and the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, supersede all regulations at variance therewith, and such regulations are hereby revoked.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout in all waters within that district or part of the North Island known as the Rotorua Acclimatization District, described in the First Schedule hereto, and comprising the Counties of Rotorua, Whakatane, and East Taupo, and parts of the Counties of Wairoa, West Taupo, and Matamata, may be issued under the hand of the General Manager of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, or any one authorized in writing by the said General

Manager in that behalf; provided that the General Manager, or his appointee, may refuse to issue a license to any person who within the previous two years has been convicted of any breach of the provisions of any Act relating to fishing for trout, or of any regulation made thereunder.

2. The fee to be charged for a license as aforesaid to each male person over the age of sixteen years shall be £1. Licenses may also be issued to boys attending school or under the age of sixteen, or to women, at a reduced fee of 5s. for each license so issued; provided that it shall be lawful for the said General Manager, or his appointee, in any case where application is made for a license on or after the 1st February in any year, to issue a license to any man for the sum of 12s. 6d., but so that such license shall extend only from the time of granting the same until the termination of the then trout-fishing season. No license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent. The General Manager, or his appointee, may issue a day license to any one applying for the same on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d. for each day's fishing.

3. Any holder of a license may fish for trout in the above-named waters from the 1st November in any year to the 31st May in the following year, both inclusive; but every such license shall be for one season only, and shall expire on the 31st May following the date on which it was issued, subject, however, to the special limitations and restrictions hereinafter mentioned.

4. Trout shall not be fished for, taken, or killed otherwise than with one rod and line; but a landing-net or gaff may be used to secure any trout caught with such rod and line. No lures or baits other than natural or artificial flies, insects, or fish shall be used with such rod and line, nor shall any of the said lures or baits be used except upon a running line attached to a rod and reel; nor shall any set rod or line be used for taking trout in any of the waters aforesaid.

5. No person shall use any bait or lure other than artificial fly in any of the streams following—namely, the Kaituna Stream from Lake Rotoiti to the electric power station at the Okere Falls, the Waimakariri, Waitahanui, and Tahana-ara Streams, and the Ohau Channel.

6. No person shall use any bait or lure other than artificial fly within a radius of 300 yards of the mouths (or outlets, as the case may be) of any of the rivers, springs, or streams flowing into or from Lakes Rotorua, Rotoiti, Rotoehu, Rotoma, Rotokakahi, and Tarawera.

7. No person shall use any bait or lure other than artificial fly within a radius of 300 yards from Te Ngae sunken reef in Lake Rotorua, as indicated by posts in the water.

8. No license shall be transferable, or be deemed to authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish.

9. No person shall take, fish for, or catch any *Salmonidae* or trout, or in any way injure or disturb the same, between the 1st June and the 31st October in any year, which period is hereby appointed a close season for all such fish. No person shall have in his possession any *Salmonidae* or trout between the 5th June and the 1st November following, except as provided for by the regulations regarding keeping trout in freezing or cool chambers after close of season, which were made by the Governor in Council on the 6th October, 1908, and on the 6th September, 1909, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 8th October, 1908, and the 16th September, 1909, respectively. Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the General Manager, or his appointee, or officers of the Marine Department, for purposes of acclimatization.

10. No person shall cast or throw into any stream or waters, or shall allow to flow into or place near the bank or margin of any stream or waters, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flax-mill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poisonous, or injurious to fish; provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to prohibit the depositing in such stream of debris from any mining claim.

11. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

12. No person shall fish for trout without a license; and every person fishing shall, on the demand of any Ranger, constable, officer of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, or of any person producing a license, give his true name and place of residence, and, on the like demand, produce and show to such Ranger, officer, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout.

13. Every trout not exceeding 10 in. in length from nose to tip of tail taken or caught by any person shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

14. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other un-sportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout; nor shall any of the above-mentioned baits be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

15. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net, or any instrument, or device, or means for taking *Salmonidae* or trout in any lake, river, or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream; provided that nothing contained in this clause shall apply to the General Manager referred to in clause 1 of these regulations, or to any person authorized in writing by the said General Manager to net fish on behalf of the Department.

16. No fishing of the form known as trolling or spinning a bait from a boat, launch, or canoe shall be practised in any river, spring, or stream flowing into or from Lakes Rotorua, Rotoiti, Rotoehu, Rotoma, Tarawera, or Taupo, or in the said lakes within a radius of 300 yards of the mouths (or outlets, as the case may be) of any of the said rivers, springs, or streams flowing into or from the said lakes, or any of them.

17. Nothing herein contained, or contained in any license issued under these regulations, shall be deemed to authorize any person to fish for or take *Salmonidae* or trout from the Wairoa Stream between the waterfalls and Lake Tarawera.

18. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any trout, or any part thereof; provided always that this clause shall not apply to fish bought or sold by the General Manager referred to in clause 1 of these regulations, or to any person authorized in writing by the said General Manager to purchase or sell fish on his behalf.

19. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than £1 or more than £50.

20. If any person shall be convicted of an offence against these regulations, the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

VANCOUVER ISLAND.—NANAIMO HARBOUR.—UNCHARTED ROCK.—BUOY ESTABLISHED.—Oregon rock, about 60 ft. long in a 160°–340° direction and 15 ft. wide, surrounded by depths of 9 ft. to 12 ft., with summit, about 5 ft. in extent, drying 1 ft. at extreme low water, lies 315 ft. 169° from Passage Rock buoy, Nanaimo Harbour, Vancouver Island, British Columbia.

A black wooden spar buoy has been moored in 8 ft. of water at the south-eastern end of the rock.

There is no safe passage westward of the above danger.

The distribution will take place on the 3rd February, 1913, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 25th January, 1913.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1912; and *such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—*

#### DECLARATION.

RECOMMENDATION.

SCHEDULE.

*Hours of Labour.*

1. The hours of labour shall be forty-eight, and shall be regulated by the employer between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on five days of the week, and between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday. In country districts it shall be permissible for some other day in the week to be substituted for Saturday, as may be mutually agreed upon by the employer and his worker.

*Wages.*

2. The minimum weekly wage to men employed on weekly wages, including pressers, shall be £2 10s. per week.

No deduction shall be made from this weekly wage save for time lost through the worker's own default.

*Overtime and Holidays.*

3. All work performed beyond the hours prescribed in clause 1 hereof shall be considered as overtime, and shall be paid for in accordance with the following scale: From 6 p.m. until 10 p.m., at the rate of time and a quarter; from 10 p.m. until midnight, at the rate of time and a half; from midnight until 6 a.m., at the rate of double time; 6 a.m. to 8 a.m., at the rate of time and a quarter.

All work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday shall be paid for at the rate of double time, and all work done on Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Easter Monday, and Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. No deductions from weekly hands for the above holidays.

Any time lost by a worker through his own default shall be deducted before overtime is allowed.

*Apprentices.*

4. The proportion of apprentices to journeymen shall be as follows: For the first four men or any less number, one apprentice; for more than four men and up to eight men, two apprentices; and so on in the same proportion.

For the purpose of determining the number of apprentices to journeymen, the calculation shall be based on a two-thirds full-time employment of journeymen during the six months immediately prior to taking an apprentice.

5. (a.) Any employer taking an apprentice to learn the trade shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall pay such apprentice not less than the undermentioned rates of wages: For the first year, 5s. per week; for the second year, 10s. per week; for the third year, 15s. per week; for the fourth year, £1 per week; for the fifth year, £1 5s. per week.

(b.) The period of apprenticeship shall be five years, but two months' probation shall be allowed the first employer to determine his fitness, such two months to be included in the period of apprenticeship. The obligation of the apprentice to serve the employer shall be a duty enforceable under this award.

(c.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the apprenticeship wish, for any reason, to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he shall give him a certificate for the time served, and procure him another employer, carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, who shall continue to teach the apprentice, to pay him the wages prescribed by this award according to the total length of time he has served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer: provided that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him; but he shall give him a certificate of the time actually served.

(d.) An employer taking an apprentice shall give notice thereof, and of the name of the apprentice, to the Inspector of Factories within one week after the expiration of the period of probation; such notice shall be in writing bearing the signature of the apprentice, his guardian, and the employer; and an employer transferring an apprentice to another employer shall similarly within one week thereof give notice of such transfer to the Inspector of Factories.

(e.) An employer shall not be deemed to discharge his duty towards his apprentice if he fails to keep him at work owing to slackness of work, but such slackness may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

(f.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice of the discharge and the cause thereof to the Inspector of Factories.

(g.) Existing arrangements with or relating to apprentices now serving any employer may continue, provided that any employer wishing such arrangements to continue shall forward the names of his present apprentices to the Inspector of Factories within one month after the filing of this award.

(h.) An apprentice absenting himself from work without the consent of his employer for any cause other than sickness shall not be entitled to be paid for the time so lost, and shall make up such time before the following year of his apprenticeship shall be deemed to commence, and the total period of his apprenticeship shall be extended for a period equal to such lost time.

#### *General Conditions.*

6. Not more than one weekly hand shall be employed in any shop unless pieceworkers are also employed, and the proportion of weekly-wage hands shall be not more than one to every four pieceworkers or fraction of the first four. For the purpose of determining the number of weekly-wage hands to pieceworkers, the calculation shall be based on a two-thirds full-time employment for the six months previous for the average of the labour. A presser may be employed in addition to a first weekly hand, but not more than one presser to be allowed in any one shop.

7. (a.) There shall be a fair distribution of work among all operatives in each workroom by the employer. Where there are several workrooms used by the employer, the same shall be considered and included as one workroom for the purposes of this clause.

(b.) Nothing in this award contained shall prevent the employment of a second presser on weekly wages at the determination of a joint committee as provided for in clause 13 hereof.

8. There shall be no distribution of work known as the "team system." The weekly hands shall have charge of the male apprentices, and shall have no other permanent assistance.

9. All bespoke work shall be done in the registered workroom, within the district covered by this award, of the employer for whom the work is performed, and for whom or by whom the order is taken. All such work as shall be performed by a journeyman other than on weekly wages shall be paid according to the time statement hereto attached. The expression "bespoke work" in these conditions shall include all garments for which orders or measures are taken; also all goods made and sold as "tailor-made."

10. All work shall be done in the workshop or premises of the employer, and no work shall be done in any premises occupied by

an operative except by consent of the joint committee referred to in clause 13.

*Preference.*

11. The employers shall employ members of the union in preference to non-members, provided there are members of the union equally qualified with non-members to perform the particular work required to be done, and known to the employer to be available in the locality where the employer's business is situated, and who are ready and willing to undertake the work when non-members are employed.

*Time Statement.*

12. (a.) The time statement hereto attached shall be deemed to be incorporated herein, and shall form part of this award.

(b.) When other than weekly hands are employed at ladies' tailoring, the work may be done, at the option of the employer, either at log rates or at the minimum rate of 1s. 4½d. per hour by the clock.

*Detailed Disputes.*

13. In case of a dispute as to the interpretation of any of the clauses or provisions hereof, or of anything in the time statement, such dispute shall be referred to a joint committee, consisting of two representatives of the union and two of the employers, to be appointed as occasion requires, such representatives to elect a chairman, who shall have a casting-vote, and in default of their agreeing upon a chairman, the chairman shall be the Conciliation Commissioner or the Inspector of Factories for the district. The interpretation adopted by such committee shall be deemed the proper interpretation of the award subject to any ruling of the Court.

*Strikes.*

14. (a.) The union shall do all in its power to prevent any strike by any of the workers affected by this award, and if any strike shall occur in which any members of the union shall take part such strike shall be *prima facie* evidence that the union has committed a breach of its duty hereunder.

(b.) If any strike by any of the workers affected by this award shall occur in which any members of the union shall take part, then the operation of all the provisions contained in the foregoing clauses of this award shall be suspended, and in lieu thereof the following provisions shall come into force, and shall remain in force until the further order of this Court, that is to say—

The hours of work, wages, and other conditions of work of all workers coming within the scope of this award shall be fixed by agreement between the employer and the individual workers employed by him.

(c.) The Court reserves leave to any party bound by this award to apply to this Court for an order under this clause declaring that a strike has taken place, or bringing into force again after a strike has taken place the provisions contained in the foregoing clauses of this award.

TIME STATEMENT.

CLASSIFICATION OF MATERIAL.

The time hereinafter mentioned shall be calculated at the rate of 1s. per hour.

*First Class.*

Superfine cloth, beavers, Venetian, face covert coating, kersey, buckskin, doeskin, satura, llamas, heavy Meltons, dress coatings, velvet, velveteen, velvet cord, Bedford cord, whipcord, dress worsted coatings, corkscrews, heavy pilots, plush, silk, satin, quilting, cassimere, fur, knitted vests, faced hunting vesting, marcella, box-cloth, silk vesting, fancy vesting, and all other faced cloths.

*Second Class.*

Fancy or worsted coatings and worsted suitings, worsted trousering, very light quality Melton (any colour), nap, whitneys, friezes, unfaced covert coatings, silk mixture, vicuna, heavy milled serge, worsted silk mixture, angola, Saxony, fine serge, stockinette, light-quality pilots (any colour), fine hopsack, heavy hopsack, very light quality beaver (any colour), fine bellwarp coatings or serge, heavy bellwarp coatings or serge, camel-hair, sergerettes, alpaca, and lustre. Horse-cloth fancy vestings, Valencia Russell cord, Valencia white drill.

*Third Class.*

Common rough inferior worsted suitings, common rough inferior segerettes, cotton, corduroy, moleskin, drills, ducks, khaki, or jean. Common rough inferior, serges, Harris and homespun tweeds, Bannockburns, tennis or cricket flannel, saddle tweed,\* tweeds and other material not mentioned in the other classes.

NOTE.—Classification of material and all other particulars of the job to be mentioned on a ticket to be handed to the worker with each job.

\* That all saddle-tweeds be third class, except in riding-breeches, which shall be paid second class.

COATS.

Size.

The standard size for coats to be determined as follows: 34 in. to 42 in., the breast-measure over vest to be guide.

Oversize, for each 4 in. or fraction thereof over 42 in. round chest over vest to be time in addition to standard time as follows: Sac coat, 1 hour extra; body coat, 1½ hours extra.

Undersize: Under 34 in. breast over vest to 30 in., 1 hour less in sac coats; in body coats, 1½ hours less; under 30 in. breast over vest, 2 hours less in sac coats, and 3 hours less in body coats.

OVERCOATS.

Size.

Standard Size.—Overcoats, 34 in. to 42 in. round chest over vest, the same as time set out under each kind of overcoat.

Undersize.—Under 34 in. round chest over vest, coverts, Chesterfields, long overcoats, and ulsters, 1 hour less than the standard time; under 32 in., 2 hours less than the standard time. Body overcoats under 34 in. as aforesaid, 1½ hours less than the standard time; body overcoats under 32 in., 3 hours less than the standard time.

Oversize.—Each 4 in. or fraction thereof over 42 in. round chest over vest to be time in addition to the standard time as follows, viz.: In coverts and Chesterfields, extra 1 hour; in long overcoats and ulsters, extra 1½ hours; in all body-fitting overcoats, extra 1½ hours; if overcoats over 44 in. in length, 2 hours extra to any of the foregoing items; and under 34 in., deduct 2 hours.

VESTS.

Size.

Standard Size.—Vest, 34 in. up to 42 in. round chest over vest, the same time as set under "Vests" hereunder mentioned.

Undersize.—Vests under 34 in. round chest over vest, ½ hour less than the standard time. Vests under 30 in. round chest over vest, 1 hour less than the standard time.

Oversize.—Vests over 42 in. round chest over vest, for each 4 in. or fraction thereof, ½ hour extra in addition to the standard time.

TROUSERS.

Size.

Standard Size.—Men's trousers, 42 in. round waist measured, the same time as set out under "Trousers" hereunder mentioned.

Undersize.—Trousers under 28 in. round waist as aforesaid, ½ hour less than the standard. 26 in. and under round waist as aforesaid, 1 hour less than the standard.

Oversize.—For each 4 in. or fraction thereof over 42 in. round waist as aforesaid, ½ hour extra in addition to the standard time.

DRESS COATS.

Planing and marking in shoulders, gorge, side seams, waist, top of back and pleats (or an equivalent amount)—Seaming side seams, waist seams, lapels, side body seams, pleats, pleat pockets—First press; basting in canvas and button stays—Padding lapels and putting on stay-tape—Seaming facings, lapels, and side linings, shoulder-seams—Second press; basting over facing, lining—Felling in all linings, including four waist-tacks—Edges bluff, bound, or stitched—Holes in breast, pressing off breast, buttons on breast, making plain sleeves, one row of stitching, putting in sleeves—Joining coat—Cutting, stitching, and padding collars—Blind vent at hands, not exceeding three buttons—One-ply wadding and stitching round scye, back lined—Cuts in gorge, not exceeding 2 in.—Pressing and covering collar, putting on collar—Putting on hanger—Pressing off.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 646, against 722 in August—a decrease of 76. The deaths in September were 245—a decrease of 17 as compared with last month. Of the total deaths, males contributed 128, females 117. Forty-eight of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 19.59 per cent. of the whole number; 42 of these were under one year of age.

There were 98 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 113 in August. The following table shows the classification:—

*Poverty Bay Bakers and Pastrycooks.—Notice of Recommendation of Conciliation Council.*

MEMORANDUM of agreement made this 13th day of September, 1912, between the Auckland Operative Bakers and Pastrycooks' Industrial Union of Workers (Gisborne Branch) and Clare and Sons and other employers.

RECOMMENDATION.

*Hours of Work.*

1. (a.) The hours of work for bakers and pastrycooks shall not exceed forty-eight in any one week.

(b.) Subject to the special provisions hereinafter contained, the daily hours of work shall be regulated by each employer from time to time according to the requirements of his business, but so that any time worked in excess of nine hours on the first five working-days of the week and ten hours on Saturdays by any worker shall be reckoned and paid for as overtime, whether or not such worker shall have worked forty-eight hours in that week.

(c.) The hour for starting work shall be not earlier than 4 o'clock a.m. except on Saturdays and the day immediately preceding a public holiday, when it may be one hour earlier—namely 3 o'clock a.m. In the event of a double holiday work may commence two hours earlier—namely, 2 o'clock a.m. Where employers have country deliveries or have to forward bread by country coaches, they may start work at 3.30 a.m.

(d.) No workman shall work longer than four hours and a half without a meal, and that half an hour shall be allowed for same.

(e.) Time for sponging and doughing to be deducted from the day's work, not less than one hour to be allowed for same.

*Wages.*

2. (a.) The minimum wages for journeyman bakers and pastrycooks shall be as follows: Foreman, £3 5s. per week; other hands, £2 15s. per week.

(b.) All time lost by a worker through his own default without personal misconduct shall be deducted *pro rata* from his wages for that week.

(c.) All time lost by any worker through his personal misconduct may be deducted from his wages at the rate of time and a quarter.

(d.) A jobber shall be paid at the rate of not less than 10s. per day of eight hours. He shall be paid not less than a half-day's wages in any event. If he is employed for more than four hours he shall be paid not less than 1s. 3d. per hour up to the full day of eight hours, and after that he shall be paid overtime at the rates mentioned in clause 3 hereof.

(e.) When the employer is himself substantially engaged in doing the actual work of a foreman in his own bakehouse he shall be classed as such, and he shall take an equal share of sponging with his men, or if he elects not to do sponging he shall pay the worker who does it for his time. That no man be later in the bakehouse than 8 p.m. for the purpose of sponging.

*Overtime.*

3. (a.) Overtime shall be paid as follows: Foreman at the rate of 2s. per hour; journeyman at the rate of 1s. 6d. per hour, till 10 p.m.; all work to cease between 10 and 12 p.m.

(b.) If any employer shall require any of his workers to start work at an earlier hour than that prescribed in clause 1, subclause (c) hereof, he shall pay such worker overtime at the rate of double time for all time worked between midnight and the hour prescribed for starting work, and such overtime shall be paid notwithstanding a full day's work shall not be worked by the particular worker who is so required to start work at such earlier hour. If a jobber is required to work at an earlier hour than the hours prescribed in clause 1, subclause (c) hereof, he shall be paid double time for any time worked between midnight and such prescribed hours.

*Unskilled Labour.*

4. That no unskilled worker be allowed to assist in the operation of the making and baking of bread.

*Sunday Sparging.*

5. Sunday sparging to cover all statutory and public holidays.

*Holidays.*

6. (a.) Any work done on any of the following holidays shall be paid for at the rate of 3s. per hour in addition to the usual weekly wages: New Year's Day, 2nd January, Show Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Prince of Wales's Birthday, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day. Any work done on Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of 1s. 9d. per hour in addition to the usual weekly wages.

(b.) When any holiday shall be generally observed in any city or town on any day other than that prescribed hereby the provisions of this award shall apply to such substituted holiday in such city or town.

*Rate of Pay for Sunday Work.*

7. Rate of pay for Sunday work to be 3s. per hour in addition to usual wages.

*Payment of Wages.*

8. That all wages shall be paid weekly in the bakehouse on Saturdays, within fifteen minutes of leaving off work.

*Apprentices.*

9. (a.) Any employer taking an apprentice shall be deemed to have undertaken the obligation which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award of teaching such apprentice the trade, and shall pay such apprentice not less than the undermentioned rate of wages: For the first six months, 12s. 6d. per week; second six months, 15s. per week; third six months, 17s. 6d. per week; fourth six months, £1 per week; fifth six months, £1 2s. 6d. per week; sixth six months, £1 5s. per week; seventh six months, £1 7s. 6d. per week; eighth six months, £1 10s. per week; fifth year, £2 per week. Term of apprenticeship, five years.

(b.) Where an apprentice has to board with an employer the sum of 7s. 6d. per week shall be allowed for the first year's board, 10s. per week for the second year's board, 12s. 6d. per week for the third year's board, and 15s. per week for the fourth year and after.

(c.) The period of apprenticeship shall be for five years, but three months' probation shall be allowed the first employer of any apprentice to determine his fitness, such three months to be included in the period of apprenticeship.

(d.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the apprenticeship wish for any reason to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he shall give him a certificate for the time served, and procure him another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, who will continue to teach the apprentice, to pay him the wages prescribed by this award according to the total length of time he has served, and generally to perform the obligation of the original employer: Provided that it shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall give him a certificate covering the time actually served.

(e.) If an employer shall from any cause beyond his control be unable to fulfil his obligation to an apprentice it shall be lawful for such an apprentice to complete his term with another employer,

and such employer may take and employ such apprentice notwithstanding he has the full number of apprentices allowed by this award.

(f.) An employer taking an apprentice shall give notice thereof and the name of the apprentice to the Inspector of Factories within one month after the expiration of the period of probation, and an employer transferring an apprentice to another employer shall similarly, within one week thereof, give notice of such transfer to such Inspector.

(g.) An employer shall not be deemed to discharge his duty towards his apprentice if he fails to keep him at work owing to slackness of work, but such slackness may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

(h.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice of the discharge and the cause thereof to the Inspector of Factories.

(i.) Every employer shall be allowed to have one apprentice whether he employs any journeymen or not. If an employer employs more than two journeymen he shall be allowed two apprentices, but not more than two apprentices shall be allowed in any one bakehouse.

(j.) Existing arrangements with or relating to apprentices now serving under indentures shall not be affected by anything herein contained.

#### *Carters.*

10. A carter shall not be employed in any bakehouse in connection with the manufacture of any goods in the baking trade, but a baker may deliver bread so long as he does not work more than the prescribed hours.

#### *Under-rate Workers.*

11. (a.) Any worker who considers himself incapable of earning the minimum wage fixed by this award may be paid such lower wage as may from time to time be fixed on the application of such worker, after due notice to the union, by the local Inspector of Awards or such other person as the Court may from time to time appoint for that purpose; and such Inspector or person in so fixing such wage shall have regard to the worker's capability, his past earnings, and such other circumstances as such Inspector or person shall think fit to consider after hearing such evidence and argument as the union and such worker shall offer.

(b.) Such permit shall be for such period, not exceeding six months, as such Inspector or person shall determine, and after the expiration of such period shall continue in force until fourteen days' notice shall have been given to such worker by the secretary of the union requiring him to have his wage again fixed in manner prescribed by this clause: Provided that in the case of any person whose wage is so fixed by reason of old age or permanent disability it may be fixed for such longer period as such Inspector or other person shall think fit.

(c.) Notwithstanding the foregoing, it shall be competent for a worker to agree with the president or secretary of the union upon such wage without having the same so fixed.

(d.) It shall be the duty of the union to give notice to the Inspector of Factories of every agreement made with a worker pursuant hereto.

(e.) It shall be the duty of an employer, before employing a worker at such lower wage, to examine the permit or agreement by which such wage is fixed.

#### *Preference.*

12. (a.) Each employer shall have the right to engage any worker he chooses, but if the worker so employed shall not be a member of the union, such worker within two weeks from the date of his engagement shall become and remain a member of the union.

(b.) The provisions of the foregoing clause shall operate only if and so long as the rules of the union shall permit any worker of good character and sober habits to become a member of the union

upon payment of an entrance fee not exceeding 5s., upon a written or verbal application, without ballot or other election, and to continue a member upon payment of subsequent contributions not exceeding 6d. per week.

(c.) The names of all workers so engaged shall be given by the employer to the secretary of the union when asked for by him.

(d.) Nothing herein contained shall prevent the continued employment of workers now in the employment of any employer, although such workers may not be or become members of the union.

*Dispute Committee.*

13. (a.) As soon as practicable after the coming into operation of this award a committee shall be appointed, consisting of two members appointed by the master bakers, two members appointed by the operative bakers, and the Inspector of Awards for the time being in office in the district, who shall act as chairman of the Committee.

(b.) All disputes arising between the workers' union and any employer as to the interpretation of any of the provisions of this award, or the proper classification of any employer or employees of any employer who is a party to this award, shall be referred to the said committee for settlement, and the decision of such committee in each and every case referred to it shall be final and binding on all the parties interested in such dispute.

*Board and Lodging.*

14. Workers may be boarded and lodged on the employer's premises at a rate not exceeding 15s. per week.

*Strikes.*

15. (a.) The union shall do all in its power to prevent any strike by any of the workers affected by this award, and if any strike shall occur in which any members of the union shall take part such strike shall be *prima facie* evidence that the union has committed a breach of its duty hereunder.

(b.) If any strike by any of the workers affected by this award shall occur in which any members of the union shall take part, then the operation of all the provisions contained in the foregoing clauses of this award shall be suspended, and in lieu thereof the following provision shall come into force and shall remain in force until the further order of this Court, that is to say: The hours of work, wages, and other conditions of work of all workers coming within the scope of this award shall be fixed by agreement between the employer and the individual workers employed by him.

(c.) The Court reserves leave to any party bound by this award to apply to this Court for an order under this clause declaring that a strike has taken place, or bringing into force again after a strike has taken place the provisions contained in the foregoing clauses of the award.

*Employment of Females.*

16. No female to be allowed to work at the pastrycook trade other than packing of cakes and cleaning of fruit.

*Scope of Award.*

17. This award shall apply only to employers carrying on business as bakers or pastrycooks in the Poverty Bay portion of the industrial district, which is defined to be all that portion which lies on the south-east side of a line starting at the East Cape and carried along the dividing range until it meets the boundary between the Northern District and the Wellington District.

*Term of Award.*

18. Two years, to commence as from 1st November, 1912.

R E C O M M E N D A T I O N .

1. *Interpretation.*

PLUMBING-WORK shall mean and include ship's plumbing; all sanitary work; gasfitting, hot- and cold-water fitting, hot-water and heating apparatus; fixing of corrugated-iron roofing, spouting, downpipes, gutters, valleys, and flashings, in any metal; drain-pipes and vents to any house or building; and the fixing of pumps and rams.

2. *Hours of Work.*

(a.) The hours of work shall not exceed eight in respect of each working-day except Saturday, and four on Saturday, which shall constitute a week's work of forty-four hours. The working-hours shall be between the hours of 7.45 a.m. and 5 p.m. on each working-day except Saturday, and on Saturday between the hours of 7.45 a.m. and 12 noon. One hour to be allowed each day for dinner (Saturdays excepted).

(b.) In cases of emergency the meal-hour may be altered or curtailed as may be mutually agreed upon by the individual employer and the employee.

(c.) In places where the statutory half-holiday is observed on any other day than Saturday, the worker who takes his half-holiday on such day shall make up such lost time on Saturday afternoon without payment of overtime.

3. *Wages.*

(a.) All journeymen plumbers, gasfitters, tinsplate and sheet-metal workers shall be paid not less than 1s. 4 1/2 d. (one shilling and fourpence halfpenny) per hour. Journeymen at present employed at 1s. 3d. per hour who do not comply with the provisions of clause 1 shall not be affected by this award for one year from date of this award coming into operation. After the expiration of one year such journeymen shall receive 1s. 4 1/2 d. per hour.

(b.) Tinsmiths engaged in retinning shall be paid 3d. per hour extra while actually engaged in retinning.

4. *Payment of Wages.*

All wages shall be paid weekly and at the completion of working-hours.

5. *Overtime.*

All time worked outside the hours prescribed in clause 2 hereof shall be paid for at the following rates: First three hours, time and a quarter; then time and a half till midnight, and thereafter double time until 7.45 a.m.

#### 6. *Holidays.*

(a.) Irrespective of the hours worked on any day, double-time rates shall be paid for work done on Sundays, Good Friday, Christmas Day, and Labour Day. For time worked on New Year's Day, Easter Monday, reigning sovereign's birthday, and Boxing Day time and a half shall be paid.

#### 7. *Notice of Leaving or Dismissal.*

In case of the dismissal (except for misconduct) of any worker or of any worker leaving of his own accord, not less than two hours' notice shall be given on either side. Any moneys due at such time shall be paid within twenty-four hours after the time of any such worker leaving his employer's service.

#### 8. *Tools.*

(a.) Employers shall provide journeymen with soldering-bolts, pipe-fitting tools, metal-pots, plumbing-irons, mandrels, files, and springs. Journeymen to find all other tools required for their work, including pipe-tongs up to 1 in. pipes. Soldering-bolts to be returned in good condition, reasonable wear-and-tear excepted, or to be paid for by the employee.

(b.) The employer shall provide all tinsmiths and sheet-metal workers with all tools required. Such tools to remain the property of the employer, and shall not be taken off the premises except with the permission of the employer.

(c.) When a worker leaves the work he shall return his tools in good order, allowing for ordinary wear-and-tear. In the event of his failing to do so he shall pay his employer the value of such tools.

(d.) Where work is being done elsewhere than at the place of an employer, he shall provide, when necessary, upon the premises where the work is to be done, a properly secured place for the tools of the employer and employee.

#### 9. *Suburban Work.*

(a.) "Suburban work" means work performed by a worker at a distance of over two miles from his employer's place of business, but which does not come within the definition of country work.

(b.) Workers shall be at their employer's place of business at the hour appointed for the commencement of work, but if previously required to do so they shall proceed direct to the place where the work is to be performed, and be there at the time appointed for the commencement of work. And if the distance required to be travelled in order to reach the place be more than two miles from his employer's place of business, they shall be paid at the ordinary rate of wages for the time occupied in proceeding to the work for the excess of such distance, reckoning the time taken at the rate of three miles an hour.

(c.) Any worker employed upon suburban work to reach which a conveyance is required shall be conveyed to and from such work, or his fares paid to and from such work, and he shall also be paid at the ordinary rate for his time while going to such work.

#### 10. *Country Work.*

(a.) "Country work" means work performed by a worker which necessitates his lodging elsewhere than at his usual place of residence.

(b.) A worker employed upon country work shall be conveyed by his employer to and from such work free of charge, or his travelling-expenses paid by the employer going to and returning from such work, but once only during the continuance of the work if the work is continuous and the worker is not recalled by his employer.

(c.) Workers while working at country work shall be paid an additional sum of 3s. per day for six days in the week, but the employer may in lieu thereof provide such workers free of charge suitable board and lodging while so employed.

(d.) Time occupied in travelling shall be paid for at ordinary rates, but no more than an ordinary day's wage shall be paid for any day occupied in travelling, though the hours occupied may exceed eight, unless the journeyman is on the same day engaged in working for his employer.

(e.) An employer may agree with a worker employed on country work that such worker shall work at ordinary rates in excess of the hours prescribed by clause 2 hereof, provided that the hours so worked in excess shall not exceed three in any one day.

(f.) Any worker who shall be called upon to travel to any country work for more than four hours upon a Saturday shall receive an ordinary day's wage. An ordinary day's wage for the purposes of this clause is a working-day of eight hours.

(g.) No apprentice in his first, second, or third year shall be sent to country work unless upon such work he is working under the constant supervision of a journeyman of the trade.

#### 11. *Piecework.*

No piecework or labour-only jobs shall be allowed.

#### 12. *Apprentices.*

(a.) Any youth engaged at the plumbing, gasfitting, tinsplate, or sheet-metal trade shall be an apprentice, and the proportion of apprentices to any employer or firm shall be as follows: Each firm or employer shall be entitled to one apprentice; after that the number of apprentices employed shall not exceed one apprentice to each journeyman. This proportion is to be gauged by full employment of journeymen for full time for the previous six months.

(b.) The period of apprenticeship shall be six years; but three months' probation shall be allowed the first employer of any apprentice to determine his fitness, such three months to be included in the period of apprenticeship. The obligation of the apprentice to serve his employer shall be deemed to be a duty enforceable under this award, and an employer taking an apprentice to learn the trade shall be deemed to undertake the duty to teach him, which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award.

(c.) The minimum rates of pay for apprentices shall be as follows: For the first year, 7s. 6d. per week; second year, 11s. per week; third year, 15s. per week; fourth year, £1 per week; fifth year, £1 7s. 6d. per week; sixth year, £1 15s. per week.

(d.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the apprenticeship, through the slackness of trade or any unforeseen cause, wish to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he shall give him a certificate for the time served, and procure him another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, who will continue to teach the apprentice and generally perform the obligations of the original employer: Provided always that it shall not be competent for any employer to take over more than one such transferred apprentice over and above the number prescribed in section (a) of this clause.

(e.) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, it shall not be obligatory upon an employer to find an apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle his employer to discharge him, but he shall give him a certificate covering the time actually served.

(f.) All time lost by an apprentice either through his own default or through sickness in any year of his apprenticeship shall be made up before such an apprentice shall be considered as having entered upon the next succeeding year of his apprenticeship.

(g.) Any youth who has served part of his apprenticeship to the trade in any part of the Empire, or in any part of the Dominion outside the scope of this award, may enter into a legal agreement with any employer within the district to which this award relates to finish the term of six years, upon production of a certificate from his former employer showing the time served by him: Provided always that all other sections of this clause are observed.

(h.) An employer taking an apprentice shall give notice thereof, and of the name of the apprentice, to the Inspector of Factories within one week after the expiration of the period of probation; such notice shall be in writing bearing the signature of the apprentice and the employer, and an employer transferring an apprentice to another employer shall similarly within one week thereof give notice of such transfer to the Inspector of Factories.

(i.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice of the discharge and the cause thereof in writing to the Inspector of Factories.

(j.) Existing arrangements with or relating to apprentices now serving any employer may continue, provided that any employer wishing such arrangements to continue shall forward the names of

his present apprentices to the Inspector of Factories within one month after the filing of this award.

### 13. *Under-rate Workers.*

(a.) Any journeyman plumber, gasfitter, tinsplate or sheet-metal worker who considers himself incapable of earning the minimum wage may be paid such lower wage as may from time to time be fixed, on the application of such worker after due notice to the union, by the local Inspector of Awards, or such other person as the Court may from time to time appoint for that purpose; and such Inspector or other person in so fixing such wage shall have regard to the worker's capability, his past earnings, and such other circumstances as such Inspector or other person shall think fit to consider, after hearing such evidence and argument as the union and such worker shall offer.

(b.) Such permit shall be for such period not exceeding six months as such Inspector or other person shall determine, and after the expiration of such period shall continue in force until fourteen days' notice shall have been given to such worker by the secretary of the union requiring him to have his wage again fixed in manner prescribed by this clause: Provided that in the case of any person whose wage is so fixed by reason of old age or permanent disability it may be fixed for such longer period as such Inspector or other person shall think fit.

(c.) Notwithstanding the foregoing, it shall be competent for a worker to agree with the president or secretary of the union upon such wage without having the same so fixed.

(d.) It shall be the duty of the union to give notice to the Inspector of Factories of every agreement made with a worker pursuant hereto.

(e.) It shall be the duty of an employer before employing such worker at such lower wage to examine the permit or agreement by which such wage is fixed.

### 14. *Bicycles.*

Any worker and employer may agree that the worker shall use his bicycle in proceeding to and from any suburban or country work, and the worker shall, if he so uses his bicycle at the rate of eight miles per hour, receive 1d. for every mile or fraction thereof so traversed in excess of two miles. This sum shall be payable in addition to the rate of wages payable under this award.

### 15. *Preference.*

It shall be the duty of every employer when employing a journeyman to ascertain if he is a member of the union, and if he is not a member of the union the employer shall notify the secretary of the union accordingly within fourteen days as from the date of employing such journeyman. It shall be the duty of every non-unionist so employed to join the union within one week after receiving from the secretary of the union a request in writing to do so. Compliance by the employer with the provisions of this clause shall relieve him from all liability under the provisions of this award relating to preference.

### 16. *Scope of Award.*

This award shall apply to all employers carrying on business in the Taranaki Industrial District.

### 17. *Exemption.*

This award shall not apply to workers in laying or repairing gas-mains.

### 18. *Term of Award.*

This award shall come into force on the [Date to be fixed], and shall continue in force until the 6th day of April, 1915; but so that if during the said term a Dominion award shall be made in relation to the plumbing trade, then such award shall supersede this award, which shall thereupon cease to have any force or effect.
