The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 606, against 577 in July—an increase of 29. The deaths in August were 238—a decrease of 45 as compared with last month. Of the total deaths males contributed 140, females 98. Forty-one of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 17.23 per cent. of the whole number; 32 of these were under one year of age.

There were 94 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 124 in July. The following table shows the classification:—

Now, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it now, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vessed in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, and section 4 of the Local Bodies' Loans Amendment Act, 1910, the Franklin County Council hereby resolve that, for the purpose of providing moneys sufficient to cover the interest and sinking fund in respect of such loan (namely, £150), the said Franklin County Council hereby make and levy a special said Franklin County Council hereby make and levy a special rate of 1/24th of a penny in the pound upon the rateable value of all rateable properties of the Waiau Ward Special-rating Area (as defined when the poll was taken); and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the first day of November in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of 36 years and a half, or until such loan is fully paid off.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

TOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are Laught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):-

- 1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
 Children who have lost their hearing after having
- learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine. involves liability to a fine.
