Change of Name of Locality, "Wade" to "Silverdale."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS settlers in the locality known as "Wade," in the County of Waitemata, desire that the name of such locality be changed to "Silverdale": And whereas the Council of the County of Waitemata has, by resolution adopted at an ordinary meeting thereof, consented to the name of "Silverdale" being substituted for the existing name of "Wade":

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1903, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the locality now known as "Wade," in the County of Waitemata, shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Silverdale," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such locality accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

Land withdrawn from State Forest reservation.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto is a State forest under the control of the Commissioner of State Forests appointed under the State Forests Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and the said land is now no longer required for State-forest purposes: And whereas plans showing the extent and position of the said land, and a statement of the reasons why it is no longer required for State-forest purposes, have been laid before both Houses of Parliament for a period of thirty days, and no resolution has been passed by either of such Houses objecting to the issue of this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section twenty-eight of the said Act, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Proclamation specified in Part II of the said Schedule, as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*; and doth hereby proclaim and declare that from and after such date the parcel of land described in Part I of the said Schedule shall be no longer subject to the provisions of the said Act.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District situated in Block XV, Russell Survey District, and Blocks II, III, IV, VII, and VIII, Hukerenui Survey District, being part of the Puhipuhi State Forest Reserve, and containing 11,900 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the north-west generally by the Waioitu River; towards the north generally by the Mokotuna Stream, the Taumatāhinau and Paremata-Mokau Blocks; towards the east generally by the Kaimamaku River; towards the south by other part of the Puhipuhi State Forest Reserve by right lines of a total distance of 3442 links; again towards the north-west and the south-west

generally by other part of the Puhipuhi State Forest Reserve aforesaid by right lines of total distances of 8304 and 5250 links respectively; towards the south-east and again towards the east generally by a road; again towards the south-west generally by Puhipuhi Nos. 5, 4B, and 4A Blocks; again towards the north-west generally by right lines of a total distance of 32584 links; again towards the south-west generally by the Air Line Road; again towards the south-east, south-west, and north-west by the south-eastern, south-western, and north-western boundaries of the Great Northern Nos. 1, 2, and 3 Special Claim respectively; and again towards the south-east generally by the Air Line Road aforesaid to the Waioitu River: save and except from the herein-before-described boundaries a plantation containing 110 acres, more or less: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less: as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 5484/63, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon edged red.

Proclaiming Native Land to be Crown Land under Section 374 of the Native Land Act, 1909.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and seventy-four of the Native Land Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided, *inter alia*, that all Native land purchased by the Crown under the authority of that Act shall, on becoming vested in severalty in the Crown, become Crown land subject to the provisions of the Land Act, 1908, and shall be proclaimed as such by the Governor, and shall thereafter be administered and dealt with accordingly:

And whereas the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has been purchased and has become vested in severalty in the Crown:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three hundred and seventy-four of the said Act, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the land set out in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty of the Public Works Act, 1908, that if it is found that any land, held, taken, purchased, or acquired at any time under this or any other Act or Provincial Ordinance, or otherwise howsoever, for any public work, is not required for such public work, the Governor may, by an Order in Council publicly notified and gazetted, cause the same to be sold under the conditions therein mentioned:

And whereas it is further provided by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, that in the case of any land so taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work and not required for that purpose, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without complying with any other requirements of the aforesaid section thirty, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto was taken for the purposes of a road: And whereas such road has been stopped, and it is desirable to declare the land contained therein to be Crown land: And whereas a plan has been prepared, and the Minister has recommended the Governor to declare such land to be Crown land:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the above-in-part-recited Acts, and of all other powers in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and that such land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act:

And whereas the Christchurch Tramway Board (hereinafter referred to as "the said Board") desires to erect electric lines from the overhead tramway wires at Cashmere Hills for street lighting at Cashmere Hills, Heathcote County (hereinafter referred to as "the said electric lines"), and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the said Board to erect and maintain the said electric lines for the purpose of street lighting, the electric-lines routes of such and the position of the lights being indicated by the small circles shown on the

plan marked P.W.D. 33729, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS.

1. The conductors shall be at a minimum height of 20 ft. above the surface of the ground.
2. The positive lines shall consist of 7/18 S.W.G. copper wires, insulated with vulcanized india-rubber of 600-megohm grade, and the negative lines of 7/18 S.W.G. copper wires which may be bare. The lines shall be insulated by means of porcelain insulators, carried on substantial hardwood poles placed not more than 200 ft. apart, and shall be 18 ft. clear over the surface of the road at the lowest point of the span.
3. A fuse cut-out shall be placed on the positive conductor where it leaves the tramway trolley-wire. A switch and a fuse that will operate with 50 per cent. excess current over the full load of the circuit shall be inserted at the distribution-box on the positive conductor in each circuit.
4. The negative conductor shall be bonded direct to the rail without switches or fuses.
5. The conductors shall be carried on substantial supports, which shall be designed to have a factor of safety of 5 under a wind-pressure of 30 lb. per square foot.
6. At crossings the conductors shall pass over or under the telegraph wires, as may be decided by the Minister of Telegraphs. Where the conductors cross telegraph or telephone wires, or if any telegraph or telephone wire is hereafter installed so as to cross the conductors, and at such other points as may be deemed necessary by the Minister of Telegraphs, substantial guard-wires effectively earthed shall be erected by or at the cost of the said Board. Such guard-wires shall consist of two stranded galvanized-steel wires carried on substantial supports at a height of 2 ft. above the conductors if the telegraph or telephone wires pass over the conductors, or 2 ft. above the telegraph or telephone wires if they pass under the conductors.
7. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of January, 1914, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of January, 1915.
8. The said Board shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.
9. The said Board shall not use the said electric lines, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the Board that he has received from the Engineer appointed by him to inspect the works a certificate that they have been satisfactorily carried out.
10. The said electric lines, including their supports, their conductors, and their insulated covering, shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained by the said Board as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions, and shall not be permitted by the said Board to remain erected after they have ceased to be used for the supply of electricity.
11. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the said Board without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.
12. If the said Board fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license, the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the Board within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice, and if the said Board fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period, it shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.
13. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the said Board fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.
14. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the said Board, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the same.
15. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works, nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the said Board for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or work-

ing of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

16. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Christchurch Tramway Board shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any such electric line within the Heathcote County except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, as may from time to time be agreed on between the Christchurch Tramway Board and the Heathcote County Council.

17. This license may be cancelled by the Governor in Council after one month's notice in writing has been given to the said Board by the Heathcote County Council of its intention to apply for such cancellation.

SUMMARY FOR OCTOBER.

The month was one of seasonable weather, for although dull skies were frequent, both precipitation and temperature were about the normal, the greatest positive difference in the former was accounted for in the southern extreme of the South Island, this owing to the heavy rains on the 29th and 30th.

None of the atmospheric disturbances were of remarkable intensity such as to cause storms of a severe character.

Westerly areas of low pressure passed in the south on the 3rd, 8th, and 16th, and immediately following these dates cold southerly winds were experienced. The strongest southerly, however, in the east coast districts occurred on the night of the 18th in connection with a depression centred off East Cape, and between the 15th and the 19th of the month conditions were generally very unsettled.

CALIFORNIA.

SAN FRANCISCO BAY.—SAN PABLO BAY.—GAS AND BELL BUOY ESTABLISHED.—BUOY DISCONTINUED.—On 2nd September, 1913, San Pablo dredged channel gas and bell buoy 1, conical with pyramidal skeleton superstructure, showing an *intermittent white* light of about 120 candle-power every 20 seconds—thus, light 10 seconds, eclipsed 10 seconds—was established in San Pablo Bay, California, in place of San Pablo dredged channel buoy 1, a first-class can, which was then discontinued.

Lower mid-channel gas and bell buoy, painted in perpendicular stripes, was discontinued on the same date.

CORTES BANK.—GAS AND WHISTLE BUOY TO BE ESTABLISHED.—About 15th November, 1913, Cortes Bank gas and whistle buoy 2 C B, cylindrical with pyramidal skeleton superstructure, showing a *flashing white* light of about 530

candle-power every 10 seconds—thus, flash 3 seconds, eclipsed 7 seconds—will be established to mark Cortes Bank off the sea-coast of California.

The light will be exhibited 17 ft. above the water and will be visible 9 miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be a 375-millimeter lens lantern burning acetylene gas.

LOS ANGELES HARBOUR.—SAN PEDRO BREAKWATER.—BELL-BUOY DISCONTINUED.—Referring to Notice to Mariners No. 29 (2257) of 1913, further notice is given that on 8th August, 1913, San Pedro Breakwater bell-buoy 1 SPB, Los Angeles Harbour, California, was permanently discontinued.

SAN FRANCISCO BAY.—ALVISO CHANNEL.—BEACON DESTROYED.—Alviso Channel beacon No. 11, San Francisco Bay, California, was reported destroyed 18th August, 1913.

This beacon will be rebuilt as soon as practicable.

SHOAL SOUNDINGS REPORTED.—Lieut. F. P. Evans, R.N.R., commanding the Royal Mail steamship "Tahiti," reports that on 7th August, 1913, between 6.15 and 6.25 a.m., he obtained soundings at 35 fathoms, rocky bottom, in latitude 37° 28' N., longitude 122° 58' 30" W., a point shown on the charts as being outside the 100-fathom curve.

The above depth was obtained by a Sir William Thompson sounding machine, and repeated casts gave the same depth for a distance of about 1 mile in a northeast-southwest direction. Later the depth increased to 49 fathoms, and this and subsequent soundings agreed with the charted depths.

An hour and a half later a vertical angle of Mount Tamalpais was observed for position, and this was checked by correct soundings and an observation of the sun on the prime vertical at 8 a.m. for longitude. Later, upon arrival in San Francisco, his chronometer was found to be correct.

AFRICA.

SOUTH COAST.—FALSE BAY.—SIMONS BAY.—BUOYS DISCONTINUED.—BUOY MOVED.—The following mooring-buoys in Simons Bay, south coast of Africa, have been discontinued:—

Mooring-buoy No. 9, "Penelope," located in (approximately) latitude 34° 11' S., longitude 18° 26' E.

Mooring-buoy No. 8, in (approximately) latitude 34° 11' 15" S., longitude 18° 26' E.

Mooring-buoy No. 5 has been moved 55 yards 33° from its former position and re-established 370 yards 77° from the head of Admiral's Jetty.

SUNDA STRAIT.—BANK REPORTED.—The master of the Netherlands Government cable ship "Telegraaf" reports having located a bank, with a least depth of 30 fathoms, in the entrance to Sunda Strait.

The bank extends in a southerly direction from latitude 6° 14' S., longitude 104° 45' 30" E., to latitude 6° 20' S., longitude 104° 45' 30" E. Soundings of 160 to 275 fathoms were obtained about 2 miles southward of the bank.

WASHINGTON.

PUGET SOUND.—SEATTLE HARBOUR.—SHOAL REMOVED.—BUOY DISCONTINUED.—On 1st July, 1913, West Waterway middle-ground buoy, a second-class spar, painted red and black in horizontal bands, established to mark a shoal in Seattle Harbour, Puget Sound, Washington, was permanently discontinued, the shoal which it marked having been removed.

ADMIRALTY INLET.—POINT WILSON LIGHT-STATION.—CHARACTERISTIC OF FOG-SIGNAL CHANGED.—On 1st September, 1913, the fog-signal at Point Wilson Light-station, Admiralty Inlet, Washington, was changed from a steam-whistle to a *first-class air siren*, which will sound 1 blast every 30 seconds—thus, blast 4 seconds, silent interval 26 seconds.

JAVA.

NORTH COAST.—SURABAYA.—LIGHT ESTABLISHED.—The Netherlands Government has given notice that a *fixed green* light has been established on the dock located to the southward of the green buoy and westward of Kalimas River, Surabaya, north coast of Java.

EASTER ISLAND.—MAGNETIC DISTURBANCE.—The master of the sailing-vessel "Knight of the Garter" reports a magnetic disturbance of considerable magnitude, probably due to local attraction of Rana Kao Volcano, while rounding the south-western end of Easter Island, South Pacific Ocean.

Approximate position of Easter Island: Latitude 27° 8' S., longitude 109° 25' W.

NOTE.—DISCONTINUANCE OF OCEAN METEOROLOGICAL CHARTS.—The United States Weather Bureau has terminated the issue of the Marine Meteorological Chart of the several oceans, ending with the numbers for August, 1913.

Marine observers who co-operate with the Weather Bureau will not be deprived of ocean charts in return for such co-operation, but will hereafter receive, instead of the above, the Pilot Charts published by the Hydrographic Office. and a heavy penalty will be incurred for a violation of this regulation.

Subsidies to Public Libraries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £4,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 9th February, 1914, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 26th January, 1914.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the

vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. It is particularly enjoined upon the authorities in charge of the public libraries concerned that a due proportion of the books purchased shall be books having a permanent value; that is on books of more than merely passing interest.

5. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1913; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

DECLARATION.

I, [Name], of [Place of abode], [Occupation], do solemnly and sincerely declare that I am Chairman [or Secretary, or Treasurer] of the [Name of institution]; that during the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1913, the receipts of the aforesaid institution for the maintenance of the library only were as follows: From rates levied by a local governing body under Part I of the Libraries and Mechanics' Institutes Act, 1908, pounds shillings and pence; from the subscriptions of members, pounds shillings and pence; and

from voluntary contributions other than members' subscriptions, pounds shillings and pence; that the library is public in the sense of belonging to the public, and is not under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only; that the information hereinafter furnished by me in the appendix hereto is correct in every particular; that the abstract of accounts is a true statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year herein specified; that the whole of the subsidy received during the year was expended in the purchase of books for the library; [and that by the rules of the library it is open to the public free of charge].

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER,
CHRISTCHURCH.UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION
DEPARTMENT.

Director: MR. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
