A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act inspect any lands passessing scenic or historical charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation: recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a sceric reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the pro-

visions thereof.

The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned jetties in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit there-from, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said jetties and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such jetties or either of them, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be

REGULATIONS.

UNDERVIEWERS', FIREMEN AND DEPUTIES' CERTIFICATES.

1. With respect to the examinations for certificates as underviewers, and firemen and deputies the following provisions shall apply:

- (1.) Examinations shall be held at such times and places as are appointed by the Board.
 (2.) In each district where coal-mining is carried on the Board of Examiners shall consist of one or more members of the Board of Examiners appointed under the said Act and an Inspector of Mines.
 (3.) Certificates by examination shall be in Forms 1 and 2.

(4.) The examination for underviewers' certificates shall be partly written, oral, and practical, and shall include the following subjects:—

(a.) Working coal and timbering underground.
(b.) Mine - gases, spontaneous combustion, and

(c.) Dealing with old workings and other sources of danger

(d.) Arithmetic, and a knowledge of the Coalmines Act, 1908, and the amendments thereto, and the regulations issued thereunder.

(e.) First aid to the injured.

(f.) A candidate will be required to show that he (f.) A candidate will be required to show that he is able to make accurate tests for inflammable gas, and that he can do this with any of the various kinds of safety lamp, and with any of the various kinds of oil in use in the district in which he is employed. For this purpose he will be required, first, to show to the examiner that he understands the method of detecting inflammable gas by means of a safety lamp, and secondly, to make correct obsersafety lamp, and secondly, to make correct observations of gas-caps as they appear on the flames of various kinds of safety lamps burning the various kinds of oil. By a correct observation is meant that the candidate must be able to judge by the size and appearance of the cap how much gas approximately is present. He will be tested with percentages of gas from 2 per cent. upwards, and no candidate will pass who is unable to see a 2-per-cent. cap. A candidate who ordinarily wears glasses will not necessarily be called upon to make the observations without them, but it will rest with the examiner to decide by such tests as he thinks fit whether the eyesight is so defective that under the working-conditions in a mine a candidate would not be able conditions in a mine a candidate would not be able to make accurate observations.

(g.) A candidate will be required to show that he can measure the quantity of air in an air-current. The quantity of air in cubic feet per minute passing through the air-way of a mine being found by multiplying the number of square feet in the crosssection of the air-way by the speed of the air-current in feet per minute, the candidate will be required, first, to measure the speed of the air-current passing through the air-way of a mine, or through some gallery corresponding to or representing the air-way of a mine, both (i) by means of an anemometer and (ii) by observing the speed at which dust or smoke is carried by the air-currents; and, secondly, to calculate from the measurements the size (that is,

calculate from the measurements the size (that is, cross-sectional area) of the air-way or gallery in which the air to be measured is passing.

(h.) The candidate's hearing will be tested. The regulations require that his hearing should be such as to enable him to carry out his duties efficiently. This does not mean that a fireman must possess a standard of hearing should the fire that the standard of the strength of the standard of the strength of the stren Inis does not mean that a fireman must possess a standard of hearing above that of the average man, nor is it required that his hearing must be up to the standard in both ears. If the candidate is able to hear sounds audible to the average man it will be sufficient. The tests will usually be of a simple nature, and will naturally be varied by the examiner with different candidates and at different times.

Every candidate for a certificate by examination shall at least one month before the date fixed for the examination, and in the Form No. 3 hereto, make application in that behalf to "The Secretary of the Board of Examiners under the Coal-mines Act," at Wellington, and shall forward therewith the prescribed fee of 5s. and also a medical certificate that his senses of sight and hearing are not defective. his senses of sight and hearing are not defective.

5. For the purpose of enabling the Board to determine whether the candidate possesses the requisite practical experience, his application shall specify with sufficient particularity for identification and reference the respective mines in which he has been employed, and the period and nature of

his employment in each.

H. DAVIDSON, Chief Accountant, New Zealand Railways. Additional Regulations made by the Public Service Commissioner under the Authority of the Public Service Act, 1912.

HEREAS by section 34 of the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Public Service Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor in Council, is authorized to make regulations for the carrying-out of the provisions of the said Act:

Now, therefore, the Commissioner, in pursuance and exercise of the said authority, and with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make the additional regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth order that such regulations shall apply to every officer or other person employed in the Printing and Stationery Department.

SCHEDULE

ATTENDANCE.

1. The hours of attendance (except for linotype and monotype operators and the Clerical Division) shall be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., with an interval of one hour for dinner; except on Saturdays, when the hours shall be from 8 a.m. to 12 noon continuously. Hours for linotype and monotype operators shall be from 8 a.m. to 4.30 p.m., with an interval of one hour for dinner; except on Saturdays, when the hours shall be from 8 a.m. to 12 noon.

2. The hours of attendance for the Clerical Division shall be the

same as those observed in the Government Buildings.

3. If it is found necessary to organize a staff of night-hands, the number of hours worked per week shall be at the rate of four hours less per week than the day staff, and the additional rate of pay shall be a maximum of 10s. per week.

4. Punctual attendance must be strictly observed, and employees

must continue at work until the signal to cease is given.

5. Time-clocks are provided in the several branches to record the time of arrival and departure of all employees. Each employee must strike the clock for himself or herself. Absentees will be reported to the Superintendent each morning before 10 o'clock. A breach of this rule will be severely dealt with.

OVERTIME.

6. If attendance should be required earlier in the morning or later at night than usual, such attendance will be paid for as overtime at time-and-a-half rates.

Officers in the Clerical Division are not entitled to overtime, though it may be necessary that they should be on duty after ordinary working-hours.

ABSENCE.

7. Any employee who absents himself from the office during working-hours owing to any cause other than sickness, accident, or death of near relative must, not later than the following day, when feasible, report to his overseer, in writing or otherwise, the cause of such absence; and a record of the time lost shall be entered, for subsequent deduction from his salary.

Should the alleged cause of absence be deemed frivolous, or should any employee be frequently absent without sufficient cause, it will be the duty of the overseer to report the matter, through the Superintendent, to the Government Printer, who shall deal with it in the

manner provided by section 52 of the said Act.

8. If in any case absence is caused by sickness, accident, or death of near relative, and extends beyond two days, the employee must send notice, and, in case of sickness or accident, forward a medical certificate (a lodge certificate will be accepted) at the earliest opportunity.

9. Where sick-leave is applied for for more than three months the application must be referred to the Commissioner.

Sick-leave when granted by the Permanent Head shall not exceed the periods or rates of pay set out in the following schedule. A report of all leave granted under this regulation shall be submitted monthly for the approval of the Commissioner:—

Pay during sick-leave shall not be granted where an officer receives compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

Where in case of illness any officer who has received leave of absence for three months is not so far recovered as to be able to resume his duties, further extensions of leave may be provisionally granted by the Commissioner in accordance with the following schedule; provided that on each extension of leave the applicant shall be subjected to an examination by a medical practitioner approved by the Commissioner:—

If any officer is absent from duty on account of illness, and such absence has extended beyond three months, he shall not be permitted to return to duty until some medical practitioner approved by the Commissioner has certified that he is fit to resume work.

When extended leave is granted other than on full pay the rate paid for Sundays and holidays shall be the same as that allowed for the period of leave.

Sick-leave allowed under this regulation may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave provided for in the schedules is intended to cover a period of three years, dating from the first absence on sick-leave.

The second or any subsequent triennial period will commence on the date of the first absence on sick-leave following the date upon which the previous triennial period expired; and for the three years thus commencing the full amount of leave provided in the schedules according to length of service may again be allowed.

10. Any person guilty of practising imposition under the plea of sickness shall be subject to instant dismissal, disratement in rank, or reduction in salary, as the Commissioner may determine.

HOLIDAYS.

11. All public holidays will be granted to the employees by the Government Printer when any such holiday will not unduly interfere with the work in progress.

Should the attendance of the staff, or any portion thereof, be necessary on any holiday, an equal amount of time will be allowed for such attendance. If such equivalent time is not given within fourteen days of the holiday, then equivalent pay shall be given in lieu thereof. Double pay will be allowed for working on a Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, or Christmas Day.

- 12. The permanent staff shall be granted three weeks' holiday in each year, to be taken as follows—viz., two weeks at Christmastime (all public holidays occurring during that period to be included therein), and one week at such other period during the year as shall be arranged by the Permanent Head.
- 13. After twelve months' service temporary employees shall receive the same holiday and sick-leave privileges as permanent employees.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

- 14. Applications by permanent employees for leave of absence (other than the annual holiday) shall in all cases be made in writing to the Government Printer.
- 15. The Government Printer shall, in all cases of application for leave of absence by any employee, consider (1) the general conduct of the employee during the previous year, and (2) the regularity or irregularity of attendance by the employee for the same period during the hours of attendance prescribed by Regulation 1.
- 16. Special leave may be granted to members of the permanent staff on written application on the prescribed form to the Government Printer, when approved by the Commissioner.
- 17. Any employee absent from the office without such application having been made and granted shall, except in case of sudden illness or other emergency, as mentioned in Regulation 8, be deemed to be absent without leave.
- 18. On application, after ten years' continuous service, leave of absence may be granted by the Commissioner (on the recommendation of the Government Printer) to overseers, readers, and those employed in the Clerical Division for a period not exceeding three months on full pay, and to each member of the permanent staff for a period not exceeding two months on full pay: Provided that in each case the officer has not during the previous ten years had similar leave. ["Continuous service" means from original date of continuous employment.]
- 19. In cases of pressing necessity leave of absence may be granted by the Government Printer for one week without deduction of salary to any person on the permanent staff, or who has been employed during the preceding five years, provided the circumstances under which the request is made are stated in writing and are considered sufficient to justify the request being granted.

CLASSIFICATION.

20. The officers permanently employed in the Printing and Stationery Department shall be grouped under three heads, termed the "Administrative," "Clerical," and "General" Divisions; and such officers shall be entitled to be paid severally the annual increases of salary set forth in the Schedule to the General Classification List.

INCREASE OF SALARY.

- 21. Except in the case of officers appointed or promoted at some other date, every accrued increase of salary shall date from the first day of the financial year during which such increase may be voted by Parliament.
- 22. Increase of salary shall be granted and payable under the conditions prescribed by section 25 of the said Act.

OVERSEERS' REPORTS.

23. It shall be the duty of the respective officers of the general branches to report to the Superintendent at once upon its occurrence any remissness of duty, want of punctuality, or wastefulness on the part of any employee. The Chief Clerk shall report similarly upon the conduct of the clerical and warehouse employees. A yearly report shall also be supplied the Government Printer on the efficiency, regularity, and punctuality of each member of the staff in the several branches.

24. The Government Printer shall inquire into all complaints, and report to the Commissioner, making such recommendations as in his opinion the circumstances warrant.

GOVERNMENT PRINTER'S REPORT.

25. It shall be the duty of the Government Printer annually to furnish the Commissioner with a report on each officer and employee.

PROMOTIONS.

- 26. In selecting a person to fill any vacancy, fitness and merit shall be the first consideration, and seniority the next; but in cases of equal or nearly equal merit the senior officer shall take precedence, provided that there is no substantial reason to the contrary.
- 27. Appointments to the permanent staff shall be made from the ranks of the time-workers on the temporary staff.
- 28. In order to give effect as fully as possible to the foregoing regulation, the appointments shall be recommended by the Government Printer on the yearly reports of the overseer of the branch in which the vacancy occurs. Members of the staff shall be notified at once of the nature of any adverse report.
- 29. Readers shall be appointed or promoted by the Commissioner, on the recommendation of the Government Printer after consulting with the four senior readers.

RIGHT OF APPEAL.

30. In the event of any member of the staff feeling aggrieved with any decision of the Government Printer affecting himself personally or the branch in which he serves, permission will be given such member to state the grounds of his dissatisfaction, in writing, to the Commissioner. Each appeal shall be handed to the Government Printer, who shall forward it to the Commissioner within four days, together with such remarks or explanation as he feels called upon to make. The decision appealed against shall remain in force until such time as the decision of the Commissioner is given. In the event of any important decision being appealed against, the person appealing shall have the right to appear before the Commissioner and state his case either personally or by a representative from the staff, and call evidence in support of such appeal.

MISCONDUCT.

- 31. Should any member of the permanent staff be guilty of negligence or insubordination, it shall be the duty of his overseer to admonish him; but, should such offence be repeated, it shall be the duty of the overseer (through the Superintendent) to report the matter to the Government Printer, who shall deal with it in the manner prescribed by section 52 of the said Act.
- 32. Any member of the permanent staff who has been guilty of negligence, insubordination, or other misconduct shall not receive for the following year the accrued increase of salary to which he would otherwise have been entitled under Regulation 21.

CONFIDENTIAL WORK.

- 33. To ensure due secrecy, Ministerial statements and memoranda, Customs-tariff alterations, policy measures, and all work of a strictly confidential character shall, when practicable, be entrusted only to members of the permanent staff. Should the extent or urgency of the work, however, require a wider distribution, it shall be the duty of the overseers to confine it to as few hands as possible.
- 34. Any employee who may reasonably be suspected of divulging information of a confidential nature shall be suspended, and should proof be forthcoming he shall be at once dismissed by the Commissioner.

PERMANENT STAFF.

35. The permanent staff shall comprise all employees whose names shall appear in a register to be called the "Staff Register," which shall contain a record of date of appointment, age, absences, gratuities, and any other matters that may be deemed necessary.

TEMPORARY STAFF.

- 36. The temporary staff of compositors shall comprise all those not included in the permanent staff, and may be employed either on piece or time work.
- 37. Temporary hands of less than two months' service will be under engagement by the day, terminable without notice on either side; all others shall be subject to one week's notice on either side.
- 38. Semi-permanent hands who have not been off the staff for more than two months during the preceding year shall be entitled to all gazetted Government holidays occurring while in employment. Temporary hands shall be so entitled after two months' consecutive employment immediately preceding such holiday.
- 39. The rates of remuneration for temporary employees shall in in no case be lower than the current rate paid in Wellington City for a similar class of work.

APPLICATIONS OF EMPLOYEES, HOW TO BE MADE.

40. The application of any employee for promotion, leave of absence, increase of salary, or in respect to any other matter affecting his position in the Office shall be made to the Government Printer by the applicant himself, through the Superintendent or the head of his branch; and if it is made by or through any other person it will be treated as irregular.

Boys.

41. Boys, other than apprentices, will be employed at the rate of 10s. per week for the first six months. Thereafter increases will be given at the rate of 2s. 6d. per week at intervals of six months until the rate paid assistants in the several branches is reached, when the schedule rates will be paid.

APPRENTICES.

- 42. Applicants for employment as apprentices must not be under fourteen or over sixteen years of age, and must be of sound bodily health and of good character, and shall have passed an examination equal to that of the Fifth Standard under the Education Act.
- 43. All male apprentices shall be indentured for a period of not less than six years, and the rates of wages shall be the rates ruling in Wellington City.
- 44. Apprentices will be placed in the branches for which they seem best adapted. Those selected for the composing branch must be at least one year in the reading-room prior to being transferred to the composing-room; but in no case shall more than one year passed in the reading-room be reckoned as part of the period of apprenticeship.
- 45. Apprentices in all branches who have served their full term satisfactorily shall be entitled to one year's employment as journeymen.

FEMALE EMPLOYEES.

46. Candidates for employment must not be under fourteen years of age, and must be of sound bodily health and of good character.

47. Females will be taken for the first six months on probation, at 8s. per week. Should they prove capable and industrious, they will then receive the following rates of wages as casual hands:—

ALTERATION IN REGULATIONS.

48. These regulations may be altered or amended from time to time as occasion may require. Due notice of such alteration or amendment to be given to employees.

By-laws.

49. The Government Printer shall have power, subject to the Commissioner's approval, to make, alter, or amend by-laws, not being inconsistent with these regulations, for the internal regulation and discipline of the Department.

SUSPENSION.

50. In cases of suspension from duty, report shall be made to the Commissioner, with the necessary recommendation as to the confirmation or otherwise of such suspension.

STRANGERS VISITING THE OFFICE.

51. Persons wishing to interview any employee during working-hours shall first apply at the clerks' office, when, if the matter is urgent, the employee will be summoned to the waiting-room. Strangers are not allowed in the workrooms except by authority of the Government Printer or his deputy.

GENERAL.

- 52. The Government Printer may remove any member temporarily from the class in which he is entered, and such member shall whilst engaged in the higher class receive the wages due to members of that class; but on being returned to the class from which he was temporarily raised he shall receive the rate of pay belonging to that class. No member shall lose status or pay if temporarily removed to a lower class than that to which he belongs.
- 53. Suggestions that tend towards economy and efficient working of the different branches are invited from employees; these suggestions to be forwarded to the Government Printer, and if adopted will be duly recognized.
- 54. Subject to the provisions of these regulations, the General Regulations contained in Parts 1, 2, 5, 7, and 8 of the General Regulations made by the Public Service Commissioner shall apply to every officer and person employed in the Printing and Stationery Department.

Atmospheric pressure remained high in the northern districts from the beginning until the 27th of the month, although during this period several depressions of but slight intensity passed in the south—viz., on the 3rd, 9th, 11th, 13th, 16th, and 22nd. On the latter date some heavy downpours occurred, especially in the western districts.

The most unsettled period, however, was from the 27th to the end of the month, when an intense and extensive depression of a cyclonic type enveloped the Dominion. General rains ensued, which were extremely beneficial to portions of the North Island, where dry conditions had been experienced for some time.

As a whole the month was one of fine and warm weather. Nearly the whole of the North Island, and also the north-eastern portion of the South, recorded considerably less than the normal rainfall, but the remaining portion of the South Island had an excess.

Caution with regard to Sweeping Operations.

Caution.—H.M. vessels are frequently engaged in sweeping operations off ports in the United Kingdom.

Whilst so engaged they work in pairs, connected by a wire hawser, and are consequently hampered to a very considerable extent in their manceuvring powers.

With a view to indicating the nature of the work on which these vessels are engaged, they will show the following signals: A black ball at the foremast-head, and a similar ball at the yardarm, or where it can be best seen, on that side on which it is dangerous for vessels to pass.

For mutual safety, other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, should endeavour, without violating the rule of the road, to keep out of the way of vessels flying this signal, and should especially remember that it is dangerous to pass between the vessels of a pair.

BAY OF BENGAL, BURMA.—MERGUI ARCHIPELAGO.

Courts Island, Rock South-westward of.

Position.—At a distance of 5½ miles, 240° (S. 59° W. Mag.), from the 1,180-foot summit of Courts Island. Lat. 11° 55′ 15″ N., long. 97° 53′ 30″ E., on chart No. 216A.
