WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act:

And whereas the Christchurch Tramway Board (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect electric lines from the trolley-wire on Racecourse Road to connect with a two and a half kilowatt motor-generator on the property of Edward Cutts, Esq., Upper Riccarton, Paparua County (hereinafter referred to as "the said electric lines"), and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the said licensee to erect and maintain the said electric lines for the purpose of supplying electrical energy to the aforesaid motor-generator, such electric lines and the position of the motor-generator being indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 35294, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### CONDITIONS.

1. The conductors shall be supported at a minimum height of 20 ft. above the surface of the ground.
2. The positive lines shall consist of 7/21½ S.W.G. copper wires, insulated with vulcanized indiarubber of 600-megohm grade, and the negative lines of 7/21½ S.W.G. copper wires, which may be bare. The lines shall be insulated by means of porcelain insulators, carried on substantial hardwood poles placed not more than 200 ft. apart, and shall be 18 ft. clear over the surface of the road at the lowest point of the span.
3. A fuse cut-out shall be placed on the positive conductor where it leaves the tramway trolley-wire, to operate at 50 per cent above the maximum load of the circuit. A switch and a fuse that will operate with 50 per cent. excess current over the full load of the circuit shall be inserted at the distribution-box on the positive conductor in each lighting circuit, and for a motor circuit a switch and circuit-breaker set to operate with an overload of 50 per cent. excess current, and with a no-load release, shall be inserted in the positive conductor and placed near each motor respectively.
4. The negative conductor shall be continuous throughout its length from the distribution-box or the motor terminal to the tramway-rail, to which it shall be effectively bonded.
5. The conductors shall be carried on substantial supports, which shall be designed to have a factor of safety of five under a wind-pressure of 30 lb. per square foot.
6. At crossings the conductors shall pass over or under the telegraph wires, as may be decided by the Minister of Telegraphs. Where the conductors cross telegraph or telephone wires, or if any telegraph or telephone wire is hereafter installed so as to cross the conductors, and at such other points as may be deemed necessary by the Minister of Telegraphs, substantial guard-wires effectively earthed shall be erected by or at the cost of the said licensee. Such guard-wires shall consist of two-stranded galvanized-steel wires carried on substantial supports at a height of 2 ft. above the conductors if the telegraph or telephone wires pass over the conductors, or 2 ft. above the telegraph or telephone wires if they pass under the conductors. Earth-wires where led down poles shall be protected by a casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground.
7. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government Railways until the licensee has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto, as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).
8. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of June, 1914, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of August, 1914.
9. The licensee shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.
10. The licensee shall not use the said electric lines, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the licensee that he has received from the Engineer appointed by him to inspect the works a certificate that they have been satisfactorily carried out.
11. The said electric lines, including their supports, their conductors, and their insulated covering, shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained by the licensee as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions, and shall not be permitted by the licensee to remain erected after they have ceased to be used for the supply of electricity.

12. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the licensee without the expressed consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

13. *Regulations as to Annual Leave of Absence to Lightkeepers.*

**W**HEREAS by section 34 of the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Public Service Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor in Council, is authorized to make regulations for the carrying-out of the provisions of the said Act, and such regulations may be made either generally or with respect to any particular case or class of cases:

Now, therefore, the Commissioner, in pursuance and exercise of the said authority, and with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make the additional regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth order that such regulations shall apply to every lightkeeper in the employ of the Marine Department.

SCHEDULE.

1. APPLICATIONS by lightkeepers for leave of absence shall in all cases be made in writing to the Permanent Head of the Marine Department.

2. Annual leave may be granted by the Permanent Head in accordance with the following scale:—

Keepers of less than five years' service who are employed at mainland stations where one or two keepers are provided: fourteen days.

Keepers of less than five years' service who are employed at mainland stations where three keepers are provided: seventeen days.

Keepers of less than five years' service who are employed at island stations: seventeen days.

All keepers of not less than five and up to fifteen years' service: seven additional days in every second year.

All keepers of over fifteen years' service: eleven additional days in every second year.

Leave may be accumulated for two years if so desired.

3. The granting of leave of absence shall in all cases be subject to the condition that the general conduct and diligence of the lightkeeper during the previous year have been satisfactory.

4. If, for any cause, the Permanent Head thinks leave of absence ought not to be granted, he may refuse the same, subject to the right of appeal to the Commissioner.

#### Regulations governing the Introduction of Potatoes into the United States of America.—Notice No. 1739.

Department of Agriculture, Industries, and Commerce,  
Wellington, 4th May, 1914.

THE following regulations, dated 30th December, 1913, and issued by the Secretary of Agriculture, Washington, U.S.A., governing the introduction of potatoes into the United States are published for general information.

#### REGULATIONS.

##### REGULATION 1.—DEFINITION.

FOR the purpose of these regulations, the term "potato" shall be understood as meaning the common or Irish potato (*Solanum tuberosum*) and its horticultural varieties.

##### REGULATION 2.—GENERAL CONDITIONS GOVERNING POTATO IMPORTATIONS.

Potatoes will be admitted from any country or well-defined district thereof not specifically mentioned in Notice of Quarantine No. 11, issued 22nd December, 1913,\* when it is determined, by adequate field inspection conducted by recognized experts of the country concerned, that such country or district thereof is free from injurious potato diseases and injurious insect pests; and such country must further agree to examine and certify all potatoes offered for export in compliance with these regulations:

Provided that the entry of potatoes will not be permitted from any country unless such country either has an effective quarantine prohibiting the entry into such country or district thereof of potatoes from any country or district under quarantine by the United States, or forbids by law the exportation to the United States of all potatoes not grown within the country or district or locality thereof from which the potatoes are exported:

Provided further that potatoes grown in a district which is believed by a duly authorized official to be free from injurious potato diseases, and which have at the time of the issuance of these regulations been taken from the ground and stored, may be certified after inspection as hereinafter provided in Regulation 5.

Quarantine of the countries specifically mentioned in Notice of Quarantine No. 11, issued 22nd December, 1913, may be lifted by the Secretary of Agriculture, as to the country or district thereof, upon satisfactory evidence that such country or district thereof is free from injurious potato diseases and injurious insect pests, and thereafter potatoes will be admitted under and in accordance with these regulations.

Entry of potatoes will not be allowed unless the invoice is accompanied by an original certificate, and unless each container bears a copy certificate in accordance with Regulation 5.

Potatoes will be admitted into the United States only through the port designated in the permit.

The entry of potatoes will not be permitted except where the shipments pass directly from the country of origin to the port of entry in the United States; provided that when transshipment is necessary at a port of a country under quarantine, such transshipment shall be made by lighters from boat to boat in the harbour without landing the potatoes, and the consular invoice of place of origin must follow the shipment from original port of departure to the port of entry in the United States.

No shipment of potatoes will be permitted entry until it has been examined by an Inspector of the Department of

Agriculture, and found or believed to be free from wart disease and the powdery scab, and other dangerous plant-diseases and dangerous insect pests.

Shipments of potatoes inspected as provided herein found to be infested with wart diseases or with powdery scab or other injurious plant-diseases, or with injurious insect pests, will be refused entry.

All charges for storage, cartage, and labour incident to inspection, other than the services of Inspectors, shall be paid by the importer.

##### REGULATION 3.—APPLICATIONS FOR PERMITS FOR IMPORTATION OF POTATOES.

Persons contemplating the importation of potatoes shall first make application to the Federal Horticultural Board, Department of Agriculture, Washington, D.C., for a permit, stating in the application the name and address of the exporter, the country and locality where grown, the port of departure (or port of consular invoice), the proposed port of entry, and the name and address of the importer in the United States to whom the permit should be sent.

Applications for permits must be made in advance of the shipment of the potatoes.

Applications may be made by telegraph, in which case the information required above must be given.

Permits are not required for potatoes entering the United States for immediate transportation in bond to foreign countries.

##### REGULATION 4.—PERMITS FOR ENTRY OF POTATOES.

On approval by the Secretary of Agriculture of the application for the importation of potatoes a permit will be issued in triplicate. One copy of the permit will be furnished to the applicant, to be retained by him for presentation, on the arrival of the imported potatoes, to the Customs officer at the port of entry named in the permit; one copy will be mailed to the Collector at the port of entry; and the third filed with the application. The beginning of the period for which a permit will be valid will be expressed in the permit. All permits will expire on the 30th day of June next after they become valid.

Permits for the entry of potatoes may be refused, and existing permits may be cancelled, on proof that the certificate of inspection does not correctly give the locality where the potatoes were grown, character of the shipment as to freedom from disease or insect infestation, or that the containers have been previously used for the shipment of potatoes.

REGULATION 5.—FOREIGN CERTIFICATE OF INSPECTION.

Each certificate shall give the number of the permit; the date of inspection; name and address of the exporter; the district or locality and the country where grown; name and address of consignee; a statement that the potatoes were grown in a district free from infection with wart disease and powdery scab, and have been inspected by a duly authorized official and found or believed to be free from insect pests and plant-diseases; and that they are contained in new bags, boxes, barrels, or other containers. The original certificate shall be signed and sealed by a responsible inspection official for the country of origin. The copy certificate may be entirely printed, including the seal. The form of such certificate shall be as follows:—

To whom it may concern :

This is to certify that the potatoes included in this shipment as per invoice attached, shipped under Permit No. , consigned to [Name and address of consignee], shipped by [Name and address of exporter], were grown in [District or locality and country], a district free from infection with black wart and powdery scab, are contained in new bags, boxes, barrels, or other containers, and were inspected by [Name of Inspector], [Date and year], and are believed by the Inspector to be free from insect pests and plant-diseases.

Permits may be cancelled and further permits refused for the importation of potatoes from any country whenever such potatoes, in the judgment of the Federal Horticultural Board, are found to be so infested as to plainly indicate that the foreign inspection is merely perfunctory.

Lists of officials in foreign countries authorized to inspect potatoes, giving their names and official designations, will be furnished to Collectors of Customs through the Secretary of the Treasury.

REGULATION 6.—NOTICE OF ARRIVAL OF POTATOES BY PERMITTEE.

Immediately upon arrival, and before unloading from the vessel or other carrier, the permittee shall notify the Secretary of Agriculture, on forms provided for that purpose, stating the number of permit, the quantity of potatoes included in the shipment, the country and locality where grown, the name and address of exporter or shipper, the port of departure, the date of arrival, and the name of the ship or vessel if transported by water, and the designation of the dock where the potatoes are to be landed; and, if by rail, the name of the railroad company, the car numbers, and the terminal where the potatoes are to be unloaded.

At the same time a copy of the notice to the Secretary of Agriculture shall be sent by the permittee to the duly authorized Inspector of the Department at the port of entry designated in the permit.

Permits may be cancelled and other permits refused if the permittee fails to give either of said notices or gives a false notice.

Lists of such Inspectors and officers may be ascertained from the Collector of Customs, or the Federal Horticultural Board, Washington, D.C.

## MADAGASCAR.

**STORM-WARNING SIGNALS BY RADIO.**—A radio storm-warning service has been organized for experimental use to give notice of the passage of cyclones along the east, north-west, and west coasts of Madagascar.

The warning telegram for cyclones traversing the north-west coast of Madagascar or the Mozambique Channel coming from the observatory of Tananarive will be emitted every even hour from 6 to 24, both inclusive, alternately by the stations at Mayotta and Majunga.

The warning telegram for cyclones traversing the north-east and east coasts of Madagascar will be emitted every even hour from 6 to 24, both inclusive, alternately by the stations of Mayotta and Diego Suarez.

In both cases the warning telegram will be preceded and followed by the attention signal, — — — — —, repeated at short intervals. This specially reserved signal, in the absence of further details, will indicate that a cyclone is expected.

Vessels equipped with radio apparatus are invited to communicate directly with the radio telegraphic stations of the colony the cyclonic disturbances which they experience, with the view of increasing as much as possible the value of the service.

## CHINA.

**YANGTZE RIVER.—NORTH CHANNEL.—BEACON MOVED.**—The Chinese Government has given notice that the Liuchiao beacon, southern shore of Tsungming Island, North Channel, Yangtze River entrance, China, has been moved 1,111 ft. 49° 30' owing to the erosion of the shore in the vicinity.

## SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

**NEW CALEDONIA.—PUME POINT.—SHOAL TO SOUTHWARD.**—Capt. Thomas Baillie, of the steamship "Baron Tweedmouth," reports a shoal with a least depth of 3½ fathoms over it 3½ miles 192° from Pume Point, New Caledonia.

**GILBERT ISLANDS.—NONUTI (SYDENHAM) ISLAND.—NON-EXISTENCE OF ROCK SOUTH-EASTWARD.**—Information has been received that the rock marked "E.D." on the charts, about 11 miles 148° from the south extreme of Temotu Islet, Gilbert Islands, South Pacific Ocean, reported to have been struck by the schooner "Caluna," does not exist.

**TONGA ISLANDS.—NIUAFU (GOOD HOPE) ISLAND NOT DISAPPEARED.**—Information has been received from Capt. J. H. Trask, of the steamer "Sonoma," that neither Niuaifu (Good Hope) Island nor Honga Hapai Island, Tonga Islands, has disappeared, the former report of the captain in this respect having been in error.

**LORD HOWE ISLAND.—NON-EXISTENCE OF REEF NORTH-EASTWARD.**—Capt. J. H. Trask, of the steamer "Sonoma," reports that on his last voyage to Sydney, at about 5.30 a.m., on a bright clear morning, he steamed over or very close to the assigned position of the reef reported in November, 1900, by Capt. C. G. F. Peterson, of the American schooner "James H. Bruce," in (approximately) latitude 30° 46' S., longitude 160° E., without seeing any indication of shoal water.

Capt. Trask further states that at 2 a.m., 9th February, on his voyage home, he passed over or close to the same position in bright moonlight and saw nothing.

**NEW HEBRIDES.—AMBRYN ISLAND.—DIP POINT ANCHORAGE.—DECREASED DEPTHS.—CAUTION.**—Information from H.B.M.S. "Pyramus," 1914, has been received that recent volcanic eruptions have entirely altered the coast-line and off-lying depths over a large area between Dip Point and Rowo Point, Ambryn Island, New Hebrides.

The hospital, mission house, and trader's house at Lonwolwol were all destroyed.

The plan of Dip Point Anchorage on H.O. Chart No. 2879 is cancelled.

A cautionary note will be placed on the plan of Craig Cove on H.O. Chart No. 2879.

#### CHILE.

**MAGELLAN STRAIT.—VESSELS TO REPORT IN PASSING LIGHTHOUSES.**—It is earnestly requested by the local authorities at Punta Arenas, Chile, that vessels passing through Magellan Strait show their official number and display the national ensign when passing the lighthouses at Dungeness, Delgada Point, Cape San Isidro and Evangelistas, and any other lighthouse which may solicit such information.

Announcement of the port of departure and the destination would also be welcome.

The information indicated is desired especially from vessels that pass through the straits without calling at Punta Arenas.

The information thus secured will be entered in registers kept at the lighthouses, and will be forwarded to ships' owners and consignees. It will also enable the Chilean naval authorities to know whether vessels bound through the straits in either direction have or have not passed through, and will thus be of material assistance in locating vessels that may be overdue.

#### PRIVATE BILL.

To provide that the said Trustees for the furtherance of any of the objects of the said funds, institutions, or organizations shall from time to time, with the consent of the said General Assembly, have the power of selling, mortgaging, exchanging, or leasing any property vested in them upon trust for any of the said funds, institutions, or organizations, of raising money by debentures, and of investing any moneys held by them for any of the said funds, institutions, or organizations.

D. To provide that the said Trustees shall have power, subject to the existing rights of any person or persons, and on the direction of the said General Assembly, to amalgamate the Aged and Infirm Ministers Fund and the Widows and Orphans Fund.

E. To provide that any person, persons, or body corporate holding any property of any fund, institution, or organization as aforesaid may be empowered to convey and assure such property to the said Trustees subject to the trusts upon which such person, persons, or body corporate shall hold the same.

F. To provide that section 6 of the Second Schedule to the Presbyterian Church Property Act, 1885, may be amended by adding at the end thereof the words "or may be invested in manner set out in section 95 of the Trustee Act, 1908."

G. To provide that section 8 of the Second Schedule to the Presbyterian Church Property Act, 1885, may be amended by inserting between the words "of" and "building" in the third line of the said section the words "acquiring any land for the purposes of any particular congregation or of."

To empower the Board, as an additional power to that contained in the proviso to section 28 of the principal Act, to expend the proceeds of the sale of lands in making permanent improvements to land held on the same trusts as the lands sold; and further to provide that the power to sell under the provisions of section 28 shall be deemed a power to sell for cash or on terms.

3. To empower the Board (subject to the approval of the Conference)—

- (a.) To borrow money, and mortgage any part or parts of its lands as security therefor.

- (c.) To lease its land for any term not exceeding twenty-one years, or for any term not exceeding sixty years if leased for building purposes.

Any money borrowed is to be expended only in paying the purchase-money of or effecting permanent improvements to the land mortgaged or other land held on the same trusts, or in paying off any mortgage, and any money received by way of equality of exchange is to be expended in the manner provided for the disposal of proceeds of any sale.

4. To provide that the consent of the Conference, where required by the provisions of the principal Act or the amending Act, shall be sufficient if given by the Conference or by any person, body, or committee authorized by the Conference.

5.
