WHEREAS the lands specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto are State forests under the control of the Commissioner of State Forests appointed under the State Forests Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and the said lands are now no longer required for State-forest purposes: And whereas plans showing the extent and position of the said lands and a statement of the reasons why they are no longer required for State-forest purposes, have been laid before both Houses of Parliament for a period of thirty days, and no resolution has been passed by either of such Houses objecting to the issue of this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers conferred by section twenty-eight of the said Act, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Proclamations specified in the second column of the Schedule hereto, so far as they relate to the lands described in the first column of the Schedule hereto, as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*; and doth hereby proclaim and declare that from and after such date the parcels of land described in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be no longer subject to the provisions of the said Act.

Warrant vesting Control of the Ongarue Bridge at Taumarunui in the Taumarunui Borough Council, and apportioning the Cost of Maintenance of the same.

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and twenty of the Public Works Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor may, by warrant under his hand publicly notified and gazetted, direct that any bridge already constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, over or across any river or arm of the sea respectively shall, from and after a date to be fixed in such warrant, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of such local authority as shall be mentioned in that behalf in such warrant; and may by such warrant as aforesaid fix or determine whether all or any, and if so what, part of the cost, whether theretofore incurred or thereafter to

be incurred, of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing any such bridge is to be provided and paid by the local authority or authorities; and may by such warrant as aforesaid direct how, when, and to whom any such payment is to be made:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made under the hereinbefore-in-part-recited Act for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the bridge described in the Schedule hereto, and known as the Ongarue Bridge at Taumarunui (hereinafter called "the said bridge"), shall, from and after the date of this warrant, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Taumarunui Borough Council. And, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers aforesaid, I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, or improving the said bridge is to be provided and paid by the local authorities hereinafter mentioned in the following proportions—viz.: the Taumarunui Borough Council to pay half of such cost, and the Ohura County Council to pay half of such cost respectively.

And I also hereby direct that the contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Ohura County Council towards the cost of maintaining, repairing, or improving the said bridge shall be paid from time to time, in the proportion hereinbefore prescribed, out of the funds of the said Council, within a period of one month after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Taumarunui Borough Council, and such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the Taumarunui Borough Council for and on behalf of the Ohura County Council.

Conditions of the Issue of Licenses under the Race Meetings Act, 1909.

WHEREAS by the Race Meetings Act, 1909, it is provided that any racing club may make application to the Minister of Internal Affairs for a license under that Act to conduct horse-races: And whereas the said Minister may in his discretion grant any such license, subject to such conditions as he thinks fit with respect to the number, character, times, and places of the horse-races which may take place under the authority of the license, and as to the management and control of those races: And whereas it is expedient to publish the following conditions, which shall apply to all licenses granted under the authority of the said Act, in addition to any other conditions which the said Minister may in any particular case impose upon the issue of any license as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, Francis Henry Dillon Bell, the Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, hereby give notice that all licenses granted under the Race Meetings Act, 1909, will be granted under and subject to the following conditions:—

1. Every application for a license under the said Act shall be addressed to the Minister of Internal Affairs, and shall be in the form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect; such application to be made at least one month before the date of the proposed race meeting.

2. Before granting any such application the Minister of Internal Affairs will refer the application to a Commissioner of Police for report.

3. After the receipt of the police report the Minister of Internal Affairs will consider the application.

4. Licenses will be in the form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

5. A condition will always be imposed that not more than eight races per diem shall be run at any race meeting.

6. Where only one race meeting is authorized to be held in any racing year, that race meeting may be authorized by the license to extend over two days; but in all other cases the license will only authorize one day's racing.

7. The term "racing year" means a period of twelve months, commencing on the 1st day of August in each year.

8. The applicants for a license must satisfy the Minister that due provision has been made for the conduct of the proposed race meeting, and that the date or dates proposed are not coincident with dates fixed for race meetings at other neighbouring places. The applicants should in general obtain from the authorities of the racing or trotting conferences respectively approval of the proposed programme and dates prior to presenting the application.

9. Nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to prevent the Minister of Internal Affairs from imposing on the issue of any license any other conditions which he thinks fit in the particular case.

The following are condensed reports of enumerators on the prospects of yields of crops in the various districts:—

Auckland.—Season good, and yields generally above the average. Potatoes, however, affected by blight in several localities.

Taranaki.—Wheat and oats, good crops generally, and barley fair to good. Yields of grass-seed very satisfactory. Potatoes, fair average, but other root crops irregular; late-sown turnips and mangolds, however, doing well.

Hawke's Bay.—Good yields of wheat, oats, barley, and rye-grass. Turnips and mangolds also good, though weather has affected root crops in some localities.

Wellington.—Heavy yields of wheat and oats in Wanganui district, and good yields of other crops, except that early sown turnips are unsatisfactory. Wairarapa crops looked promising, but bad weather will diminish yields. In remainder of province oats failed, and potatoes severely affected by blight. Good crops of turnips.

Marlborough and Nelson.—Crops doing fairly well, and good yields expected.

Canterbury.—Grain crops and cocksfoot well up to average in spite of bad weather. Early potatoes attacked with blight, but later crops more satisfactory, and yields should equal last year's.

Otago.—Wheat and oat crops not good, except in Maniototo, Vincent, and Waitaki Counties. Good yields of turnips and also of potatoes, though blight is fairly widespread, especially in coastal districts.

Southland.—Oats lighter than usual, and rye-grass not quite up to standard. Average crop of potatoes, blight prevalent. Prospects of turnip crops good.

Estimated Total Yields.—According to the returns furnished the total estimated yield of the principal crops will be approximately as given below. It should be remembered that the estimate is based on a collection of returns by post. All forms posted to farmers were not returned, the percentage of returns received out of the forms issued varying from 82.72 in Auckland to 95.53 in Canterbury, and averaging 89.01 per cent. over the whole Dominion.
