A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a scenic reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

Altering the Middle-line of a Portion of the Stratford-Kawakawa Railway.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, under the provisions in that behalf of section one hundred and eighty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1908, the middle-line of portion of the Stratford-Kawakawa Railway from 12 m. 7 ch. on the old trial line, P.W.D. 30654 (5 m. 76 ch. on present line, P.W.D. 30725), to 17 m. (P.W.D. 30480) were defined by Proclamations dated the thirteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and the thirteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, respectively, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* Nos. 101 and 82, of the fourteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and the nineteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, respectively: And whereas it has been found necessary in the construction of such railway to alter such line in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the aforesaid section one hundred and eighty-eight, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke the Schedules to the said Proclamations defining the middle-line of the said railway between the points marked 12 m. 7 ch. and 17 m. on the plans numbered P.W.D. 30654 and P.W.D. 30480 referred to therein; and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of the part of the said railway between the points marked 5 m. 60 ch. (12 m. 7 ch. old mileage) and 10 m. 56 ch. (17 m. old mileage), marked on the plan numbered P.W.D. 34687, shall be as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Magistrates' Courts Amendment Act, 1913, it is provided that where a Magistrate at the commencement of the said Act holds in conjunction with his office as Magistrate any office to which the Public Service Act, 1912, applies, the Governor in Council may, if he thinks fit, by notice in the *Gazette* declare that such Magistrate shall in respect of his office as Magistrate, and notwithstanding anything in the last mentioned Act, be subject to the provisions of that Act :

And whereas Robert Stone Florance holds in conjunction with his office as Magistrate the offices of District Land Registrar, Registrar of Deeds, and Examiner of Titles at Gisborne, being offices to which the Public Service Act, 1912, applies :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council grant to any person or body corporate a license to use water from any fall, river, stream, or other source for the purpose of generating electricity for electric light, mechanical power, or other uses, and to exercise in respect of that purpose any of the powers and authorities specified in that behalf in the said section: And whereas it is further provided by the said section that any such license may confer upon the licensee a right at any time or times during the continuance of the license (but subject to such conditions and restrictions as are expressed in the license) to enter upon any road, railway, or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such cables, wires, and other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the fall, river, stream, or other source aforesaid and any place to which the licensee is authorized to transmit electricity in pursuance of the license:

And whereas the Taihape Borough Council (which, with its successors and assigns is hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") has applied for a license under the said section to take and use water from the Hautapu River, in the Provincial District of Wellington (hereinafter referred to as "the said river"), for the purpose of generating electricity as aforesaid, and it is expedient to issue such license accordingly:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him as aforesaid, and of the powers conferred by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers enabling him in that

behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to the licensee, subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, a license to take and use from the Hautapu River aforesaid, for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding sixty-seven cubic feet per second at any one time; and also to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, heating, and power purposes as hereinafter described.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

1. In this license—

- "Consumer's wires" means any electric lines on the consumer's premises which are connected with the Council's electric lines.
- "Council" means the Taihape Borough Council.
- "Distribution line or lines" means the portion of any line from which service wires are connected for the purpose of supplying consumers.
- "Earthed" applied to any conductor means that such conductor shall be so connected to the general mass of earth as to ensure at all times an immediate and safe discharge to earth of electric energy.
- "Electric line" means any wire, wires, conductor, or other means used for conveying, transmitting, or distributing electricity for power, lighting, or heating purposes, and includes any instrument, insulator, casing, tubing, pipe, covering, or post enclosing or supporting an electric line or anything connected therewith.
- "Electric telegraph line" means any wire, wires, or cables belonging to the Post and Telegraph Department, or erected under authority granted by the Minister of Telegraphs.
- "Inspecting Engineer" means the engineer or other officer appointed by the Minister of Public Works for the purpose of inspecting the works to be constructed or maintained under this license.
- "Minister" means the Minister of Public Works.
- "Pressure" means difference of electric potential between any two conductors through which supply of energy is given, or between any part of either conductor and the earth.
- "Street" includes road.
- "Telegraph" includes telephone.

2. The said water shall be used solely for the purpose of generating electricity.

3. The said water shall be taken from the said river at the headworks, situated about 2 chains up the said river from the bridge over the said river on the main road in the Borough of Taihape, at a point indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 33664, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington.

4. From the said headworks the water shall be conducted in a southerly direction by means of a tunnel for a distance of about 9 chains to the power-house, situated on the right bank of the said river, the positions of the said tunnel and power-house being more particularly delineated on the plan referred to in the last preceding clause hereof. All water taken from the said river by the licensee in pursuance of this license shall be returned thereto at the power-house.

5. The licensee shall, in respect of his license, pay to the Receiver of Land Revenue at Wellington, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a fee of one peppercorn per annum if demanded.

6. This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years, commencing on the 1st January, 1913. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine, but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

7. This license may be assigned by the licensee with the express consent in writing of the Governor in Council.

8. The licensee is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the position of the said works being indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 33664 hereinbefore referred to:—

- (a.) Headworks consisting of a dam and necessary intake.
- (b.) Tunnel leading from such dam to the power-house hereinafter referred to.
- (c.) A power-house with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lighting-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity.

Such equipment shall be suitable for and capable of generating electrical energy equal to 100 kilowatts.

- (d.) Transmission and other lines over the routes shown by means of lines and small circles on the said plan.
- (e.) Such further transmission and other lines within the Borough of Taihape as at present constituted and within that part of the Rangitikei County situated between the Taihape Borough boundary and the Hautapu River, and bordered green on the plan marked P.W.D. 33664, as may from time to time be required within such borough and part of the Rangitikei County respectively.

9. The licensee shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such transmission-lines, poles, or other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the generating-station and any of the substations to which this license applies.

10. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause, no work of any nature shall be erected or constructed in pursuance of this license upon, over, or under any part of the Government railways until the licensee has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto, as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).

11. The Inspecting Engineer, both during and after the construction of the works, shall have free access to and liberty at any time to inspect the same so as to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

12. After the said works have been completed, the licensee shall maintain the same in proper working-order during the continuance of this license.

13. The licensee is hereby empowered to take, under the Public Works Act, 1908, as for a public work, such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor, be necessary to enable the licensee to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license.

14. Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said river except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said river.

15. If the licensee fails or neglects—

(a.) To use or maintain the said works after completion so as to secure the full benefit of the undertaking; or

(b.) To observe any of the conditions or obligations herein imposed,—

then and in any such case the licensee shall be liable to a fine of £50 for every week or part of a week during which such default or neglect continues, or the Governor may by Order in Council revoke this license.

16. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause, this license shall not be revoked and no proceedings shall be taken for the recovery of a fine in respect of the breach thereof unless and until notice in writing of the intention so to revoke the license or to take such proceedings has been served upon the licensee or placed upon some principal or conspicuous part of the works, and default has been made by the licensee in repairing or remedying the breach or breaches specified in the said notice for the following periods:—

(a.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor can be met by a fine, for thirty days after the service of such notice.

(b.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor is of such a nature as to require the revocation of this license, for ninety days after the service of such notice.

17. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed in any way to limit any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, or otherwise under any Act of the General Assembly authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works. Nor shall His Majesty, or the Governor or any person on his behalf, be liable to pay to the licensee any compensation for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

18. The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon,

if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee neglects or fails so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment or compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

19. The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor by Order in Council.

20. With respect to the transmission and other lines authorized to be erected by this license, and to the transmission and supply of electricity in pursuance thereof, the following special provisions shall apply.

SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

21. The system of supply shall be a three-wire direct-current system, with a voltage at consumer's terminals of 460 volts between the outers and 230 volts between each outer and the neutral. The neutral shall be earthed at the main switchboard, but otherwise efficiently insulated throughout its length. The earth connection shall be provided with a switch for cutting off the earth connection for testing, and with a recording ammeter reading to a maximum of 5 amperes.

REGULATION OF PRESSURE.

22. The pressure shall be maintained within 4 per cent. above or below the declared pressure at the consumers' terminals. The Council shall maintain a suitable recording voltmeter, and on complaint by any consumer that the variations in voltage exceed these limits, or on the instructions of the Inspecting Engineer, the Council shall connect a recording voltmeter to record the pressure between the lines at their entrance to the consumers' premises, and shall supply to the Inspecting Engineer a chart showing the variations in voltage between the lines at this point for a period of seven consecutive days. If the variations thus recorded exceed the above limits, the Council shall take immediate steps to comply with this regulation. If after thirty days a similar chart shows that the above limits of variation in voltage are not complied with, a breach of these regulations shall be deemed to have been committed. If the accuracy of the Council's recording voltmeter is questioned by the consumer, a standard instrument shall be supplied by the Inspecting Engineer, the readings of which shall be accepted as final.

SWITCHBOARD.

23. All switchboards shall be made of and mounted on material that is not inflammable, and no switchboard conductor shall carry electric current at a density exceeding one thousand amperes per square inch.

CIRCUIT-BREAKERS.

24. All outgoing feeders and distributors from any powerhouse or sub-station shall be provided with automatic circuit-breakers or fuses, set to open circuit at 50 per cent. excess current over the rated full load of such feeder or distributor, with a time-limit not exceeding ten seconds.

DISTRIBUTION.

25. The distribution may be carried out either by underground or overhead conductors, provided that if at any time it is deemed by the Minister to be detrimental to the public safety for the conductors or any particular class of conductors to be overhead they shall, on receipt of notification to that effect from the Minister, and within ten months of such notification, be laid underground, and all consequent and necessary alterations made by and at the cost of the Council.

OVERHEAD ELECTRIC LINES.

26. Overhead electric lines shall be of stranded hard-drawn copper, aluminium, or other material of not less than .0129 square inches in section, provided that service wires of short span may be not less than .0072 square inches. The lines shall be covered throughout with triple braiding thoroughly impregnated with weather-proofing compound, provided that where circumstances permit the lines may, with the consent of the Minister, be bare.

The stress in overhead conductors shall not exceed 25,000 lb. per square inch for copper and 12,000 lb. per square inch for aluminium in the extreme case of a temperature of 20° Fahr. and a wind-pressure of 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane occurring simultaneously. The span between supports and the sag shall be determined to conform with the above limiting stresses, provided that the span shall not exceed 200 ft.

No overhead electric lines shall come within 3 ft. of any other aerial wires or cables except where it may be permitted to pass either wires between other wires at a pole or support.

Where an aerial line crosses a street, the angle between the line and the direction of the street at the place of crossing shall not be less than 60 degrees, and the spans shall be as short as possible. The minimum height of the line shall be 20 ft. above the street-level.

SUPPORTS FOR OVERHEAD ELECTRIC LINES.

27. All overhead electric lines shall be carried at a minimum height of 18 ft. above the ground.

All aerial wires shall be attached to suitable insulators, carried on cross-arms of suitable material and cross-section, and they shall be so attached to the insulators or guarded that they cannot fall away from the support. Conductors, covered with insulating material, shall be so attached that their insulation shall not be impaired where they are secured to the insulator.

Every support for an aerial line shall be of durable material, and properly strengthened against forces due to wind-pressure, change of direction of line, and unequal length of span. The factor of safety of such supports shall be at least 4 (four) if of iron, steel, or reinforced concrete, and 6 (six) if of wood, taking into consideration all possible stresses, including wind-pressure at 30 lb. per square foot on plane surfaces and 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane for cylindrical surfaces.

LOCATION OF OVERHEAD LINES.

28. Except by permission of the Minister of Telegraphs, or subject to an agreement between the Post and Telegraph Department and the Council, all overhead electric-light pole lines shall be placed on the opposite side of the street to that on which any telegraph lines exist; and where the erection of the electric-light wires necessitates the alteration of any existing telegraph wires, and such alteration is approved by the Minister of Telegraphs, the expense of the alteration shall be borne by the Council.

Where electric lines are on one side of the street and electric telegraph lines on the other, and service is required to be given from either to the other side of the street, the Council and the Minister of Telegraphs shall give to each other reasonable facilities as far as possible to effect supply.

In running the lines authorized by this license through streets where no telegraph line exists the Council shall keep to the one side of the street, and in running wires to the opposite side of the street the Council shall arrange so as to interfere as little as possible with the route on that side of any future telegraph line.

TELEGRAPH AND TELEPHONE WIRE CROSSINGS.

29. Where electric lines are permitted to be supported on telegraph poles, all details of the support and of the insulation of the adjacent spans shall be approved by the Minister of Telegraphs, who may require such electric lines at any time to be removed from such telegraph poles, on reasonable notice and without compensation of any description.

Where overhead electric lines cross telegraph lines the electric lines shall be protected for the crossing-span with a triple covering of jute braiding and thoroughly compounded.

At telegraph crossings the electric wires shall be insulated as provided by clause 26, and shall cross over or under the telegraph wires as may be decided by the Minister of Telegraphs.

Efficient guard-wires, effectively earthed, shall be erected where electric wires intersect telegraph wires or cables, if so required by the Minister of Telegraphs.

Earth-wires, where led down poles, shall be protected by a casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground.

The cost of all necessary guard-wires and special provisions required to comply with this clause, or deemed to be necessary as a protection to telegraph or telephone wires generally, shall be borne by the Council, whether the telegraph lines are erected before or after the electric lines. In the latter case the Council, on receipt of notice from the local officer of the Telegraph Department that it is proposed to run a telegraph line along the route, shall forthwith make the necessary changes required to comply with this clause at any points at which electric lines already cross such routes.

RAILWAY CROSSINGS.

30. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government railways until the Board has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto, as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).

SERVICE CONNECTIONS TO OVERHEAD LINES.

31. Service lines from aerial lines shall be taken from insulators, and shall not be tapped off between insulators. They shall be led as directly as possible to insulators firmly

attached to some portion of the consumer's premises, which is not accessible to any person without the use of a ladder or other special appliance. Every portion of any service line which is outside a building and is within 7 ft. from any part of the building shall be rubber-insulated.

MAINTENANCE.

32. Every aerial line, including its supports, its conductors, and their insulating covering, and all structural parts and electric appliances and devices belonging to or connected with the line, shall be duly and sufficiently maintained by the Council as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions.

LIGHTNING-ARRESTERS.

33. Where any portion of an electric line or any support for an electric line is exposed in such a position as to be liable to injury from lightning, it shall be efficiently protected against such liability.

UNDERGROUND CONDUCTORS.

34. Underground conductors shall be thoroughly insulated, and shall be protected from mechanical damage by a wooden boxing or earthenware or stoneware conduit. They shall be laid, wherever possible, under the footpaths, and with a cover of at least 12 in. from the surface of the pavement. Where laid under the roadway this cover shall be increased to 2 ft.

All conduits, pipes, casings, and street boxes used as receptacles for electric lines shall be constructed of durable material, and shall be of ample strength to prevent damage from heavy traffic, and reasonable means shall be taken to prevent the accumulation of gas in such receptacles.

Where any underground line crosses or is in proximity to any metallic substance, special precaution shall be taken against the possibility of any electrical charging of the metallic substance from the line, or from any metallic conduit pipe or casing enclosing the line.

EARTHING CONDUITS.

35. All metal conduits, pipes, or casings containing an electric line shall be efficiently earthed, and shall be so jointed and connected across all street boxes and other openings as to make good electrical connection throughout their whole length.

STREET BOXES.

36. The covers of street boxes shall be so secured that they cannot be opened except by means of a special appliance. Street boxes shall be either filled solid with cable compound or, if not so filled, shall be inspected from time to time for the presence of gas, and suitable action shall be taken to check its influx and accumulation.

INSULATION OF ELECTRIC MAINS.

37. Every main, either overhead or underground, shall be tested for insulation after having been placed in position and before it is used for the purposes of supply, the testing pressure being at least 500 volts; and the Council shall duly record the results of the tests of each main or section of a main, and forthwith forward a report thereof to the Resident Engineer of the Public Works Department at Stratford.

The insulation of every complete circuit used for the supply of energy, including all machinery, apparatus, and devices forming part of or in connection with such circuit, shall be so maintained that the leakage current shall not under any conditions exceed one-thousandth part of the maximum supply current. Every leakage shall be remedied by the Council without delay. Every such circuit shall be tested for insulation at least once in every week, and the Council shall duly record the results of the tests, and forward a report thereof at the end of each month to the Resident Engineer of the Public Works Department at Stratford.

CONTINUITY OF SUPPLY.

38. From and after the time when the Council commences to supply energy in pursuance of this license, it shall maintain continuously sufficient power for the use of all the consumers for the time being entitled to be supplied, provided that, for any purposes connected with the efficient working of the undertaking, the Minister may give permission to the Council to discontinue the supply at such intervals of time and for such periods as he may think expedient. When the supply is so discontinued, public notice shall be given, when practicable, of such discontinuance, and of the probable duration thereof.

SUPPLY TO CONSUMERS.

39. The owner or occupier of any premises within the area of supply included in the license shall be entitled to a supply of electrical energy on the following conditions:—

(a.) If within 60 ft. of an electric line belonging to the Council the service shall be made free of cost.

(b.) If more than 60 ft. distant from any electric line belonging to the Council, the Council shall run the necessary service mains for a distance of 60 ft. free of charge, and the consumer shall pay the cost of the service wires for the balance of the distance, such payment not exceeding 1s. per foot of distance.

(c.) If the plant or mains of the Council are insufficient to supply the applicant with electrical energy the service may with the consent of the Minister, be postponed for a period not exceeding twelve months. Otherwise service shall be made within fourteen days of application.

(d.) Every consumer within any part of the area included in the license shall be entitled to a supply of electrical energy on the same terms on which any other consumer in such part of the area is entitled under similar circumstances to a corresponding supply.

(e.) If the nature of the proposed consumption of energy by any applicant is such as is likely to seriously interfere with the maintenance of a constant pressure on the lines in accordance with clause 22, the licensee may, with the approval of the Minister, require the consumer to install such apparatus as shall enable the conditions of clause 22 to be complied with.

(f.) The licensee may require services to be wired or installed by competent tradesmen, but no preference shall be given to services wired or installed by any individual contractor or firm of contractors.

(g.) The charge for electrical energy if paid within fourteen days of the rendering of a correct account shall not exceed an average rate of 9d. per unit for lighting purposes, and an average rate of 4d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes, provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes. If not paid within the said period of fourteen days the charges shall not exceed 1s. and 6d. per unit respectively.

(h.) No meter rent shall be charged, but a minimum charge may be made monthly independent of the consumption not exceeding 2s. 6d. per K.W. or part of a K.W. of maximum capacity of each service. Where more than one meter is required to be installed in one building each meter shall, for the purpose of this clause, be considered an independent service.

(i.) If payment by the consumer is delayed more than thirty days after the date of rendering a correct account, the supply of electricity to such premises may be cut off without notice, and need not be restored until all arrears are paid.

SERVICE CONNECTIONS.

40. The Council shall be responsible for all electric lines or wires, fittings, and apparatus belonging to it or under its control which may be upon a consumer's premises being maintained in a safe condition, and in all respects fit for supplying energy.

In delivering the energy to a consumer's terminals the Council shall exercise all due precautions, so as to avoid risk of causing fire on the premises.

A suitable safety-fuse or other automatic circuit-breaker shall be inserted in each service line within a consumer's premises as close as possible to the point of entry, and contained within a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fire-proof construction.

All electric wires and apparatus on a consumer's premises, except such parts as require to be earthed, shall be highly insulated, and suitable for the voltage at which the supply is given. They shall be thoroughly protected against injury to the insulation or access of moisture. All electric wires shall be so fixed and protected as to prevent the possibility of electrical discharge to any adjacent metallic substance.

INSULATION ON CONSUMER'S INSTALLATION.

41. The Council shall not connect the wires and fittings on a consumer's premises with its mains, or, in the case of premises already connected, continue the supply from its mains, unless it is reasonably satisfied that the requirements of this license are complied with, that the wiring and fittings are suitable for the voltage at which supply is being given, that the installation generally is in accordance with the requirements of good practice, and that the connection or continuance of supply would not cause a leakage from those wires and fittings exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises.

For the purpose of satisfying itself that the requirements of this license are being observed, in so far as they apply to wires on a consumer's premises, the Council may require that notice be served upon it of the intention to instal wires, fittings, lamps, motors, or other apparatus on any premises, and may inspect the same during any reasonable hours while the installation of such is in progress.

TESTING CONSUMER'S INSTALLATION.

42. If the Council is reasonably satisfied, after making all proper examination by testing or otherwise, that the wirings

and fittings are not suitable for the voltage being employed, that a leakage exists at some part of a circuit of such extent as to be a source of danger, and that such leakage does not exist at any part of the circuit belonging to the Council, or that any other requirements of this license are not being complied with, then and in such case any officer of the Council duly authorized by it in writing may, for the purpose of discovering whether the leakage exists at any part of a circuit within or upon any consumer's premises, or whether the wiring is suitable and the general requirements of the license are complied with, by notice require the consumer, at some reasonable time after the service of the notice, to permit him to inspect and to test the wires and fittings belonging to the consumer and forming part of the circuit.

If on such testing and inspection the officer discovers a leakage from the consumer's wires exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises, or that the requirements of this license are not properly conformed to, or if the consumer does not give all due facilities for inspection and testing, the Council shall either not commence the supply or shall forthwith discontinue the supply of energy to the premises in question, giving immediate notice to the consumer of its reasons for not commencing or for discontinuing the supply; and in either case supply shall not be given until the Council is reasonably satisfied that the installation is in conformity with the requirements of this license.

If any consumer is dissatisfied with the action of the Council in refusing to give, or in discontinuing, or in not commencing the supply of energy to his premises, the wires and fittings of that consumer may, on his application to the Minister and on payment of the cost, be inspected and tested by the Inspecting Engineer. This provision shall be endorsed on every notice given under the provisions of the two last preceding paragraphs.

PLANS.

43. The Council shall, before the erection or construction of any part of the work hereby authorized is begun, submit for the approval of the Minister such plans and other information showing and describing such work as he may require. In the event of the Council at any time desiring to make alterations to the work involving a departure from the type of construction shown on the approved plans, it shall submit for the Minister's approval plans showing such type of construction as it is proposed to adopt, and with such approval the alterations may be carried out.

NOTICE REGARDING EXTENSIONS, ETC.

44. Before commencing the erection of any part of the lines hereby authorized, or the extension of any line already erected, the Council shall give at least seven days' notice in writing to the Resident Engineer of the Public Works Department in Stratford, and also to the District Engineer of the Post and Telegraph Department in Wellington, of its intention to carry out the work, and shall forward to the Minister of Public Works a locality plan showing the route of any extension.

ELECTRIC LINES IN RANGITIKEI COUNTY.

45. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric line within the Rangitikei County except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of its license and the regulations relating thereto, as may from time to time be agreed on between the licensee and the Rangitikei County Council.

NOTICE OF COMPLETION.

46. The Council shall, prior to the completion of the said works or any separate portion thereof, give to the Minister at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

COMMENCEMENT OF SUPPLY.

47. The Council shall not use any portion of the electric lines authorized by this license, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the Council that he has received from the Inspecting Engineer a certificate that the said work, or any portion thereof, has been satisfactorily carried out.

INSPECTION OF WORKS.

48. The Minister may at any time order an inspection to be made of the works, lines, and wires of the Council used for electric lighting, heating, and power purposes. If any defect is found to exist it must be remedied forthwith; and if, in the opinion of the officer or person inspecting, such defect is serious, the Minister may, on receipt of the report, direct the Council to at once cease transmitting energy either over the whole of the Council's line and wires or over any specified part thereof until such defect is repaired or remedied. The cost of such inspection shall be borne by the Council.

COMPLIANCE WITH CONDITIONS.

49. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the Council, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the same.

DEFAULT AND PENALTY.

50. If the Council fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the Council within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice; but it shall not be held to have committed default for any failure to maintain power continuously if such failure is due to the breakdown of machinery or other accident, unless such breakdown or accident is proved to be due to negligence on the part of the Council; and if the Council fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period it shall be liable to a penalty of £20, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown. The recovery of a penalty under this license shall not affect the liability (if any) of the Council to pay or make compensation in respect of any damage or injury which may be caused by reason of the default.

REVOCATION OF LICENSE.

51. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the Council fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

PUBLIC WORKS, COMPENSATION, ETC.

52. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works; nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the Council for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

COMMENCEMENT OF LICENSE.

53. This license shall come into force on and after the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

Subsidies to Public Libraries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £4,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 9th February, 1914, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 26th January, 1914.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive

of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. It is particularly enjoined upon the authorities in charge of the public libraries concerned that a due proportion of the books purchased shall be books having a permanent value—that is, on books of more than merely passing interest.

5. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1913; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

DECLARATION.

I, [Name], of [Place of abode], [Occupation], do solemnly and sincerely declare that I am Chairman [or Secretary, or Treasurer] of the [Name of institution]; that during the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1913, the receipts of the aforesaid institution for the maintenance of the library only were as follows: From rates levied by a local governing body under Part I of the Libraries and Mechanics' Institutes Act, 1908, pounds shillings and pence; from the subscriptions of members, pounds shillings and pence; and from voluntary contributions other than members' subscriptions, pounds shillings and pence; that the library is public in the sense of belonging to the public, and is not under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only; that the information hereinafter furnished by me in the appendix hereto is correct in every particular; that the abstract of accounts is a true statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year herein specified; that the whole of the subsidy received during the year was expended in the purchase of books for the library; [and that by the rules of the library it is open to the public free of charge].

SUMMARY FOR NOVEMBER.

The weather in November just passed has been remarkably similar to that experienced in the same month last year. As in the previous November, so in this there was an almost total absence of well-developed anticyclones, and the numerous depressions which accounted for the lack of settled conditions were not unlike those in November, 1912, both as regards type and intensity.

Between the 19th and 23rd fair weather generally prevailed, but during the remainder of the month dull and unsettled conditions were the rule.

The most unfavourable conditions were experienced about the 6th, the 18th, and during the last week, the disturbing cause in each case being a westerly area of low pressure, those passing on the 6th and 18th being apparently of a cyclonic nature.

Precipitation was considerably above the average throughout the Dominion.

Section 9.—Level section, somewhat dry and stony, with scrub on parts.

Section 10.—Level; some good land, remainder somewhat stony.

Section 11.—Flat section; very fair country towards river, balance light and dry. Lucerne will probably take on this section.

Section 12.—Level, and generally light ploughable land.

Sections 13 and 13A.—Homestead Block. Good even land, free from stones. The lower terrace is good silt ground, suitable for lucerne. The upper or "Bounds" block—Section 13A—is very largely capable of grassing and substantial improvement: The lower and middle portion of 13A is really nice country, comprising good slopes and generally good sweet tussock country which, well handled, could be turned to much account. Section 17.—Front flats light and stony in places, but portions along Wye Stream good and suitable for lucerne. Remainder of section generally easy, clean, tussock country. A driving right is reserved along the Wye and within 2 chains of that stream through this section for the lessee or owner of Section 13A until such time as the owner or lessee of this section fences off the 1-chain-road reserve along his frontage bordering Wye Stream.

Section 18.—Section generally consists of nice hills and low downs, well grassed and tussocked. Front paddock of about 240 acres is of very good quality, and at present under cocksfoot.

Section 19.—Back portion of subdivision sloping down to Boundary Stream generally inferior and broken, with light birch bush. Front and middle parts nice danthonia, spurs opening to clean tussock country on the top. Flat along road, good ground, and nice homestead-site.

Section 20.—Lower terrace good land; considerable flax. Top end low downs with good covering, mainly fiorin. Good useful section.

Front part of section generally light, all ploughable; middle portion very good tussock spurs, well grassed, very nice country; top end steeper and not so good. Section 23.—Section consists of clean, well covered, tussock and grass country, with a few patches of good manuka; lower part chiefly good ploughable land. A useful section.

Section 24.—Front face from flats to above saddle along boundary of No. 23 clean tussock country with rock outcrops. From top towards Boundary Stream good tussock land; spurs good and easy. Around Wantwood Trig. and on both sides nice tops and gentle slopes. Front flats somewhat patchy.

Section 25.—Front flats rather patchy and scrubby, but contain some excellent land. About 300 acres up Boundary Stream inferior; balance of section generally nice easy country, well grassed with good tussock.

Sections 26 and 26A.—Small area of flat up Boundary Stream and portion of country lying to the east under "Devil's Backbone" is inferior and rocky, but generally a good class of land exists in this block, capable of grassing. There is a good show of cocksfoot up stream. A fine, clean, tussock spur intersects the block, and lower end of spurs are good. Capable of extensive improvement.

Section 27.—The front flats of this section consist mainly of rich land, and capable of high improvement and lucerne culture. The lower downs and hill portion is useful country; nice lying spurs, fairly well grassed, with a small amount of fern and scrub. A good belt of flax is growing on the section. A stock-driving right, 2 chains wide, along Boundary Stream is reserved through this allotment between Sections 26 and 26A, and available for the lessee or owner of Sections 26 and 26A only.

Section 28.—Front portion of section contains some very good land; belt of flax and about 26 acres of heavy manuka

growing on this flat. Top terrace under netting fence, a nice stretch of even land, but rather light and stony; balance low hills, well covered with danthonia.

Section 29.—This section embraces the whole of the "48th Valley," and has an excellent aspect; the lower area back from road rather light and inferior, with flax swamp of 35 acres, and adjoining 45 acres capable of big improvement. Up valley there is nice tussock country on the slopes running down in good, rich, ferny, manuka faces to bottom of valley. The back boundary runs up to about 3,000 ft., steep and rocky in parts, but showing good possibilities of improvement. Patches of flax up stream through centre of section.

Section 30.—Frontage of this block somewhat light, but improves above swamp and terrace. A good wide scrubby valley, known as "47," runs well back to the foot of range, with easy slopes right and left. At back the land rises steeply to top of range—a height of about 3,000 ft. Country inferior and broken along back boundary or top of range. A section with a good aspect and easily worked.

Section 31.—The greater portion of this section has been under cultivation. There is a patch of about 70 acres of swamp and flax on flat, which is rich ground; also about 80 acres of good even terrace ground. The hills at back have easy slopes, but soil somewhat hard. Mixed agricultural and sheep country.

Section 32.—Flats back from road in grass and oats for feeding; upper portion in oats and emerald rye, somewhat lighter soil. Middle portion fair slopes to some nice country below netting fence. Back part of block up to back boundary hard and rubbly ground.

Section 33.—Back portion of this block is a bit hard and shaly. Below netting fence it is much better, with improving slopes in lower parts. Flats along frontage distinctly good, and the upper flats are of good average quality, now in oats and grass for feeding. Small area of gorse on this section.

Section 34.—Section ring-fenced with exception of about half a mile from netting fence. Hills all nice easy country, low-lying, and well covered with danthonia. Flats mostly in oats, with small swampy area of about 15 acres in grass; soil rich. A valuable section.

Section 35.—Hillersden Homestead Block. The flats around homestead and running out to main road are distinctly good land. From flats to netting fence easy clean slopes. Above netting fence to back boundary the country is rather hard and steep, with a fair amount of scrub and fern. A very well-watered section. Also, homestead and gardens have a thoroughly up-to-date and never-failing water service. The homestead is charmingly situated amongst magnificent plantations.

Section 36.—Generally this section comprises good sweet country; under Mount Olympus tussocky and fair free soil. Valley from Jack's whare and immediate slopes good, with English grasses and soil free and good. Waihopai faces rather broken. Good extent of flats along Waihopai, of good average quality.

Section 37.—Greater portion of this section patchy, but capable of some improvement. Part around and under "Devil's Backbone" inferior and broken, and lying cold. The front country embraces the old "Netherwood" homestead site, and good flats adjoining.

Section 38.—This section comprises a great portion of the country known as the "Finger-marks," and is mainly good ewe country. The Waihopai faces are a bit rocky, but generally the whole section is good, sweet, tussock land and capable of improvement.

Section 39.—This with Section 38 mainly makes up the block known as the "Finger-marks." Good ewe country, and generally clean, sweet, tussock land with good soil, and would take surface sowing well.

Section 40.—The poorer parts of this section lie along the Waihopai River front. To the west of Wether Hill and towards ranges nice gullies and slopes with English grasses; carries tussock to the highest tops. Greater portion good land, and capable of considerable improvement. This subdivision contains the block known as "Wether Hill."

Section 41.—Known as the "Te Arowhenua Block." Front portion of section good, and well covered with fiorin and danthonia. The lower lands consist of generally useful country. Range tops inferior and useless.

Section 42.—Upper "Stronvar" Block. Slopes and gullies face out generally west, and are somewhat steep, but sweet country along lower and middle slopes. Range tops at back inferior. Section capable of considerable improvement.

Section 43.—Lower "Stronvar" Block. Nice sweet country along the Waihopai Valley frontage, becoming inferior and broken on the higher tops. A strip of good feeding ground exists along Spey River from back boundary down stream.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

Hillersden Settlement, formerly the property of Mr. Thomas Carter, is situated in the Wairau and Waihopai Valleys, about twenty-five miles westward (or inland) from the Town of Blenheim, and extending along those valleys from ten to eleven miles. 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and by all or any other statutes it thereunto enabling, the Road Board of the Papatoetoe Road District do hereby make and enact the following by-laws (to come into effect on the gazetting thereof), namely:—

PART I.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Interpretation.

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws, unless inconsistent with the context,—

"Board" means the Papatoetoe Road Board;

"District" means the Papatoetoe Road District as defined by the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 18th day of May, 1883, page 651, and any alterations thereof which may from time to time be legally made;

"District Health Officer" means the District Health Officer of the public health district within which the district is situate;

"Footpath" means any portion of the road laid off or formed for the use of pedestrians solely;

"House" includes hotel, boardinghouse, and any building in which human beings dwell or are intended to dwell, and includes a shop with dwelling-rooms attached;

"Inspector of Nuisances" means the Inspector of Nuisances for the time being appointed by the Board, or if there be no such Inspector appointed then the Clerk of the Board shall be deemed the Inspector of Nuisances for the purposes of these by-laws;

"Occupier" in respect of any premises means the person by whom or on whose behalf such premises are actually occupied, and in the case of a factory includes any agent, manager, foreman, or other person acting or apparently acting in the general management or control of such factory, and in the case of any premises not actually occupied by any person means the owner of such premises;

"Owner" in respect of any premises means the person for the time being entitled to receive the rack-rent thereof, or who would be so entitled if the same were let to a tenant at rack-rent;

"Offensive matter" includes offal, putrid or decayed animal or vegetable matter or fish, the refuse of fruit and vegetables, carrion, dead animals, and any other matter giving off an offensive odour or being in any way injurious to health;

"Person" and words applying to any person or individual shall include a body of persons, whether incorporated or unincorporated:

"Privy" includes earth-closet, water-closet, pan privy, and every place for the reception of faecal matter:

"Sufficient privy" means a water-closet or pan privy of the description, with the appliances, fittings, and connections, and places as required by these by-laws:

"Road" means any road in the district, and includes street and also any footpath and crossing, and the whole land between the fences on either side of a road or street:

"Sanitary fitting" includes a urinal, sink, bath, wash-tub, lavatory, and any receptacle, appliance, or thing for the reception or removal of human or animal excreta, sewage, or liquid waste:

"Sewage-tank" means a tank, reservoir, or receptacle for the reception and disintegration of sewage, and includes that class of sewage-tank commonly known as a septic tank, and includes all reservoirs, pipes, filter-beds, discharges, and other parts ordinarily appurtenant to or required for the efficient operation of a sewage-tank:

"An offence" shall mean an offence against these by-laws, and shall include the omission or neglect to comply with any part thereof.

Where not inconsistent, words, phrases, and designations herein used which appear in the interpretation clauses of any of the Acts under which these by-laws are made shall have and include the interpretations given thereto by such Acts.

2. These by-laws shall (except as to any by-law or by-laws the application whereof is limited to the special area) apply to and be in force within the whole district.

Offences and Penalties.

3. Any person who shall do, or cause to be done, or be concerned in doing, anything contrary to these by-laws, or any of them, or any provision therein contained, or who shall omit to do anything required by these by-laws, or any of them, to be done by him, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these by-laws.

Any person committing a breach of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence, and in case of a continuous offence to a penalty of not more than £5 for each day during which such offence continues.

Powers of Board.

4. If the Board is satisfied upon due inquiry that a full compliance with all or any of these by-laws or any provisions thereof would injuriously affect the course and operation of business, or be attended with great loss and inconvenience to any person, or would work a wrong, then and under such circumstances the Board may, on special application in any particular case and upon such terms and conditions as it shall in each particular case see fit to impose,—

(a.) Relax or modify the strict observance of or compliance with any provisions of these by-laws; or

(b.) Dispense with the observance of or compliance with any provisions of these by-laws.

5. It shall be the duty of every person applying to the Board to exercise the powers in the last clause mentioned to produce clear evidence in support of such application and on the grounds upon which he makes the same, in order that the Board be fully satisfied of the merits of such application.

PART II.

CARE AND MANAGEMENT OF ROADS.

1. No person shall ride or lead any horse or other animal, or wheel any barrow or other vehicle, or ride any cycle or other vehicle upon or along any footpath.

Preventing the Dragging of Material.

2. No person shall drag or allow to be dragged on a road any timber or other heavy material not being wholly raised above ground on wheels.

Cattle Wandering.

3. No person shall permit any cattle to be at large without proper guidance, or to wander or to be herded or grazed, upon any road other than in the ordinary course of driving stock.

Obstruction by Vehicles, &c.

4. No person shall allow to remain upon any road any vehicle having no horse or other animal harnessed thereto, or any plough, harrow, reaping, threshing, or other machine,

and no person shall leave any vehicle with any horse or animal harnessed thereto on any road unless one of the wheels is fastened to the vehicle by a chain.

Obstruction by Materials.

5. No person shall leave any timber, bricks, stone, building or other material upon any road, or upon or over any channel or surface drain in any road, without the permission in writing of the Board having been first obtained.

Offensive Droppings.

6. No person shall spill, or cast, or allow any nightsoil or other offensive matter to be spilt or cast into or upon any road, or any land, building, or erection adjacent to such road.

Offensive Drainage.

7. No person shall cause or permit any offensive matter or offensive liquid to run from any land, manufactory, building, or place into or upon any road, or any right-of-way, or any footpath, or channel, or ditch.

Rubbish Deposits, &c.

8. No person shall throw, leave, or deposit upon any road or vacant allotment within the district any offensive matter, or any bottles, earthenware, china, or rubbish of any description.

Burning Litter, &c.

9. No person shall burn any litter, shavings, straw, or other materials or matter on any road, or on any open space near any building, without the consent in writing of the Board.

Eaves-droppings.

10. No person shall allow any droppings of the eaves of any house, erection, or veranda to fall upon any road.

Regulations of Bicycles, Motor-cars, &c.

11. No person shall use or permit to be used any bicycle, tricycle, or motor-car, or any other vehicle not propelled by a horse or other animal, in or upon any road after sunset and before sunrise, unless, in the case of a bicycle or tricycle, the same shall be provided with a lamp, which shall be lighted and placed in a conspicuous place in the front of such bicycle or tricycle, or, in the case of a motor-car or any such other vehicle, the same shall be provided with a light on each side of such motor-car or vehicle. And no person shall at any time use or permit to be used on any road any bicycle, tricycle, motor-car, or other vehicle as aforesaid unless the same shall be provided with an alarm-bell or a horn; and the rider or driver thereof shall sound such bell or horn when approaching any vehicle, or any person on horseback, or any person who may be crossing any road whether on foot or on horseback; and the rider or driver of every such bicycle, tricycle, motor-car, or other vehicle shall observe the rules as to keeping the proper side of the road when meeting or passing vehicles as is prescribed by law for persons driving vehicles.

Carrying Lights.

12. No person shall drive or use any vehicle drawn by one or more horses in or upon any road between sunset and sunrise without carrying a light on each side of such vehicle.

Driving round Corners.

13. No person shall ride or drive any animal or vehicle of any kind round any corner of any road at other than a walking-pace.

Damage through Dogs.

14. If any dog shall, on any road within the district, rush at, attack, or startle any person, or any horse, cattle, or other animal, whereby the life or limbs of any person shall be endangered, or any property be injured or endangered, the owner of such dog, or the person in charge of such dog, shall be guilty of an offence.

Crossings and Drains on Footpaths.

15. No person shall construct any crossing across any channel, drain, or footpath, or make any drain under any footpath. All such crossings and drains shall be constructed by the Board, but at the expense of the person requiring the same, and any such crossing or drain shall consist of such material as the Board shall from time to time approve. No person shall allow anything other than storm-water to pass through any drain laid under any footpath. Any person desiring to have a crossing made or drain laid leading from his property into any road shall make a written application in that behalf to the Clerk of the Board, and shall upon receipt of a notice from the Clerk of the Board stating the

estimated cost of the construction of such crossing or drain, as the case may be, pay the amount of such estimated cost to the Clerk of the Board before the Board shall proceed with such construction. If any such crossing or drain shall be out of repair, the owner or occupier of the premises from which the same leads, or any person for whose use and benefit the same exists, shall, within seven days after notice in writing from the Clerk of the Board to that effect stating the repairs required, properly and completely repair the same in accordance with such notice, failing which the Board may effect such repairs and recover the cost thereof from such owner, occupier, or person. And in case any such owner, occupier, or person shall make default and fail to comply with such notice within the time therein mentioned, he shall be deemed to commit an offence on every day during which he shall be in such default as aforesaid.

Carting over Footpaths.

16. No person shall cart any metal, stone, building, or other material across any footpath where there is not a crossing constructed in accordance with By-law No. 15 of Part II without the consent in writing of the Clerk of the Board on written application made in that behalf, and stating the property to or from which the carting is to be done, first obtained; and the applicant for such consent shall, prior to the issue of such consent, deposit with the Clerk of the Board a sum not exceeding £10, as the Engineer, or, if there be no Engineer, the Clerk of the Board, shall direct, as security for the necessary repairs to the footpath or kerbing which may be caused by carting material or otherwise, and shall obtain a receipt for the same; and upon repairs being completed to the satisfaction of the Engineer or Clerk of the Board, as the case may be, the said deposit shall thereupon be returned, and on failing to execute the necessary repairs after forty-eight hours' notice so to do from the Clerk of the Board the same shall be done at the cost and risk of the applicant, and the costs thereof deducted from the amount of such deposit.

PART III.

DWELLING SITES.

Dwelling-site Areas.

1. Except as provided by next succeeding by-law (No. 2) no person shall erect a new house in the district upon a site of a less area than one-quarter of an acre, and unless such site shall have a frontage of at least 66 ft. to a public road.

2. If any person, being the owner of a site having an area and frontage of such limited extent that not more than one new house can in compliance with these by-laws be erected thereon, shall erect a house upon any portion of such site, and shall thereafter sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of such portion with the house thereon, it shall not be lawful for any person thereafter to erect a house upon the remaining area of the said site.

Exceptions.

3. The preceding by-laws shall not apply to prevent the erection of one new house on an allotment, lot, or section which does not comply with the requirements of the said by-laws, but which is shown on any public plan or any plan lodged or deposited in any Lands or Deeds Registration Office, or approved by the Board, prior to the gazettement of these by-laws, or on a site owned at the date of the coming into force of these by-laws by a person not owning any adjoining land; or to prevent the erection of a shop with dwelling-rooms attached upon any site having frontage to a public road, provided that in the erection of such shop and dwelling-rooms provision shall be made for the disposal of sewage and offensive matter from such shop and dwelling-rooms thereto attached in accordance with any general conditions for such disposal which may be made by the said Board.

4. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 1 of these by-laws the said Board may permit the erection of a dwelling-house upon any area in the district containing not less than one-fourth of an acre which may not strictly comply with the requirements of the said clause 1, but which may in the opinion of the Board, having regard to its configuration and the particular circumstances of the case, be a fit and suitable site for the erection of a dwellinghouse.

Air-spaces.

5. No person shall erect a new house in the district unless he shall provide at the side or in the rear thereof an open space exclusively belonging to such house and of an aggregate area of not less than 600 square feet: Provided that such open space shall extend throughout the entire width, or, in the alternative, throughout the entire depth, of the site, and shall be free from any erection thereon above the level of the ground, and shall be so maintained while the site is occupied

by the house: Provided also that the minimum distance across such open space from every part of any wash-house, shed, convenience, or other erection attached thereto shall be as follows:—

- (a.) If the height of the house does not exceed 15 ft.—15 ft.
- (b.) If the height exceeds 15 ft. but does not exceed 25 ft.—20 ft.
- (c.) If the height exceeds 25 ft. but does not exceed 35 ft.—25 ft.
- (d.) If the height exceeds 35 ft.—30 ft.

For the purpose of these by-laws, where the side boundaries of any site are not of the same length, the mean length of such side boundaries shall be taken as the depth of the site for the purpose of defining the distance across such open space; and the height of a house shall, for the purpose of these by-laws, be measured from the average level of the ground immediately adjoining the side or the rear of such house, as the case may be, to the level of half the vertical height of the roof or to the top of the parapet, whichever is the higher.

Alterations to Buildings.

6. No person shall make any alteration or addition to any house (whether erected before the coming into operation of these by-laws or not) whereby the open space attached to such house shall be diminished by such alteration or addition so as to leave a less open space than is required by these by-laws to be provided.

Definition of New House.

7. The erection of a house upon vacant land or upon a site previously occupied by any building, or the re-erection of any house pulled down to within 1 ft. of the ground floor, or the conversion into a house of any building not originally constructed for human habitation, or the conversion into more than one house of a building originally constructed as one house only, or an addition or raising of a house (so far as such addition or raising is concerned), shall be deemed to be the erection of a new house within the meaning of these by-laws.

Definition of Site.

8. The ground upon which any house is erected, together with the whole curtilage thereof enclosed within the boundary fences, walls, or lines of the premises, shall be deemed to be the site of such house within the meaning of these by-laws.

Site Formation.

9. The ground on which any new house is erected and the ground immediately around such new house shall be so formed and graded that no water can lodge thereon or under such house, or run under such house.

Plans to be provided.

10. The erection of a new dwellinghouse shall not be commenced or proceeded with until the person who proposes to carry out such work shall have made application to the Clerk in the form set out in the Second Schedule to these by-laws. Such persons shall at the same time lodge with the Clerk complete plans showing the block-plan and sections of the said site, and the measurements of the height and distance from the boundaries of such dwellinghouse, as required by the provisions of these by-laws. Such plan and sections shall be in ink on drawing-paper or tracing-cloth, and shall be to a scale not less than one-eighth of an inch to the foot: Provided always that if the work proposed to be done is of such a trivial nature as, in the opinion of the Building Committee, not to require the preparation of such plans and sections, such Committee may dispense with their production. If the Building Committee are satisfied that all conditions required by these by-laws are or can be fulfilled by the proposed works as described in such plans, and after the payment of the fees set forth in the First Schedule hereto, a permit for the erection of the dwellinghouse shall be issued by the Clerk.

Foundations of Concrete, &c.

11. In any foundation-wall, either of concrete or bricks or stone, either separate or conjoined, a proper damp-proof course of sheet 4 lb. lead, asphalt, or slates laid in cement, or other durable material impervious to moisture, shall be laid beneath the level of the lowest timbers and at a height of not less than 6 in. above the surface of the ground adjoining such wall.

Plates and Joists above Ground.

12. No part of any plate or joist of any house shall be at a less distance, in the case of a plate, than 3 in., and in the case of a joist than 6 in. from any portion of the ground below

or immediately adjoining such plate. The space between the lowest joist and the ground shall in all cases have sufficient and proper communication with the external air for the purposes of ventilation.

Walls of Living Rooms.

13. No room in any house other than a bathroom, closet, or store-room shall have a less average height than 9 ft. 6 in. between the floor and the ceiling throughout an area equal to at least two-thirds of the floor-space.

Ventilation and Lighting.

14. Every room, other than a bathroom, or closet, or store-room, shall be provided with at least one window, other than a skylight, opening direct to the external air. At least one-half of such window shall be movable or made to open, and the opening must extend to the top of the window; and the total glazed surface of such window or windows provided shall be equal in area to at least one-tenth of the floor-space of such room.

Walls of Bathrooms and Closets.

15. At least a portion of one wall of every bathroom or water-closet shall be in contact with the external air.

Insanitary Material.

16. No person shall use any materials in the erection, re-erection, or repair of any dwellinghouse which are unsound, insanitary, or improper to be used for their intended purpose, and any such materials shall within twenty-four hours of condemnation by the Inspector of Nuisances be removed from the site of the proposed house, and shall not again be brought thereon until the house has been completed.

17. If any dwellinghouse or part of a dwellinghouse be erected, altered, or repaired contrary in any particular to the provisions of these by-laws, it shall be lawful for the Board to give notice in writing to the owner of such dwellinghouse, within a time to be mentioned in such notice, to take down, remove, or alter such dwellinghouse, or part of such dwellinghouse, in such a manner that the provisions of these by-laws shall be accurately fulfilled. Non-compliance with any such notice shall be deemed an offence.

PART IV

SANITARY.

Burial of Nightsoil.

1. No person shall bury, or cause or suffer or allow to be buried, nightsoil within the curtilage of any premises which shall be less than 1 acre in extent, but this provision shall not apply until the Board shall make provision for the regular removal of nightsoil under By-law No. 11 of Part IV hereof, or within the curtilage of any premises used as an hotel or boardinghouse, and then not within 33 ft. of any road, or any house or public building, or any building in which any person may be or may be intended to be employed in any manufacture, trade, or business within the district.

Nightsoil in Infectious Cases.

2. No person shall bury upon any private property the nightsoil produced upon any premises from which a case of infectious disease has been duly notified to the Board, and during such time as the District Health Officer shall declare the premises to be infected, but all such nightsoil shall be removed and disposed of by the Board at the expense of the occupier; and every pail or pan used for the reception or removal of such nightsoil shall be specially marked, and be retarred after emptying and cleansing before being used again.

Mode of Burial of Nightsoil.

3. No person shall bury nightsoil otherwise than in the following manner:—

A V-shaped furrow or trench shall be formed of not more than 18 in. in depth, and the nightsoil shall be placed therein, each lot as soon as placed to be covered with at least 6 in. of earth flush up to the surface of the ground. No fresh trench shall be opened up within 3 ft. of an old trench at any time within three months of the final closing of such old trench.

Sewage-tank. (See definition.)

4. No person shall use, or cause or permit to be used, any sewage-tank—

- (1.) Unless such tank in its design, position, and method of construction has been first approved by the District Health Officer and by the Inspector of Nuisances; or

- (2.) After the District Health Officer or the Inspector of Nuisances shall, on account of some defect or fault therein or wrongful use thereof, in writing notify such person not to use such septic-tank, and until such notice shall be in writing withdrawn by the person giving the same.

Water-closets.

5. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, any privy of the nature of a water-closet in the district unless the same be connected with a sewage-tank approved as mentioned in section (1) of By-law No. 4, Part IV, and not the subject of a notice not to use the same under section (2) of said By-law No. 4, and unless the same be furnished with such ventilation and appliances, and such closet and appliances be constructed in all particulars and parts in such manner, of such materials, and with such separate flushing and cleansing apparatus, traps, and pipes, as the Inspector of Nuisances shall require.

Privy Pans.

6. The owner of each house in the district shall provide or cause to be provided every pan-privy with a watertight galvanized-iron pan of a size, pattern, and design approved by the Board for the reception of nightsoil, and the specification whereof shall be deposited at the office of the Board.

Privy-construction.

7. The floor under the seat of every privy or closet shall be raised at least 6 in. above the ground, and shall be constructed of impervious material; and the privy or closet shall be constructed so that the pan shall fit in below the seat in such a manner as to prevent any matter reaching the floor, and shall be in all respects constructed, maintained, and kept in repair to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Nuisances; and means of access shall be provided so that all nightsoil can be removed therefrom without being carried through any house or public building, or any building in which any person may be or may be intended to be employed in any manufacture, trade, or business.

Deodorizers.

8. Every person or occupier of any house within the district shall provide and keep convenient to the privy a box containing dry earth, or sawdust, or lime or other suitable material to be used in such privy or closet as a deodorizer.

Sanitary Control.

9. All privies, closets, and house-drains within the district shall be under the superintendence, government, and control of the Board.

Position of Privy.

10. No privy or closet (except a privy of the nature of a water-closet constructed and being in accordance with By-law No. 5 of Part IV) shall be permitted to be erected or to remain at less distance than 15 ft. from any house or building used as a dwelling, or from any road, street, or footpath, or from the boundary fence of any used or occupied land or allotment.

Removal of Nightsoil.

11. The Board shall, as soon as reasonably practicable, make such provision as it shall think fit for the regular removal from any and every house within the district, and at the expense of the owner or occupier thereof, of all or any rubbish, nightsoil, or any offensive matter of any kind.

Power of Entry.

12. The Inspector of Nuisances, or any other person or persons who may be appointed by the Board for the purposes of these by-laws, shall have power to enter into or upon any buildings or land within the district for the purpose of effecting any such removal as in section 11 specified, or for examining the condition of every privy, drain, closet, pan, or earth-box, or for cleansing, constructing, altering, or repairing the same.

Nightsoil Carting.

13. No person who shall be engaged in the trades of scavenging or the removal of nightsoil within the district shall—

- (a.) Remove, cart, carry, or transport any offensive matter, pans, boxes, or other receptacles in any cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle which has not got the name of the owner clearly and legibly painted, in letters at least 2 in. in height in white paint on a dark ground, on some conspicuous part of such cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle.

- (b.) Convey or remove, or permit the conveyance or removal of, nightsoil in the district between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 p.m.
- (c.) Convey or remove into, or permit to be conveyed or removed through or from, the district any nightsoil or offensive matter, unless the same shall be enclosed in pans or other receptacles of a pattern approved by the Board.

Carting Offensive Matter.

14. No person shall drive, take, conduct, or convey any cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle in, through, or upon the district, or any part thereof, whilst any offensive or noxious smell or odour emanates from any such cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle or the contents thereof.

Sufficient Privy.

15. A "sufficient privy" as defined by these by-laws shall be deemed to be a "sufficient privy" within the meaning of the Public Health Act, 1900.

Sufficient Privy necessary.

16. No owner on any premises shall construct or build thereon, or permit to be constructed or built thereon, any privy other than a "sufficient privy" as herein defined.

Preventing Nuisances.

17. No person shall permit any privy, back yard, or premises of which he shall be the occupier or owner within the district to become in such a condition as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

Ashpit.

18. An ashpit shall not be deemed a "sufficient ashpit" within the meaning of the Public Health Act, 1900, unless the same be either—

- (a.) A galvanized-iron watertight receptacle of such shape as to be readily emptied and cleaned, but so that it shall not be of greater interior capacity than 2 cubic feet, and it shall be fitted with a close-fitting covering or door, to be kept shut except when it is being filled or emptied, and with handles for moving and emptying the same; or
- (b.) A furrow or trench similar to and to be used in the same manner as is provided by By-law No. 3 of Part IV in respect of the burial of nightsoil, and to in all respects comply with the requirements of the said By-law No. 3.

Position of Pit.

19. No person shall make or construct, or use or permit to be used, any pit or hole for the reception of drainage from any premises within the district unless the same is at least 25 ft. from any dwellinghouse or road.

Pig-keeping.

20. No person shall keep, or allow or suffer or permit to be kept, swine or pigs within the district on any holding of less than 2 acres in area, nor shall they in any case be kept as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or erect or permit or allow to remain any pigsty at a less distance than 100 ft. from any house or from any road or boundary of any occupied neighbouring property. The floor of every pigsty shall be of concrete or other impervious material to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Nuisances, and shall be so constructed that there shall be no soakage of the soil with pigs' food, urine, or drainage from the sty.

Stables.

21. No person shall erect, cause, or allow to be erected any stable nearer than 15 ft. from any house, or nearer than 15 ft. from any boundary of neighbouring property. The floor of any stable now or hereafter erected shall be constructed of concrete or other impervious material, and so constructed that there shall be no soakage of the soil with urine or drainage from the stable. No person shall allow an accumulation of animal excreta or manure to remain on any property so as to cause a nuisance.

Fowls.

22. No person shall keep fowls on any allotment of land of a less area than a quarter of an acre. All fowl-houses shall have concrete, tar asphalt, or other impervious floors, and the owner of a fowl-house shall have the walls limewashed at least once in every three months, and shall have the fowl-house cleaned out regularly at least once a week. No person shall erect any fowl-house or cause any fowl-house to be built or remain nearer than 25 ft. from any dwelling, or nearer than 10 ft. from any boundary of any adjoining land.

House Drainage.

23. The owner of any house shall, when required by the Inspector of Nuisances, provide the same with suitable and sufficient drainage, to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Nuisances, to carry away the whole of the sewage and household waste-water from the house, and provided with such grease-traps or other traps as the Inspector of Nuisances may require; and such drains shall be constructed of iron or earthenware glazed pipes at least 4 in. in diameter, with sockets properly jointed and cemented, and laid underground at a gradient of not less than 1 in 40, and led into a pit constructed as follows:—

Such pit shall be at least 8 ft. deep, and must go down to a rock bottom or gravel strata, or such other strata as shall be approved of by the Inspector of Nuisances, and any rock bottom if not traversed with crevices shall be opened by blasting. The pit shall then be filled up with stones of not less than 3 in. in diameter to not less than 18 in. of the lowest ground level of the pit's mouth. The drain must be led 12 in. into this pit, so that the pipe-mouth discharges among the stones. The stones are to be covered flush up to the ground surface all round with dry earth well pressed down. Such pit must be situated not less than 25 ft. from any dwellinghouse.

General Drainage.

24. No person shall construct or allow to remain any drain for the carriage of sewage except in accordance with the following provisions:—

- (a.) In no case shall two or more premises be allowed to be drained by one common pipe, unless a special permit has first been obtained from the Board.
- (b.) No drain shall pass underneath any house except where any other course is impracticable, and in such case the drain shall be of earthenware pipes with cemented joints and embedded in 6 in. of concrete, or cast-iron pipes with lead-caulked joints.
- (c.) No right-angle junctions shall be permitted in any drain. All junctions shall be effected by means of Y-junction pipes. No inlet except such as may be necessary for a water-closet shall be permitted within or beneath a building to any drain.
- (d.) All sanitary fittings shall be metal-trapped and placed with their outlets against or as near as possible to an external wall, and shall not be directly connected to any drain, but shall discharge (through waste-pipes where necessary) outside the building over a gully-trap, or over a watertight concrete channel of not more than 6 ft. in length leading to a gully-trap.

Storm Water.

25. The owner of any land or building shall provide the same with suitable and sufficient drains to carry away the whole of the rainfall and surface water to a point at least 25 ft. from any house, and so that such water cannot flow, spread, or soak beneath any building.

PART V.

REGULATING HEAVY TRAFFIC.

1. "Heavy traffic" shall mean the transportation of any vehicle, engine, or machine which shall, together with any bricks, pipes, stone, earth, or scoria ash being transported thereon, weigh more than 1½ tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels.

2. The owner of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic used in carting bricks, pipes, stone, earth, or scoria ash upon any of the roads within the boundaries of the Papatoetoe Road District shall, before using such vehicle upon any such roads, apply to the Papatoetoe Road Board for a license, and shall pay to the said Board the yearly license fee as follows, viz.:—

For vehicles having tires of the width of 4½ in. or over	£
For vehicles having tires under 4½ in. in width	5

3. Provided nevertheless that the Board may in its discretion, and on application by the owner or driver of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic, permit the owner or driver of such vehicle to use the same for the purpose of carting bricks, pipes, stone, earth, or scoria ash upon or over all or any of the roads within the boundaries of the aforesaid road district without having paid such license fee, upon payment to the said Board of the following charges by way of compensation for any damage likely to occur to such roads:—

For every load carried on any one day upon or over any such road	s. d.

If more than three loads are carried in any one vehicle on any one day upon or over any such roads, then for that day	3 0

4. Any person who after the coming into operation of this by-law shall use any vehicle for heavy traffic within the boundaries of the Papatoetoe Road District without having first paid the said license fee for such vehicle, or obtained the permission of the said Board under clause 3 of these by-laws and paid the charges prescribed thereunder, or who shall do or cause to be done or be concerned in doing anything contrary to any provision of these by-laws, or shall omit to do anything required to be done by him by any such provision, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these by-laws, and on conviction thereof shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £5.

5. Any constable or any officer of the Board may stop and detain any vehicle which in his opinion infringes any of these by-laws, and inspect, examine, and measure the tires thereof, and the weight of such vehicle and the contents thereof; and the driver or person for the time being in charge of such vehicle shall permit such inspection, examination, measurement, and weighing to be made accordingly, and shall, if so requested by any such constable or officer of the Board, take such vehicle, together with the contents thereof, to the nearest public weighbridge, and then and there weigh the same, and no person shall obstruct any such constable or officer in or about the making of such inspection, examination, measurement, or weighing.

6. Applications for licenses under clause 2, or a permit under clause 3, of these by-laws shall be made in writing to the Clerk of the Board. Such licenses or permits shall be under the hand of the Clerk. All licenses shall expire twelve calendar months from the date of the issue thereof.

7. The Clerk shall keep at the office of the Board a register of all licenses issued under clause 2 and permits under clause 3 of these by-laws. Such register shall be open to public inspection without fee.

8. Every license shall be numbered, and the owner of the licensed vehicle shall cause the number to be legibly painted and maintained during the currency of the license on the off side of such vehicle, in black figures on a white ground, together with the letters "P.R.B.," each of such figures and letters to be not less than 1½ in. in length.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
