*Resuming Land for a Site for a Public School in Block V, Hautapu Survey District, Wellington Land District.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and forty-four of the Land Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation resume possession of any land leased under Part III of the said Act, or under any corresponding Part of the Land Act, 1892, which in his opinion is required for any public purpose:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto forms part of land which is held under occupation-with-right-of-purchase license from His Majesty the King under Part III of the Land Act, 1892, dated the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five:

And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is required for a public purpose—that is to say, for a site for a public school:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Land Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby proclaim and declare that I hereby resume possession of the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto for the public purpose hereinbefore mentioned, the same being part of the land held under occupation-with-right-of-purchase license as aforesaid.

## A PROCLAMATION.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the River Boards Act, 1908, as amended by the River Boards Amendment Act, 1913, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the date hereof, that part of the said Dominion described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby constituted a district under the said Act, and shall be known by the name of the Otanomomo River District; and that the number of members who are to constitute the Board of the said district shall be five. And I do also proclaim and declare that William Prentice, of Otanomomo, shall be the Returning Officer to conduct the first election of five members of the aforesaid Board; that Tuesday, the tenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, shall be the day, and the residence of William Prentice, at Riverslee Farm, Balclutha, shall be the place, for holding such first election; and that Tuesday, the seventeenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, at seven o'clock in the afternoon, shall be the time, and the said residence of William Prentice, at Riverslee Farm, Balclutha, shall be the place, at which the first meeting of the members of the Board of the said Otanomomo River District shall be held; and, lastly, I do proclaim and declare that Angus McDonald, of Balclutha, shall be the person to make a roll of electors for the purposes of the aforesaid first election, in the manner prescribed by section eight of the said River Boards Act, 1908.

And whereas the Mosgiel Borough Council, the local authority having control of the street described in the Schedule hereto, did by resolution declare that the provisions of the said section one hundred and seventeen should not apply to the said street:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that such resolution should be approved in so far as it refers to the south-eastern side of the street described in the Schedule hereto, subject to the condition hereinafter mentioned:

WHEREAS it is enacted by the fifth section of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor in Council may make regulations for, amongst other things, generally regulating the sea-fishings of the Dominion, and imposing conditions and restrictions on the taking of fish :

And whereas it is desirable to make the regulations hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act; and doth declare that such regulation shall have force and effect throughout the Dominion.

B

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the term "long-line" shall mean and include lines set, moored, or placed for the purpose of taking fish, but shall not mean or include deep "hand-lines."

2. No long line set, moored, or placed for the purpose of taking fish shall be left for a longer period than two hours without being attended to and the fish taken off.

3. The registered owner or master of any fishing-boat who engages in long-line fishing shall distinctly mark the letters and registered number of such boat on each mark-buoy or object to which he has a long line attached.

4. Any person committing a breach of the above regulations is liable to a fine of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

Regulations under the Land Transfer Act, 1908.

LIVERPOOL, Governor.  
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-second day of January, 1914.

Present:

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE W. F. MASSEY PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Land Transfer Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations prescribing and altering the fees which may be taken by Registrars and regulating the practice and conduct of business under the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him as aforesaid, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prescribe the fees specified in the Schedule hereto as the fees to be taken by Registrars and make the Regulations hereinafter set forth for the purposes of the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations "the Act" means the Land Transfer Act, 1908, including any amendments thereof; and all other terms have the same signification as when used in the Act, unless a contrary intention appears.

2. These regulations shall be deemed to supersede any regulations heretofore in force under the said Act or any repealed Act (which are hereby revoked as from the date of these regulations coming into force), excepting those of the 14th March, 1908, and the 17th January, 1910, relating to Crown leases, and those prescribing the fees to be charged by licensed land brokers, and those made by the Surveyors' Board for the guidance of surveyors.

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st March, 1914.

OFFICE AND OFFICE HOURS.

4. In and for each district there shall be an office to be known as "the Land Registry Office," which shall be open

for public business daily from 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m., except on Saturdays, when the hours shall be from 9.30 a.m. till 12 noon, and on Sundays and public holidays.

BOOKS TO BE KEPT.

5. In addition to the Register and Provisional Register Books provided for by sections 33 and 46 of the Act, there shall be kept in and for each district the following books:—

- (1.) An application-book, in which shall be entered particulars relating to all applications to bring land under the operation of the Act.
- (2.) A journal, in which shall be entered particulars of all instruments received for registration, referring to the same by number in the order in which the same shall be received for registration.
- (3.) A nominal index, in which shall be entered the names of all persons having any registered interest in land, together with the nature of the instrument creating the interest, the property affected, and the folium of the Register-book.
- (4.) A sectional index, in which shall be entered particulars of all land alienated from the Crown and subject to the Act, with the corresponding folium of the Register-book.

PRINTED FORMS.

6. The forms of instruments prescribed by the Act may be used with such modifications as the case may require and the Registrar approve.

7. Solicitors, licensed land brokers, and others may have their own forms printed. In such case two proof copies shall be forwarded to the Registrar for approval, one to be returned when approved and the other to be filed for reference.

8. All forms must be printed on hand-made paper of the best quality and of demy size. Inset sheets used with any form must be of the same size and of a good quality of paper.

9. An approval fee shall be payable in respect of every instrument presented for registration on a form or forms not previously approved.

FORM OF INSTRUMENTS.

10. All applications and instruments for registration must be on forms supplied by the Stamp Office or approved by a Registrar. They must be legibly written or typed. If typed the original, and not a carbon copy, shall be retained in the Registry Office.

11. In the case of instruments registered in duplicate or triplicate, each part must be an exact replica of the other or others both as to the body of the instrument and as to any declarations, consents, or other matters endorsed thereon or attached thereto.

12. No instrument shall be received for registration which purports to deal with matters or to create interests not capable of registration, or to affect land or other property not subject to the provisions of the Act, or which for any other reason is incapable of complete registration; but this shall not prevent the registration of any instrument affecting land in two or more registration districts, nor shall it prevent the registration of any instrument as to part only of the land affected: Provided that a request for such partial registration be endorsed thereon and signed by the person presenting the same for registration. Such instrument may at the like request be re-registered as to the remainder or any other part of the land affected thereby.

CORRECTION OF ERRORS.

13. The Registrar may at his discretion refuse to register any instrument containing an erasure or alteration. Mistakes should be corrected by drawing the pen through the words or figures written in error and writing the correct words or figures over them. Any such correction and any interlineation or addition should be initialled by the party executing the instrument and by the attesting witness.

14. No alteration whatever shall be allowed to be made in any application or instrument during retention thereof in the office. Except as after mentioned, applications or instruments requiring amendments must be withdrawn.

15. Errors or defects in description of parcels in any application to bring land under the Act may be amended by permission of the Registrar at any time before such application is gazetted by substitution of amended description and diagram: Provided that such amendment shall not alter the subject-matter of the application so as to include land not originally the subject thereof.

16. The like errors or defects in instruments dealing with land under the Act may, before registration, be corrected in the like manner: Provided that such corrections shall be in matter of description of parcels only, and shall not in any way materially alter the subject-matter of the instrument.



17. Every such amended description shall be expressed to be by way of substitution for the original description, and shall refer to the original application or instrument by name and number, and shall be signed by the applicant or the parties executing such instrument, or, at the discretion of the Registrar, by the solicitor or broker who shall have signed the certificate or correctness required by the Act.

18. No alteration whatever may be made in any instrument after the same has been registered.

#### REGISTRATION.

19. Applications to bring land under the Act, and instruments, dealings, and other matters required to be registered or entered in the Register-book, or deposited, shall be presented at the Land Registry Office by the person claiming thereunder or by some person acting on his or her behalf between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., except on Saturdays, when the hours shall be from 10 a.m. to 12 noon.

20. No application, instrument, dealing, or other matter shall be received for registration unless the same shall comply in all respects with the requirements of the Act, and of these and any other regulations for the time being in force thereunder, and of any other law or regulation in force affecting the subject-matter of such application, instrument, or dealing.

21. No instrument the memorial whereof is required to be entered upon the duplicate certificate or other instrument of title shall be received for registration unless such duplicate is produced therewith or has been previously lodged for the purpose of such registration, except:—

- (a.) When the Registrar shall dispense with the production of the same under section 40 of the Act.
- (b.) For the purpose of giving notice under section 186 of the Act for the production of the same.
- (c.) In the case of any decree or order of any Court, or any Proclamation, Order in Council, or other instrument made or issued under any Act of the General Assembly.
- (d.) In any case in which it is provided by any Act of the General Assembly that the production of such duplicate shall not be required.

#### DEFECTIVE INSTRUMENTS: HOW DEALT WITH.

22. If after any application, instrument, or dealing has been received, any material defect, error, or omission shall be discovered therein, or in the title of the applicant or of any party thereto, or any caveat, by reason whereof the same cannot be registered or proceeded with, the Registrar shall forthwith notify the same by requisition in writing to the person by whom such instrument, dealing, or application was presented.

23. If such requisition cannot be satisfied, the application, instrument, or dealing may be withdrawn; and in such case the fees paid on reception thereof may be refunded, and every endorsement or entry relating thereto shall thereupon be cancelled. The withdrawn application or instrument, and all documents lodged in connection therewith, may be returned to the person by whom the same were presented or lodged: Provided that a copy of such application or instrument be supplied for the office file.

#### DELIVERY OF DOCUMENTS.

24. (a.) Every certificate of title, lease, or other instrument produced to the Registrar for the purpose of registering any dealing, and the duplicate or triplicate (if any) of every instrument presented for registration, shall be returned only to the person by whom the same were respectively produced or presented, or to such other person as he may in writing direct.

(b.) Any certificate of title issued for the balance or for any part of the land included in any partially cancelled certificate shall be delivered only to the mortgagee (if any), or to the person by whom such partially cancelled certificate was produced, or to such other person as he may in writing direct.

(c.) The foregoing provisions shall not be construed to prevent the Registrar from delivering to the registered proprietor or any other person any such certificate of title, lease, or other instrument where it appears to the Registrar that such registered proprietor or other person is entitled to the custody of the same.

#### CAVEATS.

25. In addition to the particulars required by section 148 of the Act, every caveat against dealings shall show how the estate or interest claimed is derived from the registered proprietor, and shall state whether such estate or interest is subject to any, and, if any, what prior encumbrances, estates, or interests, and whether it is intended to forbid the registration of all instruments affecting the title of the registered proprietor, or with any, and, if any, what exceptions.

26. A caveat, as mentioned in the last preceding clause, shall not prevent the registration of any instrument or class

of instruments specifically excepted from the operation thereof, nor of any instrument affecting or relating to any estate or interest to which the caveator's estate or interest is expressed to be subject.

27. On the request, in writing, of any person presenting for registration any instrument the registration whereof is prevented by a caveat, and on payment of the prescribed fee, the Registrar shall give to the caveator the notice referred to in section 155 of the Act.

#### SEARCHES.

28. On payment of the prescribed fees any person may search the Register and Provisional Register Books and Nominal Index, and all registered and deposited instruments and plans at any time during the hours specified in clause 4.

29. A "search" shall be deemed to include—

- (1.) The inspection of any one folium of the Register-book and of all registered instruments and plans referred to therein.
- (2.) The inspection of any one registered or deposited instrument or plan without reference to any particular title.

30. A "general search" shall be deemed to include inspection of the Nominal Index and of any number of titles in the name of one registered proprietor, with the relative instruments and plans.

31. For the purpose of assessing search fees, every search shall be deemed to be completed on the day on which the same is commenced: Provided that the Registrar may, at his discretion, allow a search uncompleted on one day to be completed on the following or a subsequent day without further fee.

32. Every person making a search shall enter his name and affix stamps for the search fees in a book to be kept for that purpose at the time of making the search.

33. Reasonable assistance may be afforded by the officers of the Department to persons searching, but no search may be made by such officers except by special arrangement approved by the Registrar-General of Land, and no responsibility shall be incurred for the accuracy of any information so obtained.

#### PLANS.

34. Every survey plan—

- (a.) Defining the land included in any application to bring the same under the provisions of the Act, or in any transfer of or other dealing with land under the provisions of the Act, or in any request for the issue of a balance or substituted certificate of title;
- (b.) Showing the subdivision into allotments of the land comprised in any certificate or certificates of title, or of any part thereof;
- (c.) Made for the purpose of correcting the boundaries or description of the land in any certificate of title—

shall be presented at the Land Registry Office in the like manner and within the same hours as instruments for registration.

35. Such survey plan shall be referred to the Chief Surveyor or other officer appointed for the purpose for examination and approval—

- (a.) As a survey of the particular land comprised in such application, transfer, or dealing; or
- (b.) As a survey of the land comprised in any such request as aforesaid; or
- (c.) As a survey of such subdivision into allotments; or
- (d.) As a correct or amended survey of the land in any certificate of title—

as the case may be; and when so approved shall be deposited, subject; however, to the final approval of the Registrar.

36. No alteration or addition whatever shall be made in or to any plan after the same has been deposited without the sanction of the Registrar.

37. No plan showing new roads or rights-of-way shall be deposited until all necessary consents of local bodies have been given and all requirements of the Public Works or other Acts regulating the laying-out, dedication, formation, or widening of roads have been complied with.

#### FEES.

38. All fees under the Act shall be due and payable in advance.

39. Where several properties are included in one form of application, there shall be charged in respect of each property an application fee and a fee for bringing the land under the Act. Land included within one outer boundary shall be deemed one property for the purpose of this regulation.

40. In all cases a fee of £1 is hereby prescribed as the charge to be made for advertising notice of application to bring land under the Act: Provided that whenever it is necessary that unusual publicity shall be given to any application, the

District Land Registrar may require payment of such additional sum as shall in his judgment be sufficient to defray the cost of such advertisements. The charge for advertising other notices shall be £1 10s.

41. In all cases where application is made to bring land under the Act, and the certificate of title is directed to issue, and is issued in the name of the applicant, the fees for bringing such land under the Act, with the exception of the application fee and the fee for advertising, may, at the request of the applicant, remain unpaid until the certificate of title is issued.

42. In cases where two or more proprietors, holding separate parcels of land under separate certificates of title, combine in one instrument to deal with their respective parcels, the same registration fees shall be payable in respect of such instrument as if each proprietor had executed a separate instrument.

43. In cases where freehold and leasehold interests, or where two or more leases or mortgages are transferred or otherwise dealt with by one instrument, the same registration fee shall be payable in respect of such instrument as if each such interest, lease, or mortgage had been dealt with by a separate instrument.

44. In any other case in which two or more operations are included in one instrument the same fees shall be payable as if each operation were affected by a separate instrument.

45. The area of land or number of parcels or subdivisions which may be included in one certificate of title shall be in the discretion of the Registrar. In the case of a large area or number of parcels or subdivisions being required and, at the discretion of the Registrar, permitted to be included in one certificate, the Registrar may require payment of such additional fee as he shall consider reasonable to cover the extra work.
