A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the River Boards Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), as amended by the River Boards Amendment Act, 1910, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the date hereof, that part of the said Dominion described in the First Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby constituted a district under the said Act, and shall be known by the name of the Palmerston North-Kairanga River District; and that the said district shall be divided into two subdivisions, to be called the Palmerston North Subdivision and the Kairanga Subdivision, the boundaries whereof shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto; and, further, that the number of members who are to constitute the Board of the said district shall be five, and that three members shall be elected for the Palmerston North Subdivision and two members for the Kairanga Subdivision.

And I do also proclaim and declare that William Harold Collingwood, of Palmerston North, shall be the Returning Officer to conduct the first elections of each subdivision of the aforesaid district; that Wednesday, the eleventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, shall be the day for holding such first elections; and that Wednesday, the eighteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, at twelve o'clock noon, shall be the time, and the Palmerston North Borough Council Chambers shall be the place, at which the first meeting of the members of the Board of the said river district shall be held.

And, lastly, I do proclaim and declare that the aforesaid William Harold Collingwood shall be the person to make a roll of electors for the purposes of the aforesaid first elections, in the manner prescribed by section eight of the said Act.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

PALMERSTON NORTH-KAIRANGA RIVER DISTRICT.

All that area in the Wellington Land District bounded towards the north-west by Boundary Road from the westernmost corner of the Borough of Palmerston North to Te Matai

Road; thence towards the north-east by Te Matai Road to the Manawatu River; thence by a right line to the westernmost corner of Section No. 236, Block XII, Kairanga Survey District; thence by that section to Section No. 301, Block XVI; thence towards the south-east by the last-mentioned section to the Palmerston North - Pahiatua Road, across that road, by Section No. 290, Block XVI, and Section No. 266, Block XV, to the Manawatu Bridge Road, across that road, by the road forming the north-western boundaries of Sections Nos. 255, 287, and 286, and by Sections Nos. 285 and 256 to Section No. 177; thence towards the south-west by the last-mentioned section, across Fitzherbert Road West, by Sections Nos. 192 and 193, Block XV aforesaid, across Riverbank Road, and by Section No. 199, Block XIV, Kairanga Survey District, to its northernmost corner; thence by a right line across the Manawatu River to the south-western corner of the Borough of Palmerston North; and thence by the south-western boundary of that borough to Boundary Road, the place of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

PALMERSTON NORTH SUBDIVISION.

Fitzherbert Road West, by Sections Nos. 192 and 193, Block XV aforesaid, across Riverbank Road, and by Section No. 199, Block XIV, Kairanga Survey District, to its northernmost corner; thence by a right line across the Manawatu River to the south-western corner of the Borough of Palmerston North; and thence again towards the north-west and south-west by the said Borough of Palmerston North to the place of commencement.

Land reserved under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a scenic reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

PAENGAROA SCENIC RESERVE.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, containing by admeasurement 239 acres 2 roods, more or less, being Section No. 32, Block XII, Maungakaretu Survey District. HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the third section of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, a majority of the ratepayers in the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, situated in the County of Waikato, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the said area be constituted a drainage district under the provisions of the said Act :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in the third section of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby constitute and declare the area of land described in the Schedule hereto to be a district for the purposes of Part I of the said Act, and to be called by the name of the "Uapoto Drainage District"; and also, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in the fourth section of the said Act, doth hereby declare that the Board of Trustees of the said district shall consist of five persons, to be elected as members of the said Board, and under and in accordance with the said Act.

WHEREAS the Taumarunui Borough Council lately proposed to raise a loan of four thousand five hundred pounds under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, and its amendments, for the installation of street and house lighting by means of "Dreadnought gas" in the Borough of Taumarunui: And whereas an irregularity or defect has occurred in the procedure to obtain such loan inasmuch as the newspaper notice required to be given by paragraph (d) of section three of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, with reference to the deposit for public inspection of the special roll prepared in connection with the raising of such loan did not state that the area described as "Subdivisions 1 to 27 (inclusive), Ohura South G No. 4D, known as Ngatai's Extension," was included in the part of the borough over which the loan was to be raised, although such special roll did include that area, and the said area was definitely described in all subsequent proceedings relating to the loan: And whereas it appears that the ratepayers have not been misled by such irregularity or defect :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section one hundred and twenty-one of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, and section seven of the Local Bodies' Loans Amendment Act, 1910, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby validate the said public notification of the said special roll, and doth hereby order and declare that the proceedings adopted to raise the said loan shall be taken to be as valid as though the said public notification had correctly described the area affected by the said special roll. Arrangements for taking Poll respecting Proposed Borough of Takapuna, County of Waitemata.

THE HONOURABLE W. F. MASSEY PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1910, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby direct that a poll shall be taken on the proposal praying that the area described in the Schedule hereto, being part of the Takapuna Riding of the County of Waitemata, may be constituted a borough under the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, and, further, doth hereby make the following appointments and arrangements for the purpose of taking the said poll:—

1. Alick Merriott Pickford, of Swanson Street, Auckland, to be the Returning Officer for the purpose of taking the said poll, and also to be the person authorized to prepare a voters roll of the persons entitled to vote at the said poll.
2. The voters roll prepared and signed by the said Alick Merriott Pickford shall be the voters roll to be used at the said poll.
3. Each person on such roll shall be entitled to one vote only.
4. The said poll shall be taken on Wednesday, the twenty-eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and shall close at seven o'clock in the afternoon of that day.
5. Except as herein provided, the said poll shall be taken as nearly as may be in the manner provided by the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1908, and the Returning Officer hereby appointed shall be deemed to be a Returning Officer appointed for the purposes of that Act.

Certain Species of Birds indigenous to New Zealand not to be deemed protected.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, as amended by the Animals Protection Amendment Act, 1910, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby suspend the operation of section ten of the said Animals Protection Amendment Act, 1910, for the period commencing on the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and ending on the thirty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, with respect to the species of birds indigenous to New Zealand mentioned in the Schedule hereto:

Provided, however, that the said birds shall not be taken or killed except in such districts and on such conditions as may be notified by the Governor under the said Acts.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
