WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, natoric interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently to the said land s

and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize and license the Board to erect, construct, lay down, and maintain electric lines for lighting and power purposes within the Noarnawahia Town District, such electric lines within the Ngaruawahia Town District, such electric lines being indicated by red lines on the plan marked P.W.D.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS.

1. In the following conditions,—
"Consumer's wires" means any electric line on a consumer's premises which is connected with the service lines of the Board.
"Inspecting Engineer" means the Engineer or other officer appointed by the Minister for the purpose of inspecting the works to be constructed or maintained by the

Pressure" means the difference of electrical potential Pressure means the difference of electrical potential po

"Minister" means the Minister of Public Works.
"Telegraph" includes telephone.
Any metallic body to be "efficiently connected with earth" shall be connected with the general mass of the earth in such manner as will ensure at all times an immediate and safe discharge of electrical energy.

2. The supply of electrical energy shall be given to private consumers by means of direct current on the three-wire system at a pressure of 230 volts effective between each of the outer wires and the neutral and 460 volts between each of the outer wires and the neutral and 460 volts be-tween the two outer wires. The declared voltage at the consumers' terminals shall be 230 and 460 volts respectively.

3. The neutral wire shall be efficiently insulated throughout its length, and shall be earthed only at the power-station. The earth connection shall be provided with a switch for cutting off the earth connection for testing, and with a recording ammeter reading to a maximum of 5 amperes.

4. The main switchboard shall be made of and be

mounted on material that is not inflammable.

mounted on material that is not inflammable.

5. Except where otherwise provided, the overhead conductors may be of bare hard-drawn copper or aluminium wire. If at any time it is found detrimental to the public safety to have these wires bare, the Minister may require the Board to have them insulated, and they shall thereupon be insulated accordingly. No electric-light wire shall come within 3 ft. of any other class of aerial wires or of cables, except where it may be permitted to pass the electric-light wires through such other wires or cables at a pole.

6. Where lead-covered telephone cables or any open telegraph or other aerial wires are crossed above or beneath by the electric-light wires, the latter wires shall be insulated with not less than 600-megohms-per-mile grade of vulcanized rubber throughout the crossing-span, and over every such span they shall be suitably suspended from effectively earthed steel bearer-wires if the Minister of Telegraphs shall so require.

effectively earthed steel bearer-wires if the Minister of Telegraphs shall so require.
7. In places where it may be required to cross with the electric-light wires through any other aerial wires or through cables, all such through crossings, if permitted, shall be effected at a pole. In every case of a through crossing, no matter whose property the lines crossed through may be, the method of carrying the electric-light wires across the pole, protecting them thereon, preventing other wires from coming into contact with them, and protecting persons working on the poles from danger of shock, shall be to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs. Where the insulated wires cross through on the

shock, shall be to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs. Where the insulated wires cross through on the pole they shall be encased in a protecting tube for the entire length of the arms on such pole. If metal pipe is used to encase the wires it shall be effectively earthed.

8. Efficient guard-wires shall, if so required by the Minister of Telegraphs or the Minister, be erected in a manner to meet with the approval of either one Minister or the other, or both, as the case may require, at all crossings and places where the electric-light wires intersect telegraph or other wires. The Board shall bear the expense of such guard-wires in all cases where an electric-light wire intersects a telegraph or other wire previously light wire intersects a telegraph or other wire previously

existing.

9. In running the lines authorized by this license through streets where no telegraph lines exist, the Board shall keep to one side of the street; and in running service wires to the opposite side of the street, the Board shall arrange so as to interfere as little as possible with the route of any future telegraph line.

any future telegraph line.

10. Except by permission of the Minister, all overhead electric-light pole lines shall be placed on the opposite side of the streets to that on which any telegraph-pole lines exist; and where the erection of the electric-light wires necessitates the alteration of any existing telegraph wires, and such alteration is approved by the Minister of Telegraphs, the expense of the alteration shall be borne by the

11. Where the electric-light wires are on one side of a 11. Where the electric-light wires are on one side of a street and the telegraph wires are on the other, and service is required to be given from either to the other side of the street, the Board and the Minister of Telegraphs shall give to each other reasonable facilities as far as possible to effect supply.

12. Every main shall be tested for insulation after having been placed in position and before it is used for the purposes of supply, the testing pressure being at least 500 volts, and the Board shall duly record the results of the tests of each main or section of a main, and forthwith forward a report thereof to the District Engineer of Public Works at Auckland.

13. The insulation of every complete circuit used for the

13. The insulation of every complete circuit used for the supply of energy, including all machinery, apparatus, and devices forming part of or in connection with such circuit, shall be so maintained that the leakage current shall not shall be so maintained that the leakage current shall not under any conditions exceed one-thousandth part of the maximum supply current. Every leakage shall be remedied without delay. Every such circuit shall be tested for insulation at least once in every week, and the Board shall duly record the results of the tests, and forward a report thereof at the end of each week to the District Engineer of Public Works at Auckland.

14. The sectional area of the conductor in any electric line other than service wires or connections to street lamps laid or erected in any street shall not be less than 7/18 standard wire gauge. Service wires and connections to street lamps shall not be less than No. 12 standard wire gauge if solid, or 7/20 standard wire gauge if stranded.

15. All metal pipes or coverings containing any electric wire shall be efficiently connected with earth, and shall be so jointed as to make good electrical connection throughout their whole length.

16. Arc lamps used in any street for public lighting shall be so fixed as not to be in any part at a less height than 10 ft. from the ground.

16. Arc lamps used in any street for public lighting shall be so fixed as not to be in any part at a less height than 10 ft. from the ground.

All arc lamps shall be so guarded as to prevent pieces of ignited carbon or broken glass falling from them, and shall not be used in situations where there is any danger of the presence of explosive dust or gas.

17. The variation of pressure at any consumer's terminals shall not exceed 4 per cent. above or below the normal pressure at which he is being supplied.

18. Every support for an aerial line shall be of durable material and properly strengthened against forces due to wind-pressure, change of direction of line, and unequal length of span. The factor of safety of such supports shall be at least four if of iron, steel, or reinforced concrete, and six if of wood, taking into consideration all possible stresses, including wind-pressure at 30 lb. per square foot on plane surfaces and 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane for cylindrical surfaces. The stress in the aerial conductors shall not exceed 28,000 lb. per square inch for copper and 15,000 lb. per square inch for aluminium in the extreme case of a temperature of 12° Fahr. and a wind-pressure of 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane occurring simultaneously.

19. Earth-wires, where led down poles, shall be protected by casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground.

20. All aerial wires shall be attached to suitable insulators carried on cross-arms of suitable material and cross-section, and they shall be so attached to the insulators or guarded that they cannot fall away from the support. Conductors covered with insulating material shall be so attached that their insulation will not be impaired where they are secured to the insulator.

21. Any aerial wire shall not in any part thereof be at a less height from the ground than 18 ft., or within 5 ft. measured horizontally or vertically from any part of any building or erection other than a support for the line, except where brought into a building for the purpose of supply. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government railways until the Board has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto, as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2). 1910 (No. 2).

22. Service lines from aerial lines shall be led as directly

22. Service lines from aerial lines shall be led as directly as possible to insulators firmly attached to some portion of the consumer's premises which is not accessible to any person without the use of a ladder or other special appliance. Every portion of any service line which is outside a building, and is within 7 ft. from any part of the building, shall be rubber-insulated.

23. Where an aerial line crosses a street, the angle between the line and the direction of the street at the place of crossing shall not be less than 60 degrees, and the spans shall be as short as possible. The minimum height of the line shall be 20 ft. above the street level.

24. Where an aerial line crosses or is in proximity to any metallic substance, precautions shall be taken against the possibility of the line coming into contact with the metallic substance, or of the metallic substance coming into contact with the line by breakage or otherwise.

25. Every aerial line, including its supports, its conductors, and their insulating covering, and all the structural parts and electrical appliances and devices belonging to or connected with the line, shall be duly and efficiently maintained as regards both electrical and mechanical

maintained as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions.

26. An aerial line shall not be permitted to remain erected after it has ceased to be used for the supply of energy, unless the Board intends within a reasonable time again to take it into use.

27. Where any portion of any electric line or any support for an electric line is exposed in such a position as to be liable to cause injury from lightning, it shall be efficiently protected against such liability.

28. The Board shall be responsible for all electric lines or wires, fittings, and apparatus belonging to it, or under its control, which may be upon a consumer's premises, being maintained in a safe condition and in all respects fit for supplying energy.

29. In delivering the energy to a consumer's terminals the Board shall exercise all due precautions so as to avoid risk of causing fire on the premises.

30. A suitable safety-fuse or other automatic circuit-breaker shall be inserted in each service line within a consumer's premises as close as possible to the point of entry, and contained within a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fireproof construction.

31. All electric wires placed on a consumer's premises shall be insulated with rubber of 600-megohm grade, and shall be thoroughly protected against injury to the insulation or access of moisture. All electric wires shall be so fixed and protected as to prevent the possibility of electrical discharge to any adjacent metallic substance.

32. The Board shall not connect the wires and fittings en a consumer's premises with its mains, or, in the case of premises already connected, continue the supply from its mains, unless it is reasonably satisfied that the requirements of this license are complied with, that the wiring and fittings are suitable for the voltage at which supply is being given, that the installation generally is in accordance with the requirements of good practice, and that the connection or continuance of supply would not cause a leakage from those wires and fittings exce

leakage from those wires and fittings exceeding one tenthousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises.

For the purpose of satisfying itself that the requirements of this license are being observed in so far as they apply to wires on a consumer's premises, the Board may require that notice be served upon it of the intention to instal wires, fittings, lamps, motors, or other apparatus on any premises, and may inspect the same during any reasonable hours while the installation of such is in progress.

33. If the Board is reasonably satisfied, after making all proper examination by testing or otherwise, that the wiring and fittings are not suitable for the voltage being employed, that a leakage exists at some part of a circuit of such extent as to be a source of danger, and that such leakage does not exist at any part of the circuit belonging to the Board, or that any other requirements of this license are not being complied with, then and in such case any officer of the Board, duly authorized by it in writing, may, for the purpose of discovering whether the leakage exists at any part of a circuit within or upon any consumer's premises, or whether the wiring is suitable and the general requirements of the license are complied with, by notice require the consumer, at some reasonable time after the service of the notice, to permit him to inspect and to test the wires and fittings belonging to the consumer and forming part of the circuit.

If on such testing and inspection the officer discovers a leakage from the consumer's wires exceeding one tenthousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises, or that the requirements of this license are not properly conformed to, or if the consumer does not give all due facilities for inspection and testing, the Board shall either not commence the supply or shall forthwith discontinue the supply of energy to the premises in question, giving immediate notice to the consumer of its reasons for not commencing or for discontinuing the supply, and in either

34. If any consumer is dissatisfied with the action of the Board in refusing to give, or in discontinuing, or in not recommencing the supply of energy to his premises, the wires and fittings of that consumer may, on his application to the Minister, and on payment of the cost, be inspected and tested by the Inspecting Engineer.

This provision shall be indorsed on every notice given under the provisions of either of the two last preceding clauses.

35. The Board shall, upon receipt of an application from the occupier of any premises within 60 ft. of any of the

Board's public-supply electric lines, furnish such premises with electrical energy upon the same terms and conditions on which any other consumer is entitled under similar circumwhich any other consumer is entitled under similar circumstances to a corresponding supply, provided that the Board's plant is of sufficient power to supply the electrical energy required by such occupier as well as the requirements of other consumers.

36. The Board shall, before the erection or construction of any part of the work hereby authorized is begun, submit or any part of the work hereby authorized is begun, submit for the approval of the Minister such plans and other infor-mation showing and describing such work as he may require. In the event of the Board at any time desiring to make alterations to the work involving a departure from the type of construction shown on the approved plans, it shall submit for the Minister's approval plans showing such type of con-struction as it is proposed to adopt, and with such approval the alterations may be carried out.

37. From and after the time when the Board commences to supply energy in pursuance of this license, it shall maintain continuously sufficient power for the use of all the consumers for the time being entitled to be supplied: Provided that, for any purposes connected with the efficient working of the undertaking, the Minister may give permission to the Board to discontinue the supply at such intervals of time and for such periods as he may think expedient. When the supply is so discontinued, public notice shall be given, when practicable, of such discontinuance, and of the probable duration thereof.

38. The Minister may at any time order an inspection to be made of the works, lines, and wires of the Board used for electric lighting and power purposes. If any defect is found to exist it must be remedied forthwith, and if in the opinion of the officer or person inspecting such default is serious, the Minister may, on receipt of the report, direct the Board to at once cease transmitting energy either over the whole of the Board's line and wires, or over any specified part thereof, until such defect is repaired or remedied. The cost of such inspection shall be borne by the Board.

39. After the supply of energy has begun, notice shall be given to the District Engineer of Public Works, Auckland, and to the Postmaster at Ngaruawahia, of each further proposed extension or alteration of lines or wires in pursuance of this license.

The recovery of a penalty under this license shall not affect the liability (if any) of the Board to pay or make compensation in respect of any damage or injury which may be caused by reason of the default.

45. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the Board fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

46. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the Board, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the same.

47. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban poroughs amounted to 577, against 560 in February—an increase of 17. The deaths in March were 268—an increase of 12 as compared with last month. Of the total deaths, males contributed 136, females 132. Sixty-nine of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 25.71 per cent. of the whole number; 56 of these were under one year of age.

There were 73 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 74 in February. The following table shows the classification:—

Otago and Southland Farriers.—Recommendation of Conciliation Council.

In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an industrial dispute between the Dunedin and Suburban Farriers' Industrial Union of Workers, applicant, and A. Alexander and others, respondents.

THE following recommendation of the Conciliation Council appointed to hear the above dispute is published pursuant to subsection (4) of section 43 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act, 1908, and number 34 of the regulations thereunder.

Dated at Dunedin this 1st day of April, 1913.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

Hours of Work.

1. The ordinary week's work shall not exceed forty-four hours. Not more than eight hours ordinary time, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m., shall be worked on five days of the week, and not more than four hours on Saturday, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 12 noon, or on any other day usually observed in any district as the weekly half-holiday.

Wages.

2. The wages of farriers shall be 1s. 5d. per hour, and floormen 1s. 2d. per hour.

Overtime.

3. That all time worked beyond the hours mentioned in clause 1 on any one day shall be overtime, and shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for the first hour, for the next two hours shall be paid time and a half, after which double time shall be paid up to 7 a.m.

Holidays.

4. The following days shall be observed as holidays: Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, 2nd January, Good Friday,

Easter Monday, Labour Day, the birthday of the reigning Sovereign, and Dunedin Cup Day from noon. When any holiday shall be generally observed on another day than that prescribed hereby, the provisions of this award shall apply to such substituted holiday. Dunedin Cup Day only to apply to a radius of fifteen miles from the Dunedin Post-office. Any work done on these holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

Apprentices.

5. (a.) Any employer taking an apprentice to learn the trade shall be bound to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall pay such apprentice not less than the undermentioned rates of wages, namely: For the first year, 10s. per week; for the second year, 17s. 6d. per week; for the third year, £1 2s. 6d. per week; for the fourth year, £1 10s. per week; for the fifth year, £1 17s. 6d. per week.

(b.) The period of apprenticeship shall be five years, but three months' probation shall be allowed the first employer of any apprentice to determine his fitness, such three months to be included in the period of apprenticeship, and the obligation of the apprentice to serve his employer shall be deemed to be a duty enforce-

able under this award.

(c.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the apprenticeship wish, for any reason, to dispense with the service of the apprentice he shall give him a certificate for the time he has served, and procure him another employer, carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, who shall continue to teach the apprentice, pay him the wages prescribed by this award according to the total length of time he has served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.

(d.) An employer taking an apprentice shall give notice thereof and the name of the apprentice to the Inspector of Factories within one week after the expiration of the period of probation, and an employer transferring an apprentice to another employer shall similarly, within one week thereof, give notice of such transfer to

such Inspector.

(e.) The proportion of apprentices shall be one to each shop, and an additional apprentice to every two tradesmen after the first two. When an apprentice has served five years and is given a fire, an additional apprentice may be taken on.

Piecework.

6. Piecework shall not be allowed, except shoe-turning, which shall be paid 2s. 6d. a dozen for any shoes up to 14 in., and 3s. a dozen for shoes over 14 in.

Preference Clause.

7. (a.) If any employer shall hereafter engage any worker who shall not be a member of the union, and who within two weeks after his engagement shall not become and remain a member of the union, the employer shall dismiss such worker from his service if requested to do so by the union, provided there is then a member of the union qualified to perform the particular work required to be done and ready and willing to undertake the same.

(b.) Whenever an employer shall employ any worker who is not a member of the union, he shall, within twenty-four hours thereafter, give notice in writing of such employment to the secretary

of the union.

(c.) Whenever an employer shall shorten hands, preference of employment shall be given to members of the union.

Mixed Occupations.

8. Any person having mixed occupations—say, as firemen and floormen—shall receive the higher rate of pay.

Scope of Award.

9. The award shall extend over Otago and Southland.

Term of Award.

10. The award shall come into force from the 1st April, 1913, and shall continue in force until the 1st April, 1915.

Otago Metal-workers' Assistants.—Recommendation of Conciliation Council.

(Otago and Southland Industrial District.)

In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an industrial dispute between the Otago Metal-workers' Assistants' Industrial Union of Workers, applicants, and Anderson and Co. and others, respondents.

THE following recommendation of the Conciliation Council appointed to hear the above dispute is published pursuant to subsection (4) of section 43 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act, 1908, and number 34 of the regulations thereunder.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

Hours of Work.

1. Eight hours to be a standard day's work on five days, and on Saturday four hours; but the different shops can arrange to work a fraction of an hour each day to make up for the Saturday half-holiday, for which fraction no overtime shall be charged.

Night-workers.

2. The hours for night-workers to be arranged in each establishment, one hour to be allowed each night for meals when two shifts are worked; when three shifts are worked, meal-time as may be found practicable.

Minimum Rate of Wages.

3. The following shall be the minimum rate of wages: Labourers, 1s. $0\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour; strikers, 1s. $0\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour; yardmen, 1s. $0\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour; machinists, 1s. $1\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour.

4. All labourers working on ship or marine-boiler repair work to be paid at the rate of 1s. $2\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour, while on the job either

on board or in the shop.

5. All furnacemen working cupola and annealing furnaces shall be paid at the rate of Is. 2\frac{1}{4}d. per hour. This rate shall be paid to an annealing-furnace man during such times as he is employed firing up.

firing up.
6. The wages of boys and youths shall be as follows: Under fifteen years of age, 10s. per week; fifteen to sixteen, 15s. per week; sixteen to seventeen, £1 per week; seventeen to eighteen, £1 5s. per week; eighteen to nineteen, £1 10s. per week; nineteen to twenty, £1 15s. per week; after that, the minimum rate of wages.

Boilermakers' Award.

7. It shall be a sufficient compliance with the provisions of clause 10 of the award made by the Court in the matter of a dispute between the United Boilermakers and Iron-ship Builders' Union of Workers and the employers therein mentioned if the machinists engaged as workmen under such award are members of the Otago Metal-workers' Assistants' Union.

Overtime and Holidays.

8. (a.) All time worked in excess of the time mentioned in clause 1 hereof in any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours, and thereafter at the rate of time and a half.

rate of time and a half.

(b.) Work done on New Year's Day, Easter Monday, or the King's Righthay shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half

King's Birthday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(c.) Work done on Sunday, Good Friday, Labour Day, or Christmas Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

Under-rate Workers.

9. (a.) Any worker who considers himself incapable of earning the minimum wage fixed by this award may be paid such lower wage as may from time to time be fixed, on the application of the worker, after forty-eight hours' notice given to the union, by the

local Inspector of Awards, or such other person as the Court may from time to time appoint for that purpose; and such Inspector or person, in so fixing such wage, shall have regard to the worker's capability, his past earnings, and such other circumstances as such Inspector or person may think fit to consider, after hearing such evidence and argument as the union and worker shall offer.

(b.) Whenever occasion arises for so fixing the worker's wage, it shall be fixed for such period, not exceeding six months, as such Inspector or other person shall determine, and, after the expiration of such period, until fourteen days' notice shall have been given to him by the secretary of the union requiring him to have his wage again fixed in manner prescribed by this clause; provided that in the case of any person whose rate is so fixed by reason of old age or permanent disability, it may be fixed for such longer period as such Inspector or other person shall think fit.

longer period as such Inspector or other person shall think fit.

(c.) Notwithstanding the foregoing, it shall be competent for a worker to agree in writing with the president or secretary of the

union upon such wage without having the same so fixed.

(d.) It shall be the duty of the union to give notice to the Inspector of Awards of every agreement made with a worker pursuant hereto.

(e.) It shall be the duty of an employer before employing a worker at such lower wage to examine a permit or agreement by which such wage is fixed.

Travelling-expenses to Country Work.

10. (a.) Fare to be paid both ways, also living-expenses while on job. Time shall count from time of leaving the shop till return, but no more than eight hours to be paid for travelling on any one day.

(b.) All men sent from Port Chalmers to Dunedin, or from Dunedin to Port Chalmers, shall have their fares paid, meals pro-

vided, and allowed 1s. per day for travelling-time.

Preference of Employment.

11. In the engagement of his workers the employer shall have the right to engage any worker he chooses, provided that within one week from the date of his engagement the worker shall become a member of the union.

No Discrimination.

12. The employers in employing labour shall not discriminate against members of the union, and shall not in the engagement or dismissal of their hands, or in the conduct of their business, do anything for the purpose of injuring the said union, whether directly or indirectly.

Matters not provided for.

13. Matters not provided for in this award, or any dispute that may arise in connection with the same, shall be settled between the particular employer concerned and the secretary or president of the union; and, in default of any agreement being arrived at, then such matter shall be referred to the Inspector of Factories for decision. Either party, if dissatisfied with such decision, may appeal to the Court, upon giving written notice of such appeal to the other party within seven days after such decision shall have been communicated to the party desiring to appeal.

Provision as to Country Work.

14. The provisions of clause 10 shall not apply to any work done in connection with contracts entered into before the hearing of this dispute and incompleted; but an employer shall not be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he shall, within twenty-eight (28) days from the date on which this award is filed, give to the Inspector of Awards in Dunedin notice in writing of the contracts in respect of which he claims exemption, stating the date of such contracts, the name of the person or body with whom the same has been made, and the nature of the work and where the same is to be performed.

Term of Award.

15. The award shall come into force on the 14th April, 1913, and remain in force until the 14th April, 1914.

POR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of seven and sixteen is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of six, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted :-

- Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
- Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
