WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a scenic reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

*Authorizing the Ngaruawahia Town Board to erect Electric Lines within the Ngaruawahia Town District.*

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act :

And whereas the Ngaruawahia Town Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") desires to erect electric lines for lighting and power purposes, and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize and license the Board to erect, construct, lay down, and maintain electric lines for lighting and power purposes within the Ngaruawahia Town District, such electric lines being indicated by red lines on the plan marked P.W.D.

33218, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District.

### SCHEDULE.

#### CONDITIONS.

1. In the following conditions,—

“Consumer’s wires” means any electric line on a consumer’s premises which is connected with the service lines of the Board.

“Inspecting Engineer” means the Engineer or other officer appointed by the Minister for the purpose of inspecting the works to be constructed or maintained by the Board.

“Pressure” means the difference of electrical potential between any two conductors through which a supply of energy is given, or between any part of either conductor and the earth.

“Minister” means the Minister of Public Works.

“Telegraph” includes telephone.

Any metallic body to be “efficiently connected with earth” shall be connected with the general mass of the earth in such manner as will ensure at all times an immediate and safe discharge of electrical energy.

2. The supply of electrical energy shall be given to private consumers by means of direct current on the three-wire system at a pressure of 230 volts effective between each of the outer wires and the neutral and 460 volts between the two outer wires. The declared voltage at the consumers’ terminals shall be 230 and 460 volts respectively.

3. The neutral wire shall be efficiently insulated throughout its length, and shall be earthed only at the power-station. The earth connection shall be provided with a switch for cutting off the earth connection for testing, and with a recording ammeter reading to a maximum of 5 amperes.

4. The main switchboard shall be made of and be mounted on material that is not inflammable.

5. Except where otherwise provided, the overhead conductors may be of bare hard-drawn copper or aluminium wire. If at any time it is found detrimental to the public safety to have these wires bare, the Minister may require the Board to have them insulated, and they shall thereupon be insulated accordingly. No electric-light wire shall come within 3 ft. of any other class of aerial wires or of cables, except where it may be permitted to pass the electric-light wires through such other wires or cables at a pole.

6. Where lead-covered telephone cables or any open telegraph or other aerial wires are crossed above or beneath by the electric-light wires, the latter wires shall be insulated with not less than 600-megohms-per-mile grade of vulcanized rubber throughout the crossing-span, and over every such span they shall be suitably suspended from effectively earthed steel bearer-wires if the Minister of Telegraphs shall so require.

7. In places where it may be required to cross with the electric-light wires through any other aerial wires or through cables, all such through crossings, if permitted, shall be effected at a pole. In every case of a through crossing, no matter whose property the lines crossed through may be, the method of carrying the electric-light wires across the pole, protecting them thereon, preventing other wires from coming into contact with them, and protecting persons working on the poles from danger of shock, shall be to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs. Where the insulated wires cross through on the pole they shall be encased in a protecting tube for the entire length of the arms on such pole. If metal pipe is used to encase the wires it shall be effectively earthed.

8. Efficient guard-wires shall, if so required by the Minister of Telegraphs or the Minister, be erected in a manner to meet with the approval of either one Minister or the other, or both, as the case may require, at all crossings and places where the electric-light wires intersect telegraph or other wires. The Board shall bear the expense of such guard-wires in all cases where an electric-light wire intersects a telegraph or other wire previously existing.

9. In running the lines authorized by this license through streets where no telegraph lines exist, the Board shall keep to one side of the street; and in running service wires to the opposite side of the street, the Board shall arrange so as to interfere as little as possible with the route of any future telegraph line.

10. Except by permission of the Minister, all overhead electric-light pole lines shall be placed on the opposite side of the streets to that on which any telegraph-pole lines exist; and where the erection of the electric-light wires necessitates the alteration of any existing telegraph wires, and such alteration is approved by the Minister of Telegraphs, the expense of the alteration shall be borne by the Board.

11. Where the electric-light wires are on one side of a street and the telegraph wires are on the other, and service is required to be given from either to the other side of the street, the Board and the Minister of Telegraphs shall give to each other reasonable facilities as far as possible to effect supply.

12. Every main shall be tested for insulation after having been placed in position and before it is used for the purposes of supply, the testing pressure being at least 500 volts, and the Board shall duly record the results of the tests of each main or section of a main, and forthwith forward a report thereof to the District Engineer of Public Works at Auckland.

13. The insulation of every complete circuit used for the supply of energy, including all machinery, apparatus, and devices forming part of or in connection with such circuit, shall be so maintained that the leakage current shall not under any conditions exceed one-thousandth part of the maximum supply current. Every leakage shall be remedied without delay. Every such circuit shall be tested for insulation at least once in every week, and the Board shall duly record the results of the tests, and forward a report thereof at the end of each week to the District Engineer of Public Works at Auckland.

14. The sectional area of the conductor in any electric line other than service wires or connections to street lamps laid or erected in any street shall not be less than 7/18 standard wire gauge. Service wires and connections to street lamps shall not be less than No. 12 standard wire gauge if solid, or 7/20 standard wire gauge if stranded.

15. All metal pipes or coverings containing any electric wire shall be efficiently connected with earth, and shall be so jointed as to make good electrical connection throughout their whole length.

16. Arc lamps used in any street for public lighting shall be so fixed as not to be in any part at a less height than 10 ft. from the ground.

All arc lamps shall be so guarded as to prevent pieces of ignited carbon or broken glass falling from them, and shall not be used in situations where there is any danger of the presence of explosive dust or gas.

17. The variation of pressure at any consumer’s terminals shall not exceed 4 per cent. above or below the normal pressure at which he is being supplied.

18. Every support for an aerial line shall be of durable material and properly strengthened against forces due to wind-pressure, change of direction of line, and unequal length of span. The factor of safety of such supports shall be at least four if of iron, steel, or reinforced concrete, and six if of wood, taking into consideration all possible stresses, including wind-pressure at 30 lb. per square foot on plane surfaces and 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane for cylindrical surfaces. The stress in the aerial conductors shall not exceed 23,000 lb. per square inch for copper and 15,000 lb. per square inch for aluminium in the extreme case of a temperature of 12° Fahr. and a wind-pressure of 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane occurring simultaneously.

19. Earth-wires, where led down poles, shall be protected by casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground.

20. All aerial wires shall be attached to suitable insulators carried on cross-arms of suitable material and cross-section, and they shall be so attached to the insulators or guarded that they cannot fall away from the support. Conductors covered with insulating material shall be so attached that their insulation will not be impaired where they are secured to the insulator.

21. Any aerial wire shall not in any part thereof be at a less height from the ground than 18 ft., or within 5 ft. measured horizontally or vertically from any part of any building or erection other than a support for the line, except where brought into a building for the purpose of supply. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government railways until the Board has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto, as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).

22. Service lines from aerial lines shall be led as directly as possible to insulators firmly attached to some portion of the consumer’s premises which is not accessible to any person without the use of a ladder or other special appliance. Every portion of any service line which is outside a building, and is within 7 ft. from any part of the building, shall be rubber-insulated.

23. Where an aerial line crosses a street, the angle between the line and the direction of the street at the place of crossing shall not be less than 60 degrees, and the spans shall be as short as possible. The minimum height of the line shall be 20 ft. above the street level.

24. Where an aerial line crosses or is in proximity to any metallic substance, precautions shall be taken against the possibility of the line coming into contact with the metallic substance, or of the metallic substance coming into contact with the line by breakage or otherwise.

25. Every aerial line, including its supports, its conductors, and their insulating covering, and all the structural parts and electrical appliances and devices belonging to or connected with the line, shall be duly and efficiently maintained as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions.

26. An aerial line shall not be permitted to remain erected after it has ceased to be used for the supply of energy, unless the Board intends within a reasonable time again to take it into use.

27. Where any portion of any electric line or any support for an electric line is exposed in such a position as to be liable to cause injury from lightning, it shall be efficiently protected against such liability.

28. The Board shall be responsible for all electric lines or wires, fittings, and apparatus belonging to it, or under its control, which may be upon a consumer's premises, being maintained in a safe condition and in all respects fit for supplying energy.

29. In delivering the energy to a consumer's terminals the Board shall exercise all due precautions so as to avoid risk of causing fire on the premises.

30. A suitable safety-fuse or other automatic circuit-breaker shall be inserted in each service line within a consumer's premises as close as possible to the point of entry, and contained within a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fireproof construction.

31. All electric wires placed on a consumer's premises shall be insulated with rubber of 600-megohm grade, and shall be thoroughly protected against injury to the insulation or access of moisture. All electric wires shall be so fixed and protected as to prevent the possibility of electrical discharge to any adjacent metallic substance.

32. The Board shall not connect the wires and fittings on a consumer's premises with its mains, or, in the case of premises already connected, continue the supply from its mains, unless it is reasonably satisfied that the requirements of this license are complied with, that the wiring and fittings are suitable for the voltage at which supply is being given, that the installation generally is in accordance with the requirements of good practice, and that the connection or continuance of supply would not cause a leakage from those wires and fittings exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises.

For the purpose of satisfying itself that the requirements of this license are being observed in so far as they apply to wires on a consumer's premises, the Board may require that notice be served upon it of the intention to instal wires, fittings, lamps, motors, or other apparatus on any premises, and may inspect the same during any reasonable hours while the installation of such is in progress.

33. If the Board is reasonably satisfied, after making all proper examination by testing or otherwise, that the wiring and fittings are not suitable for the voltage being employed, that a leakage exists at some part of a circuit of such extent as to be a source of danger, and that such leakage does not exist at any part of the circuit belonging to the Board, or that any other requirements of this license are not being complied with, then and in such case any officer of the Board, duly authorized by it in writing, may, for the purpose of discovering whether the leakage exists at any part of a circuit within or upon any consumer's premises, or whether the wiring is suitable and the general requirements of the license are complied with, by notice require the consumer, at some reasonable time after the service of the notice, to permit him to inspect and to test the wires and fittings belonging to the consumer and forming part of the circuit.

If on such testing and inspection the officer discovers a leakage from the consumer's wires exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises, or that the requirements of this license are not properly conformed to, or if the consumer does not give all due facilities for inspection and testing, the Board shall either not commence the supply or shall forthwith discontinue the supply of energy to the premises in question, giving immediate notice to the consumer of its reasons for not commencing or for discontinuing the supply, and in either case supply shall not be given until the Board is reasonably satisfied that the installation is in conformity with the requirements of this license.

34. If any consumer is dissatisfied with the action of the Board in refusing to give, or in discontinuing, or in not recommencing the supply of energy to his premises, the wires and fittings of that consumer may, on his application to the Minister, and on payment of the cost, be inspected and tested by the Inspecting Engineer.

This provision shall be indorsed on every notice given under the provisions of either of the two last preceding clauses.

35. The Board shall, upon receipt of an application from the occupier of any premises within 60 ft. of any of the

Board's public-supply electric lines, furnish such premises with electrical energy upon the same terms and conditions on which any other consumer is entitled under similar circumstances to a corresponding supply, provided that the Board's plant is of sufficient power to supply the electrical energy required by such occupier as well as the requirements of other consumers.

36. The Board shall, before the erection or construction of any part of the work hereby authorized is begun, submit for the approval of the Minister such plans and other information showing and describing such work as he may require. In the event of the Board at any time desiring to make alterations to the work involving a departure from the type of construction shown on the approved plans, it shall submit for the Minister's approval plans showing such type of construction as it is proposed to adopt, and with such approval the alterations may be carried out.

37. From and after the time when the Board commences to supply energy in pursuance of this license, it shall maintain continuously sufficient power for the use of all the consumers for the time being entitled to be supplied: Provided that, for any purposes connected with the efficient working of the undertaking, the Minister may give permission to the Board to discontinue the supply at such intervals of time and for such periods as he may think expedient. When the supply is so discontinued, public notice shall be given, when practicable, of such discontinuance, and of the probable duration thereof.

38. The Minister may at any time order an inspection to be made of the works, lines, and wires of the Board used for electric lighting and power purposes. If any defect is found to exist it must be remedied forthwith, and if in the opinion of the officer or person inspecting such default is serious, the Minister may, on receipt of the report, direct the Board to at once cease transmitting energy either over the whole of the Board's line and wires, or over any specified part thereof, until such defect is repaired or remedied. The cost of such inspection shall be borne by the Board.

39. After the supply of energy has begun, notice shall be given to the District Engineer of Public Works, Auckland, and to the Postmaster at Ngaruawahia, of each further proposed extension or alteration of lines or wires in pursuance of this license.

40. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of May, 1913, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of May, 1914.

41. The Board shall, prior to the completion of the said works, or any separate portion thereof, give to the Minister at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

42. The Board shall not use any portion of the electric lines authorized by this license, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the Board that he has received from the Inspecting Engineer a certificate that the said work, or any portion thereof, has been satisfactorily carried out.

43. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the Board without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

44. If the Board fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the Board within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice; but it shall not be held to have committed default for any failure to maintain power continuously if such failure is due to the breakdown of machinery or other accident, unless such breakdown or accident is proved to be due to negligence on the part of the Board; and if the Board fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period it shall be liable to a penalty of £20, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown. The recovery of a penalty under this license shall not affect the liability (if any) of the Board to pay or make compensation in respect of any damage or injury which may be caused by reason of the default.

45. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the Board fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

46. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the Board, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the same.

47. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers

vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works; nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the Board for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the Board as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Board to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said wharf is to be erected, as shown on the plan M.D. 4025 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Board upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the erection of the said wharf, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 4025.

3. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

4. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

5. The Board shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereon; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Board in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause the defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Board and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date thereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Board shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Board three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Board in New Zealand.

11. The Board shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

12. In case the Board shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the Board or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Board, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

The light should be visible on a clear dark night for a distance of 27 miles all round the horizon, except where obscured by the Hen and Chickens Islands between the bearings of 198° (S. 3° W. magnetic), and 225° (S. 30° W. magnetic), and 237° (S. 42° W. magnetic), and 270° (S. 75° W. magnetic).

NOTE.—Over a portion of this arc between the bearings of 237° (S. 42° W. magnetic) and 246° (S. 51° W. magnetic) the light will be partly visible at a long distance over a low part of the Middle Chicken.

In the above table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Christchurch, and Dunedin.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 577, against 560 in February—an increase of 17. The deaths in March were 268—an increase of 12 as compared with last month. Of the total deaths, males contributed 136, females 132. Sixty-nine of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 25.71 per cent. of the whole number; 56 of these were under one year of age.

There were 73 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 74 in February. The following table shows the classification:—

*Otago and Southland Farriers.—Recommendation of Conciliation Council.*

In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an industrial dispute between the Dunedin and Suburban Farriers' Industrial Union of Workers, applicant, and A. Alexander and others, respondents.

THE following recommendation of the Conciliation Council appointed to hear the above dispute is published pursuant to subsection (4) of section 43 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act, 1908, and number 34 of the regulations thereunder.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

*Hours of Work.*

1. THE ordinary week's work shall not exceed forty-four hours. Not more than eight hours ordinary time, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m., shall be worked on five days of the week, and not more than four hours on Saturday, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 12 noon, or on any other day usually observed in any district as the weekly half-holiday.

*Wages.*

2. The wages of farriers shall be 1s. 5d. per hour, and floormen 1s. 2d. per hour.

*Overtime.*

3. That all time worked beyond the hours mentioned in clause 1 on any one day shall be overtime, and shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for the first hour, for the next two hours shall be paid time and a half, after which double time shall be paid up to 7 a.m.

*Holidays.*

4. The following days shall be observed as holidays: Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, 2nd January, Good Friday,

Easter Monday, Labour Day, the birthday of the reigning Sovereign, and Dunedin Cup Day from noon. When any holiday shall be generally observed on another day than that prescribed hereby, the provisions of this award shall apply to such substituted holiday. Dunedin Cup Day only to apply to a radius of fifteen miles from the Dunedin Post-office. Any work done on these holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

*Apprentices.*

5. (a.) Any employer taking an apprentice to learn the trade shall be bound to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall pay such apprentice not less than the undermentioned rates of wages, namely: For the first year, 10s. per week; for the second year, 17s. 6d. per week; for the third year, £1 2s. 6d. per week; for the fourth year, £1 10s. per week; for the fifth year, £1 17s. 6d. per week.

(b.) The period of apprenticeship shall be five years, but three months' probation shall be allowed the first employer of any apprentice to determine his fitness, such three months to be included in the period of apprenticeship, and the obligation of the apprentice to serve his employer shall be deemed to be a duty enforceable under this award.

(c.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the apprenticeship wish, for any reason, to dispense with the service of the apprentice he shall give him a certificate for the time he has served, and procure him another employer, carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, who shall continue to teach the apprentice, pay him the wages prescribed by this award according to the total length of time he has served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.

(d.) An employer taking an apprentice shall give notice thereof and the name of the apprentice to the Inspector of Factories within one week after the expiration of the period of probation, and an employer transferring an apprentice to another employer shall similarly, within one week thereof, give notice of such transfer to such Inspector.

(e.) The proportion of apprentices shall be one to each shop, and an additional apprentice to every two tradesmen after the first two. When an apprentice has served five years and is given a fire, an additional apprentice may be taken on.

*Piecework.*

6. Piecework shall not be allowed, except shoe-turning, which shall be paid 2s. 6d. a dozen for any shoes up to 14 in., and 3s. a dozen for shoes over 14 in.

*Preference Clause.*

7. (a.) If any employer shall hereafter engage any worker who shall not be a member of the union, and who within two weeks after his engagement shall not become and remain a member of the union, the employer shall dismiss such worker from his service if requested to do so by the union, provided there is then a member of the union qualified to perform the particular work required to be done and ready and willing to undertake the same.

(b.) Whenever an employer shall employ any worker who is not a member of the union, he shall, within twenty-four hours thereafter, give notice in writing of such employment to the secretary of the union.

(c.) Whenever an employer shall shorten hands, preference of employment shall be given to members of the union.

*Mixed Occupations.*

8. Any person having mixed occupations—say, as firemen and floormen—shall receive the higher rate of pay.

*Scope of Award.*

9. The award shall extend over Otago and Southland.

*Term of Award.*

10. The award shall come into force from the 1st April, 1913, and shall continue in force until the 1st April, 1915.

*Otago Metal-workers' Assistants.—Recommendation of Conciliation Council.*

(Otago and Southland Industrial District.)

In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments; and in the matter of an industrial dispute between the Otago Metal-workers' Assistants' Industrial Union of Workers, applicants, and Anderson and Co. and others, respondents.

THE following recommendation of the Conciliation Council appointed to hear the above dispute is published pursuant to subsection (4) of section 43 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act, 1908, and number 34 of the regulations thereunder.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

*Hours of Work.*

1. EIGHT hours to be a standard day's work on five days, and on Saturday four hours; but the different shops can arrange to work a fraction of an hour each day to make up for the Saturday half-holiday, for which fraction no overtime shall be charged.

*Night-workers.*

2. The hours for night-workers to be arranged in each establishment, one hour to be allowed each night for meals when two shifts are worked; when three shifts are worked, meal-time as may be found practicable.

*Minimum Rate of Wages.*

3. The following shall be the minimum rate of wages: Labourers, 1s. 0 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour; strikers, 1s. 0 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour; yardmen, 1s. 0 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour; machinists, 1s. 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour.

4. All labourers working on ship or marine-boiler repair work to be paid at the rate of 1s. 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour, while on the job either on board or in the shop.

5. All furnacemen working cupola and annealing furnaces shall be paid at the rate of 1s. 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per hour. This rate shall be paid to an annealing-furnace man during such times as he is employed firing up.

6. The wages of boys and youths shall be as follows: Under fifteen years of age, 10s. per week; fifteen to sixteen, 15s. per week; sixteen to seventeen, £1 per week; seventeen to eighteen, £1 5s. per week; eighteen to nineteen, £1 10s. per week; nineteen to twenty, £1 15s. per week; after that, the minimum rate of wages.

*Boilermakers' Award.*

7. It shall be a sufficient compliance with the provisions of clause 10 of the award made by the Court in the matter of a dispute between the United Boilermakers and Iron-ship Builders' Union of Workers and the employers therein mentioned if the machinists engaged as workmen under such award are members of the Otago Metal-workers' Assistants' Union.

*Overtime and Holidays.*

8. (a.) All time worked in excess of the time mentioned in clause 1 hereof in any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours, and thereafter at the rate of time and a half.

(b.) Work done on New Year's Day, Easter Monday, or the King's Birthday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(c.) Work done on Sunday, Good Friday, Labour Day, or Christmas Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

*Under-rate Workers.*

9. (a.) Any worker who considers himself incapable of earning the minimum wage fixed by this award may be paid such lower wage as may from time to time be fixed, on the application of the worker, after forty-eight hours' notice given to the union, by the

local Inspector of Awards, or such other person as the Court may from time to time appoint for that purpose; and such Inspector or person, in so fixing such wage, shall have regard to the worker's capability, his past earnings, and such other circumstances as such Inspector or person may think fit to consider, after hearing such evidence and argument as the union and worker shall offer.

(b.) Whenever occasion arises for so fixing the worker's wage, it shall be fixed for such period, not exceeding six months, as such Inspector or other person shall determine, and, after the expiration of such period, until fourteen days' notice shall have been given to him by the secretary of the union requiring him to have his wage again fixed in manner prescribed by this clause; provided that in the case of any person whose rate is so fixed by reason of old age or permanent disability, it may be fixed for such longer period as such Inspector or other person shall think fit.

(c.) Notwithstanding the foregoing, it shall be competent for a worker to agree in writing with the president or secretary of the union upon such wage without having the same so fixed.

(d.) It shall be the duty of the union to give notice to the Inspector of Awards of every agreement made with a worker pursuant hereto.

(e.) It shall be the duty of an employer before employing a worker at such lower wage to examine a permit or agreement by which such wage is fixed.

*Travelling-expenses to Country Work.*

10. (a.) Fare to be paid both ways, also living-expenses while on job. Time shall count from time of leaving the shop till return, but no more than eight hours to be paid for travelling on any one day.

(b.) All men sent from Port Chalmers to Dunedin, or from Dunedin to Port Chalmers, shall have their fares paid, meals provided, and allowed 1s. per day for travelling-time.

*Preference of Employment.*

11. In the engagement of his workers the employer shall have the right to engage any worker he chooses, provided that within one week from the date of his engagement the worker shall become a member of the union.

*No Discrimination.*

12. The employers in employing labour shall not discriminate against members of the union, and shall not in the engagement or dismissal of their hands, or in the conduct of their business, do anything for the purpose of injuring the said union, whether directly or indirectly.

*Matters not provided for.*

13. Matters not provided for in this award, or any dispute that may arise in connection with the same, shall be settled between the particular employer concerned and the secretary or president of the union; and, in default of any agreement being arrived at, then such matter shall be referred to the Inspector of Factories for decision. Either party, if dissatisfied with such decision, may appeal to the Court, upon giving written notice of such appeal to the other party within seven days after such decision shall have been communicated to the party desiring to appeal.

*Provision as to Country Work.*

14. The provisions of clause 10 shall not apply to any work done in connection with contracts entered into before the hearing of this dispute and incompleting; but an employer shall not be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he shall, within twenty-eight (28) days from the date on which this award is filed, give to the Inspector of Awards in Dunedin notice in writing of the contracts in respect of which he claims exemption, stating the date of such contracts, the name of the person or body with whom the same has been made, and the nature of the work and where the same is to be performed.

*Term of Award.*

15. The award shall come into force on the 14th April, 1913, and remain in force until the 14th April, 1914.
