A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Town Boards Act, 1908, that the Governor may declare that any locality outside a borough wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said area shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district, under the Town Boards Act, 1908, by the name of the Rangataua Town District; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of seven members.

SCHEDULE.

RANGATAUA TOWN DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District bounded towards the north-east by Section No. 7, Block V, Karioi Survey District, from the south-eastern side of the Mangateitei Road to the right bank of the Mangaehuehue Stream; towards the east by the said bank of that stream to the north-eastern side of the Ohakune-Waiouru Road; towards the south-west by the said side of that road to the south-east side of the Mangateitei Road aforesaid; and towards the north-west by the said side of the last-mentioned road, across a public road, across a railway reserve, and again by the

aforesaid side of the Mangateitei Road to the place of commencement.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the lands described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said lands should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

ERRATUM.—In the fifth line of the Schedule to the Proclamation taking land for the purposes of a road in Blocks V, IX, and X, Hapuakohe Survey District, Waikato County, published in *Gazette* No. 33, page 1357, of 17th April, 1913, for "Blocks X and IX" read "Blocks V and IX."

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereunder shall be scenic reserves under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the licensee without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

10. If the licensee fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license, the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the licensee within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice, and if the licensee fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period it shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.

Such guard-wires shall consist of at least two stranded galvanized-steel wires carried on substantial supports at a height of 2 ft. above the conductors if the telegraph or telephone wires pass over the conductors, or 2 ft. above the telegraph or telephone wires if they pass under the conductors.
9. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of June, 1913, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of June, 1914.
10. The said Board shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.
11. The said electric lines, including their supports, their conductors, and their insulated covering, shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained by the said Board as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions, and shall not be permitted by the said Board to remain erected after they have ceased to be used for the supply of electricity.

This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the said Board without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.
14. If the said Board fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license, the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the Board within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice, and if the said Board fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period it shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.
15. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the said Board fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt

thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

REGULATIONS.

1. SAMBUR or Ceylon deer (stags or bucks only) may be taken or killed within the said district from the 1st day of August, 1913, to the 30th day of September, 1913, both days inclusive.
2. Licenses to kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Wellington, and the Postmasters at Palmerston North, Bull's, Foxton, and Marton, on payment of a license fee of 20s., in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Acts and these regulations.
3. No licensee shall be allowed to take or kill more than three stags or bucks; and, further, the said Chief Postmaster and Postmasters shall not issue more than one license to take or kill deer to the same person.
4. No hind or fawn will be allowed to be killed on any pretext whatever; and no dogs will be allowed to accompany either the licensee or any attendant he may have with him.
5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him in this behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke all regulations heretofore made under the said Acts, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth hereunder for the purposes of the said Acts.

REGULATIONS.

SPECIAL ROLL.

1. THE special roll for the part of a district for which a loan is to be raised, and which is not a legal subdivision, shall be prepared from the existing valuation roll by the local authority proposing to raise the loan, and shall be in the following form, and shall contain the particulars therein specified :-

2. The special roll shall be deposited for public inspection at the office of the local authority for not less than seven days prior to the first public notice of intention to raise the loan, or not less than seven days before any steps are taken to obtain the ratepayers' consent to the loan, under paragraph (d) of section 15 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, as the case may be, and notice of that deposit shall be published on the first day of such deposit in some newspaper circulating in the district within which the rating-area is situated.

3. Any person whose name appears on the roll and who objects to any matter or thing contained in the said roll, or who objects to the omission of any matter or thing from the said roll, and who desires that such objections shall be heard or considered, shall forward notice thereof in writing to the local authority within seven days after the last day on which the roll was deposited as aforesaid. Such notice shall be in duplicate, and shall state fully the grounds of objection and also the full name and address of the objector.

4. The local authority shall cause to be prepared a list of all objections (if any) to the said roll, and such list shall state the name and address of the objector, his number on the special roll, and his reasons for objecting to the valuation or to any other matter or thing contained in or omitted from the said roll.

5. Such list, together with the said roll, shall be submitted to the Stipendiary Magistrate for the said district, and if there is more than one Stipendiary Magistrate for such district, then to the senior Stipendiary Magistrate for the same. The said Stipendiary Magistrate shall give at least seven days notice of the time and place appointed by him to hear such objections, and he shall have jurisdiction to hear and finally determine the same, and all matters directly connected with such objections, and also to make all such alterations in the said roll as he thinks proper, and shall initial all alterations, additions, or erasures so made by him, and shall sign the said roll.

6. The roll when so signed and initialled shall be the special roll for the portion of the district specified therein, and shall be delivered by the said Stipendiary Magistrate to the local authority as the complete special roll for the particular rating district or area to which the same relates.

7. Where no objections have been made to the said special roll, the Chairman of the local authority shall sign the said roll and affix the seal of the local authority to the same, and such roll shall thereupon be deemed to be duly authenticated.

RATEPAYERS' CONSENT.

8. The signatures to every consent of the ratepayers to be testified for the purposes of paragraph (d) of section 15 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, shall be witnessed by some adult person or persons, and verified by statutory declaration of the attesting witness or witnesses, and such consent shall, when completed, if the loan is to be applied for from the Superintendent of the State-guaranteed Advances Office, be forwarded by the Chairman of the local authority of the district to the said Superintendent at Wellington, together with a statutory declaration made by such Chairman in the form hereinafter prescribed.

9. Every such consent shall be in the following form :-

MERGER OF RATING-AREA.

Where the whole of any area over which a special rate has been made as security for a loan is merged or included within the district of a local authority other than the local authority that made the rate, such last-mentioned authority shall forthwith give notice of such loan to the local authority in whose district such area has been so merged or included, and also to the Minister of Finance.

(2.) Every such notice shall be in the form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto, and shall set forth the particulars indicated therein.

(3.) Where special rates have been made as aforesaid in respect of two or more loans separate notices shall be given in respect of each such loan.

13. (1.) Where part only of any such special-rating area is merged or included as aforesaid the local authority that raised the loan may forward to the Minister of Finance an application in writing for an apportionment of the interest and other charges payable in respect of that loan, and may set forth in its application the apportionment which it suggests should be made.

(2.) Where special rates have been made over the said area in respect of two or more loans separate applications shall be made in respect of each such loan.

(3.) The local authority that raised the loan shall forthwith serve on the local authority in whose district part of the special-rating area has been merged or included as aforesaid a copy of every such application, certified under the hand of the Chairman of the local authority.

(4.) Every application for an apportionment of interest and other charges as aforesaid shall be in the form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto.

(5.) There shall be annexed to every application under this regulation and to the certified copy thereof a plan of the whole area over which a special rate has been levied, and such plan shall distinguish between the merged area and the area not so merged.

14. (1.) If the local authority in whose district part of the special-rating area has been merged or included as aforesaid objects to the proposed apportionment of the interest and charges in respect of any loan, it shall, within two months after the receipt by it of the copy of the application for apportionment, forward written notice of its objection under the seal of the local authority, setting forth the grounds thereof, to the Minister of Finance, and shall, within the said period, serve on the local authority applying for an apportionment

(2.) On the expiration of the said period of two months the Chairman of the local authority applying for the apportionment shall make and sign a statutory declaration in the form No. 3 or the form No. 4 (as the case may require), and shall forward the same to the Minister of Finance.

15. (1.) Upon the receipt of such declaration the Minister shall cause to be transmitted to the Governor the application for apportionment, the objections (if any) made to the suggested apportionment, and the statutory declaration made under the last preceding regulation.

(2.) The Governor may thereupon make such apportionment as he thinks fit, pursuant to the provisions of subsection (4) of section five of the Local Bodies' Loans Amendment Act, 1912.

16. The foregoing clauses of these regulations relating to the merger of rating-areas apply only to loans granted by the Minister under Part II of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, or the corresponding provisions of any former Act.

17. Where any document is directed by these regulations to be served on or given to a local authority it shall be sufficient if such notice is sent to or delivered at the office of such local authority, addressed to the Clerk or other principal officer thereof.

RANGITIKEI COUNTY COUNCIL.

Resolution making Special Rate.—Loan of £380.—Waikakahi Road, Moawhango River Bridge, and Pokaka Road.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, the Rangitikei County Council hereby resolves as follows: That, for the purpose of providing the principal, interest, and other charges on a further loan of £380 (being 10 per centum of the original loan of £3,800), authorized to be raised by the Rangitikei County Council, under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of forming and gravelling the Waikakahi Road and erecting a bridge over the Moawhango River on such road, and forming and gravelling the Pokaka Road from the Waikakahi Road to Moawhango, the said Rangitikei County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of 1/45 of a penny in the pound sterling upon the rateable value (upon the basis of the capital value) of all rateable property of the Erewhon Special-rating District, as described on page 1704 of the *New Zealand Gazette* of 18th of May, 1911, and comprising all that area in the Wellington Land District bounded towards the south-west and west generally by a right line from Trig. Station No. 32, Papaki, to Trig. Station No. 16, Kauakeke, commencing at the intersection of that line with the Waikakahi Stream, situated in Block XI, Ohinewairua Survey District; thence by a right line to the Trig. Station No. 17, Auahitotara; thence by a right line to Trig. Station No. 24, Te Rotete; thence by a right line to Trig. Station No. 28, Manukaiapu, situated in Block XVI, Kaimanawa Survey District; thence towards the east generally by a right line to Trig. Station No. 27, Block XV, Mangamaire Survey District; thence by a right line to a point in the middle of the Rangitikei River, being the point of intersection of a line along the middle of the said Rangitikei River with a line drawn from the said Trig. Station No. 27 to Trig. Amending Regulations for the Carriage of Timber on Decks of Vessels.

WHEREAS by Warrant dated the 26th day of April, 1911, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 36, of the 4th day of the following month, regulations were made governing the issue of licenses for the carriage of cargo and live-stock on the decks of vessels:

And whereas it is desirable to amend the said regulations in the manner hereinafter described :

Now, therefore, I, Francis Marion Bates Fisher, the Minister of Marine, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section 223 of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby revoke clause 30 of the herein-before-recited regulations, and do hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

30. In the case of ships the whole of whose deck cargo does not consist of timber, the alleyways are always to be kept clear of cargo and live-stock, and there shall be a clear passage of not less than 3 ft. wide either on one side or the other, or part on one side and part on the other.

30A. On ships the whole of whose deck cargo is timber, it may be stowed from rail to rail, in which case it shall be properly secured to the satisfaction of the Superintendent, and such lifelines for the protection of life as he may require shall be properly fitted and secured. The heaviest timber shall be stowed nearest the deck and graduating with the lightest timbers at the surface, so that the timber when stowed shall present a flat and even surface fore and aft and athwart ships.

3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
