And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto was reserved for railway purposes: And whereas such land is now no longer required for railway purposes, and it is desirable to declare the said land to be Crown land: And whereas a plan has been prepared, and the Minister has recommended the Governor to declare such land to be Crown

(3.) Any consumption in the family.

(4.) The occupation of the father or mother, or both.

- (5.) As to whether the pupil works before or after school hours; and, if so, at what occupation.
- 3. (a.) Any such male teacher may make such medical or physical examination as that hereinbefore prescribed in respect of any boys in the school.
- (b.) Any such female teacher may make such medical or physical examination in respect of any girls in the school, or in respect of any boys who are under ten years of age.
