WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act:

And whereas the Christchurch Tramway Board (hereinafter referred to as "the said Board") desires to erect electric lines from its overhead wire on Stanmore Road along Avonglade Street, to connect with a motor in the pumping-station of the Christchurch Drainage Board at the end of Avonglade Street, and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the said Board to erect and maintain electric lines for the purpose of supplying electricity to the aforesaid motor, such electric lines being indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 34570, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District.

CONDITIONS.

1. The conductors shall be at a minimum height of 20 ft. above the surface of the ground.
2. The conductors shall be composed of stranded copper or aluminium. The size of the strand shall be not less than No. 20 standard wire gauge, and the number of strands shall not be less than seven.
3. The positive conductor shall be insulated throughout its length with rubber covering of 2,500 megohm grade.
4. The negative conductor may be uninsulated.
5. A fuse cut-out rated to operate at 50 per cent. above the maximum current of the current shall be placed on the positive conductor where it leaves the tramway trolley-wire. A switch and a circuit-breaker fitted with an over-load and no-load release shall be inserted in the positive conductor and placed near the motor.
6. The negative conductor shall be continuous throughout its length from the motor terminal to the tramway-rail, to which it shall be effectively bonded.
7. The conductor shall be carried on substantial supports, which shall be designed to have a factor of safety of 5 under a wind-pressure of 30 lb. per square foot.
8. Where the conductors cross telegraph or telephone wires, or if any telegraph or telephone wire is hereinafter installed so as to cross the conductors, substantial guard-wires shall, if required by the Minister of Telegraphs, be erected by the Minister at the cost of the said Board. Such guard-wires shall consist of at least two stranded galvanized-steel wires carried on substantial supports at a height of 2 ft. above the conductors if the telegraph or telephone wires pass over the conductors, or 2 ft. above the telegraph or telephone wires if they pass under the conductors.
9. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of March, 1914, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of March, 1915.

10. The said Board shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

11. The said Board shall not use the said electric line, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the Board that he has received from the Engineer appointed by him to inspect the works a certificate that they have been satisfactorily carried out.

12. The said electric lines, including their supports, their conductors, and their insulated covering, shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained by the said Board as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions, and shall not be permitted by the said Board to remain erected after they have ceased to be used for the supply of electricity.

13. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the said Board without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

14. If the said Board fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license, the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the Board within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice, and if the said Board fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period it shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.

15. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the said Board fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

16. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the said Board, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the same.

17. 5. The conductors shall be carried on substantial supports, which shall be designed to have a factor of safety of 5 under a wind-pressure of 30 lb. per square foot.

6. At crossings the conductors shall pass over or under the telegraph wires, as may be decided by the Minister of Telegraphs. Where the conductors cross telegraph or telephone wires, or if any telegraph or telephone wire is hereafter installed so as to cross the conductors, and at such other points as may be deemed necessary by the Minister of Telegraphs, substantial guard-wires effectively earthed shall be erected by or at the cost of the said Board. Each guard-wire shall consist of two stranded galvanized-steel wires carried on substantial supports at a height of 2 ft. above the conductors if the telegraph or telephone wires pass over the conductors, or 2 ft. above the telegraph or telephone wires if they pass under the conductors.

7. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of March, 1914, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of March, 1915.

8. The said Board shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

9. The said Board shall not use the said electric lines, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the Board that he has received from the Engineer appointed by him to inspect the works a certificate that they have been satisfactorily carried out.

10. The said electric lines, including their supports, their conductors, and their insulated covering, shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained by the said Board as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions, and shall not be permitted by the said Board to remain erected after they have ceased to be used for the supply of electricity.

11. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the said Board without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

12. If the said Board fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license, the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the Board within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice, and if the said Board fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period it shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.

13. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the said Board fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

14. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the said Board, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the same.

15. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works, nor shall any compensation be payable to or

on behalf of the said Board for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

16. This license shall come into force on and after the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

License authorizing Todd Brothers and Company (Limited) to erect Electric Lines on the Road on the Western Side of the Heriot Railway-station Yard and across the Road and Railway at the North End of the Station Yard.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirtieth day of January, 1914.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act :

And whereas Messrs. Todd Brothers and Company (Limited) (hereinafter referred to as "the said licensee") desires to erect electric lines on the road on the western side of the Heriot Railway-station yard and across the road and railway at the north end of the station yard (hereinafter referred to as "the said electric lines"), and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the said licensee to erect and maintain the said electric lines for the purpose of supplying electricity to the premises marked 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 on the plan marked P.W.D. 34679, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District, such electric lines being indicated by a red line on the said plan.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS.

1. IN this license—

"Minister" means Minister of Public Works :

"Inspecting Engineer" means the Engineer or other officer appointed by the Minister for the purpose of inspecting the work to be constructed or maintained by the said licensee hereunder.

2. The conductors shall be at a minimum height of 20 ft. above the surface of the ground and may be uninsulated.

3. The conductors shall be composed of stranded copper or aluminium. The size of the strand shall be not less than No. 20 standard wire gauge, and the number of strands shall not be less than seven.

4. The potential difference between the two wires or between either wire and the earth shall not exceed 110 volts direct current.

5. The main switchboard shall be made of and be mounted on material that is non-inflammable.

6. All outgoing feeders and distributors from the generating-station shall be provided with automatic circuit-breakers or fuses, set to open circuit at 50 per cent. excess current over the rated full load of such feeder or distributor with a time-limit not exceeding ten seconds.

7. Every support for an aerial line shall be of durable material, and properly strengthened against forces due to wind-pressure, change of direction of the line, and unequal length of span. The factor of safety of such supports shall be at least four, taking into consideration all possible stresses, including wind-pressure at 30 lb. per square foot on plane surfaces and 18 lb. per square foot on cylindrical surfaces. The stress in the aerial conductors shall not exceed 25,000 lb. per square inch for copper and 12,500 lb. per square inch for aluminium in the extreme case of a temperature of 12° F. and a wind-pressure of 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane occurring simultaneously.

8. The said electric-light lines shall occupy the other side of the road to that taken by the existing telegraph and tele-

phone lines, and all future extensions shall be run on one side only of roads or streets.

9. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government Railways until the said licensee has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).

10. Where lead-covered telephone-cables or any open telegraph or other aerial wires are crossed above or beneath by the said electric-light lines, the latter wires shall be insulated with not less than 300-megohms-per-mile grade of vulcanized rubber throughout the crossing-span, and over every such span they shall be suitably suspended from effectively earthed steel bearer-wires, if the Minister of Telegraphs shall so require. If required by the Minister of Telegraphs, efficient guard-wires or other protective devices shall be erected at crossings and places where electric-light wires intersect telegraph wires, or wherever such protection is deemed necessary. The licensee shall bear the cost of carrying out such protection.

Earth-wires, where led down poles, shall be protected by casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground.

11. All aerial wires shall be attached to suitable insulators, carried on cross-arms of suitable material and cross-section, and they shall be so attached to the insulator, or guarded, that they cannot fall away from the support. Conductors covered with insulating-material shall be so attached that their insulation will not be impaired where they are secured to the insulator.

12. An aerial line shall be removed so soon as it has ceased to be used for the transmission of electricity, unless the said licensee intends within a reasonable time again to take it into use.

13. Where an aerial line crosses or is in proximity to any metallic substance, precautions shall be taken against the possibility of the line coming into contact with the metallic substance or of the metallic substance coming into contact with the line by breakage or otherwise.

14. Every aerial line, including its supports, its conductors, and their insulating covering, and all the structural parts and electrical appliances and devices belonging to or connected with the said electric line, shall be duly and efficiently maintained as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions.

15. Service lines from aerial lines shall be taken from insulators, and shall not be tapped off between insulators. They shall be led as directly as possible to insulators firmly attached to some portion of the consumer's premises which is not accessible to any person without the use of a ladder or other special appliance. Every portion of any service line which is outside a building and within 7 ft. of any part of the building shall be rubber insulated.

16. Service wires shall not be less than No. 12 S.W.G. if solid, or 7/20 S.W.G. if stranded.

17. All metal pipes or coverings containing any electric line or wires shall be efficiently connected with earth, and shall be so jointed as to make good electrical connection throughout their whole length.

18. The said licensee shall be responsible for all electric lines, fittings, and apparatus belonging to him, or under his control, which may be upon a consumer's premises, being maintained in a safe condition and in all respects fit for supplying energy.

19. In delivering the energy to a consumer's terminals the said licensee shall exercise all due precautions so as to avoid risk of causing fire on the premises.

20. All electric lines and apparatus on a consumer's premises, excepting such parts as are required to be connected to earth shall be highly insulated and be suitable for the voltage at which supply is being given. They shall be thoroughly protected against injury to the insulation and against the access of moisture, and any metal forming part of the electric circuit shall not, unless efficiently connected with earth, be exposed so that it can be touched. All electric lines shall be so fixed and protected as to prevent the possibility of electrical discharge to any adjacent metallic substance.

21. A suitable safety-fuse or other automatic circuit-breaker shall be inserted in each service line within a consumer's premises as close as possible to the point of entry, and contained within a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fireproof construction.

22. The wiring shall be done from distributing-boards which shall be of incombustible material. Suitable fuses at each pole, fitted to engage in spring clips, shall be placed on these boards so that it shall be possible to disconnect any or all circuits from the supply. If double-pole switches are used on the distributing-board circuits, fuses need not then be of the type to engage in spring clips.

23. There must be an approved porcelain bridge or other efficient insulation between the terminals of lamp-holders, and where lamp-holders are liable to be handled by persons

making good earth contact they shall be provided with non-conducting covers.

24. Insulation of conductors used for interior wiring shall be of vulcanized rubber of not less than 600-megohms-per-mile grade.

25. The said licensee shall not connect the wires and fittings on a consumer's premises with his mains, or, in the case of premises already connected, continue the supply from his mains, unless he is reasonably satisfied that the requirements of this license, as far as applicable, are being complied with, that the wiring and fittings are suitable to the voltage at which supply is being given, and that the connection or continuance of supply would not cause a leakage from those wires and fittings exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply of current to the premises; and where the said licensee declines to make such connection or to continue to supply he shall serve upon the consumer a notice stating the reasons of so declining.

26. If the said licensee is reasonably satisfied, after making all proper examinations by testing or otherwise, that the wiring and fittings are not suitable for the voltage being employed, that a leakage exists at some part of the circuit of such extent as to be a source of danger, and that such leakage does not exist at any part of the circuit belonging to the said licensee, or that any other requirements of this license, so far as they apply to the consumer's premises, are not being complied with, then and in such case any officer of the said licensee duly authorized by him in writing may, for the purpose of discovering whether the leakage exists at any part of the circuit within or upon any consumer's premises, or whether the wiring is suitable, and the general requirements of this license are complied with, by notice require the consumer at some reasonable time after the service of the notice to permit him to inspect the wires and fittings belonging to the consumer and forming part of the circuit.

27. If on such testing and inspection the officer discovers a leakage from the consumer's wires exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises, or that the requirements of this license are not properly conformed to, or if the consumer does not give all due facilities for inspection and testing, the said licensee shall forthwith discontinue the supply of energy to the premises in question, giving immediate notice of the discontinuance to the consumer, and shall not recommence the supply until he is reasonably satisfied that the cause of leakage has been remedied, and that the installation is in conformity with these conditions.

28. If any consumer is dissatisfied with the action of the said licensee in refusing to give, or in discontinuing, or in not recommencing the supply of energy to his premises, the wires and fittings of that consumer may, on his application to the Minister and on payment of the cost of such inspection, be inspected and be tested for the existence of leakage by the Inspecting Engineer.

This provision shall be endorsed on every notice given under the provisions of either of the two last preceding clauses hereof.

29. From the time when the said licensee commences to supply energy through any distributing-main, and during the continuance of this license, he shall maintain continuously sufficient power for the use of all the consumers for the time being entitled to be supplied from such main; provided that for any purposes connected with the efficient working of the undertaking the Minister may give permission to the said licensee to discontinue the supply at such intervals and at such periods as he thinks expedient. When the supply is so discontinued, public notice shall be given when practicable of such discontinuance and of the probable duration thereof.

30. The variation of pressure at any consumer's terminals shall not under any conditions exceed 4 per cent. above or below the normal pressure at which he is being supplied.

31. The said licensee shall not use the said electric lines, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the said licensee that he has received from the Inspecting Engineer a certificate that the work hereby authorized has been satisfactorily carried out.

32. The Minister may at any time order an inspection to be made of the lines and wires of the said licensee. If any defect is found to exist it must be remedied forthwith, and if serious in the opinion of the Inspecting Engineer the Minister may, on the receipt of the report, direct the said licensee to at once cease transmitting energy either over the whole of the said electric lines and wires, or any part thereof, as to him may seem fit, until such defect is repaired or remedied. The cost of such inspections shall be borne by the said licensee.

33. After the supply of energy has begun, not less than fourteen days' notice in writing shall be given to the Resident Engineer of Public Works at Dunedin, and to the Telegraph

Engineer for the district, his deputy, or such other officer as the Minister from time to time directs, of each further extension that the said licensee is about to make.

34. The said licensee shall, upon the receipt of an application from an occupier of any premises, within 60 ft. of any of the said licensee's public-supply lines, furnish such premises with electric energy upon the same terms and conditions on which any other consumer is entitled under similar circumstances to a corresponding supply.

35. The said licensee shall, before erection or construction of any part of the work hereby authorized is begun, submit for the approval of the Minister such plans and other information showing and describing such work as he may require.

36. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of August, 1914, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of August, 1915.

37. The said licensee shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

38. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the said licensee without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

39. If the said licensee fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license, the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the licensee within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice, and if the said licensee fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period, he shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.

40. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the said licensee fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

41. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the said licensee, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the same.

42. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works, nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the said licensee for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

43. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the said licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use the said electric lines except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license, as may from time to time be agreed on between the said licensee and the Tuapeka County Council.

44. This license shall come into force on and after the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the twenty-sixth section of the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby order and declare that the reserve for recreation in the Southland Land District described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of Part II of the said Act; and such reserve shall hereafter be known as Green Point Domain, and be managed, administered, and dealt with as a public domain.

SCHEDULE.

GREEN POINT DOMAIN.

ALL that area in the Southland Land District, containing by admeasurement 32 acres 3 roods 20 perches, more or less, being Section 52, Block IV, Campbelltown Hundred. Regulations under the Immigration Restriction Acts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of January, 1914.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE W. F. MASSEY PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on him by the Immigration Restriction Act, 1908, and the amendments thereof, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made under the said Acts on the thirteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof:—

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations shall apply to *bona fide* merchants and tourists, including Chinese, who cannot comply with the provisions of the Immigration Restriction Act, or to Chinese

merchants and tourists, who, although able to comply with such provisions, do not wish to pay poll-tax.

2. Certificates in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto, signed by the Collector of Customs at the port of issue, will be issued to *bona fide* merchants and tourists, who can produce passports issued by the Governments of their respective countries and viced by the British Consul in those countries or by any other duly authorized British authority :

Provided that no certificate shall be issued to any person debarred from landing by paragraph (b), (c), or (d) of section 14 of the Immigration Restriction Act, 1908 :

Provided also that in any case where, in the opinion of the Minister of Customs, there are special circumstances, he may authorize the issue of a certificate without the production of a passport upon a bond being given for £100, with security satisfactory to the Collector, that the person named therein shall leave New Zealand upon the expiry of a period not exceeding six months.

3. (1.) Merchants or tourists coming under these regulations may land and remain in New Zealand for a period not exceeding six months.

(2.) Such persons shall not again be granted a certificate should they return to New Zealand before the expiry of five years from the date of their departure upon the preceding visit, except on such special conditions as may be prescribed by the Minister.

4. The Minister may in cases of extreme urgency extend the certificate of any merchant or tourist for such time and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit.

5. (1.) Every person applying to the Collector of Customs for a certificate shall provide two photographs of himself taken within one year of such application. One of the photographs shall be securely attached to the certificate issued to the applicant, and the other to a duplicate certificate to be filed by the Collector.

(2.) The applicant shall also deposit a sum of £10 with the Collector as security that he will report upon departure from New Zealand, and that sum shall be returned to him by the Collector at the port of departure upon identification and upon complying with these regulations.

(3.) The amount deposited on account of any person who departs without being identified or who remains in New Zealand beyond the time permitted by his certificate shall be forfeited and paid into the Public Account.

6. Immediately before departure from New Zealand the holder of a certificate shall personally deliver up the same to the Collector of Customs at the port of departure.

7. Certificates delivered up at a port of departure shall be forwarded to the Collector at the port of issue, to be filed with the duplicate.

8. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, any prohibited immigrant or Chinese arriving at a New Zealand port *en route* to some place beyond New Zealand may be permitted to land for a period not exceeding twenty-one days: provided that a bond, with security satisfactory to the Collector of Customs, is given that the person named therein shall report himself to the Collector upon departure from New Zealand within the time specified. Such bond shall be in the following amounts:—

- (a.) In the case of Chinese, £200.
- (b.) In the case of all other prohibited persons, £100.

MOUNT ROSKILL ROAD BOARD.

THE Mount Roskill Road Board, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the Road Boards Act, 1908, the Public Health Act, 1908, the Public Works Act, 1908, the Motor Regulation Act, 1908, and their several amendments, and of every other power and authority enabling in that behalf, hereby makes the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws, if not inconsistent with the context, the following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

- "The Board" means the Mount Roskill Road Board.
- "The Clerk" means the Clerk for the time being of the Mount Roskill Road Board.
- "The district" means the Mount Roskill Road District.
- "House" includes hotel, boardinghouse, and any building in which human beings dwell or congregate, or carry on any occupation, or are intended to dwell.

congregate, or carry on any occupation, and includes shops with dwelling-rooms attached.

"Inspector" means any Inspector appointed by the Board for the purposes of these by-laws or any of them.

"Offensive matter" includes malodorous fish, animal, or vegetable substances, nightsoil, faecal matter of any sort, refuse, garbage, rubbish, nightsoil-cans or other plant used in the removal of nightsoil, and includes any other matter or substance of an offensive or noxious nature.

PART I. BUILDING.

2. No person shall erect a new house within the district except in conformity with the following provisions:—

Site.

(a.) The ground upon which any house is erected, together with the whole curtilage thereof enclosed within the boundary-fences, walls, or lines of the premises, shall be deemed to be the site of such house within the meaning of these by-laws.

Definition of New House.

(b.) The erection of a house upon vacant land or upon a site previously occupied by any building, or the re-erection of any house pulled down to within 5 ft. of the ground, or the conversion into a house of any building not originally constructed for human habitation, or the conversion into more than one house of a building originally constructed as one house only, or an addition to or raising of a house (so far as such addition or raising is concerned), or the procuring of an existing house or of any other building or part of a building intended to be re-erected and used as a house or part of a house, and placing the same upon a site in the district, shall be deemed to be the erection of a new house within the meaning of these by-laws.

Plans to be provided.

(c.) The erection of a new house shall not be commenced or proceeded with until the person who purposes to carry out such work shall have made application to the Clerk in the form set forth in the First Schedule of these by-laws. Such person shall at the same time lodge with the Clerk complete plans, in duplicate, showing the block-plan and sections of the said site, the measurement of the area thereof, and the measurements of the height and distance from the boundaries of such house, as required by the provisions of these by-laws. Such plan and sections shall be in ink, on drawing-paper or tracing-cloth, and shall be to a scale not less than one-eighth of an inch to the foot. The Board shall be entitled to retain one copy of the said plans: Provided always that if the work proposed to be done is of such a trivial nature as, in the opinion of the Board, not to require the preparation of such plans and sections, the Board may dispense with the production of such plans. If all conditions required by these by-laws are or can be fulfilled by the proposed works as described in such plans, a permit for the erection of the house shall be issued by the Board; and such erection shall not be commenced or proceeded with until such permit shall have been issued, and then not otherwise than in accordance and conformity with the said plans. If a building in respect of which a permit has been issued shall not be commenced and substantially in course of erection within three months of the date of issue of the permit, such permit shall be void.

Building-site Area.

(d.) No person shall erect a new house in the district upon a site of less area than one-fifth of an acre, and unless such site shall have a frontage of at least 50 ft. to a public road; and such area and frontage shall not be thereafter reduced, but shall be maintained as part of the curtilage and as exclusively belonging and appropriated to such house while the same shall be standing: Provided that this subclause shall not apply to prevent the erection of one new house on an allotment, lot, or section which does not comply with the requirements thereof, but which is shown as a separate and distinct area on any public plan or on any plan lodged or deposited in the Deeds Register Office or District Land Registry Office at Auckland prior to the date of the passing of these by-laws, or on a site owned at such time by a person not owning any adjoining land.

Site-formation.

(e.) The ground on which any new house is to be erected, and the ground immediately adjoining any such new house, shall be so formed and graded by the person erecting the same that no water can lodge thereon or under such house, or run under any such house; and no person shall commence the erection of any building upon any site which shall have

been filled up with offensive matter, or which shall have thereon any material impregnated with faecal matter or impregnated with any animal or vegetable matter, or upon which any such matter may have been deposited, unless and until such matter shall have been properly removed by excavation or otherwise from such site.

Air-spaces.

(f.) No person shall erect a new house in the district unless he provide at the side or in the rear thereof an open space exclusively belonging to such dwellinghouse, and of an extent of not less than 400 square feet superficial. Such open space shall extend throughout the entire width or, in the alternative, throughout the entire depth of the site, and shall be free from any erection thereon above the level of the ground, and shall be so maintained while the site is occupied by the house. The minimum distance across such open space from every part of the house, and from any part of any wash-house, shed, convenience, or other erection added thereto, shall be as follows:—

- (i.) If the height of the house does not exceed 15 ft., 15 ft.;
- (ii.) If the height exceeds 15 ft. but does not exceed 25 ft., 20 ft.;
- (iii.) If the height exceeds 25 ft. but does not exceed 35 ft., 25 ft.;
- (iv.) If the height exceeds 35 ft., 30 ft.

For the purpose of these by-laws, where the side boundaries of any site are not of the same length the mean length of such side boundaries shall be taken as the depth of the site for the purpose of defining the distance across such open space: and the height of a house shall for the purposes of these by-laws be measured from the average level of the ground immediately adjoining the side or the rear of such house, as the case may be, to the level of half the vertical height of the roof or to the top of the parapet, whichever is the higher.

Preventing Reduction of Space.

(g.) No person shall make any alteration or addition to any house (whether erected before the coming into operation of these by-laws or not) whereby the open space attached to such house shall be diminished by such alteration or addition so as to leave less open space than is required by these by-laws to be provided, or whereby the open space existing at the time these by-laws come into force, being less (computed as aforesaid) than that provided for in these by-laws, shall be diminished or reduced.

Foundation of Concrete, &c.

(h.) In any foundation wall, either of concrete, or bricks, or stone, either separate or conjoined, a proper damp-proof course of sheet 4 lb. lead, asphalt, or slates, laid in cement or other durable material impervious to moisture, shall be laid beneath the level of the lowest timbers, and at a height of not less than 6 in. above the surface of the ground adjoining such wall.

Plates and Joists above Ground.

(i.) No part of any plate or joist of any house shall be at a less distance in the case of a plate than 3 in., and in the case of a joist than 6 in., from any portion of the ground below or immediately adjoining such plate or joist, as the case may be. The space between the lowest joist and the ground shall in all cases have sufficient and proper communication with the external air for the purpose of ventilation.

Ventilation and Lighting.

(j.) Every bedroom shall be provided with at least one window other than a skylight, opening directly into the external air. At least one-half of such window shall be movable or made to open, and the opening must extend to the top of the window, and the total glazed surface of such window shall be not less than 6 square feet.

Walls of Living-rooms.

(k.) No room in any house, other than a bathroom, closet, or store-room, shall have a less average height than 9 ft., nor less cubic capacity than 650 ft.

Walls of Bathrooms or Closets.

(l.) A portion of one wall of every bathroom or water-closet shall be in contact with the external air.

Insanitary Material.

(m.) No person shall use any materials in the erection, re-erection, or repair of any house which are unsound, insanitary, or improper to be used for their intended purpose; and no person shall bring or cause to be brought any such materials on the site whereon any building is being built, added to, altered, or repaired until such building, addition, alteration, or repair shall have been completed. The Inspec-

tor may give notice in writing to any owner of such materials to remove the same from the site, and on failure to comply with such notice within twenty-four hours after service thereof the owner shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these by-laws.

PART II.

CARE AND MANAGEMENT OF ROADS.

Use of Footpaths.

3. No person shall ride or lead any horse or other animal, or wheel any barrow or other vehicle, or ride any cycle or other vehicle upon or along any footpath.

Preventing the Dragging of Material.

4. No person shall drag or allow to be dragged on a road any timber or other heavy material not being wholly raised above the ground on wheels.

Cattle wandering.

5. No person shall permit any cattle to be at large without proper guidance, or to wander, or to be herded or grazed upon any road other than in the ordinary course of driving stock.

Obstruction by Vehicles, &c.

6. No person shall allow to remain upon any road any vehicle having no horse or other animal harnessed thereto, or any plough, harrow, reaping, threshing, or other machine; and no person shall leave any vehicle with any horse or animal harnessed thereto on any road unless one of the wheels is fastened to the vehicle by a chain.

Obstruction by Materials.

7. No person shall leave any timber, bricks, stone, building or other material upon any road, or upon or over any channel or surface drain in any road, without the permission in writing of the Board having been first obtained.

Offensive Drainage.

8. No person shall cause or permit any offensive matter or offensive liquid to run from any land, manufactory, building, or place into or upon any road, or any right-of-way, or any footpath, channel, or ditch.

Rubbish-depots, &c.

9. No person shall throw, leave, or deposit upon any road or vacant allotment within the district any offensive matter, or any bottles, earthenware, china, or rubbish of any description; and no person shall allow hedge-clippings to remain on any road or street within the district for a longer time than four hours.

Burning Litter, &c.

10. No person shall burn any litter, shavings, straw, or other materials or matter on any road, or on any open space near any building, without the consent in writing of the Board.

Eaves Droppings.

11. No person shall allow any droppings of the eaves of any house, erection, or veranda to fall upon any road.

Regulation of Bicycles, Motor-cars, &c.

12. No person shall use or permit to be used any bicycle, tricycle, or motor-car, or any other vehicle not propelled by a horse or other animal, in or upon any road after sunset and before sunrise unless, in the case of a bicycle or tricycle, the same shall be provided with a lamp which shall be lighted and placed in a conspicuous place in the front of such bicycle or tricycle, or in the case of a motor-car or any such other vehicle the same shall be provided with a light on each side

in front of such motor-car or vehicle. And no person shall at any time use or permit to be used on any road any bicycle, tricycle, motor-car, or other vehicle as aforesaid unless the same shall be provided with an alarm bell or horn; and the rider or driver thereof shall sound such bell or horn when approaching any vehicle, or any person on horseback, or any person who may be crossing any road, whether on foot or on horseback; and the rider or driver of every such bicycle, tricycle, motor-car, or other vehicle shall observe the rules as to keeping the proper side of the road when meeting or passing vehicles as is prescribed by law for persons driving vehicles. No person shall drive a motor-car upon any road or street within the district at a greater speed than fifteen miles per hour, or, when passing a stationary tram-car, at a greater rate of speed than four miles per hour.

Carrying Lights.

13. No person shall drive or use any vehicle drawn by one or more horses in or upon any road between sunset and sunrise without carrying a light on each side of such vehicle.

Driving round Corners.

14. No person shall ride or drive any animal or vehicle of any kind round any corner of any road at other than a walking pace.

Crossings and Drains on Footpaths.

15. No person shall construct any crossing across any channel, drain, or footpath, or make any drain under any footpath. All such crossings and drains shall be constructed by the Board, but at the expense of the person requiring the same; and any such crossing or drain shall consist of such material as the Board shall from time to time approve. No person shall allow anything other than storm-water to pass through any drain laid under any footpath. Any person desiring to have a crossing made or drain laid leading from his property into any road shall make a written application in that behalf to the Clerk of the Board, and shall, upon receipt of a notice from the Clerk of the Board stating the estimated cost of the construction of such crossing or drain, as the case may be, pay the amount of such estimated cost to the Clerk of the Board before the Board shall proceed with such construction. If any such crossing or drain shall be out of repair, the owner or occupier of the premises from which the same leads, or any person for whose use and benefit the same exists, shall, within seven days after notice in writing from the Clerk of the Board to that effect stating the repairs required, properly and completely repair the same in accordance with such notice, failing which the Board may effect such repairs and recover the cost thereof from such owner, occupier, or person. And in case any such owner, occupier, or person shall make default and fail to comply with such notice within the time therein mentioned, he shall be deemed to commit an offence on every day during which he shall be in such default as aforesaid.

Carting over Footpaths.

16. No person shall cart any timber, metal, stone, building or other material across any footpath where there is not a crossing properly constructed, without the consent in writing of the Clerk of the Board, on written application made in that behalf and stating the property to or from which the carting is to be done, first obtained; and the applicant for such consent shall, prior to the issue of such consent, deposit with the Clerk of the Board a sum not exceeding £10, as the Engineer, or, if there be no Engineer, the Clerk of the Board, shall direct, as security for the necessary repairs to the footpaths or kerbing which may be caused by carting material or otherwise, and shall obtain a receipt for the same; and upon repairs being completed to the satisfaction of the Engineer or Clerk of the Board, as the case may be, the said deposit shall thereupon be returned; and on failing to execute the necessary repairs after forty-eight hours' notice so to do from the Clerk of the Board the same shall be done at the cost and risk of the applicant, and the costs thereof deducted from the amount of such deposit.

Heavy Traffic.

17. The owner of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic used in carting stone, earth, or scoria-ash upon any of the roads within the boundaries of the Mount Roskill Road District shall, before using such vehicle upon any such road, apply to the Mount Roskill Road Board for a license, and shall pay to the Mount Roskill Road Board the yearly license fee following, that is to say,—

For vehicles having tires of the width of 4½ in.	£
or over	5
For vehicles having tires under 4½ in. in width	10

17A. Provided, nevertheless, that the Board may, in its discretion, and on application by the owner or driver of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic used in carting stone, earth,

or scoria-ash, permit the owner or driver of such vehicle to use such vehicle for the purpose of carting stone, earth, or scoria-ash upon or over all or any of the roads within the boundaries of such road district, without having paid such license fee, upon the payment to the said Board of the following charges by way of compensation for any damage likely to occur to such roads:—

For every load carried on any one day upon or over any such road	1s.
If more than three loads are carried in any one vehicle in any one day upon or over any such roads, then for that day	3s.

18. Any person who, after the coming into operation of these by-laws, shall use any vehicle for heavy traffic within the boundaries of the Mount Roskill Road District without having first obtained a license or the permission of the said Board under clause 17A of these by-laws, and paid the charges prescribed thereunder, or who shall do or cause to be done, or be concerned in doing, anything contrary to any provision of these by-laws, or who shall omit to do anything required to be done by him by any such provision, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these by-laws.

19. "Heavy traffic" shall mean the transportation of any vehicle, engine, or machine which shall, together with any stone, earth, or scoria-ash being transported thereon, weigh more than 1½ tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels.

"Owner" of any vehicle shall include a bailee or hirer entitled to the possession and use or profit thereof.

20. Any constable or any officer of the Board may stop and detain any vehicle which in his opinion infringes any of these by-laws, and inspect, examine, and measure the tires thereof and the weight of such vehicle and the contents thereof; and the driver and the person for the time being in charge of such vehicle shall permit such inspection, examination, measurement, and weighing to be made accordingly, and shall, if so requested by any such constable or officer of the Board, take such vehicle, together with the contents thereof, to the nearest public weighbridge, and then and there weigh the same; and no person shall obstruct any such constable or officer in or about the making of such inspection, examination, measurement, or weighing.

21. Application for licenses under clause 17, or a permit under clause 17A, of these by-laws shall be made in writing to the Clerk of the Board. Such licenses or permits shall be under the hand of the Clerk. All licenses shall expire twelve calendar months from the date of the issue thereof.

22. The Clerk shall keep at the office of the Board a register of all licenses issued under clause 17, and permits under clause 17A, of these by-laws. Such register shall be open to public inspection without fee.

23. Every license shall be numbered; and the owner of the licensed vehicle shall cause the like number to be legibly painted, and maintained during the currency of the license, on the off side of such vehicle in white figures on a black ground, together with the letters "Mt. R.R.B.," each of such figures and letters to be not less than 1 in. in length.

Form of License.

24. Licenses under clause 17 of these by-laws may be in or to the effect of the following form:—

PART III.

DRAINAGE AND SANITATION.

25. It shall be the duty of any person on whose behalf any water-closet, urinal, bath, sink, lavatory, drain, or other sanitary appliance shall be established, erected, set up, or altered, to cause all the provisions of these by-laws in any way affecting the same to be complied with, and in default thereof such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

(a.) It shall not be lawful for any person hereafter in any manner to erect, make, or establish a water-closet, a drain or drain-connection, or to construct or alter any sanitary appliance or work without first having obtained a permit from the Board; application for such permit to be accompanied by a plan of the proposed work.

(b.) Every person to whom a permit has been granted shall give twenty-four hours' notice in writing to the Sanitary Inspector that the underground work in connection with the laying, alteration of, opening up, cleansing, or removal of drains will be ready and open for inspection, and no such work shall be covered up until it shall have been inspected, tested, and approved.

(c.) All underground drains used or intended to be used to carry away sewage or household waste waters or matters from any house or dwelling, and all sanitary connections therewith, shall in every case be constructed, adapted, and maintained in such manner as to sufficiently and efficiently carry away such sewage or household waste waters or matters; and the joints of such drains shall be made of cement, and made watertight.

(d.) No person shall allow any household waste, or impure waters, or any noxious matters to flow from any building or land in his occupation on to a road; or into any ditch or drain declared to be a public drain, or upon any adjacent land without the permission in writing of the local Board.

(e.) Every sink, lavatory-basin, closet, urinal, or bath shall be placed so that the outlet thereof is as near as possible to the external wall of the room containing such sanitary fitting, and the gully-traps over which the waste-pipes from such fittings discharge shall be placed so as to enable such waste-pipes to be of the shortest possible length.

(f.) No drain or portion of a drain may be laid so as to pass under any building; and no inlet to a drain, except such inlet as may be necessary for any water-closet, shall be placed or remain within or under a building. For every house where drainage is provided a gully-trap connected to the drain must be placed where most convenient for the receipt of waste waters.

(g.) For household slops and discharges from the waste-pipes of baths, sinks, and lavatories, self-cleansing gully-traps shall be used, such traps to be not less than 6 in. in diameter at the inlet and 4 in. at the outlet, and fitted with dish-shaped tops and with gratings. The dish must be joined to the trap by a socket-and-spigot joint, properly finished with cement, or may be of one piece with the trap, and the depth of the dish to the top of the grating must not be less than 3 in. Gratings to gully-traps must be movable, and provided with openings of suitable outlet capacity. Gully-traps must have a water seal of not less than 2 in. in depth.

(h.) All bath, lavatory, sink, washtub, rain-water, or other waste-pipes shall discharge into the open air, either directly over a trapped gully at a height of not less than 3 in. nor more than 6 in. above the grating thereof, or over (and at height of 3 in. above) a properly graded watertight concrete or earthenware channel led to a gully-trap. The waste pipes from the kitchen and scullery sinks of hotels, boarding-houses, clubs, and restaurants shall discharge over a grease trap of approved pattern and material.

(i.) The waste-pipes of baths, lavatories, and sinks shall be trapped directly under their intakes with approved siphon traps of equal bore, and having a seal of not less than 2 in., and provided with an access cap.

(j.) Every kitchen-sink shall be constructed of impervious material.

N.B.—The following will be considered impervious materials: Lead, galvanized iron, copper, enamelled or plain cast iron, glazed fireclay or earthenware.

(k.) No waste matters from any water-closet may be discharged into any drain or sewer not being a brick, concrete, ferro-concrete, iron or earthenware pipe drain or sewer. No person shall erect any water-closet unless all the drains and sewers through which the waste matters from such water-closet would pass are closed drains and sewers, connected to or with an approved outfall, or cesspit, or sewage-tank, so constructed and maintained as when in use shall not be a nuisance or injurious to health:

Provided that for the distance which such drain or sewer may traverse any foreshore below high-water mark, a properly constructed wooden chute may be permitted upon the written approval of the Board.

(l.) When for any reason any sanitary convenience or any portion of a drain, or any fittings in connection therewith, are no longer required for use such sanitary convenience and such portion of any drain or fittings

shall be disconnected and removed, and any openings or connections with an existing drain or sewer shall be efficiently closed.

(m.) Where a drain is used to make a connection to a sewer or sewage-tank, or where a water-closet is connected to a drain, such drain shall be provided at its highest point with a ventilation shaft of at least 4 in. in diameter, and constructed of such material and carried to such height above all eaves and windows as may be approved by the Board.

26. After the coming into force of these by-laws it shall be deemed an offence if the owner of any premises in the district constructs or suffers to be constructed, or suffers to remain thereon, or uses or suffers to be used, any cesspool, or cesspit, or hollow in the ground for the reception of nightsoil, faecal matter, or sewage, except in the case of such sewage-tank, sump, or cesspit as may be properly constructed to plans approved by the Board. Any such cesspool or cesspit not constructed to the satisfaction of the Board, or any hollow in the ground into which nightsoil has been placed, shall, after the coming into force of this by-law, be filled up with clean earth, or be emptied, disinfected, and refilled with clean earth, as the Inspector of Nuisances may direct.

Septic Tanks.

27. (a.) No person shall use, or cause or permit to be used, any septic tank unless such tank in its design, position, and method of construction has been approved by the Board or the Inspector of Nuisances.

(b.) After the Inspector of Nuisances shall, on account of some defect or fault therein or wrongful use thereof, in writing notify such person not to use such septic tank, and until such notice shall be in writing withdrawn by the person giving the same.

Water-closets.

28. No person shall use, or cause or allow to be used, any privy of the nature of a water-closet in the district unless the same be connected with a septic tank approved by the Inspector of Nuisances and not the subject of a notice not to use such septic tank by the Inspector of Nuisances.

Privy-construction.

29. The floor under the seat of every privy or closet shall be raised at least 6 in. above the ground, and the privy or closet shall be constructed so that the pan shall fit in below the seat in such manner as to prevent any matter reaching the floor. The pan shall be in all respects constructed, maintained, and repaired to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Nuisances; and means of access shall be provided so that all nightsoil can be removed therefrom without being carried through any house or public building, or any building in which any person may be, or may be intended to be, employed in any manufacture, trade, or business.

30. No person shall erect, nor shall any person allow to remain, any privy or closet, other than a water-closet, at a less distance than 15 ft. from any house or building used as a dwelling, or from any road, street, or footpath, or from the boundary-fence of any used or occupied land or allotment.

31. Every owner or occupier of any dwellinghouse or other tenement within the district shall provide and keep conveniently to the privy or closet a box containing dry earth, or sawdust, or lime, or other deodorizer, to be used in such privy or closet as a deodorizer.

Disposal of Offensive Matter.

32. No person, whether engaged in the trades of scavenging or the removal of nightsoil or not so engaged, shall leave, spill, cast, place, deposit, bury, or otherwise dispose of any offensive matter in or upon any land within the limits of the district, except at such depot or depots as shall from time to time be approved by the Board on the application of any person desiring to deposit offensive matter: Provided that nothing in these by-laws shall prevent any person from disposing of any offensive matter produced upon any property within the said district which is actually occupied by him, by burying the same upon the said land, or otherwise disposing of the same upon the said land, so that such burying or depositing thereof shall not cause a nuisance.

33. The Board shall not approve of any depot for the disposal of any offensive matter in the district unless it first cause a notification of its intention to approve of such depot to be advertised on three consecutive days in some daily newspaper published in the City of Auckland in the week immediately preceding the meeting of the Board at which it is intended to approve of such depot.

34. No person shall leave, spill, cast, place, deposit, bury, or otherwise dispose of any offensive matter in or upon any public place within the district.

35. No person who shall be engaged in the trades of scavenging or the removal of nightsoil within the district

shall convey or remove into, through, or from the district any offensive matter unless the same shall be enclosed in pans approved by the Board.

36. No person shall drive, take, conduct, or convey any cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle in, through, or upon the district or any part thereof whilst any offensive or noxious smell or odour emanates from any such cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle, or the contents thereof.

37. No person shall leave or permit to remain, either unburied or buried as herein provided, in any public place, or within 30 chains of any public road or dwellinghouse, any offensive matter for a longer period than three hours.

38. No contractor or person engaged as employer or employee in the trades of scavenging or removing nightsoil shall leave or permit to be left on any road or in any public place within the district any offensive matter.

39. No person shall leave unburied or uncovered at any depot approved by the Board any offensive matter for more than two hours after such offensive matter shall have arrived at such depot.

40. No person shall bury, deposit, or leave any offensive matter at any place within 30 chains of any public road, or within 30 chains of any dwellinghouse, or any place where cows are milked, or in which milk is stored, kept, vended, or sold.

41. No person shall deposit, place, or bury any offensive matter upon any land the surface-drainage of which is conducted into any well or watercourse the water of which is used for domestic purposes, or for the watering of horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals.

42. Every person bringing, placing, or depositing any offensive matter into or upon any depot approved by the Board shall forthwith bury all nightsoil, faecal matter, garbage, rubbish, animal and vegetable matter in such a manner that there shall be at least 6 in. of soil covering all parts of such nightsoil, faecal matter, garbage, rubbish, animal and vegetable matter, and shall leave the surface of the soil covering any such matter so buried level with the surface of the surrounding land; and every such person shall bury all fish heads or entrails so that not less than 18 in. of soil shall cover such fish heads or entrails, and shall leave the surface of the soil covering such fish heads or entrails level with the surrounding land.

43. No person shall bring or convey into, through, or upon the district any cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle containing any offensive matter except between the hours of ten o'clock post meridian and midnight, and between midnight and four o'clock ante meridian.

44. No person shall drive, convey, or carry any cart, wagon, float, or other vehicle, or any empty box, pan, or receptacle for offensive matter in or through the district unless the same, after having been emptied, shall have been deodorized and is free from noxious or offensive smell or odour.

45. The Board may make such provision from time to time as it may think fit for the regular removal of human faecal matter; and if and so often as a contract shall be subsisting and in force between the Board and a contractor for the removal of human faecal matter from premises within the district, or if and as often as the Board undertakes such removal, no owner or occupier of any such premises shall remove or permit to be removed any such matter as aforesaid except by such contractor or the Board, his or its servants or agents.

Pigs.

46. No person shall keep, or allow, or suffer, or permit to be kept, swine or pigs at a less distance than 50 ft. from any house or building used as a dwelling, or from any road or footpath, or boundary of any occupied neighbouring property.

47. The floor of any pigsty shall be of concrete or other impervious material, and shall be constructed to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Nuisances appointed by the Board, and so that there shall be no soakage of soil with pigs' food or urine.

PART IV.

GENERAL.

48. Every person who shall erect a building or shall execute any work to which these by-laws shall apply shall, at all reasonable hours during and after the erection of such building or the execution of such work, afford the Board's Inspector free access to such building or work for the purpose of inspection.

49. These by-laws shall apply to the whole district, and shall come into force on being gazetted.

50. If any person shall commit a breach of any of these by-laws he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the case of a continuous breach, to an additional fine not exceeding £5 for every day on which the breach is continued

after the first day. The continued existence in a state contrary to any by-law of any work or thing shall be deemed a continuous breach within the meaning of this clause.

In pursuance of section 109 of the Public Health Act, 1908, I hereby approve the foregoing by-laws.

By-law No. 38.—Regulating the Use of Level Crossings by Vehicles, &c.

PURSUANT to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Government Railways Act, 1908, and the amendments thereof, I, William Herbert Herries, do hereby revoke By-law No. 38 of the by-laws gazetted on the 10th June, 1909, and in lieu thereof do hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto for regulating the use of level crossings by vehicles, &c. And I do hereby declare that such by-laws shall come into force from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

BY-LAWS.

1. No person shall drive or attempt to drive any vehicle other than a motor vehicle, or any animal, on any part of a public road where the same crosses over or upon a railway on the same level, otherwise than at a walking pace, and every person shall before crossing the lines of rail comply with the directions upon the notice-boards, "Stop, look out for the engine."

2. No person in charge of a motor vehicle or driving a motor vehicle on or along any road or street shall approach a railway level crossing within one hundred yards of such crossing without slackening speed to a rate not exceeding ten miles an hour; and every person in charge of or driving a motor vehicle shall stop before coming in contact with the railway-line, and shall keep a vigilant lookout for approaching trains, and shall not attempt to cross the railway-line unless the line is clear.

3. No person in charge of a motor vehicle or driving a motor vehicle on or along any road or street shall cross over any railway level crossing at a greater speed than ten miles an hour.

4. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws, or shall fail to do any act in any such by-law directed to be done by him, or shall do any act which by any such by-law is directed not to be done by him, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for each such breach or the failure to do or the doing of each such act as aforesaid respectively; but if any such person is employed on or about the railway, and the by-law relates to his conduct, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £1 for each breach, failure, or act respectively.

NOTE.—The weather from the 1st to the 21st was extremely unsettled, but the latter portion of the month was bright and sunny. The rainfall was over double the average of previous years, while barometric pressure and temperatures were below. Total bright sunshine, 218h. 10m., and four sunless days. The mean earth temperature at 1 ft. was 61-7°, and 60-9° at 3 ft. Mean dew-point, 51-2°; mean elastic force of vapour, 0-377 in.; and mean relative humidity, 75 per cent. of saturation.

SUMMARY FOR DECEMBER.

Between the 1st and the 22nd of the month the distribution of atmospheric pressure was such as to cause extremely unsettled weather and an abundance of rainfall. In nearly every instance the disturbance was a cyclonic type, the most intense being the one whose centre passed through Cook Strait on the evening of the 16th, with a barometric reading of 28-98 inches at Wellington. This cyclone moved very rapidly, and in this respect was in marked contrast to one prevailing between the 9th and the 14th. Of the latter, following is given approximately of the position of its centre on the different days while it was under review:—

Arrivals and Departures in 1913.

Registrar-General's Office, Wellington, 30th January, 1914.

TABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1913, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The total number of persons who arrived in the Dominion during 1913 was 44,588, and the departures during the year numbered 30,369, the excess of arrivals over departures for the year being 14,219.

According to returns furnished by the Immigration officers, 14,707 persons arrived from the United Kingdom, and 2,649 persons departed therefor during the year. From the Commonwealth of Australia the arrivals are returned as numbering 26,764 persons, and the departures thereto as 24,961 persons. Arrivals and departures from and to other countries were 3,117 and 2,759 persons respectively.

Of the 44,588 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 5,915, or 13.27 per cent. of the total, were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 30,369 departures the children numbered 2,663, or 8.77 per cent.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director: MR. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
