The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 637, against 575 in February—an increase of 62. The deaths in March were 251—an increase of 18 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 141, females 110. Sixty-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 24.70 per cent. of the whole number; 55 of these were under one year of age.

There were 76 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 75 in February. The following table shows the classification:—

This by-law shall be called and may for all purposes be cited as By-law No. 3 of the Ohinemuri County, and shall apply to that portion of the Ohinemuri County known as the Waihi Beach Road, and situate between the south-eastern boundary of the Borough of Waihi and the north-western boundary of the Tauranga County.

1. In this by-law—

“Motor” shall have the meaning assigned to the word “motor” by section 2 of the Motor Regulation Act, 1908 ; and shall include a motor-car, cycle-car, motor-cycle, or any other vehicle propelled by mechanical power :

“Road” means that portion of the Waihi Beach Road as is under the care, control, or management of the Ohinemuri County Council, and as to which the Ohinemuri County Council has by law authority to make this by-law, or as to which the same is capable of operating ; and, unless repugnant to the context, includes a bridge or culvert forming part of such road, and is hereinafter referred to as “the said road” :

“Vehicle” means and includes every coach, carriage, omnibus, drag, cab, cart, dray, wagon, timber-carriage, lorry, van, express wagon, and any other conveyance whatever its construction, drawn by or harnessed to an animal or animals.

2. The driver or any person in charge of any motor on the said road shall on approaching, meeting, or overtaking any person on the said road, or when approaching any bend or corner in the said road, whether or not such other person is on foot, or is riding, leading, or driving any horse or any other animal, or is driving any vehicle, give audible and sufficient warning to such other person of the approach or position of such motor by sounding a horn, gong, bell, or other instrument.

3. The driver, rider, or person in charge of any motor on the said road shall, on the request of any person driving, riding, leading, or having charge of any restive horse, or having charge of any vehicle drawn by a restive horse, and coming towards or going the same way as the motor, or on any such person holding his hand up as a signal for that purpose, cause such motor to stop and become stationary, and shall stop the engine thereof until such person with the horse or vehicle which he is so driving, riding, leading, or in charge of shall have passed or removed to the rear of the motor.

4. No driver or person in charge of any motor when on the said road shall cause or permit or allow such motor to be

driven or operated or to remain or stand on the said road so as to obstruct or interfere with the traffic thereon.

5. No person shall drive, operate, or attempt to drive or operate a motor on the said road unless he is a person competent to drive or operate the same and competent to control its use and movements.

6. No person or bailee having the possession or use of a motor while on the said road shall permit any other person to drive or operate or attempt to drive or operate the same unless such last-mentioned person is competent to drive or operate the same.

7. No person driving or in charge of a motor when on the said road shall leave or quit such motor without having taken due precautions against its starting or being started in his absence.

8. The driver, rider, or person in charge of any motor on the said road shall, on meeting or overtaking any motor or other vehicle which shall be slowing down or shall have stopped for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, decrease the speed of the said motor so that the same shall not pass any part of the said motor or other vehicle at a greater speed than four (4) miles per hour.

9. Every driver, rider, or person in charge of any motor shall, when meeting or passing any vehicle or horseman, in every instance, whether coming or going,—

(a.) Drive and pass such vehicle or horseman on the south side of the said road.

(b.) When passing any other motor on the said road, observe the ordinary rule of the road.

10. Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

This By-law No. 3 shall come into force on the first day of June, 1914.

The above by-law was made by the Ohinemuri County Council by special order duly passed at a special meeting of the Council held on the fifth day of February, 1914, and confirmed at a subsequent meeting of the said Council on the second day of April, 1914.

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SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

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Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
