WHEREAS by section eighteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1912, it is enacted that when any land is subject to Part XIV of the Native Land Act, 1909, and is vested in a Maori Land Board accordingly, the Governor may from time to time declare by Order in Council that such land or any part thereof shall no longer be subject to that Part of the said Act:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto and known as Rangitoto A No. 46B Block is now, by virtue of an Order in Council made on the sixteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and by of De-cember, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and by virtue of the provisions of section two hundred and thirty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, subject to Part XIV of the said Act, and vested in the Waikato Maniapoto District Maori Land Board accordingly:

I N pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority conferred on him by section thirteen of the Wanganui Harbour District and Empowering Act, 1913 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and by the Harbours Amend-

ment Act, 1910, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following provisions as to the election of members of the Wanganui Harbour Board to be held in accordance with subsections two and three of section thirteen of the said Act.

PROVISIONS.

1. THE first elections under subsections (2) and (3) of section 13 THE first elections under subsections (2) and (3) of section 13 of the said Act shall be held on the 29th day of April, 1914.
 The County Council of the County of Wanganui shall be the principal authority and the Returning Officer of the Wanganui County shall be the Returning Officer for the purposes of all elections to be held in the combined district constituted under subsection (2) of section 13 of the said Act.
 The regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council in average of the powers and authorities conformed

in Council in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by sections 7 and 13 of the Harbours Amendment Act, 1910, gazetted in the New Zealand Gazette of the 2nd day of March, 1911, as amended by the further regulations made and gazetted in the New Zealand Gazette of the 30th day of March, 1911, shall regulate the first election to be held in the combined district constituted under the said subsection (2); but the further amending regulations made and gazetted in the New Zealand Gazette of the 3rd day of April, 1913, shall not apply to such first election. 4. The County Council of the County of Waitotara shall

cause to be prepared from the electors rolls of the several ridings of the County of Waitotara an electors roll for those portions of such ridings included in the Wanganui Harbour District.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in section 7 of the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1908, public notice of such two first elections shall be given not less than ten days before such elections, and the date for nomination of candidates shall be not less than five clear days before such election.

Every person removing stone, shingle, boulders, or sand from any portion of the shore lying between high- and low-water marks at ordinary spring tides, or from the bed of any harbour, or of a navigable river, or of the sea imme-diately adjacent thereto, under the authority in writing of the Minister, shall pay a royalty of 6d. per cubic yard in the case of stone, shingle, or boulders, and 3d. per cubic yard in the case of sand.

Regulations made under the Public Service Act, 1912, for the Examination of Inspectors of Factories for promotion in the Department of Labour.

HEREAS by section 34 of the Public Service Act, 1912 (here-inafter called "the said Act"), the Public Service Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor in Council, is authorized to make regulations for the carrying-out of the provisions of the said Act, and such regulations may be made either generally or with respect to any particular case or class of cases :

Now, therefore, the Commissioner, in pursuance and exercise of the said authority, and with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, with respect to the examination of Inspectors of Factories, General Division, Department of Labour, who are desirous of promotion to the positions of Officers in Charge, or as Inspectors in Charge, Clerical Division; and doth order that such regulations shall have effect from and after the date of publication thereof in the Gazette.

1. An examination for such Inspectors of Factories (hereinafter termed "the prescribed examination") shall be held at such times and at such places as may from time to time be fixed by the Commissioner and of which due notice will be given.

2. Any such Inspector of Factories who desires to sit for examination shall give notice of his intention to the Secretary of Labour.

3. Each subject of the prescribed examination shall be compulsory, and candidates shall be deemed to have failed who do not obtain at least $33\frac{1}{3}$ per centum of the maximum marks allotted for each subject, and at least 40 per centum of the aggregate maximum marks for all the subjects; provided that any candidate who fails in not more than two subjects shall be allowed to again sit for such subjects within one year of failing. In such case the marks obtained in the subjects in which the candidate passed at the previous examination shall be included in the aggregate marks obtained for all the subjects.

Whenever vacancies occur in the Department of Labour in the positions of Officers in Charge at Auckland, Christchurch, and Dunedin, or Inspectors in Charge at Wellington and Invercargill, Inspectors of Factories who have passed the prescribed examination shall be eligible for promotion to such positions, and upon such appointment shall be deemed to be promoted to the Clerical Division; provided that no officer so promoted shall be entitled to appointment to any other position in the Clerical Division until he has passed the Public Service Entrance or Senior Examination.

7. All persons duly authorized in that behalf shall have free right of ingress, egress, and regress for such purposes as the Commissioner of Crown Lands may deem expedient.

8. The lessee shall prevent the growth and spread of gorse, broom, and sweetbrier on the land, and he shall with all reasonable despatch remove or cause to be removed all gorse,

reasonable despatch remove or cause to be removed all gorse, sweetbrier, broom, ragwort, or other noxicus weeds or plants as may be directed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands. 9. The lease shall be liable to forfeiture in case the lease shall fail to fulfil any of the conditions of the lease within thirty days after the date on which the same ought to have been fulfilled.
