CHAPLAINS: ARRANGEMENTS FOR CAMPS.

1. REGULATION 597 is hereby revoked and the following regulation substituted in lieu thereof:—

Provided that there are at least fifty of his denomination present in camp, one Chaplain of each denomination shown in the Army List will be appointed for duty at every statutory camp, and will be entitled to pay according to rank as classed in the New Zealand Army List, and allowances as for Territorial officers—viz., 4s. per diem for messing whilst in camp, and travelling-allowance while going to and from same.

This will not preclude other Chaplains from attending camps, but these will not be entitled to pay, allowances, or rations.

The Chaplains entitled to draw pay, &c., at each camp will be selected by the Senior Chaplain of each denomination in each military district.

EXEMPTIONS FROM PERSONAL SERVICE.

2. The following additional regulation is made:—

Paragraph 427A. A member of the Military Forces desirous of obtaining exemption from personal service on the grounds that undue hardship is caused by the requirements of such service (section 32 (n), Defence Amendment Act, 1912), will first give fourteen days' notice to the officer commanding his unit, and at the expiration of that period

the applicant will make written application to the nearest Magistrates' Court.

The officer commanding the unit will inquire into the merits of each case, and within the fourteen days will notify the Clerk of the Magistrates' Court whether he recommends or intends to oppose the application.

TOKOMARU BAY LIGHTS.

THE Waipatu County Council has notified that the leading-lights in Tokomaru Bay (Notice No. 14 of 1912) have been considerably increased in power, as electric light has now been installed. The front red light (99 ft. in height above high water, 150 yards from the beach) shows quite distinctly in clear weather for a distance of 10 miles, and the rear white light (162 ft. above high water, 224 yards from the beach) shows up well in clear weather for a distance of 15 miles. These lights are in line with one another bearing 291° (N. 84° W. magnetic), and the line produced passes through Marotiri (1,503 ft.). The beacons have been erected to indicate as nearly as possible the middle of the stretch of water between Hikutu Rock and the end of the reef projecting from Kotunui Point.

The arc of visibility of these lights will be 64°, from 261° (S. 81° W. magnetic) to 325° (N. 35° W. magnetic), and in very clear weather they may sometimes be seen for 16 and 19 miles respectively.

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND TRUSTS BILL, 1913.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the General Assembly of New Zealand in the ensuing session by the Right Rev. THOMAS HENRY SPROTT, D.D., Bishop of Wellington; the Rev. Canon GEORGE MACMURRAY, of the City of Auckland; HENRY DOUGLASS ANDREWS, of the City of Christchurch, Barrister; and THOMAS FREDERIC MARTIN, of the City of Wellington, Barrister (hereinafter called “the promoters”), for leave to bring in a private Bill, the Short Title of which is as above, to effect the following objects and purposes, viz. :—

1. To provide that all hereditaments conveyed by Bishop Selwyn to trustees, under the Bishop of New Zealand Trusts Acts of 1858 and 1868, shall be held on behalf of the General Synod of the Church of England, upon the trusts affecting such hereditaments.

2. To give to the said trustees powers of sale and exchange (with power to give or receive money for equality of exchange), the sale and equality moneys to be laid out in purchasing other hereditaments to be held on the same trusts or in effecting permanent improvements to other hereditaments so held, or invested in trustee securities and power to mortgage for effecting permanent improvements to the property mortgaged or to other property held on the same trusts, and to give such trustees power to lease for twenty-one years, or if for building purposes for sixty years.

3. To provide that the said trustees shall exercise the said powers of sale, exchange, and mortgage only by authority of the General Synod.

4. To continue the said Acts of 1858 and 1868 and the Bishops in New Zealand Trusts Act, 1871, between the commencement of the Statutes Repeal Act, 1907, and the proposed Act.

5. To give to the trustees of all lands conveyed under the said Act of 1871, and to the trustees of lands held in trust for any Diocesan Synod, and to any incorporated Diocesan Board of Trustees in which any lands conveyed or given for religious, charitable, educational, or other purposes are or shall be vested, all the powers described in clause 2 of this notice, the powers of sale, exchange, and mortgage to be exercised with the consent of the Diocesan Synod.

6. To declare all the trustees referred to in this notice leasing authorities under the Public Bodies' Leases Act, 1908.

7. To empower the said Synods respectively to appoint and remove trustees.

8. To repeal the Church of England Lands Buildings Leases Act, 1872.

9. To give to the New Zealand Mission Trust Board, in relation to all lands conveyed to or vested in it, all the powers described in clause 2 of this notice.

10. The proposed Act is not to affect the Diocese of Christchurch.

CHRISTCHURCH.UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION
DEPARTMENT.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
