Further Proroguing the General Assembly.

To the LEGISLATIVE COUNCILLORS of the Dominion of NEW ZEALAND, and the MEMBERS elected to serve in the HOUSE of REPRESENTATIVES of the said Dominion, summoned and called to a Meeting of the General Assembly of the said Dominion, at the City of Wellington, on the twelfth day of the month of December, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, to have been commenced and held, and to every of you: GREETING.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS on the eighth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, the General Assembly of New Zealand was prorogued to the twelfth day of the month of December, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, at which time you were held constrained to appear: Now know YE that for divers causes and considerations I have thought fit to relieve you and each of you of your attendance at the time aforesaid, hereby convoking and by these presents enjoining you and each of you that on Thursday, the sixteenth day of January next, you meet in Parliament, at the City of Wellington, there to take into consideration the state and welfare of the said Dominion of New Zealand, and therein to do as may seem necessary.

(L.S.) Given under the hand of His Excellency the Honourable Sir Robert Stout, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice, Administrator of the Government in and over His Majesty's Dominion of New Zealand and its Dependencies; and issued under the Seal of the said Dominion, at the Government House, at Wellington, this eleventh day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twelve.
