And I do also proclaim and declare that William Harold Collingwood, of Palmerston North, shall be the Returning Officer to conduct the first elections of each subdivision of the aforesaid district; that Wednesday, the eleventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, shall be the day for holding such first elections; and that Wednesday, the eighteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, at twelve o'clock noon, shall be the time, and the Palmerston North Borough Council Chambers shall be the place, at which the first meeting of the members of the Board of the said river district shall be held.

And, lastly, I do proclaim and declare that the aforesaid William Harold Collingwood shall be the person to make a roll of electors for the purposes of the aforesaid first elections, in the manner prescribed by section eight of the said Act.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic. Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land dewas duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:
