Conditions governing the Admission of New Zealand Meat into the United States of America.—Notice No. 1713.

Department of Agriculture, Industries, and Commerce, Wellington, 31st July, 1913. FFICIAL intimation has been received from the

FFICIAL intimation has been received from the United States Government that the system of meatinspection in force in New Zealand satisfies the requirements of that country, and that New Zealand meat will in future be admitted into the United States without further sanitary restrictions, provided that each carcase is stamped on the four quarters with indelible ink indicating that it has passed inspection, and provided further that carcases are accompanied by certificate tags endorsed by the New Zealand Inspector, and reading as follows:—

"This meat has been examined by me and by arter and

"This meat has been examined by me, and by ante- and post-mortem veterinary inspection is found to be free from disease and suitable in every way for human consumption; and the meat has not been treated with chemical preservatives or other foreign substances injurious to health."

The Department of Agriculture, Industries, and Commerce of this Dominion will make the necessary arrangements to meet the United States requirements, and on notification being made to it by exporters of meat to that country will specially stamp the carcases. Approved certificate tags containing the wording prescribed by the United States authorities must be supplied by exporters, as in the case of meat exported to other countries.

## RECOMMENDATION.

## Hours of Work.

1. Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work. The time shall be worked between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on the first five days of the week, and between 7.30 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

Where it is considered advisable by the employers to observe the statutory half-holiday in lieu of Saturday, they may do so provided that notice in writing is given to the local Inspector of Factories.

#### Wages.

2. (a.) The minimum wage to be paid to journeymen cabinetmakers, upholsterers, chair and frame makers, machinists, wood-carvers, turners, polishers, picture-framers, and furniture packers

shall be 1s.  $4\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

(b.) Upholsterers' work shall include all kinds of bedding,

planning and laying of new carpets and lindeums.

(c.) Wages to be paid weekly on the employer's premises.

(d.) One hour's notice to be given on either side before dismissal or leaving employment, and in such case wages shall be paid immediately.

## Overtime and Holidays.

3. (a.) All time worked in excess of eight hours per day on five days of the week, or in excess of four hours on the day of the half-holiday, shall count as overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours, time and a half thereafter up to 10 p.m., and double time between 10 p.m. and the ordinary time for commencing work next morning, if worked continously.

(b.) For work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, or the

birthday of the reigning Sovereign double time shall be paid.

(c.) Where Labour Day or any other holiday in the above list is not generally observed within the district over which it is intended this award shall apply, any other day may be substituted for any of the above-mentioned holidays, provided that it is mutually arranged beforehand between the employers and their employees.

(d.) No overtime shall be charged until forty-four hours for the week have been worked, provided that the time lost in any one week is lost by the workman by his own default or on his own account.

## Classes of Workers.

4. Journeymen and apprentices shall alone be recognized, subject nevertheless to the liberty to employ boys on certain work hereinafter set forth and to the provisions as to under-rate work-

## Apprentices.

5. (a.) Any employer taking an apprentice to learn the trade shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall pay such apprentice not less than the undermentioned rate of wages-namely,

for each and every week of the first year, 8s.; for each and every week of the second year, 12s.; for each and every week of the third year, 16s.; for each and every week of the fourth year, £1 1s.; for each and every week of the fifth year, £1 8s. 6d. The proportion of apprentices to journeymen shall not exceed one to every three journeymen or fraction of any three employed in the branch of the trade to which such apprentice is apprenticed.

(b.) For the purpose of determining the number of apprentices, the number of journeymen to be taken into account must have been employed by the employer in the department of the branch of the trade to which the apprentice is apprenticed for at least two-thirds full time for the twelve months preceding the taking of the

apprentice.

(c.) The period of apprenticeship shall be five years, but three months' probation shall be allowed the employer of any apprentice to determine his fitness, such three months to be included in the period of apprenticeship. No boy shall be allowed to serve probation to more than two employers. The obligation of the apprentice to serve his employer shall be deemed to be a duty enforceable under this award.

(d.) When an apprentice has completed four years of his apprenticeship the employer shall be at liberty to employ extra apprentices in the proportion of one to every three or fraction of

the first three apprentices who have served four years.

- (e.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the apprenticeship wish for any reason to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he shall give him a certificate for the time served, and procure him another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, who will continue to teach the apprentice, to pay him the wages prescribed by this award according to the total length of time he has served, and generally to perform the obliga-tions of the original employer: Provided that it shall not be obligatory upon an employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall give him a certificate covering the time actually served.
- (f.) An employer taking an apprentice shall give notice thereof and of the name of the apprentice to the Inspector of Factories within one week after the expiration of the period of probation, and an employer transferring an apprentice to another employer shall similarly, within one week thereof, give notice of such transfer to such Inspector.
- (g.) An employer shall not be deemed to discharge his duty towards his apprentice if he fails to keep him at work owing to slackness of work, but such slackness may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him, notwithstanding that such employer may have his full number of apprentices; but no employer shall be permitted to employ more than one such apprentice in each branch.

(h.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice of the discharge and the cause thereof to the

Inspector of Factories.

(i.) All time lost by an apprentice through his own default in any year of his apprenticeship shall be made up by such apprentice before he shall be considered to have entered upon the next succeeding year of his apprenticeship, and the total period of his apprenticeship shall be extended by a period equal to such lost

## General Conditions.

- 6. (a.) All travelling-expenses and time when travelling are to be paid by the employer. Time occupied in travelling shall be paid for at ordinary rates, but no journeyman shall be paid more than an ordinary day's wage for any day occupied by him in travelling, although the hours so occupied by him may exceed eight, unless he is on the same day occupied in working for his employer.

  (b.) Each employer shall provide and keep a suitable number
- of benches, cramps, glue-pots, and glue-brushes, and a suitable grindstone for the number of men employed.
  7. No piecework shall be permitted.

8. No man or apprentice shall make or assist in the production of goods for sale on his own account, or for another employer, while in the full-time employment of any employer.

## Preference.

9. If and so long as the rules of the union shall permit any person now employed in the trade in this industrial district, and any person who may hereafter reside in this industrial district, and is a competent journeyman, or a worker entitled to an underrate permit, to become a member of such union upon payment of an entrance fee not exceeding 5s., and of subsequent contributions, whether payable weekly or not, not exceeding 6d. per week, upon a written application of the person so desiring to join the union, without ballot or other election, then and in such case the employer shall, when engaging workmen, employ members of the union in preference to non-members, provided there are members of the union equally qualified with non-members to perform the particular work required to be done, and ready and willing to undertake it. When a non-unionist workman is engaged by an employer in consequence of the union being unable to supply a workman of equal ability willing to undertake the work, at any time within twelve weeks thereafter the union shall have the right to supply a man equally capable of performing the work, provided the workman first engaged declines to become a member of the union. This provision shall also apply to those non-union workmen already employed. This clause shall not apply to any employers who carry on business solely as builders and contractors.

10. No employer shall discriminate against members of the union, and no employer shall, in the employment or dismissal of any person or in the conduct of his business, do anything for the purpose of injuring the union, whether directly or indirectly.

11. When members of the union and non-members are employed together there shall be no distinction between members and non-members, and both shall work together in harmony and shall receive equal pay for equal work.

## Under-rate Workers.

- 12. (a.) Any worker who considers himself incapable of earning the minimum wage fixed in paragraph 2 hereof may be paid such lower wage as may from time to time be fixed, on the application of the employee, after twenty-four hours' notice to the union, by the local Inspector of Factories, or such other person as the Court may from time to time appoint for that purpose; and such Inspector or person in fixing such wage shall have regard to the worker's capability, his past earnings, and such other circumstances as such Inspector or person may think fit to consider after hearing such argument and evidence as the union and the employer shall offer.
- (b.) Whenever occasion arrives for so fixing an employee's wage it shall be so fixed for such period, not exceeding six months, as such Inspector or other person shall determine; provided that in the case of any person whose wage is so fixed by reason of old age or permanent disability it may be fixed for such longer period as such Inspector or other person may think fit.

(c.) Notwithstanding the foregoing, it shall be competent for an employee to agree with the president or secretary of the union upon

such wage without having the same so fixed.

(d.) It shall be the duty of the union to give notice to the Inspector of Factories of every agreement made with an employee pursuant hereto.

(e.) It shall be the duty of an employer, before employing a man at such lower wage, to examine the permit or agreement by which such wage is fixed.

## Employment of Boys.

13. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to prevent the employment of boys at such wages as the employer may think fit for the purpose of stacking timber, boiling off and attending to glue, making dowels, helping to cramp, teasing flax, hair, kapok, flock, and feathers, cleaning up workshop, and general messages.

## Scope of Award.

14. This award shall apply to employers carrying on business as cabinetmakers, upholsterers, chair and frame makers, wood-carvers, turners, polishers, picture-framers, and furniture packers within the Industrial District of Taranaki, but shall not apply to the manufacture of wickerwork or wire mattresses.

15. This award shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Court, and shall continue in force until the 7th day of December, 1914.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

TWO scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. 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The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):-
