And, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of seven members.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act 1911 : 1 is never to the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor

under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act:

And whereas the Wellington City Corporation (hereinafter referred to as "the said Corporation") desires to erect an electric line from the overhead wire on Davis Street to connect with a motor on the Wellington Harbour Board's property in the vicinity of that street (hereinafter referred to as "the said electric line"), and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of

with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the said Corporation to erect and maintain the said electric line for the purpose of supplying electricity to the aforesaid motor, such electric line being indicated by a red line on the plan marked P.W.D. 34370, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS.

1. THE conductors shall be at a minimum height of 20 ft.

above the surface of the ground.

2. The conductors shall be composed of stranded copper or aluminium. The size of the strand shall be not less than No. 20 standard wire gauge, and the number of strands shall not be less than seven.

3. The positive conductor shall be insulated throughout its length with rubber covering of 600-megohm grade.
4. The negative conductor may be uninsulated.

5. A fuse cut-out shall be placed on the positive conductor where it leaves the tramway trolly-wire. A switch and a circuit-breaker fitted with an overload and no-load release shall be inserted in the positive conductor and placed near the motor.

the motor.

6. The negative conductor shall be continuous throughout its length from the motor terminal to the tramway rail, to which it shall be effectively bonded.

7. The conductors shall be carried on substantial supports, which shall be designed to have a factor of safety of 5 under a wind-pressure of 30 lb. per square foot.

8. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government Railways until the Corporation has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto, as required by Section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).

9. Where the conductors cross telegraph or telephone wires, or if any telegraph or telephone wire is hereafter installed so as to cross the conductors, substantial guard-

wires, or if any telegraph or telephone wire is hereafter installed so as to cross the conductors, substantial guardwires effectively earthed shall be erected by or at the cost of the said Corporation if deemed necessary by the Minister of Telegraphs. Such guard-wires shall consist of two stranded galvanized-steel wires carried on substantial supports at a height of 2 ft. above the conductors if the telegraph or telephone wires pass over the conductors, or 2 ft. above the telegraph or telephone wires if they pass under the conductors. Earth-wires where led down poles shall be protected by a casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground.

10. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of April, 1914, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day

April, 1914, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of October, 1914.

11. The said Corporation shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

12. The said Corporation shall not use the said electric line or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the Corporation that he has received from the Engineer appointed by him to inspect the work a certificate that it has been satisfactorily carried out.

13. The said electric line, including the supports, the conductors, and the insulated covering, shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained by the said Corporation as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions, and shall not be permitted by the said Corporation to remain erected after it has ceased to be used for the supply of elec-

receted after to has consected tricity.

14. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the said Corporation without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations received in this license.

is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

15. If the said Corporation fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the Corporation within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice, and if the said Corporation fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period, it shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.

16. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause

16. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the said Corporation fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

17. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the said Corporation, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the same.

18. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works, nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the said Corporation for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

CAUTION TO BE EXERCISED BY MERCHANT SHIPS WHEN APPROACHING BRITISH PORTS.

The following extract from British Admiralty Notice
to Mariners No. 1 of 1914, on the subject of caution to be exercised by merchant ships when approaching British ports, is published for general information.

PART I.

Closing of Ports.

- I. My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having taken into consideration the fact that local or other circumstances may arise in which it may be necessary, on account of perimay arise in which it may be necessary, on account of periodical exercises, manœuvres, or otherwise, to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom, or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire referred to in Part III of this notice, a sharp lookout should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph 5, Part II, of this notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.
- 2. If entrance to a port is prohibited, three red vertical lights by night, or three red vertical balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph 5, Part II, of this notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must either proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

3. At all the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III of this notice searchlights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing movable searchlights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp lookout for the signals indicated in paragraph 2 above when searchlights are observed to be working.

PART II.

Examination Service.

- 4. Under certain circumstances it may become necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III of this notice.
- 5. In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph 7 will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the ports and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor. If Government vessels or vessels belonging to the local port authority are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels with a view to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the examination anchorage. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.
- 6. As the institution of the examination service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp lookout for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph 7, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun or sound rocket. or sound-rocket.

In entering by night any of the ports mentioned below in Part III, serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient all round lamps, two red and two white, are kept available

7. By day the distinguishing flags of the examination steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border) and a blue ensign.

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is closed.

By night the steamer will carry

(a.) Three red vertical lights if the port is closed. (b.) Three white vertical lights if the port is open.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

8. Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any of these ports when the examination service is in force, they must, in their own interests, strictly obey all instructions given to them by the examination steamer. In the absence of any instructions from the examination steamer they must proceed to the position marked "Examination anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

Whilst at anchor in the examination anchorage masters are warned that they must not lower any boats (except to avoid accident), communicate with the shore, work cables, move the ship, or allow any one to leave the ship without permission from the examination steamer. 9. In case of fog, masters of vessels are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the examination anchorage itself should be approached with caution.

10. The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

By the inclusion of the suburbs the rate is lowered at Wellington, but raised in the case of the other three centres. Excluding the suburbs, it will be observed that Wellington has the highest rate, Christchurch next highest, Auckland and Dunedin following. The birth-rate for the Dominion last year was 26·14 per thousand. All four centres are

thus below the average.

The birth-rates for each of the four central boroughs last year show a decrease when compared with 1912. In Auckland the rate fell from 30.63 to 23.23; in Wellington from 28.20 to 24.88; in Christchurch from 29.52 to 23.56; and in Dunedin from 29.10 to 21.61. The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Dunedin, but raises it at Christohurch.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburous northern amounted to 624, against 635 in December—a decrease of 11. The deaths in January were 214—a decrease of 30 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 116, females 98. Thirty-eight of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 17.76 per cent. of the whole number; 27 of these were under one year of age.

There were 55 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 69 in December. The following table shows the classification:—

THE following recommendations of the Conciliation Council appointed to hear the above dispute are published pursuant to subsection (4) of section 43 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act Amendment Act, 1908, and number 34 of the regulations thereunder.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

Hours of Work.

1. (a.) The actual working-time per week shall not exceed forty-seven hours.

(b.) The actual working-time per day shall not exceed eight hours and a half for the first five working-days of the week, and four hours and a half on Saturday.

(c.) Work shall not commence earlier than 7.30 a.m. and cease at 4.45 p.m., and three-quarters of an hour shall be allowed for dinner, except on Saturday, when work shall cease at noon.

(d.) Where shifts are worked the shift's work shall not exceed eight hours per day, inclusive of crib-time.

Overtime.

2. (a.) In case of shift-men they shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter if required to continue work after completion of their ordinary shift, and in cases of emergency it shall be competent for the company to start its men at an earlier hour than that provided for in this award, providing that after eight hours (inclusive of crib-time) have been worked it shall be considered as overtime and paid for at overtime rates.

(b.) The above clause (a) shall not apply when workers arrange to work double shifts or overtime for the convenience of their

fellow-workers.

No shift-man shall absent himself from work without lawful excuse, and no worker shall take the place of another worker without having first obtained the permission of whoever for the time being is in charge of the department affected.

(c.) All time worked beyond hours herein prescribed shall be paid for as overtime at the rate of time and a quarter until midnight, and thereafter until the usual starting-time at the rate of time and a half.

Holidays.

3. All work done on Sundays shall be paid for as overtime work at the rate of time and a half. All work done on New Year's Day, Boxing Day, Christmas Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Easter Saturday, and the recognized Labour Day for the Auckland Province shall be paid for at double the time rates.

Discharging and Loading Boats-

- (a.) Where workers are engaged discharging and loading boats other than coal or white-lime barges the rate of pay shall not be less than 1s. 6d. per hour. No overtime rates to apply to this clause
- (b.) Youths' wages to be fixed and their work defined by mutual agreement between the union and employers.

Men being sent Home.

5. In the event of men coming to work and being sent home through there being no work through no fault of their own, they shall be allowed one hour, at 1s. &d. per hour, unless previously notified. Where shift-men are allowed to load boats payment shall commence when work starts.

Tools.

6. All tools shall be supplied by the employer.

Meals

7. Thirty minutes shall be allowed for crib-time. Where two or more men are employed in the same department they shall not have crib simultaneously.

Accommodation.

8. Fresh water shall be provided for drinking and washing

purposes.

The employers shall provide the workers with (a) a bathroom suitably equipped; (b) proper accommodation to enable workers to change their clothes and have their meals; (c) proper sanitary accommodation.

Proper heating-apparatus shall be installed to dry workers' clothes, and boiling water shall be provided in time for workers' meals, and also for the purpose of washing workers' clothes.

Transfer.

9. Any worker temporarily engaged in any line of work other than in which he is commonly engaged shall be paid the wage prevailing in that branch to which he is temporarily transferred: Provided always that in no case shall the wage be less than he is entitled to in his usual work.

Disputes.

- 10. (a.) If any dispute arises in connection with this agreement between the representatives of the company and workers, such dispute may be settled by mutual agreement between the management and the union representatives. In the event of no agreement being arrived at the dispute shall be referred to the Conciliation Commissioner, whose decision shall be final.
- (b.) Any matter not provided for in this award may be adjusted by written agreement between the employers concerned and the union representatives.
- (c.) No worker shall be employed below the minimum rate except by permit of the union.

Preference.

11. (a.) In all cases when the company is engaging hands during the term of this award it shall be the duty of the company to inform every new worker that the employer and workers at Limestone Island are working under an award, and that such worker is required to become a member of the union within a period of fourteen days, and must pay an entrance fee not exceeding 5s. within that time, together with subsequent contributions not exceeding 6d. per week, payable fortnightly, and in all respects properly comply with the rules of the union.

(b.) If the company hereafter engages any worker who does not become and remain a member of the union within fourteen days the company shall dismiss such worker if requested to do so by the union. The company undertakes to include in its pay-roll only financial members of the Limestone Island Cement Employees'

Industrial Union of Workers.

(c.) No official of the company shall be a member of the union.

Accidents.

12. A modern first-aid outfit, fully equipped, shall be kept in a convenient and accessible place.

Term of Award.

13. This award shall come into force on the 9th day of February, 1914, and shall extend until the 9th day of February, 1917.
