#### A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the lands specified in Part I of the Schedule VV hereto are State forests under the control of the Commissioner of State Forests appointed under the State Forests Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and the said lands are now no longer required for State-forest purposes: And whereas plans showing the extent and position of the said lands, and a statement of the reasons why they are no longer required for State-forest purposes, have been laid before both Houses of Parliament for a period of thirty days, and no resolution has been passed by either of such Houses objecting to the issue of this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers conferred by section twenty-eight of the said Act, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent or the Executive Council of the said Dominion doth hereby revoke Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Proclamations specified in Part II of the said Schedule, so far as they relate respectively to the lands described in Part I of the said Schedule, as from the date of the publica-tion hereof in the New Zealand Gazette; and doth hereby proclaim and declare that from and after such date the parcels of land described in Part I of the said Schedule shall be no longer subject to the provisions of the said Act.

#### SUMMARY FOR FEBRUARY.

Between the 1st and 5th of the month a westerly low-pressure area, of a cyclonic type, in its passage over the Dominion caused very unsettled conditions. Heavy rains occurred at this time in many parts, particularly in South Canterbury and northern Otago. On this account these two districts show an aggregate rainfall considerably above the average.

Several of these disturbances, but of minor intensity, had a disturbing influence on weather-conditions about the 11th, 24th, and 26th, but on the whole the month was one of fine and warm weather.

With the exception of the two districts mentioned above, precipitation was everywhere below normal.
