WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amend-W ment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except

under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act:

And whereas the Christchurch City Council (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect electric lines in the City of Christchurch, and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain, for lighting, heating, and power purposes within the City of Christchurch as at present constituted, the electric lines indicated by red lines on the plan marked P.W.D. 30871, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District, and such further lines as may from time to time be required within further lines as may from time to time be required within the said city.

SCHEDULE.

In the following conditions—
 "Minister" means the Minister of Public Works.
 "Council" means the Christchurch City Council.
 "Inspecting Engineer" means the engineer or other officer appointed by the Minister of Public Works

officer appointed by the Minister of Public Works for the purpose of inspecting the works to be constructed or maintained under this license.

"Telegraph" includes telephone.

"Pressure" means difference of electric potential between any two conductors through which supply of energy is given, or between any part of either conductor and the earth.

"Earthed" applied to any conductor means that such conductor shall be so connected to the general mass of earth as to ensure at all times an immediate and

of earth as to ensure at all times an immediate and

of earth as to ensure at all times an immediate and safe discharge to earth of electric energy.

"Electric line" means any wire, wires, conductor, or other means used for conveying, transmitting, or distributing electricity for power, lighting, or heating purposes, and includes any instrument, insulator, casing, tubing, pipe, covering, or post enclosing or supporting an electric line or anything connected therewith therewith.

therewith.

"Electric telegraph line" means any wire, wires, or cables belonging to the Post and Telegraph Department, or erected under authority granted by the Minister of Post and Telegraph Department.

"Consumer's wires" means any electric lines on the consumer's premises which are connected with the Council's electric lines.

"Distribution line or lines" means the portion of any

"Distribution line or lines" means the portion of any line from which service wires are connected for the purpose of supplying consumers.
"Street" includes road.

SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

2. Electrical energy shall be supplied to private consumers

on one of the following systems:—

(a.) Direct-current two-wire or three-wire systems, at a pressure not exceeding 460 volts across the outers or 230 volts between each outer and the neutral wire.

(6.) Three - phase four - wire system, at a frequency of 50 cycles per second, and at a pressure not exceeding 400 volts between phases or 230 volts between each phase wire and the neutral wire.

(c.) Three-phase three-wire system, at a frequency of 50 cycles per second, and at a pressure not exceeding 11,000 volts between phases.

In addition to the above system of private supply, street lighting may be supplied on either of the systems "a" and "b" above, or on a constant-current series system at a voltage not exceeding 3,300 volts.

NEUTRAL WIRES TO BE EARTHED.

3. The neutral wires of both direct and three-phase systems shall be efficiently insulated throughout their length, and each neutral system shall be earthed at the switchboard or transformer only.

REGULATION OF PRESSURE.

4. The pressure shall be maintained within 4 per cent. above or below the declared pressure at the consumers' terminals. The Council shall maintain a suitable recording voltmeter, and, on complaint by any consumer that the variations in voltage exceed these limits, or on the instructions of the Inspecting Engineer, the Council shall connect a recording

voltmeter to record the pressure between the lines at their entrance to the consumers' premises, and shall supply to the Inspecting Engineer a chart showing the variations in voltage between the lines at this point for a period of seven consecutive days. If the variations thus recorded exceed the above limits, the Council shall take immediate steps to comply with this regulation. If after thirty days a similar chart shows that the above limits of variation in voltage are not complied with, a breach of these regulations shall be deemed to have been committed. If the accuracy of the Council's recording voltmeter is questioned by the consumer, a standard instru-ment shall be supplied by the Inspecting Engineer, the read-ings of which shall be accepted as final.

SWITCHBOARD.

5. All switchboards shall be made of and mounted on material that is not inflammable, and no switchboard conducmaterial that is not inflammable, and no switchboard conduc-tor shall carry electric current at a density exceeding one thou-sand amperes per square inch. No conductor at a pressure above 600 volts shall be exposed on the front of any switch-board, and the back of any switchboard carrying exposed conductors at a pressure over 600 volts shall be screened off and accessible only to authorized persons.

CIRCUIT-BREAKERS.

6. All outgoing feeders and distributors from any power-house or sub-station shall be provided with automatic circuit-breakers or fuses, set to open circuit at 50 per cent. excess current over the rated full load of such feeder or distributor, with a time-limit not exceeding ten seconds.

DISTRIBUTION.

7. The distribution may be carried out either by underground ${\bf r}$ or overhead conductors, provided that if at any time it is deemed by the Minister to be detrimental to the public safety for the conductors or any particular class of conductors to be overhead they shall, on receipt of notification to that effect from the Minister, and within ten months of such noti-fication, be laid underground, and all consequent and neces-sary alterations made by and at the cost of the Council.

OVERHEAD ELECTRIC LINES.

8. Overhead electric lines at a pressure of 460 volts or less shall be of stranded hard-drawn copper, aluminium, or other shall be of stranded hard-drawn copper, aluminium, or other material of not less than 0129 square inches in section, provided that service wires of short span may be not less than 0072 square inches. The lines shall be covered throughout with triple braiding thoroughly impregnated with weather-proofing compound, provided that where circumstances permit the lines may, with the consent of the Minister, be bare.

Electric lines at a pressure exceeding 460 volts shall be insulated, and may be either laid underground or carried overhead. If carried overhead the electric lines shall be insulated with vulcanized indiarubber of 600 megohm grade, or lead-covered and suspended from bearer-wires: provided

that where circumstances permit, consent of the Minister may be obtained to such electric lines being bare and carried overhead. The sheathing of lead-covered cables and all bearerwires shall be earthed.

The stress in overhead conductors shall not exceed 25,000 lb. per square inch for copper and 12,000 lb. per square inch for aluminium in the extreme case of a temperature of 20° Fahr. and a wind-pressure of 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane occurring simultaneously. The span between supports and the sag shall be determined to conform with the above limiting stresses, provided that the span shall not exceed 200 ft.

No overhead electric lines shall come within 2 ft. of any other aerial wires or cables except where it may be permitted to pass either wires between other wires at a pole or support.

SUPPORTS FOR OVERHEAD ELECTRIC LINES.

9. All overhead electric lines at a pressure not exceeding 460 volts shall be carried at a minimum height of 18 ft. abov

the ground.

All overhead electric lines at a pressure over 460 volts shall be carried at a minimum height of 22 ft. above the

Series street-lighting wires insulated with 600-megohm grade indiarubber may be carried at a minimum height of

18 ft. above the ground.

All aerial wires shall be attached to suitable insulators, carried on cross-arms of suitable material and cross-section, carried on cross-arms of subable material and cross-section, and they shall be so attached to the insulators or guarded that they cannot fall away from the support. Conductors, covered with insulating material, shall be so attached that their insulation shall not be impaired where they are secured to the insulator.

Every support for an aerial line shall be of durable material, and properly strengthened against forces due to wind-pressure,

change of direction of line, and unequal length of span. The factor of safety of such supports shall be at least three if of iron, steel, or reinforced concrete, and four if of wood, taking into consideration all possible stresses, including wind-pressure at 30 lb. per square foot on plane surfaces and 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane for cylindrical surfaces.

LOCATION OF OVERHEAD LINES.

10. Except by permission of the Minister of Telegraphs, or subject to an agreement between the Post and Telegraph Department and the Council, all overhead electric-light pole lines shall be placed on the opposite side of the street to that on which any telegraph lines exist; and where the erection of the electric-light wires necessitates the alteration of any existing telegraph wires, and such alteration is approved by the Minister of Telegraphs, the expense of the

proved by the Minister of Telegraphs, the expense of the alteration shall be borne by the Council.

Where electric lines are on one side of a street and electric telegraph lines on the other, and service is required to be given from either to the other side of the street, the Council and the Minister of Telegraphs shall give to each other reasonable facilities as far as possible to effect supply.

In running the lines authorized by this license through streets where no telegraph line exists the Council shall keep to the one side of the street, and in running wires to the opposite side of the street the Council shall arrange so as to interfere as little as possible with the route on that side of any future telegraph line.

TELEGRAPH AND TELEPHONE WIRE CROSSINGS.

11. Where electric lines are permitted to be supported on telegraph poles, all details of the support and of the insulation of the adjacent spans shall be approved by the Minister of Telegraphs, who may require such electric lines at any time to be removed from such telegraph poles, on reasonable notice and without compensation of any description.

time to be removed from such telegraph poles, on reasonable notice and without compensation of any description.

Where overhead electric lines at a pressure not exceeding 460 volts cross telegraph lines the electric lines shall be protected for the crossing-span with a triple covering of jute braiding and thoroughly compounded. Where overhead electric lines at high or extra high pressure cross telegraph lines, the electric lines shall be subject to special conditions to be imposed by the Minister of Telegraphs in each case of such crossing.

to be imposed by the Minister of relegraphs in care case of such crossing.

The cost of all necessary guard-wires and special provisions required to comply with this clause, or deemed to be necessary as a protection to telegraph wires generally, shall be borne by the Council, whether the telegraph lines are erected before or after the electric lines. In the latter case the Council, on receipt of notice from the local officer of the Telegraph Department that it is proposed to run a telegraph Telegraph Department that it is proposed to run a telegraph line along the route, shall forthwith make the necessary changes required to comply with this clause at any points at which electric lines already cross such routes.

RAILWAY CROSSINGS.

12. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government railways until the Board has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto, as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).

SERVICE CONNECTIONS TO OVERHEAD LINES.

13. Service lines from aerial lines shall be taken from insulators, and shall not be tapped off between insulators. They shall be led as directly as possible to insulators firmly attached to some portion of the consumer's premises, which is not accessible to any person without the use of a ladder or other special appliance. Every portion of any service line which is outside a building and accessible therefrom shall be rubber-insulated.

MAINTENANCE.

14. Every aerial line, including its supports, its conductors, and their insulating covering, and all structural parts and electric appliances and devices belonging to or connected with the line, shall be duly and efficiently maintained by the Council as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions.

TRANSFORMERS.

15. Transformers shall be placed either on poles or in substations. The cases of all transformers shall be earthed by means of a copper conductor at least 022 square inch in section. Within sub-stations all high-tension conductors shall be thoroughly insulated or protected from accidental contact, the walls shall be lined with plaster, sheet asbestos, or other insulating material, a substantial insulating rubber mat and rubber gloves shall be supplied, and the sub-station shall be entirely inaccessible to unauthorized persons entirely inaccessible to unauthorized persons.

LIGHTNING-ARRESTERS.

16. Where any portion of an electric line or any support for an electric line is exposed to such a position as to be liable to injury from lightning, it shall be efficiently protected against such liability.

Underground Conductors.

17. Underground conductors shall be thoroughly insulated, 17. Underground conductors shall be thoroughly insulated, and shall be protected from mechanical damage by a wooden boxing or earthenware or stoneware conduit. They shall be laid, wherever possible, under the footpaths, and with a cover of at least 12 in. from the surface of the pavement. Where laid under the roadway this cover shall be increased to 2 ft. All conduits, pipes, easings, and street boxes used as receptacles for electric lines shall be constructed of durable material, and shall be of ample strength to prevent damage from heavy

and shall be of ample strength to prevent damage from heavy traffic, and reasonable means shall be taken to prevent the

accumulation of gas in such receptacles.

Where any underground line crosses or is in proximity to any metallic substance, special precaution shall be taken against the possibility of any electrical charging of the metallic substance from the line, or from any metallic conduit pipe or spins and soins and single the line. casing enclosing the line.

EARTHING CONDUITS.

18. All underground metal conduits, pipes, or casings containing an electric line shall be efficiently earthed, and shall be so jointed and connected across all street boxes and other openings as to make good electrical contact throughout their whole length.

STREET BOXES

19. The covers of street boxes shall be so secured that they cannot be opened except by means of a special appliance. Street boxes shall be either filled solid with cable compound or, if not so filled, shall be inspected from time to time for the presence of gas, and suitable action shall be taken to check its influx and accumulation.

INSULATION OF ELECTRIC MAINS.

20. Every main, either overhead or underground, shall be

20. Every main, either overhead or underground, shall be tested for insulation after having been placed in position and before it is used for the purposes of supply, the testing pressure being at least 500 volts; and the Council shall duly record the results of the tests of each main or section of a main, and forthwith forward a report thereof to the Resident Engineer of the Public Works Department at Christchurch.

The insulation of every complete circuit used for the supply of energy, including all machinery, apparatus, and devices forming part of or in connection with such circuit, shall be so maintained that the leakage current shall not under any conditions exceed one-thousandth part of the maximum supply current. Every leakage shall be remedied by the Council without delay. Every such circuit shall be tested for insulation at least once in every week, and the Council shall duly record the results of the tests, and forward a report thereof at the end of each month to the Resident Engineer of the Public Works Department at Christchurch.

CONTINUITY OF SUPPLY.

21. From and after the time when the Council commences to supply energy in pursuance of this license, it shall maintain continuously sufficient power for the use of all the consumers continuously sufficient power for the use of all the consumers for the time being entitled to be supplied, provided that, for any purposes connected with the efficient working of the undertaking, the Minister may give permission to the Council to discontinue the supply at such intervals of time and for such periods as he may think expedient. When the supply is so discontinued, public notice shall be given, when practicable of such discontinuance, and of the probable duration thereof. thereof.

SUPPLY TO CONSUMERS.

22. The owner or occupier of any premises within the area of supply included in the license shall be entitled to a supply of electrical energy on the following conditions:

(a.) If such premises are situated within 60 ft. of the boundary of any street in which an electric line belonging to the Council exists the service shall be made free of cost

- (b.) If such premises are more than 60 ft. distant from such street boundary, the Council shall run the necessary service mains for a distance of 60 ft. free of charge, and the consumer shall pay the cost of the service wires for the balance of the distance, such payment not exceeding 1s. per foot of
- (c.) If the plant or mains of the Council are insufficient to supply the applicant with electrical energy the service may, with the consent of the Minister, be postponed for a period not exceeding twelve months. Otherwise service shall be made within twenty-eight days of application.

(d.) Every consumer within any part of the area included in the license shall be entitled to a supply of electrical energy on the same terms on which any other consumer in such part of the area is entitled under similar circumstances to a corre-

of the area is entitled under similar circumstances to a corresponding supply.

(e.) If the nature of the proposed consumption of energy by any applicant is such as is likely to seriously interfere with the maintenance of a constant pressure on the lines in accordance with clause 4, the Council may, with the approval of the Minister, require the consumer to install such apparatus as shall enable the conditions of clause 4 to be complied

(f.) The Council may require services to be wired or installed by competent tradesmen, but no preference shall be given to services wired or installed by any individual con-

tractor or firm of contractors.

(e.) The charge for electrical energy if paid within fourteen (a.) The charge for electrical energy is paid within four ceed days of the rendering of a correct account shall not exceed an average rate of 6d. per unit for lighting purposes, and an average rate of 3d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes, provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting

purposes.

(h.) No meter rent shall be charged, but a minimum charge may be made monthly, independent of the consumption, not exceeding 2s. 6d. per K.W. or part of a K.W. of maximum capacity of each service. Where more than one meter is required to be installed in one building each meter shall, for the purpose of this clause, be considered an independent

(i.) If payment by the consumer is delayed more than thirty days after the date of rendering a correct account, the supply of electricity to such premises may be cut off without notice, and need not be restored until all arrears

are paid.

SERVICE CONNECTIONS.

23. The Council shall be responsible for all electric lines or wires, fittings, and apparatus belonging to it or under its control which may be upon a consumer's premises being maintained in a safe condition, and in all respects fit for supplying

energy.

In delivering the energy to a consumer's terminals the

Council shall exercise all due precautions, so as to avoid risk of causing fire on the premises.

A suitable safety-fuse or other automatic circuit-breaker shall be inserted in each service line within a consumer's premises as close as possible to the point of entry, and con-tained within a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fireproof construction.

All electric wires and apparatus on a consumer's premises, All electric wires and apparatus on a consumer's premises, except such parts as require to be earthed, shall be highly insulated, and suitable for the voltage at which the supply is given. They shall be thoroughly protected against injury to the insulation or access of moisture. All electric wires shall be so fixed and protected as to prevent the possibility of electrical discharge to any adjacent metallic substance.

Insulation on Consumer's Installation.

24. The Council shall not connect the wires and fittings on a 24. The Council shall not connect the wires and fittings on a consumer's premises with its mains, or, in the case of premises already connected, continue the supply from its mains, unless it is reasonably satisfied that the requirements of this license are complied with, that the wiring and fittings are suitable for the voltage at which supply is being given, that the installation generally is in accordance with the requirements of good practice, and that the connection or continuance of supply would not cause a leakage from those wires and fittings are exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises.

For the purpose of satisfying itself that the requirements of this license are being observed, in so far as they apply to wires on a consumer's premises, the Council may require that notice be served upon it of the intention to instal wires, fittings, lamps, motors, or other apparatus on any premises, and may inspect the same during any reasonable hours while the instal-

lation of such is in progress

TESTING CONSUMER'S INSTALLATION.

25. If the Council is reasonably satisfied, after making all proper examination by testing or otherwise, that the wiring and fittings are not suitable for the voltage being employed, or that a leakage exists at some part of a circuit of such extent that a leakage exists at some part of a circuit of such extent as to be a source of danger, and that such leakage does not exist at any part of the circuit belonging to the Council, or that any other requirements of this license are not being complied with, then and in such case any officer of the Council duly authorized by it in writing may, for the purpose of discovering whether the leakage exists at any part of a circuit within or upon any consumer's premises, or whether the wiring is suitable and the general requirements of the license are complied with, by notice require the consumer, at some reasonable time after the service of the notice, to permit him to inspect and to test the wires and fittings belonging to the consumer and forming part of the circuit.

If on such testing and inspection the officer discovers a

leakage from the consumer's wires exceeding one ten-thou-sandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises, or that the requirements of this license are not properly conformed to, or if the consumer does not give all due facilities for inspection and testing, the Council shall either not com-mence the supply or shall forthwith discontinue the supply of energy to the premises in question, giving immediate notice to the consumer of its reasons for not commencing or for discontinuing the supply; and in either case supply shall not be given until the Council is reasonably satisfied that the installation is in conformity with the requirements of this

If any consumer is dissatisfied with the action of the Council in refusing to give, or in discontinuing, or in not commencing the supply of energy to his premises, the wires and fittings of that consumer may, on his application to the Minister and on payment of the cost, be inspected and tested by the Inspecting

PLANS.

26. The Council shall, before the erection or construction of any part of the work hereby authorized is begun, submit for the approval of the Minister such plans and other informa-tion showing and describing such work as he may require. In the event of the Council at any time desiring to make alterations to the work involving a departure from the type of construction shown on the approved plans, it shall submit for the Minister's approval plans showing such type of con-struction as it is proposed to adopt, and with such approval the alterations may be carried out.

NOTICE REGARDING EXTENSIONS, ETC.

27. Before commencing the erection of any part of the lines 27. Before commencing the erection of any part of the lines hereby authorized, or the extension of any line already erected, the Council shall give at least seven days' notice in writing to the Resident Engineer of the Public Works Department in Christchurch, and also to the District Engineer of the Post and Telegraph Department in Christchurch, of its intention to carry out the work, and shall forward to the Minister of Public Works a locality plan showing the route of any extension.

NOTICE OF COMPLETION.

28. The Council shall, prior to the completion of the said works, or any separate pertion thereof, give to the Minister at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

COMMENCEMENT OF SUPPLY.

29. The Council shall not use any portion of the electric lines authorized by this license, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the Council that he has received from the Inspecting Engineer a certificate that the said works in respect of that portion have been satisfactorily carried out.

INSPECTION OF WORKS.

30. The Minister may at any time order an inspection to be made of the works, lines, and wires of the Council used for electric lighting, heating, and power purposes. If any defect is found to exist it must be remedied forthwith; and if, in the opinion of the officer or person inspecting, such default is serious the Minister may, on receipt of the report, direct the Council to at once cease transmitting energy either over the whole of the Council's line and wires or over any specified part thereof until such defect is repaired or remedied. The cost of such inspection shall be house by the Council. cost of such inspection shall be borne by the Council.

COMPLIANCE WITH CONDITIONS.

31. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the Council, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the same.

ASSIGNMENT.

32. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the Council without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

DEFAULT AND PENALTY.

33. If the Council fails to comply with any of the conditions 33. If the Council fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the Council within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice; but it shall not be held to have committed default for any failure to maintain power continuously if such failure is due to the breakdown of machinery or other accident, unless such breakdown or accident is proved to be due to negligence on the part of the Council; and if the Council fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period it shall be liable to a penalty of £20, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown. The recovery of a penalty under this license shall not affect the liability (if any) of the Council to pay or make compen-sation in respect of any damage or injury which may be caused by reason of the default.

REVOCATION OF LICENSE.

34. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the Council fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

PUBLIC WORKS, COMPENSATION, ETC.

35. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works; nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the Council for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section sixteen of the Plumbers Registration Act, 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth; and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall come into force on the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

REGULATIONS.

Examination and Registration.

1. (a.) THE Board shall from time to time, at intervals of not less than twelve months, hold, at such convenient places as the Board may decide, an examination of candidates for registration as plumbers under paragraph (a) of section 7

of the said Act.

(b.) The Board shall, by advertisement in such of the principal newspapers published in New Zealand as it thinks fit, give notice, not less than forty-two days beforehand, of the date and the places at which such examination will be

2. Every candidate must give notice in the form provided by the Board, and such notice must be sent so as to reach the Chairman of the Board at least twenty-eight days before the date of the examination at which the candidate wishes to present himself.

3. Such notice must be accompanied by evidence of the number of years of apprenticeship served by the candidate, or that he has been engaged in the plumbing trade for not less than seven years, and by the fee stated in Regulation 6 hereof.

4. The subjects in which a candidate shall be examined are those set out in the syllabus in the First Schedule hereto.

5. The examination shall consist of two parts-5. The examination shall consist of two parts—(a) by written answers to questions, for the answering of which not less than three hours shall be allowed; (b) a practical test of workmanship. The material for the practical test shall be supplied by the Board, but each candidate must provide his own tools. The examination may be passed in two parts or as a whole, but no candidate shall be allowed to present himself for the written examination until he has served at least five years of his apprenticeship, nor for the practical test until he has served an apprenticeship of six years, or has been engaged in the plumbing trade for not less than seven years. In no case may the practical test be taken prior to the written examination. the written examination.

6. (a.) The fee for examination or re-examination, including registration, shall be 17s. 6d. if taken as a whole, or 7s. 6d. for the written and 12s. 6d. for the practical if

taken in two parts.
(b.) The fee for registration under section 8 of the said Act shall be 5s., except where the candidate has passed an examination prescribed by the Board. The certificate of registration to be provided on payment of the fee shall be in pocket form, and worded as set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

(a.) The fee for the annual publication of the name of any registered person in the *Gazette* shall be 2s. 6d., and such fee shall entitle that registered person to a renewal of the pocket certificate referred to in Regulation 6 (b) hereof; provided that the previous certificate has been returned to the Board, or that it is proved to the satisfaction of the Board that same has been lost or destroyed.

(d.) The fee for a certificate under the hand of the Chief

Health Officer of the entry of the name of any person in the Register, pursuant to section 12 of the said Act, shall be 5s.
7. The form of certificate of having passed an examination under the said Act shall be that set out in the Third Schedule

8. Every person passing an examination under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate under Regulation 7 hereof without payment of any fee.

9. The districts or localities within which, after six months

from the date of the coming into force of these regulations, all sanitary plumbing shall be done by a person registered under the said Act, are as set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

APPEAL.

10. In the event of the Board refusing to cause the name of any person to be entered in the Register, or of the Board removing any person's name from the Register, the Board shall forthwith inform such person clearly of the reason for such refusal or removal.

11. Any person wishing to appeal under section 14 of the said Act shall give notice of appeal in the form set out in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

12. Within twenty-one days of receipt of such notice of appeal the Board shall inform the appellant of the name of the Magistrate before whom the appeal will be heard, and of the assessor appointed by the Board, and shall at the same time forward a copy of the Board's decision and the notice of appeal therefrom to such Magistrate.

13. The Magistrate and assessors shall hear and determine such appeal at such convenient place and time as may be

such appeal at such convenient place and time as may be decided by the Magistrate, to be not more than forty-two days from the receipt by the Board of the notice of appeal. At least five days' previous notice of such place and time shall be given to the assessors, the Board, and the appellant.

grasshopper, beetle, spider, caterpillar, creeper, or worm.

3. Not more than one bait shall be used in minnow fishing, and no minnow shall be used with more than four sets of triple hooks.

4. No flies shall be used in conjunction with a minnow.

5. No bare hooks shall be used.

6. Not more than three flies shall be used for fly-fishing on any one cast in the daytime, and not more than two at night, and no double-hooked flies shall be used, or lead used with flies.

7. No person shall use any other bait, or any method, device, or contrivance whatever, for the purpose of fishing, taking, catching, or killing trout except a rod and line, and a landing net or gaff for fish taken with rod and line.

8. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout, nor shall any of the baits above mentioned be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

9. No person shall take or attempt to take trout without a license, and every person taking or attempting to take trout shall, on demand of any Ranger, constable, or person producing a license, produce and show to such Ranger, con-stable, or license-holder his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching,

or killing trout.

10. Every trout not exceeding 9 in. in length from nose to tip of tail taken or caught by any person shall be immediately returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

11. Any person committing a breach of any of the above regulations is liable to a fine not exceeding £50.

Now, therefore, I, the undersigned, Benjamin Marcus Wilson, the General Manager of the said Department, in exercise of the powers given to local authorities by the Rating Act, 1908, and also in exercise of the powers and authorities given by the Rotorua Town Act, 1907, and the said regulations, do hereby order, direct, and declare that a rate of one-tenth of a penny in the pound on the capital value of all rateable property in the Town of Rotorua is hereby made and levied for the year commencing on the 1st day of April, 1913, and ending on the 31st day of March. 1914, and that 1913, and ending on the 31st day of March, 1914, and that such rate shall be payable in one sum on the 25th day of September, 1913.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

TWO scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maori boys not over sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination: the other, to be called the junior scholarship, is open to all Maori boys under fourteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have attended a Native school or schools under the control of the Education Department, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The scholarships are open to Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Appendix to the Native Schools Code, 1908. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 8th and 9th of December, 1913.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present them selves for examination. SUMMARY FOR AUGUST.

The month of August was notable for three extensive cyclonic systems, two whose centres passed over the South Island—viz., on the 12th and 24th respectively. The third passed in the north on the night of the 15th. About these three dates extensive rains were experienced, the heaviest occurring in the south-eastern portion of the South Island, where the total exceeded the average considerably.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

- Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- 2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
- be taught in a public school.

 3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
