The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. It is particularly enjoined upon the authorities in charge of the public libraries concerned that a due proportion of the books purchased shall be books having a permanent value—

books purchased shall be books having a permanent value—that is, on books of more than merely passing interest.

5. Application to share in the distribution must be by

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 635, against 617 in November—an increase of 18. The deaths in December were 244—an increase of 21 as compared with last month. Of the total deaths males contributed 137, females 107. Fifty-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 21.31 per cent. of the whole number; 44 of these were under one year of age.

There were 69 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 65 in November. The following table shows the classification:—
