Dividing City of Dunedin into Wards and fixing Representation.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Borough of Roslyn and the City of Dunedin were, by Proclamation dated the thirtieth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, declared to be a united borough by the name of the City of Dunedin: And whereas it is desired that the said city be divided into wards:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, do hereby divide the said City of Dunedin into five wards, with the names and boundaries set forth in the Schedule hereto; and do hereby proclaim and declare that at the general election of Councillors to be held on the last Wednesday in April, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and at subsequent general elections, five members shall be elected for the Caversham Ward, three members for the Central Ward, five members for the Leith Ward, two members for the Valley Ward, and two members for the Roslyn Ward.

SCHEDULE.

CAVERSHAM WARD.

ALL that area in the City of Dunedin bounded towards the north-west generally by the Borough of Mornington as described in the First Schedule to the Borough of Mornington Boundaries Act, 1886, from its south-west corner to where the main South Road intersects the Dunedin Town Belt, by that boundary to Park Street, and thence across and along the southern side of Park Street and its production to the boundary of the City of Dunedin as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 81, of the 31st October, 1912, page 3121;

thence towards the north-east generally and towards the south-east by the north-eastern and south-eastern boundary-lines of the said city to the Borough of St. Kilda; thence again towards the south-east generally by that borough and its south-western boundary produced to the ocean, and by the ocean to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section No. 32, Ocean Beach Survey District; and thence towards the south-west by the boundary of the City of Dunedin as described in the *Gazette* aforesaid to the place of commencement.

CENTRAL WARD.

All that area in the City of Dunedin bounded towards the north-east by a line (commencing at a point on the north-west boundary of the Town Belt) in line with the middle of Rattray Street, and produced to the intersection of that street with the middle of York Place; thence along the middle of York Place and Stuart Street and its production to the boundary of the City of Dunedin as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 81, of the 31st October, 1912, page 3121; thence towards the south-east by that boundary and the Caversham Ward hereinbefore described to the middle of the main South Road; thence towards the south-west by the Borough of Mornington as described in the First Schedule of the Borough of Mornington Boundaries Act, 1886; and thence towards the north-west by the said borough to the south-east corner of Section No. 87, Block VI, Town Survey District, and thence by that block and Block IV, Upper Kaikorai Survey District, to the place of commencement.

LEITH WARD.

All that area in the City of Dunedin bounded towards the north-east by Pine Hill Terrace from the Borough of Maori Hill to Section No. 51, Block IX, North Harbour and Blue-skin Survey District; thence towards the south-east by that section and by the south-eastern boundary of the City of Dunedin as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 81, of the 31st October, 1912, page 3121, to the Central Ward hereinbefore described; thence towards the south-west by that

VALLEY WARD.

All that area in the City of Dunedin bounded towards the north-west, north-east, and south-east by the north-western, north-eastern, and south-eastern boundary-lines of the City of Dunedin as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 81, of the 31st October, 1912, page 3121, from the junction of Maori Hill Borough with Pine Hill Terrace to the Leith Ward hereinbefore described, and towards the south-west generally by that ward to the place of commencement.

ROSLYN WARD.

All that area in the City of Dunedin bounded towards the north-west and towards the north-east by the north-western and north-eastern boundaries of the City of Dunedin as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 81, of the 31st October, 1912, page 3121, from its westernmost corner to the Leith Ward hereinbefore described; thence towards the south-east by that ward and Central Ward, hereinbefore described, to the south-east corner of Section No. 87, Block VI, Town Survey District; and thence towards the south-west generally by south-western boundary-lines of the City of Dunedin aforesaid to the place of commencement.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, respectively, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 16, of the second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and No. 60, of the fourth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, respectively, regulations were made for the election of members of Harbour Boards:

And whereas it is desirable to vary the said regulations in the manner hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by section thirteen of the Harbours Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulation varying the hereinbefore-recited regulations.

REGULATION.

NOTWITHSTANDING anything to the contrary in the hereinbefore-recited regulations, the list of the payers of harbour dues on ships shall, in the case of the Lyttelton Harbour Board for the year 1913, be compiled on or before the 12th day of March, 1913, and shall be open for inspection during office hours on each day from that date until the 19th day of that month, and a special meeting of the Harbour Board shall be held on a day subsequent to the said 19th day of March, 1913, and prior to the 1st day of April following, to adjudicate upon all objections to, or applications for enrolment upon, the said list.

Amending Regulations under the Fisheries Act, 1908, as to Size of Blue Cod.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the fifth day of March and the nineteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, respectively, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 24 of the fourteenth day of March, and No. 40 of the second day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, respectively, regulations were made prescribing the minimum weight at which blue cod may be taken, bought, sold, exposed for sale, or kept in possession :

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said regulations and to make other regulations in lieu thereof :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section five of the Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the hereinbefore-recited regulations, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof.

REGULATIONS.

(1.) No person shall take, buy, sell, expose for sale, or have in possession any blue cod of a less length than 10½ in. in the natural state, or of a less length than 9 in. when properly headed—that is, the head cut off at the back of the eyes.

(2.) Any person committing a breach of the foregoing regulation shall be liable to a fine of not less than £1 nor more than £20.

6. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulation made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. 5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
6. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

Consenting to the Assignment of a Lease under Section 311 of the Native Land Act, 1909.

WHEREAS by section 311 of the Native Land Act, 1909, it is enacted that,—

1. Except with the precedent consent of the Board, no lease or sublease of land leased by the Board under this Part of this Act or under Part II of the Native Land Settlement Act, 1907, shall be capable of being assigned to any other person; nor, except with the precedent consent of the Board, shall any sublease of any land so demised, or any part thereof, be capable of being granted to any other person:

2. Except with the approval of the Native Minister, the consent of the Board shall not be so given to any assignment or sublease in favour of a European:

3. Nothing in this section applies to any disposition by will or by operation of law:

The following are condensed reports of enumerators on the prospects of yields of crops in the various districts:—

- Auckland.*—Conditions generally unsatisfactory, and crops backward. Potato crop promises to be fair and free from blight.
- Hawke's Bay.*—Season favourable, and grain crops probably heavier than last year. Root crops suffering from dry weather.
- Taranaki.*—Early grain crops are doing well, but late sown are generally light and include many failures. Rye-grass and cocksfoot are expected to be good, as also are root crops.
- Wellington.*—Grain crops are doing very well.

Marlborough and Nelson.—The prospects for grain crops are good, but root crops are suffering from dry weather. Potatoes promise to be very fair.

Canterbury.—Wheat is doing better than oats, and cocksfoot is expected to be well over the average. Potatoes, which for some time were looking only moderately well, are improving.

Otago.—On the whole corn crops are light; potatoes and turnips only medium.

Southland.—Yields of wheat, oats, and rye-grass will be considerably less than last year, while potatoes, turnips, and mangolds will probably be much better.

Estimated Total Yields.—According to the returns furnished the total estimated yield of the principal crops will be approximately as given below. It should be remembered that the estimate is based on a collection of returns by post. All forms posted to farmers were not returned; the percentage of returns received out of the forms issued varying from 76.1 in Auckland to 99.5 in Canterbury, and averaging 86.61 per cent. over the whole Dominion.

Tuition in the Working of Mechanical Office Appliances.

There will also be a classification for exceptionally skilled operators capable of passing a further examination to be prescribed, who will be placed in Grade I (General Division), with salaries ranging from £140 to £160 per annum, and eventually there may be a number of operators selected from that grade to act as "Machinists in Charge," with salaries from £170 to £200.

An applicant's failure to pass the prescribed examination will not necessarily affect the continuity of her employment in the Public Service. No appointment to the grade of machinist shall be made to any who fail in the examination, and, in the case of those who pass, no increment will be paid until they have taken up duty in that grade.

Opportunity will be afforded applicants of learning the uses of the various machines at times outside of their ordinary hours.
