A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty of the Public Works Act, 1908, that if it is found that any land held, taken, purchased, or acquired at any time under this or any other Act or Provincial Ordinance, or otherwise howsoever, for any public work, is not required for such public work, the Governor may, by an Order in Council publicly notified and gazetted, cause the same to be sold under the conditions therein mentioned:

And whereas it is further provided by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, that in the case of any land so taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work and not required for that purpose, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without complying with any other requirements of the aforesaid section thirty, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 102 of the seventh day of the same month, the Coastal Steamship Company (Limited) was licensed to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto on the Mahurangi River for the purpose of erecting a wharf thereon in accordance with plans marked M.D. 2317 and 2318, deposited in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington: And whereas the said license was, with the consent of the Minister of Marine, transferred to the Northern Steamship Company (Limited) (hereinafter called "the company") on the twentieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten:

And whereas the said license having expired the company has applied for a renewal under the Harbours Act, 1908, and it is expedient that such renewal should be granted for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the

power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which are particularly shown and delineated on the plans marked M.D. 2317 and 2318 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining thereon a wharf; such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the maintenance of such wharf, which are shown on the plans marked M.D. 2317 and 2318, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the company shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £2 in advance, dating from the 1st day of December, 1913, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

5. All persons shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

* 6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the company, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made, as the case may be.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulation made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 4th day of December, 1913, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company.

11. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the part of the company.

12. In case the company shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;

(3.) Fail to pay the sum specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or

(4.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred,

may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Part IV of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations with respect to the purchase by lessees of the fee-simple of the land comprised in leases in perpetuity of settlement land; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

PART I.

PURCHASE OF THE WHOLE OF THE LAND INCLUDED IN A LEASE IN PERPETUITY.

1. EVERY owner of a lease in perpetuity of settlement land who desires to purchase the fee-simple of the land comprised in his lease in pursuance of the provisions of Part IV of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1913, hereinafter called "the said Act," shall give notice of his intention to the Commissioner of Crown Lands in the form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto.

2. Every such notice shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration made by the lessee in the form No. 2 in the said Schedule.

3. Every such notice shall on delivery at the office of the said Commissioner be stamped with the date of such delivery, and the Commissioner shall as soon as practicable give notice under his hand in the form No. 3 or in the form No. 4 in the Schedule hereto, informing the lessee of the receipt of the notice, and setting out in accordance with the said Act the terms upon which the purchase is to be completed.

4. Every license to occupy issued in pursuance of any such notice to purchase on deferred payments shall be under the hand of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, and shall be in the form No. 5 in the Schedule hereto.

5. Every such license to occupy shall be registered under the Land Transfer Act, 1908, in manner provided by section 90 of the Land Act, 1908.

PART II.

PURCHASE OF PART OF THE LAND INCLUDED IN A LEASE IN PERPETUITY.

6. Every owner of a lease in perpetuity of settlement land who is disqualified by section 60 of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1912, from purchasing the whole of the land included in that lease under Part IV of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1913, and who is desirous of purchasing part of that land under section 61 of the last-mentioned Act, shall make application to the Land Board in the form No. 6 in the Schedule hereto for the consent of the Land Board to such purchase.

7. The applicant shall lodge with the application a plan showing the position and the approximate area and boundaries of the land so proposed to be purchased.

8. If the Land Board consents to such purchase the lessee shall within three calendar months after such consent deliver to the Commissioner of Crown Lands a notice of his desire to purchase the land in the form No. 7 in the Schedule hereto.

9. Every such notice shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration made by the lessee in the form No. 8 in the Schedule hereto.

10. Every such notice shall be accompanied by a plan of a survey of the land proposed to be purchased, made and certified by a licensed surveyor at the cost of the lessee.

11. Every such notice shall, on the delivery thereof at the office of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, be stamped with the date of such delivery.

12. On the receipt of such notice the Commissioner of Crown Lands shall thereupon make application to the Valuer-General to determine, in accordance with section 60 of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1913, as modified by these regulations, the price of the land included in the plan.

13. For the purpose of such determination the provisions of section 60 of the said Act are hereby, under the authority of section 61 of that Act, modified in manner following:—

(a.) Every reference in section 60 of the said Act to the capital value of the land comprised in the lease shall be construed as a reference to the capital value of that part of the land comprised in the lease which is included in the said plan.

(b.) Every reference in section 60 of the said Act to improvements shall be construed as a reference to improvements effected on the land included in the said plan.

(c.) Every reference in section 60 of the said Act to the original capital value of the land included in the lease shall be construed as a reference to the original capital value of the land included in the said plan, computed in manner hereinafter provided.

(d.) For the purpose of determining the original capital value of the land included in the said plan, the Valuer-General shall apportion the original capital value of the whole of the land included in the lease, as defined by section 60 of the said Act, between the land included in the said plan and the residue of the land included in the said lease in proportion to the relative values of those several areas at the date of the delivery of the notice to purchase. The sum so apportioned to the land included in the said plan shall be deemed to be the original capital value thereof for the purpose of determining the price thereof.

14. The Valuer-General shall thereupon certify to the Commissioner of Crown Lands the price so determined by him, and the Commissioner shall thereupon, in the form No. 9 or in the form No. 10 in the Schedule hereto, deliver to the lessee a notice acknowledging the receipt of the notice and setting out the terms upon which the purchase is to be completed.

15. Every license to occupy issued in pursuance of any such notice to purchase on deferred payment shall be under the hand of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, and shall be in the form No. 11 in the Schedule thereto.

16. Every such license shall be registered under the Land Transfer Act, 1908, in manner provided by section 90 of the Land Act, 1908.

17. Upon completion of a purchase for cash, or on the payment of the deposit payable in respect of a purchase on deferred payments, the lessee shall deliver his lease to the Commissioner of Crown Lands.

18. The annual rental payable by the lessee under his lease in perpetuity for the land not included in his purchase shall, as from the date of the delivery of the notice to purchase, be reduced to a sum equal to 5 per cent. of the original capital value of the whole land originally included in the lease after deducting therefrom the original capital value calculated in accordance with these regulations of the land purchased by the lessee.

19. On the completion of a purchase for cash, or on the payment of the deposit payable in respect of a purchase on deferred payments, the Commissioner of Crown Lands shall deliver to the District Land Registrar, together with the lease, a certificate under his hand in the form No. 12 in the Schedule hereto, indicating the reduced area and rental of the lease.

20. The District Land Registrar shall thereupon enter upon the register and upon every instrument of title a memorial of the reduced area and rental, in accordance with the said certificate of the Commissioner of Crown Lands.

authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the bridge described in the Schedule hereto, and known as the Taieri Mouth Bridge (hereinafter called "the said bridge"), shall, on and after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Bruce County Council; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers aforesaid, I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, or improving the said bridge shall be provided and paid by the local authorities hereinafter mentioned in the following proportions—viz., the Bruce County Council to pay sixty per centum of such cost, and the Taieri County Council to pay forty per centum of such cost respectively: And I do hereby direct that the contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Taieri County Council towards the cost of maintaining, repairing, or improving the said bridge shall be paid from time to time, in the proportion hereinbefore prescribed, out of the county fund of the said County of Taieri, within a period of one month after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Council of the County of Bruce, stating the amount so required to be paid and the purpose for which it is required, shall have been left at the office of the Taieri County Council, and the payments so required to be made shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the Bruce County Council for and on behalf of the Council of the County of Taieri.

Elementary Kindergarten Certificates.

THE following program of examination for Elementary Kindergarten Certificates proposed to be granted under the authority of the Minister of Education to student-teachers of kindergarten schools who desire to obtain a diploma in elementary kindergarten work, and who fulfil the required conditions, is hereby published for general information.

ELEMENTARY KINDERGARTEN CERTIFICATE.

1. CANDIDATES before admission to examination for this certificate—

- (a.) Must have passed the Intermediate Examination or its equivalent, or have gained an Intermediate Certificate; and
- (b.) Must have completed two years of service as student-teacher or assistant in a kindergarten school under one or other of the recognized kindergarten associations of the Dominion, and in connexion therewith or with a training college have satisfactorily completed an approved course of two years' training and instruction in kindergarten principles and practice, and such allied subjects as fall within the scope of the certificate, or must have elsewhere completed a course of service and training recognized by the Education Department as equivalent thereto.

2. The examination will be in the following subjects:—

- (1.) Knowledge of Child Nature (including the elements of Child Hygiene and Psychology).
- (2.) Nature Knowledge.
- (3.) Kindergarten Principles.
- (4.) Kindergarten Practice.
- (5.) Class Teaching.
- (6.) Educational Handwork.
- (7.) Blackboard Drawing.
- (8.) Singing.

PROGRAM.

1. *Knowledge of Child Nature.*—The bodily functions of the child and his natural activities; conditions of healthy growth and development, with special reference to food, sleep, warmth, cleanliness, fresh air, and exercise. School conditions affecting the child's physical well-being—ventilation, heating, sanitation, hours of work, exercise, play, rest, &c. The recognition of marked defects in a child's general development. Symptoms of defective conditions in sense organs, good and bad postures during ordinary work, meaning and signs of fatigue.

Meaning and importance of play in general, of imitation, curiosity, imagination, &c. The means of developing ideas and utilizing interests, and the necessity for encouraging a variety of modes of expression. Early moral training; the development of instincts into valuable habits; the presentation of ideals within the grasp of the child; the gradual development of self-consciousness and self-control. Right use of authority.

2. *Nature Knowledge*.—(i.) *Plant Life*: The general structure of a plant and the uses of its different parts, illustrated by the simplest physiological experiments. The flower, and the formation from it of the fruit. The commonest means of seed dispersal. Experimental study of the germination of seeds. The structure and germination of the seed of the bean plant, the oak, and maize (or wheat). Special study of the growth and development of the crocus, daffodil, and potato.

Life-history and structure of the buttercup, pea, foxglove (or snapdragon), and daisy (or sunflower). Pollination on the visits of insects to flowers.

The recognition of the following trees at different seasons by means of various parts and organs, such as buds, bark, leaves, flowers, &c.—the oak, plane tree, willow, wattle, blue-gum, *pinus insignis*, manuka.

Study of the winter resting bud of any common fruit tree.

The care of garden plots, and the use in the Kindergarten of school gardens and class-room plants; school excursions.

(ii.) *Animal Life*: The general characteristics, habits, and life-histories of the following:—

- (a.) Cat, dog, cow, horse, sheep, rabbit, mouse.
- (b.) Fowl, pigeon, sparrow, starling, thrush.
- (c.) Fish and frog.
- (d.) Bee, moth, butterfly, house-fly, spider.
- (e.) Earth-worm, slug (or garden snail).

N.B.—(1.) In both plant and animal life special attention is required to be given to natural environment, and to any notable adaptations of structure and habits to the general living-conditions. (2.) Sketches in illustration of answers will be regarded as essential.

(iii.) *Earth and Sky Study* (chiefly in connexion with gardening and the needs of Plant and Animal Life):—

- (a.) Water—its general properties and the importance of these to life.
- (b.) The sun, sunlight, the variation in its strength throughout the year, and the effect of this on plant and animal life.
- (c.) The earth—different kinds of soil and their varying power of holding water; the dependence of life on the soil.
- (d.) The sky—observation of the sky, both by day and by night; and the reasons for the waxing and the waning of the moon. The identification of the following stars or star groups of the southern sky—the Southern Cross, the “Pointers” in the Centaur, the Milky Way, Orion, the Pleiades, Sirius, Canopus, and Achernar.

3. *Kindergarten Principles*.—Lives and work of Pestalozzi and Froebel. Effect of these on modern education. Froebel's principles—their application and recent modifications. The principles, physical and mental, underlying educational handwork. The educational value of different kinds of handwork and their relation to other subjects in this connexion.

4. *Kindergarten Practice*.—The provision made in the Kindergarten for the child's development at successive stages between the ages of three and seven years by means of play, stories, verse, music, observation of natural surroundings, and employments of various kinds; outdoor and indoor games of various forms suitable to young children, and their adaptation to educative purposes. The means of developing ideas of number, size, weight, and of training in language. The Kindergarten room and its furnishing, its toys, pictures, &c. School programs of correlated work. Preparation of simple materials and apparatus for lessons.

5. *Class Teaching*.—Candidates will be expected to occupy a class of children of any age between three and seven years for forty-five minutes in a manner suited to their stage of development and with due regard to their need for variety.

The following, of which (a) and (b) are compulsory, are suggested subjects from which a selection might be made to occupy the time allotted. Notes must be prepared showing the proposed program:—

- (a.) Giving a lesson—*e.g.*, a Nature lesson, or a lesson on a trade occupation, &c., or some other feature of the child's environment.
- (b.) Telling a story.
- (c.) Conducting a game.
- (d.) Superintending the children's play with such material as sand, building blocks, or with any of Froebel's “Gifts.”
- (e.) Superintending the children's employment in any definite form of handwork.

The class of children may be changed for one of a different age in the course of the forty-five minutes allowed.

6. *Educational Handwork (I and II)*.—The examination in this subject will aim at testing (i) the candidates' own skill, and (ii) their ability to guide the work of children between the ages of three and seven in a progressive series of exercises in accordance with the underlying principles of

educational handwork. The examination will be essentially of a practical character, but may include a certain amount of written work bearing upon the application of any tests that may be set, the choice of material and the reasons for choice under varying conditions, the nature of the work that may reasonably be expected from children of different ages, and the relation to other subjects of the special work concerned.

Candidates must be prepared to execute, in the presence of the examiner, and at his election, one or more exercises in educational handwork under each of the following headings; they will also be required to submit at the same time for inspection and assessment a set of exercises as detailed below done during their period of training and certified to be of their own unaided execution:—

I. *Handwork* the chief object of which is to supply means of expression and to employ the motor activities of children in gaining clear ideas, as exemplified by (a) drawing with crayon or brush, (b) modelling in clay or other suitable medium. For younger children also exercises in building with Froebel's “Gifts” and other material.

II. *Handwork* exemplifying simple processes of construction-work suitable for children, such as weaving (with raffia, wool, &c.) and basket-making, or that gives scope for the making of objects interesting to children and satisfies their love of design—*e.g.*, folding or cutting paper, and arranging this or other suitable material; mat-weaving for younger children, with suitable materials and good colours; special domestic activities; and the making of useful articles and toys.

Candidates should not only know how to make isolated examples of the above forms of Handwork, but should be able to combine them into groups—*e.g.*, a doll's house and furniture, a farm-yard, scenes of primitive life, scenes of foreign life, &c.

The following are the sets of exercises of candidates' own execution that they will be required to present for inspection and assessment (this list is subject to amendment on twelve months' notice):—

Obligatory.

- (1.) The course of drawing with crayon and brush done during training, the set to include the students' rough studies as well as finished examples.
- (2.) Modelling in clay or other suitable material: Six simple natural objects or simply arranged groups in low relief, chosen to illustrate plant or animal forms (age of class to be stated).

Selective.

Also any two of the following, (3) to (8):—

- (3.) Six examples of handwork in different kinds of material, such as children under seven might execute in order to reproduce objects seen in their own homes—furniture, pottery, wearing-apparel, &c.
- (4.) Six simple objects in paper or carton such as children under seven could make, to be produced by folding and cutting only, without the use of a ruler. (These objects must not be copied from a series in a book.)
- (5.) Six examples of weaving in raffia or other material suitable for young children. (Loom or frame to be shown, and to be of student's own construction.)
- (6.) A set of six toys such as children might be encouraged to make, using inexpensive materials only.
- (7.) Six pictures made by cutting out objects in paper without the help of an outline, and arranging or mounting them so as to form a picture or scene.
- (8.) Six simple but useful articles made of any materials, and ornamented with simple patterns to show taste and originality in the application of design. (These need not be all for children of the same age or for children under seven.)

7. *Blackboard Drawing*.—(1.) From Nature—common natural objects, including flowers, leaves, fruits, and domestic animals.

(2.) Enlargement of an outline sketch provided at the time of examination.

(3.) An illustration of a lesson or story prescribed at the time of examination.

8. *Singing*.—(i.) To submit the names of four kindergarten songs, and to sing from memory one of those chosen by the examiner. (The literary and musical value of the song will be taken into account.)

(ii.) To answer questions as to the key, rhythm, and other points of notation belonging to the song, and also to indicate the best method of teaching the song to a class.

(iii.) To imitate short phrases sung by the examiner. These may involve easy rhythms.

(iv.) To sing at sight an easy test in any major key involving both time and tune. The time may be 2/4, 3/4, 4/4, or 6/8.

(v.) To answer simple questions on the best methods of ensuring good voice production by the children.

Amending Rules for Examination of Masters and Mates.

Marine Department,
Wellington, 4th May, 1914.

WHEREAS by Warrant dated the 29th day of July, 1910, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 74, of the 2nd day of the following month, rules were made governing the examination of candidates for certificates of competency as masters and mates:

And whereas it is desired to amend the said regulations in the manner hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section 23 of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I do hereby make the following regulations amending the hereinbefore-recited regulations; and I do hereby order that they shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1914.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATION 6 is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "in the foreign or home trade" after the word "service" in the first line.

Regulations 11 to 13 inclusive are hereby revoked, and the following regulations made in lieu thereof:—

SIGHT TESTS.

11. Every candidate for a certificate of competency must pass the prescribed sight tests before a certificate can be issued to him. If circumstances render it necessary for him to proceed with the examination in navigation and seamanship before undergoing the sight tests, he should be informed that the examination in navigation and seamanship will be cancelled in the event of his failure to pass either of the sight tests.

(1.) *Form Vision Test.*—Every candidate for a certificate must pass the form vision test. If he presents himself for examination before 1st June, 1914, he will only be required to possess half normal vision—i.e., ability to read all the letters correctly in the fifth line of the test sheet, using both eyes together. A candidate who has obtained a certificate before that date will be allowed to obtain his higher certificates on the same standard of vision.

Any candidate may, and every candidate presenting himself for examination for his first certificate on or after 1st June, 1914, must pass a higher standard, viz., normal vision, using both eyes or either eye separately.

Any candidate who has obtained his first certificate under these conditions may obtain his higher certificates, provided that he has normal vision, using both eyes or either eye separately.

Detailed information with regard to the conduct of the examination and the standards required is contained in Appendix A.

(2.) *Colour Vision Tests.*—On and after the 1st day of June, 1914, every candidate for a certificate of competency of any grade must pass the colour vision test as prescribed in these regulations in lieu of the colour vision test prescribed in Appendix A of the hereinbefore-recited regulations. These tests comprise a wool test and a lantern test, and full particulars with regard to the methods adopted are given in Appendix A.

Every candidate must undergo the colour vision tests on the first occasion on which he presents himself for examination for a certificate of competency; but if he then passes he will not be required by the Marine Department to undergo the colour vision tests on any subsequent occasion. No person who holds a certificate of competency should be allowed to be examined in colour vision.

(3.) A candidate who fails to pass the prescribed form vision test may present himself for re-examination at intervals of three months. A candidate who fails to pass the colour vision test, or who is referred by the local Examiner for further examination, is not allowed to be re-examined locally. In the case of a candidate who is referred for further examination the Marine Department will make arrangements for a special examination, and it is also open to any candidate who is adjudged to have failed in the local colour vision test to appeal to the Department, who may, if it thinks fit, remit the case to a special body of Examiners for decision.

The Marine Department will repay, at a rate which will be notified to the candidate, the travelling-expenses of any candidate who is referred for further examination, as well as the travelling-expenses of any candidate who, having appealed against local failure, is reported by the special Examiners to have passed. No payment whatever will be made towards the expenses of candidates who, upon their own application, are examined by the special Examiners, and

are reported by them to have failed, unless the Marine Department consider that the particular circumstances of the case justify such payment.

The special examinations will be held in Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton (or Christchurch), and Dunedin.

When a candidate fails to pass the local colour vision test, the Examiner will point out to him the conditions under which he can appeal. Appeals are to be made through the Examiner and forwarded to the Marine Department with the Examiner's remarks.

Only Examiners who have themselves passed the colour vision tests are to undertake the local examinations.

The fee paid for examination for a certificate of competency includes the fee of 2s. 6d. for examination in form and colour vision, and if the candidate fails to pass those tests this fee will, with the exception of 2s. 6d., be returned to him.

No additional fee will be charged to any candidate referred by the local Examiner for special examination or for the special examination allowed to a candidate who appeals against failure locally. If, however, a candidate who has been reported by the special Examiners as having failed is still dissatisfied it will be open for him, if he so desires, to present himself for a second special examination on payment of a fee of five guineas, provided that he brings with him a friend to witness the examination. This second examination will, however, be entirely voluntary, and will form no part of the Department's examination for a certificate of competency. The Marine Department will, however, give consideration to the result of such examination in determining whether a certificate shall be granted.

The sight tests are open to all persons serving, or intending to serve, in the mercantile marine, and all such persons are recommended to take the earliest opportunity of ascertaining by means of these tests whether their vision is such as to qualify them for service in that profession. Any such person, if desirous of undergoing the tests, must make application to the Superintendent of a Mercantile Marine Office on the form Exn. 2b, and must pay a fee of 2s. 6d.

The fee will be payable on each occasion on which a candidate is examined.

Regulation 15 is amended by deleting the words "being British subjects" in first line.

Paragraph 1 of Regulation 29 is hereby amended by the deletion of the word "or" in the fourth line, and the insertion of the words "the St. Patrick's Ambulance Association or other approved body" after the words "the London County Council"; and paragraph 3 is amended by deleting the words "the St. John or St. Andrew's Ambulance Association" and substituting therefor "one of the approved associations."

Clause (l) of Regulation 33 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

(l.) To find on a chart or plan the course or courses to steer and the distance or distances from one given position to another; to find the ship's position together with the set and drift (if any) on the chart or plan from cross-bearings of two objects; to find the ship's position from two bearings of the same object, the course and distance run between taking the bearings being given, making due allowance for a given tide or current; also, the distance of the ship from the object or any given position at the time of taking the second bearing; and to state what the small numbers and Roman numerals found on a chart indicate, and give a method of finding approximately the time of high water at any given place without the aid of the Admiralty or other tide tables. See Appendix G, page 112.

The following clauses are hereby added to Regulation 33:—

(q.) The markings, signs, and abbreviations on Admiralty charts or plans.

(r.) The general notices published in the Board of Trade Summary of Notices to Mariners.

Clause (4) of Regulation 42 is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "fifteen knots" for the words "sixteen knots" in the sixth line thereof, and of the word "five" for the word "six" in the eighth line thereof.

Regulation 66 (a) is amended by the addition of the words "also to fix the ship's position by horizontal angles, using a station-pointer for plotting it on the chart or plan, &c."

The following new regulation is inserted as Regulation 119A:—

119A. For all certificates of competency as master or mate in the mercantile marine the qualifying service usually required is service performed in ordinary trading vessels. While the regulations provide for the acceptance in part of certain kinds of non-trading service (e.g., that performed in fishing-boats, yachts, pilot-vessels, &c.), non-trading service not specially provided for in the regulations cannot be accepted

as qualifying service unless it has been submitted to the Marine Department and its sanction obtained.

Regulation 127 is hereby revoked, and the following regulation is hereby made in lieu thereof:—

127. When service in charge of a watch in either the foreign or home trade is specified in the regulations, candidates for certificates of competency as first mate must be able to prove that during eight months at least of their service they have kept full regular watch during the whole voyage (*i.e.*, from port to port), which, if in the foreign trade, must amount to not less than eight hours of each twenty-four hours' service. Where a candidate can prove eight months of such full service, service performed in cases where watches were doubled at any time during the voyage will be accepted as equivalent to half the same period of full watch-keeping service. No amount of occasional service will, by itself, be accepted as qualifying service. Candidates for certificates of competency as master will be required to have served, during the whole of the time specified by the regulations, in full charge of a watch, and no service performed under the system of double watches except as the senior officer will be accepted as qualifying service for a certificate of this grade. Great care must be exercised by the Examiners and others in regard to such service, and unless the candidate produces a clear and satisfactory testimonial specially setting forth the above facts from the master or owner of the vessel in which the service was performed it must not be accepted.

Appendix A is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

APPENDIX A.

THE SIGHT TESTS.

These tests must be conducted under the strict personal supervision of the Examiner. A careful record must be kept of all mistakes made by the candidate in the form vision test, and on no account whatever must a candidate be allowed to make his selections in the colour vision test during any temporary absence of the Examiner.

Each Examiner must keep a record of all candidates passed by him for reference when required.

1. Form Vision Test.

(1.) *Form Vision Test to be passed first.*—The first test which the candidate is required to undergo is the test for form vision, and until he has passed this test he must not be allowed to proceed further with the examination.

(2.) *Apparatus used.*—The form vision test to be used for all candidates is that conducted on Snellen's principle by means of sheets of letters. Sets of eight of these sheets are supplied to Examiners.

(3.) *Object of the Test.*—The object of the form vision test is to determine whether the candidate can reach a sufficient standard of visual acuteness, or, in other words, to find out whether his eyesight is good or bad.

(4.) *Standard of Vision required.*—With the exceptions indicated below (see paragraph 8), every candidate for a first certificate of competency will be required to possess normal vision. Every candidate for a second or higher certificate will be required to possess normal vision.

"Normal vision" is defined, for the purpose of these regulations, as ability to read correctly nine of the twelve letters in the sixth line and eight of the fifteen letters in the seventh line of a test sheet placed in a good light at a distance of 16 ft. from the eye.

(5.) *Spectacles not allowed.*—During the examination for form vision candidates must not be allowed to use spectacles or glasses of any kind, or any other artificial aid to vision.

(6.) *Method of Testing.*—The test sheets should be hung on the wall, in a good light, but not in direct sunlight, at a height of 5 ft. or 6 ft. from the ground. The candidate should be placed at a distance of exactly 16 ft. from the sheets, and exactly opposite them. This distance should be carefully measured, and should never in any circumstances be varied.

One of the sheets should be exposed, and the candidate should be asked to read the letters on each sheet, beginning at the top and going downwards. Any mistakes which he makes should be carefully noted. If then it is found that he has read correctly at least nine letters in the sixth line and eight letters in the seventh line of a sheet, the candidate may be considered to have normal vision, and the entry "5/5" should be made in the appropriate column of the form of application (Exn. 2 or Exn. 2A, as the case may be).

(7.) *Passing or Failure.*—If at the conclusion of the test the candidate is found to reach the required standard, he may be considered to have passed, and the Examiner should proceed to test him for colour vision. If the candidate fails to reach the standard required for the certificate entered for, he should be tested with at least four sheets, and the Examiner should fill in a form Exn. 17B, and should forward it, with any remarks he may wish to make, to the Principal

Examiner for his instructions as to whether the candidate is to be regarded as passing or as failing in form vision.

(8.) *Lower Standard required in certain Cases.*—Candidates who are in possession of certificates obtained before the 1st June, 1914, may be regarded as having passed in form vision if they can read correctly with both eyes at least five of the eight letters in the fifth line of a test sheet.

(9.) *Tests to be varied.*—The Examiner should take care, by varying the order of the test sheets and by every other means in his power, to guard against the possibility of any deception on the part of the candidate.

(10.) *Result of Examination to be reported.*—The result of every examination in form vision should be reported, in the case of a candidate for a certificate of competency, to the Marine Department on form Exn. 2, and to the Principal Examiner of Masters and Mates on form Exn. 14; and, in the case of a candidate for the sight tests, only to the Marine Department on form Exn. 2B.

2. Colour Vision Tests.

(1.) The Departmental Committee appointed to inquire into the Board of Trade Sight Tests have recommended that certain modifications should be made in the wool test hitherto used, and that in addition a lantern test should be used in examining all candidates. The Marine Department have decided to carry into effect these recommendations, and the following instructions will therefore, on and after 1st June, 1914, supersede those contained in the previous edition of the Regulations relating to the Examination of Masters and Mates, in so far as the colour vision test is concerned.

SIGHT TESTS.

1. The Wool Test.

(1.) The wools provided are divided into five groups, one to each test skein. The test skeins are labelled respectively I (light green), II (pink), III (brown), IV (purple), and V (yellow), and must always be used in the order named. Care should be taken that the labels do not become detached nor the skeins belonging to the different groups get mixed. To avoid this only one group of skeins should be exposed on the table at one time.

A special bag with five pockets is provided in which the wools, when not in use, must be kept in order that they may not become faded or dirty.

(2.) The examination in the wool test should be conducted as follows:—

The first group of wools is placed in a heap upon a table covered with a white cloth and the first test skein a little to one side of it, care being taken that no strong sunlight falls directly upon the skeins. The person examined should be requested to note carefully the colour of the test skein and then to divide the group into two parts, one part consisting of those skeins which have the same colour as the test skein in them and the other part the skeins which have none of the test skein colour in them. The Examiner should explain that there is no exact match for the test skein, as the skeins which contain this colour are all either lighter or darker, and that the only question is the division of those skeins which contain the test colour more or less from those which do not. No difficulty should be experienced in explaining to the candidate what he is required to do, but if the Examiner thinks he has not grasped what is required he may himself divide the heap into two parts as a demonstration, mixing the skeins up again thoroughly before allowing the candidate to do the test.

(3.) When the candidate has dealt with the first test skein each of the four remaining tests should be gone through in a similar manner and in the order named.

(4.) As the examination proceeds the Examiner should place on one side the skeins which the candidate has wrongly selected as either resembling or not resembling the test skeins, and when the examination is finished a small piece (say one inch) should be cut off every one of the actual skeins incorrectly selected by the candidate, and stitched to Form Exn. 17C under the proper heading in the spaces provided for each test.

(5.) The greatest care must be taken that the pieces forwarded are cut off the actual skeins selected by the candidate, in order that there may be a reliable record of the actual selections made by the candidate if any question should subsequently arise.

(6.) During this test the Examiner should avoid naming the colours of any of the wools, and should explain to the candidate that he does not require them to be named by him.

(7.) The wool test should only be held in daylight. If a good natural light is not obtainable the test must be postponed. If dark or foggy weather renders it necessary to postpone the examination until after the examination in navigation or seamanship has been begun, the Examiner should not fail

to inform the candidate that the latter examination will be cancelled in the event of failure to pass the sight tests.

II. The Lantern Test.

(8.) A special lantern and a mirror have been provided for this test. The lantern should be placed directly in front of the mirror, so that the front part of the lantern is exactly ten feet from the mirror. Care should be taken that the lantern is properly placed, that is to say, the lights reflected in the mirror must show clearly when viewed through the rectangular aperture on the left of the lantern. The Examiner should always satisfy himself that these conditions are fulfilled before commencing the examination.

(9.) It is essential that a candidate should be kept in a room which is either completely or partially darkened for at least a quarter of an hour before he is required to undergo this test.

(10.) Before the examination commences the Examiner must satisfy himself that the room in which it is conducted is so darkened as to exclude all daylight.

(11.) The lantern supplied for the examination is so constructed as to allow one large or two small lights to be visible, and is fitted with 12 glasses of three colours—red, white, and green. At the commencement of the examination the Examiner should show to the candidate a series of lights through the large aperture, and should require him to name the colours as they appear to him. Care should be taken in showing the white light to emphasize the fact that the light is not a pure white. If a candidate makes a mistake of calling this light "red," a proper red light should be shown immediately after, and the candidate's attention directed to the difference between the two.

After a series of lights through the large aperture has been shown, the Examiner should make a complete circuit with the two small apertures, requiring the candidate to name the colours of each set of two lights from left to right. To prevent any possibility of the order in which the lights are arranged from being learnt, the Examiner should at least twice in each circuit go back a varying number of colours. He should keep a record of the number of the glass with which he began the series and should take care to vary it from time to time.

A record of any mistakes made with either the large aperture or the two smaller apertures should be kept on Form Exn. 17c in accordance with the instructions thereon.

(12.) As the lantern itself forms a test for colour ignorance, the old colour ignorance test becomes unnecessary and should be discontinued.

III. Success or Failure.

(13.) If a candidate with either the large aperture or the two smaller apertures of the lantern mistakes red for green or green for red, he should be considered to have "failed" in colour vision.

(14.) If a candidate makes no mistakes in the wool test, and if the only mistakes made by him with the lantern is to call the white light "red," and if after his attention has been specially directed to the difference between the two he makes no further mistake of this nature, he should be considered to have passed in colour vision.

(15.) If a candidate makes any other mistake with the lantern—i.e., if he calls white "red" repeatedly or red "white" at all, or confuses green and white, or if he makes any mistake whatever in the wool test, his case should be reported to the Principal Examiner of Masters and Mates, and he should be told that the decision as to whether any further examination is necessary or not will be communicated to him in due course. Pending the receipt of the Principal Examiner's instructions such a candidate should only be allowed to proceed with the remainder of the examination for a certificate of competency on the express understanding that the latter examination will be cancelled in the event of failure in the sight tests.

IV. Further Examination and Appeals.

(16.) If in the cases covered by the preceding paragraph the Principal Examiner decides that a further examination is necessary, arrangements will be made for a special examination to be held, and the second-class travelling-expenses necessarily incurred by a candidate in attending such an examination will be paid by the Marine Department, together with a subsistence allowance at a rate which will be notified to the candidate, but which will not in any circumstances exceed 10s. for each day necessarily occupied in attending the examination. In these cases the above expenses will be paid whatever may be the result of the final examination.

(17.) If, however, on the report of the local Examiner the Principal Examiner decides that the nature of the mistakes made shows conclusively that a candidate is so colour blind as to be unfit to hold a certificate, the candidate shall be considered to have failed.

In such cases, as well as in the cases covered by paragraph 13, the Marine Department will be prepared to allow a candidate who is dissatisfied with this decision to appeal for a special examination, but the Marine Department will not pay the travelling-expenses of any such candidate unless he is reported by the special Examiners conducting the appeal examination to have passed.

Smoky Bay.—A fixed light at sea end of jetty, on cast-iron pillar painted red, the focal plane being 25 ft. above H.W., showing a white light over the deepest water between bearings 130° (S. 53° E. mag.) and 147° (S. 36° E. mag.), and a red light over the shallow water between the bearings 120° (S. 63° E. mag.) and 130° (S. 53° E. mag.). Visible in clear weather about seven miles.

POSITION OF TRANSIT INSTRUMENT.

The adopted position of the Transit Instrument at the Hector Observatory, Wellington, is longitude 11 h. 39 m. 4.27 s. east of Greenwich, latitude 41° 17' 3.76" south; height, 418 ft. above 1909 mean sea-level.

TIME SERVICE.

1. Accurate Time Signals.

On days when accurate time signals are given, the flag T of the international code will be hoisted on the Observatory flagstaff about midday.

(a.) When the flag is flying, chronometers may be compared with a galvanometer in the public telegraph office, Featherston Street. This galvanometer is controlled by the Observatory clock, and is deflected every hour of New Zealand mean time.

(b.) Time signals are given by three electric lights erected on the Observatory flagstaff. The bottom light is green, and is 30 ft. above the ground; the middle light is red, and is 36 ft. above the ground; the top light is white, and is 42 ft. above the ground.

The green light is shown at 50 minutes, the red light at 10 minutes, and the white light at 5 minutes to the hour; all three lights are extinguished simultaneously at the hour. The switching-on of the lights must be considered as only approximately correct; the correct time is given by switching off the three lights. This signal is given at 8, 9, 10, and 11 p.m. of New Zealand mean time.

The corresponding Greenwich mean time (counted from noon) and New Zealand civil mean time (counted from midnight) of these signals are as under :—

2. Approximate Time Signals.

When owing to bad weather or other causes accurate time signals cannot be given, approximate ones will be given; but in these cases the flag will not be hoisted and the green light will not be shown. On application to the Observatory the error of these signals can usually be obtained.

3. Time Signals by Telephone and by Telegraph.

Arrangements can usually be made to give time signals by telephone or by telegraph to any part of the Dominion on application being made to the Observatory.
