Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

6. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for the term of five years, computed from the 12th day of April, 1913, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

8. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company.

9. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the part of the company.

10. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 2 of these conditions,—

then and in any such case this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, right, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

11. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regu-

lations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said jetty shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

5. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf by the Board shall be applied to keeping the said wharf, and all erections on or in connection with such wharf, in good order and repair.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf, and any buildings erected on the wharf or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon his leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Board a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Board, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Board shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. The Board shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf any building or structure whatever except with the consent of the Minister.

8. The Board shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the 31st day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

9. The Board shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the wharf.

10. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

11. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the 4th day of March, 1913, unless in the meantime altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Board shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege, without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

12. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor on giving to the Board three calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Board. No compensation or allowance shall be payable in such case.

13. The Board shall be liable for any injury which may be caused at the said wharf to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Board.

14. In case the Board shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein before set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days,—

then and in either of the said cases every right, power, or privilege hereby conferred may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without notice to the Board or other proceeding whatever, and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Board, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

WHEREAS by section five of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations which shall have force and effect either throughout New Zealand or only in such waters and places as are specified in the regulations for the purposes therein specified:

And whereas it is expedient to make the regulations hereinafter set forth with respect to the taking of whitebait in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulation.

REGULATION.

DEFLECTORS or wings for the purpose of turning whitebait into set-nets, and having a length of not more than 12 ft., may be used in the rivers in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay. Such deflectors or wings shall be made of scrim or other similar material, and shall be attached above water to stakes, and hung loose at the bottom. They shall be placed and set from the bank of the river, and at right angles to the current.

Special Regulations for Deer-shooting, Wellington.

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the conditions under which certain red-deer may be destroyed in the Wellington Acclimatization District.

REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, the secretary of the Wellington Acclimatization Society at Wellington, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such secretary, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill red-deer of either sex and of any age which in the opinion of the said secretary or of the said authorized persons should be destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or other physical imperfection.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid during a period of two months from the date hereof.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red-deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates, and name of the person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or any portion thereof.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

General Regulations of the Defence Forces (Additional).

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Defence Act, 1909, and its amendments, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations; and I do hereby declare that such regulations shall come into force on the seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

REGULATIONS.

THE NEW ZEALAND FORCES MOTOR RESERVE OF OFFICERS. Establishment.

723. THE New Zealand Forces Motor Reserve shall consist of one Lieutenant-Colonel, one Staff Officer, sixteen Majors, thirty-two Captains, and one hundred and twenty-eight Lieutenants.

Administration.

724. The New Zealand Forces Motor Reserve will be administered on mobilization by a Lieutenant-Colonel of the Territorial Force, who will be responsible to the Quartermaster-General, assisted by a Staff Officer, who will be appointed from the Permanent Forces of the Dominion. The administrative duties in peace will be performed by an officer of the Headquarters Staff under the Quartermaster-General.

Requisitions for Service.

725. In peace time requisitions for the services of New Zealand Forces Motor Reserve Officers will be forwarded direct by O.C. Districts to the Quartermaster-General, Headquarters, New Zealand Defence Forces, Wellington.

Conditions of Service.

726. (a.) Gentlemen accepting commissions in the New Zealand Forces Motor Reserve must possess a thoroughly efficient motor-car and a good practical knowledge of it. They will be required to perform seven days' duty annually (consecutively or otherwise as required, or as fourteen half-days) if called upon. Their duties will be entirely in connection with the Headquarters and District Staffs of the Defence Forces. Officers will be asked to perform duty as far as possible in the neighbourhood in which they reside.

(b.) Officers of the New Zealand Forces Motor Reserve must be between the ages of twenty-one and fifty-nine inclusive. They will be placed on the Retired List at the age of sixty.

Eligibility for Appointment.

727. Commissioned officers of the Permanent Forces, Territorial Force, Senior Cadets, and compulsory members of Rifle Clubs will not be eligible for appointment to the corps. Reserve officers and members of Rifle Clubs over the age-limit for service with the Territorial Force will, however, be eligible.

Dress.

728. The uniform to be worn will be as laid down in the New Zealand Dress Regulations. Officers must provide themselves with Service Dress only, the provision of other uniform being optional.

Absence from New Zealand.

729. Officers who will be absent from New Zealand or in any way prevented from performing their duties must inform the Officer Commanding the District to that effect, in writing.

Pay.

730. Officers shall receive the following rates of pay applicable to Territorial Officers of their rank, when called upon for duty, but only half these rates if called out for a half-day's tour of duty (see para. 731), viz. :—

Lieutenant-Colonel, at the rate of 15s. per diem.	
Major,	12s. "
Captain,	10s. "
Lieutenant,	8s. "

Allowance for Use of Cars.

731. (1.) Allowances will be granted to officers as follows in connection with their employment on duty in peace time :—

- Class "A," cars of not less than 20 horse-power and 26 cwt. in weight, having seating capacity for four persons (including driver), 40s. per diem.
- Class "B," cars of under 20 horse-power or under 26 cwt. in weight, having seating capacity for four persons (including driver), 37s. 6d. per diem.
- Class "C," cars of not less than 10 horse-power having seating capacity for one or two persons in addition to driver, 30s. per diem.

(2.) An officer may also be called out for a half-day's tour of duty, when half the above rates only will be paid. A half-day's tour of duty will not exceed five hours.

(3.) This allowance must cover all expenses, including wear and tear, cost of petrol and lubricating oil, cost of repairs, ferry tolls, &c. Days on which out and home journeys only are performed do not count for the daily allowance unless the total mileage for these journeys exceeds twenty-five miles, when an extra day's pay (para. 730) will be paid.

Precedence.

732. Officers of the New Zealand Forces Motor Reserve take precedence as follows: (1) For the purposes of command, with their unit only; (2) for purposes other than command, according to the date of their seniority in the Territorial Force.

Discipline.

733. Officers of the New Zealand Forces Motor Reserve will be subject to the regulations relating to discipline which are in force for the Territorial Force.

Forms.

734. All claims for payments, authorization of payments, and reports of duty performed must be forwarded, on the special forms authorized by the Officer Commanding the District, direct to the Permanent Staff Officer administering the corps, at Headquarters, Wellington, who will, if satisfied

that they are correct, forward them to the Quartermaster-General for approval.

Examination.

735. There will be no examination for promotion in connection with the Motor Reserve, and first appointments will be recommended by the General Officer Commanding, New Zealand Military Forces, in ranks suitable to the ages of applicants. Promotions will be subsequently made in the Motor Reserve as vacancies in the establishment of the various ranks occur.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

TWO scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maori boys not over sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination: the other, to be called the junior scholarship, is open to all Maori boys under fourteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have attended a Native school or schools under the control of the Education Department, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The scholarships are open to Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Appendix to the Native Schools Code, 1908. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 8th and 9th of December, 1913.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted so as to reach the Department not later than the 30th of September, 1913.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be obtained from teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions, the Secretaries to Education Boards, or the Secretary for Education, Wellington.

Small-pox.—Notice regulating Movements of Maoris.

Department of Public Health, Hospitals,
and Charitable Aid, Wellington.

WHEREAS certain places situated in Auckland, Wellington, and Hawke's Bay Health Districts are, or are supposed to be, infected with a dangerous infectious disease, to wit, small-pox: And whereas the said disease is specially prevalent amongst the Maoris and half-caste Maoris residing in the said districts:

Now, therefore, I, Thomas Harcourt Ambrose Valintine, Chief Health Officer under the Public Health Act, 1908, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 18 of the said Act, and acting under the authority of His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, do hereby until further notice forbid Maoris or half-caste Maoris to be brought by means of the New Zealand Government railways from any place situated within the Auckland, Wellington, and Hawke's Bay Health Districts to any other place situated within any of the said districts, or from any place situated in the said Auckland, Wellington, or Hawke's Bay Health Districts to any other place in New Zealand, unless such Maori or half-caste Maori produces a certificate under the hand of an officer of the Public Health Department, or under the hand of a Public Vaccinator, authorizing him or her to travel upon the said railways.

VANCOUVER ISLAND.—EAST COAST.—SAANICH INLET.—SEANUS ISLAND.—LIGHT ESTABLISHED.—The Canadian Government has given notice that an unwatched *intermittent white acetylene* light has been established on Senanus Island, Saanich Inlet, east coast of Vancouver Island.

Passing in any branch of Drawing at the certificate examination of January under the circumstances herein stated will exempt a candidate from further examination in the same branch under the requirements for a teacher's certificate. A similar exemption will also be granted to successful candidates at the November examination who pass the examination in Drawing I or Drawing II with credit, obtaining not less than 60 per cent. of the maximum marks assignable in each case.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 570, against 621 in May—a decrease of 51. The deaths in June were 242—a decrease of 16 as compared with last month. Of the total deaths, males contributed 131, females 111. Forty-seven of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 19.42 per cent. of the whole number; 41 of these were under one year of age.

There were 92 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 90 in May. The following table shows the classification:—

Taranaki Painters and Decorators.—Recommendation of Conciliation Council.

Under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments.

(No. 16.—Taranaki Industrial District.)

In the matter of an industrial dispute between the Taranaki Painters and Decorators' Industrial Union of Workers, applicants, and Bellringer Bros. (Limited) and others, respondents, and of a reference thereof for hearing by a Council of Conciliation.

THE following recommendation of the Council of Conciliation appointed for the hearing of the above-mentioned dispute is published in accordance with the provisions of subsection (4) of section 43 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act, 1908.

RECOMMENDATION.

Minimum Rate of Wages.

1. ALL journeymen painters, paperhangers, glaziers, grainers, decorators, and all other journeymen working at any branch of the trade (except those hereinafter provided) shall be paid not less than 1s. 3d. per hour.

Hours of Labour.

2. The hours of labour for all journeymen and apprentices employed at any branch of the trade shall be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on five days of the week, and from 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays, from the 1st day of September to the 30th day of April (both inclusive), one hour to be allowed each day for dinner (Saturdays excepted); and from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of August (both inclusive) the hours of labour shall be from 8 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. on five days of the week, and from 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays, half an hour to be allowed each day for dinner (Saturdays excepted).

Holidays.

3. No work shall be done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, and day of Painters' Annual Picnic, or before or after the hours specified in clause 2 hereof.

Payment of Wages.

4. All wages shall be paid weekly or fortnightly on Friday or Saturday either on the job or at the employer's place of business for town or suburban work, but wherever paid payment shall commence within fifteen minutes after leaving off work. Workers employed on country jobs may make mutual arrangements with their employers in respect to the time and method of paying wages.

Apprentices.

5. The number of apprentices shall be limited to one to every three journeymen or fraction of three.

6. The period of apprenticeship shall be five years.

7. An employer before taking a youth as an apprentice shall be entitled to engage him for three months on probation. If at the end of such time the youth becomes apprenticed such period of three months shall be reckoned as part of his period of apprenticeship.

8. An employer on taking an apprentice shall give notice thereof, and the name of the apprentice, to the Inspector of Factories within one week after the period of probation, and an employer transferring an apprentice to another employer shall also, within one week thereof, give notice of such transfer to such Inspector.

9. The wages to be paid to apprentices shall be as follows: During the first year of their apprenticeship, not less than 10s. per week; during the second year, not less than 15s. per week; during the third year, not less than £1 per week; during the fourth year, not less than £1 5s. per week; during the fifth year, not less than £1 10s. per week. When employed upon country work the apprentice shall be paid such wages for all overtime worked

as may be agreed upon, but not less than the rates herein mentioned, and shall also be then provided with food and sleeping-accommodation by the employer free of cost.

10. Any employer taking an apprentice to learn the trade shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award. The obligation of the apprentice to serve his employer shall also be a duty enforceable under this award.

11. At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the apprenticeship wish for any valid reason to dispense with the services of the apprentice he shall give him a certificate for the time served, and procure him another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, who shall continue to teach the apprentice, pay him the rates prescribed in this award according to the total length of time he has served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer; provided that it shall not be obligatory on the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him; but the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate covering the time actually served.

12. When the apprentice is discharged for a cause, the employer shall send notice of the discharge and the cause thereof to the Inspector of Factories.

13. An employer shall not be deemed to have discharged his duty to his apprentice if he fails to keep him at work owing to slackness of trade, but such slackness may form a proper ground for transferring him to an employer willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him. All time lost by an apprentice through his sickness or default may be deducted from his wages.

14. Existing arrangements with and relating to indentured apprentices now serving an employer may continue, provided that any employer wishing such arrangements to continue shall forward the names of his present apprentices to the Inspector of Factories within one month after the filing of this award.

15. Existing arrangements with and relating to apprentices now serving an employer may continue, provided that any employer wishing such arrangements to continue shall forward, in writing, the names of the apprentices and the conditions of their apprenticeship now existing to the Inspector of Factories for the district. This clause shall only apply to apprentices who have been in their employer's service prior to the 28th May, 1913.

Country Work.

16. "Country work" means work performed by a worker which necessitates his lodging elsewhere than at his usual place of residence.

17. Any journeyman employed upon country work shall be conveyed by his employer to and from work free of charge, or his expenses going to and returning from such work shall be paid by such employer, but once only during the continuance of the work, if such work is continuous and the journeyman or apprentice is not in the meantime recalled by his employer. An apprentice when engaged in country work shall, in addition to his travelling-expenses, be provided with suitable board and lodging at the employer's cost.

18. Any journeyman working on country work shall be allowed to work any hours that may be mutually agreed upon between employer and employee, provided that not less than 1s. 4½d. per hour is paid for such time worked and an additional allowance of 1s. 6d. per day for all working-days.

Incompetent Workmen.

19. Any journeyman who considers himself not capable of earning the minimum wage may be paid such less wages as shall from time to time be agreed upon in writing between such journeyman and the chairman and secretary of the union, and, in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such journeyman has applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage shall be so agreed upon, as shall be fixed in writing by the Inspector of Awards for the industrial district upon the application of such journeyman after twenty-four hours' notice in writing to the secretary of the union, who shall, if

desired by him, be heard by such Inspector on such application. Such permit shall be for such period, not exceeding six months, as such persons shall determine: Provided that in the case of any person whose wage is so fixed by reason of old age or permanent disability it may be fixed for such longer period as such persons may think fit.

Brushware.

20. Employers shall provide all brushware, except duster and paperhangers' laying-on brush, and shall also supply apprentices with one set of tools during their term of apprenticeship.

Suburban Work.

21. Work done over two miles from the post-office of the district, but which does not come within the definition of country work, shall be considered suburban work, and journeymen and apprentices employed thereon shall be allowed and paid for time reasonably occupied by them in walking from the employer's place of business to and from such work, or they shall be conveyed to and from such work at the cost of their employer. Half an hour to be allowed for such walking by the worker or conveyance by the employer before any travelling-time shall be payable.

22. Workers shall be at their employer's place of business at the hour appointed for the commencing of work, but if previously required to do so they shall proceed direct to the place appointed for the commencement of work.

Piecework.

23. No journeyman shall be allowed to perform piecework.

24. When any worker engages in any branch of the trade on his own account covered by this award he shall cease to belong to the Taranaki Painters and Decorators' Industrial Union of Workers, and shall not be readmitted a member until after the expiration of three months from the completion of his last job.

Preference.

25. If any employer shall hereafter engage any worker who shall not be a member of the union, and who within one week after his engagement shall not become and remain a member of the union, the employer shall dismiss such worker from his service if requested to do so by the union, provided there is then a member of the union equally qualified to perform the particular work required to be done, and ready and willing to undertake the same.

26. Whenever an employer shall employ any worker who is not a member of the union he shall, within forty-eight hours thereafter, give notice in writing of such employment to the secretary of the union.

27. The provisions of the foregoing clause shall operate only if and so long as the rules of the union shall permit any journeyman painter and paperhanger of good character and sober habits to become a member of the union upon payment of an entrance fee not exceeding 5s., upon a written or verbal application, without ballot or other election, and to continue a member upon payment of subsequent contributions not exceeding 6d. per week.

28. It shall be the duty of every non-unionist to join the union when called upon to do so by the secretary.

Scope of Award.

29. This award shall apply to all employers carrying on business in the Taranaki Industrial District.

Term of Award.

30. One year.

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SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
