"Inspecting Engineer" means and includes any Inspecting Engineer appointed by the Minister to inspect works to be constructed or maintained by virtue of electric-line licenses or any water-power licenses or any combined water-power and electric-line licenses issued under the Public Works Act, 1908, and any or all of its amendments, or under any one or more of such amendments only, or Acts passed in amendment thereof or substitution therefor :

"Low pressure" means pressures up to 600 volts :

"Minister" means the Minister of Public Works :

"Pressure" means difference of electric potential between any two conductors through which supply of energy is given or between any part of either conductor and the earth :

"Street" includes road :

"Telegraph" includes telephone.

*System of Supply.*

2. The supply of electrical energy shall be received in bulk from the Hastings Borough Council's supply at the Board's sub-station in Havelock North Town District.

The system of supply shall be three-phase alternating current at a pressure not exceeding 3,300 volts at a frequency of 50 cycles per second.

In the sub-station or in pole transformers it shall be transformed down to 400 volts between phases, and 230 volts between each phase and the neutral for low-tension distribution.

The low-tension distribution shall be on the three-phase four-wire system, one phase wire and the neutral being used for single-phase service.

The supply to street-lighting incandescent lamps and to private consumers for lighting purposes shall be at 230 volts.

*Neutral to be earthed.*

3. The neutral point of each secondary distributing system shall be earthed at the transformer.

The earth connection shall be provided with a switch for cutting off the earth connection for testing.

*High-pressure Transformers.*

4. Where high-pressure transformers are placed in sub-stations all high-tension conductors shall be thoroughly insulated and protected from accidental contact, and the sub-station shall be entirely inaccessible to unauthorized persons. Where high-pressure transformers are attached to poles they shall be placed so as to be inaccessible, except by the use of a ladder or other special appliance. Where high-pressure transformers are placed on consumers' premises the whole of the apparatus shall be enclosed or rendered inaccessible except to the authorized persons.

Where cables are led to and from transformer enclosures they shall be protected on the poles by being run in iron pipes, which shall be effectively earthed.

The cases of all transformers shall be earthed by means of a copper conductor at least 0.022 square inch in section.

*Regulation of Pressure.*

5. The pressure shall be maintained within 4 per cent. above or below the declared pressure at the consumers' terminals. The Board shall maintain a suitable recording voltmeter, and on complaint by any consumers that the variations in voltage exceed these limits, or on the instructions of the Inspecting Engineer, the Board shall connect a recording voltmeter to record the pressure between the lines at their entrance to the consumer's premises, and shall supply to the Inspecting Engineer a chart showing the variations in voltage between the lines at this point for a period of seven consecutive days. If the variations thus recorded exceed the above limits the Board shall take immediate steps to comply with this regulation. If after thirty days a similar chart shows that the above limits of variation in voltage are not complied with, a breach of these regulations shall be deemed to have been committed. If the accuracy of the Board's recording voltmeter is questioned by the consumer, a standard instrument shall be supplied by the Inspecting Engineer, the readings of which shall be accepted as final.

*Switchboard.*

6. All switchboards shall be made of and mounted on material that is not inflammable, and no switchboard conductor shall carry electric current at a density exceeding 1,000 amperes per square inch. No conductor at a pressure above 600 volts shall be exposed on the front of any switchboard, and the back of any switchboard carrying exposed conductors at a pressure over 600 volts shall be screened off and accessible only to the authorized persons.

All power-house and sub-station switchboards shall be provided with two efficient and independent earth connections connected in parallel, to one of which all frames, instrument-cases, and other metal parts shall be connected. Means shall be provided for testing the resistance between these two connections through the earth. Such tests shall be made at least once a month and recorded.

*Circuit-breakers.*

7. All outgoing feeders and distributors from any power-house or sub-station shall be provided with automatic circuit-breakers or fuses, set to open circuit at 50 per cent. excess current over the rated full load of such feeder or distributor, with a time-limit not exceeding ten seconds.

*Distribution.*

8. The distribution may be carried out either by underground or overhead conductors, provided that if at any time it is deemed by the Minister to be detrimental to the public safety for the conductors or any particular class of conductors to be overhead, they shall, on receipt of notification to that effect from the Minister, and within ten months of such notification, be laid underground, and all consequent and necessary alterations made by and at the cost of the Board.

*Overhead Electric Lines.*

9. Overhead conductors shall be of stranded hard-drawn copper, aluminium, or other material of not less than 0.0129 square inches in section, provided that service wires of short span of 100 feet or less may be not less than 0.0072 square

inches in section. The lines shall be covered throughout with triple braiding thoroughly impregnated with weather-proofing compound, provided that where circumstances permit the lines may, with the consent of the Minister, be bare.

Electric lines at high pressure shall be covered with vulcanized rubber of at least 600-megohm grade; provided that where circumstances permit the lines may, with the consent of the Minister, be bare.

The stress in overhead conductors shall not exceed 25,000 lb. per square inch for copper, and 12,000 lb. per square inch for aluminium in the extreme case of a temperature of 12 degrees Fahr. and a wind-pressure of 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane occurring simultaneously. The span between supports and the sag shall be determined to conform with the above limiting stresses, provided that the span shall not exceed 200 ft. No overhead electric lines shall come within 2 ft. of any other aerial wires or cables except where it may be permitted to pass either wires between other wires at a pole or support. Any aerial wire shall not in any part thereof be at a less height from the ground than 18 ft. or within 5 ft., measured horizontally or vertically, from any part of any building or erection other than a support for a line, except where brought into a building for the purpose of supply.

Where an aerial line crosses a street, the angle between the line and the direction of the street at the place of crossing shall not be less than 60 degrees, and the span shall be as short as possible.

*Supports for Overhead Lines.*

10. All low-tension electric lines shall be carried at a minimum height of 18 ft. above the ground, and all high-tension lines at a minimum height of 20 ft. above the ground.

All aerial wires shall be attached to suitable insulators carried on cross-arms of suitable material and cross-section, and they shall be so attached to the insulators or guarded that they cannot fall away from the support. Conductors covered with insulating material shall be so attached that their insulation shall not be impaired where they are secured to the insulator.

Every support for an aerial line shall be of durable material and properly strengthened against forces due to wind-pressure, change of direction of line, and unequal length of span. The factor of safety of such supports shall be at least 4 (four) if of iron, steel, or reinforced concrete, and 5 (five) if of wood, taking into consideration all possible stresses, including wind-pressure at 30 lb. per square foot on plane surfaces and 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane for cylindrical surfaces.

*Location of Overhead Lines.*

11. Except by permission of the Minister of Telegraphs or subject to an agreement between the Post and Telegraph Department and the Board, all overhead electric-light pole lines shall be placed on the opposite side of the street to that on which any telegraph lines exist, and where the erection of the electric-light wires necessitates the alteration of any existing telegraph wires, and such alteration is approved by the Minister of Telegraphs, the expense of the alteration shall be borne by the Board.

Where electric lines are on one side of the street and electric-telegraph lines on the other, and service is required to be given from either to the other side of the street, the Board and the Minister of Telegraphs shall give to each other reasonable facilities as far as possible to effect supply.

In running the lines authorized by this license through streets where no telegraph lines exist, the Board shall keep to the one side of the street; and in running wires to the opposite side of the street the Board shall arrange so as to interfere as little as possible with the route on that side of any future telegraph line.

*Lines not in Use.*

12. An aerial line shall not be permitted to remain erected after it has ceased to be used for the supply of energy, unless the Board intends within a reasonable time again to take it into use.

*Telegraph and Telephone Wire Crossings.*

13. Where electric lines are permitted to be supported on telegraph poles, all details of the support and of the insulation shall be approved by the Minister of Telegraphs, who may require such electric lines at any time to be removed from such telegraph poles, on reasonable notice and without compensation of any description.

In places where it may be required to cross with the electric light wires through any other aerial wire, or through cables, all such through crossings, if permitted, shall be effected at a pole. In every case of a through crossing, no matter whose property the lines cross through may be, the method of carrying the electric-light wires across the pole, protecting

them thereon, preventing other wires from coming into contact with them, and protecting persons working on the poles from danger of shock, shall be to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs.

Where the insulated wires cross through on the pole, they shall be cased in any approved protecting tube for the entire length of the arms on such poles. If metal pipe is used to encase the wires it shall be effectively earthed.

Where overhead electric lines at a pressure not exceeding 460 volts cross telegraph lines, the electric line shall be protected for the crossing-span with a triple covering of jute braid and thoroughly compounded. Where overhead electric lines at high pressure cross telegraph lines, the electric lines shall be subject to special conditions being imposed by the Minister of Telegraphs in each case of such crossing.

At telegraph crossings the electric wire shall be insulated as provided for in clause 9, and shall cross over or under the telegraph wires as may be decided by the Minister of Telegraphs.

Efficient guard-wires, effectively earthed, shall be erected where electric wires intersect telegraph or other wires or cables or wherever such protection is deemed necessary, if so required by the Minister of Telegraphs.

The cost of all necessary guard-wires and special provisions required to comply with this clause, or deemed to be necessary as a protection to telegraph or telephone wires generally, shall be borne by the Board, whether the telegraph lines are erected before or after the electric lines. In the latter case the Board, on receipt of notice from the local officer of the Telegraph Department that it is proposed to run a telegraph line along the route, shall forthwith make the necessary changes required to comply with this clause at any points at which electric lines already cross such routes.

Earth-wires, where led down poles, shall be protected by a casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground.

#### *Railway Crossings.*

14. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government railways until the Board has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto, as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).

#### *Arc Lamps.*

15. Arc lamps used in any street for public lighting shall be so fixed as not to be in any part at a less height than 10 ft. from the ground.

All arc lamps shall be so guarded as to prevent pieces of ignited carbon or broken glass falling from them, and shall not be used in situations where there is any danger of the presence of explosive dust or gas.

#### *Service Connections to Overhead Lines.*

16. Service lines from aerial lines shall be taken from insulators, and shall not be tapped off between insulators. They shall be led as directly as possible to insulators firmly attached to some portion of the consumers' premises which is not accessible to any person without the use of a ladder or other special appliance.

Every portion of any aerial line which is outside a building and is within 7 ft. from any part of the building shall be rubber-insulated.

#### *Maintenance.*

17. Every aerial line, including its supports, its conductors, and their insulating covering, and all structural parts and electrical appliances and devices belonging to or connected with the line, shall be duly and efficiently maintained by the Board as regards both the electrical and mechanical conditions.

#### *Lightning-arresters.*

18. Where any portion of an electric line or any support for an electric line is exposed in such a position as to be liable to injury from lightning, it shall be efficiently protected against such liability.

#### *Underground Conductors.*

19. Underground conductors shall be thoroughly insulated, and shall be protected from mechanical damage by a wooden boxing or earthenware or stoneware conduit. They shall be laid, wherever possible, under the footpaths, and with a cover of at least 12 in. from the surface of the pavement. Where laid under the roadway this cover shall be increased to 2 ft.

All conduits, pipes, casings, and street boxes used as receptacles for electric lines shall be constructed of durable material, and shall be of ample strength to prevent damage from heavy traffic, and reasonable means shall be taken to prevent the accumulation of gas in such receptacles.

Where any underground line crosses or is in proximity to any metallic substance, special precaution shall be taken

against the possibility of any electric charging of metallic substance from the line, or from any metallic conduit, pipe, or casing enclosing the line.

#### *Earthing Conduits.*

20. All metallic conduits, pipes, or casings containing an electric line shall be efficiently earthed, and shall be so jointed and connected across all street boxes and other openings as to make good electrical contact throughout their whole length.

#### *Street Boxes.*

21. The covers of street boxes shall be so secured that they cannot be opened except by means of a special appliance. Street boxes shall be either filled solid with cable compound or, if not so filled, shall be inspected from time to time for the presence of gas, and suitable action shall be taken to check its influx and accumulation.

#### *Insulation of Electric Mains.*

22. Every main, either overhead or underground, shall be tested for insulation after having been placed in position and before it is used for the purpose of supply, the testing pressure being at least 500 volts; and the Board shall duly record the results of the test of each main, and forthwith forward a report thereof to the Resident Engineer of the Public Works Department at Napier.

The insulation of every complete circuit used for the supply of energy, including all machinery, apparatus, and devices forming part of or in connection with such circuit, shall be so maintained that the leakage current shall not under any conditions exceed one thousandth part of the maximum supply current. Every leakage shall be remedied by the Board without delay. Every such circuit shall be tested for insulation at least once every week, and the Board shall duly record the results of such test, and forward a report thereof at the end of each month to the Resident Engineer of the Public Works Department at Napier.

#### *Continuity of Supply.*

23. From and after the time when the Board commences to supply energy in pursuance of this license, it shall maintain continuously sufficient power for the use of all consumers for the time being entitled to be supplied; provided that, for any purposes connected with the efficient working of the undertaking, the Minister may give permission to the Board to discontinue the supply at such intervals of time and for such periods as he may think expedient. When the supply is so discontinued, public notice shall be given when practicable of such discontinuance, and of the probable duration thereof.

#### *Supply to Consumers.*

24. The owner or occupier of any premises within the area of supply included in the license shall be entitled to a supply of electrical energy on the following conditions:—

(a.) If within 60 ft. of an electric line belonging to the Board the service shall be made free of cost.

(b.) If more than 60 ft. distant to any electric line belonging to the Board, the Board shall run the necessary lines for a distance of 60 ft. free of charge, and the consumer shall pay the cost of the service wires for the balance of the distance, such payment not to exceed 1s. per foot of the distance.

(c.) If the plant or mains of the Board are insufficient to supply the applicant with electrical energy, the service may, with the consent of the Minister, be postponed for a period not exceeding twelve months, otherwise service shall be made within twenty-eight days of the application.

(d.) Every consumer within any part of the area included in the license shall be entitled to a supply of electrical energy on the same terms on which any other consumer in such part of the area is entitled under similar circumstances to a corresponding supply.

(e.) If the nature of the proposed consumption of energy by any applicant is such as is likely to seriously interfere with the maintenance of the constant pressure on the line in accordance with clause 5, the Board may, with the approval of the Minister, require the consumer to instal such apparatus as shall enable the conditions of clause 5 to be complied with.

(f.) The Board may require services to be wired or installed by competent tradesmen, but no preference shall be given to services wired or installed by any individual contractor or firm of contractors.

(g.) If payment by any consumer is delayed more than thirty days after the date of rendering a correct account, the supply of electricity to such premises may be cut off without notice, and need not be restored until all arrears are paid.

#### *Service Connections.*

25. The Board shall be responsible for all electric lines or wires fittings, and apparatus belonging to it, or under its

control, which may be upon a consumer's premises, being maintained in a safe condition, and in all respects fit for supplying energy.

In delivering the energy to consumers' terminals, the Board shall exercise all due precautions, so as to avoid risk of causing fire on the premises.

A suitable safety-fuse or other automatic circuit-breaker shall be inserted in each service line within a consumer's premises as close as possible to the point of entry, and contained within a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fire-proof construction.

All electric wires placed on a consumer's premises shall be insulated with rubber of 600-megohm grade, and shall be thoroughly protected against injury to the insulation or access of moisture. All electric wires shall be so fixed and protected as to prevent the possibility of electrical discharge to any adjacent metallic substance.

#### *Installation on Consumer's Premises.*

26. The Board shall not connect the wires and fittings on a consumer's premises with its mains, or, in the case of premises already connected, continue the supply from its mains, unless it is reasonably satisfied that the requirements of this license are complied with, that the wiring and fittings are suitable for the voltage at which supply is being given, that the installation generally is in accordance with the requirements of good practice, and that the connection and continuance of supply would not cause a leakage from those wires and fittings exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises.

For the purpose of satisfying itself that the requirements of this license are being observed, in so far as they apply to wires on consumer's premises, the Board may require that notice be served upon it of the intention to instal wires, fittings, lamps, motors, or other apparatus on any premises, and may inspect the same during any reasonable hours while the installation of such is in progress.

#### *Testing Consumer's Installations.*

27. If the Board is reasonably satisfied, after making all proper examinations by testing or otherwise, that the wiring and fittings are not suitable for the voltage being employed, that a leakage exists at some part of the circuit of such extent as to be a source of danger, and that such leakage does not exist at any part of the circuit belonging to the Board, or that any requirements of this license are not being complied with, then, and in such case, any officer of the Board duly authorized by it in writing may, for the purpose of discovering whether the leakage exists at any part of the circuit within or upon any consumer's premises, or whether the wiring is suitable and the general requirements of the license are complied with, by notice require the consumer, at some reasonable time after the service of the notice, to permit him to inspect and to test the wires and fittings belonging to the consumer and forming part of the circuit.

If on such testing and inspection the officer discovers a leakage in the consumer's wires exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises, or that the requirements of this license are not being properly conformed to, or if the consumer does not give all due facilities for inspection and testing, the Board shall either not commence the supply or shall forthwith discontinue the supply of energy to the premises in question, giving immediate notice to the consumer of its reasons for not commencing or for discontinuing the supply; and in either case supply shall not be given until the Board is reasonably satisfied that the installation is in conformity with the requirements of this license.

If any consumer is dissatisfied with the action of the Board in refusing to give, or in discontinuing, or in not commencing the supply of energy to his premises the wires and fittings of that consumer may, on his application to the Minister and on payment of the cost, be inspected and tested by the Inspecting Engineer. This provision shall be endorsed on every notice given under the provisions of either of the two preceding paragraphs.

#### *Plans.*

28. The Board shall, before the erection or construction of any part of the work hereby authorized is begun, submit for the approval of the Minister such plans and other information showing and describing such work as he may require. In the event of the Board desiring to make alterations to the work involving a departure from the type of construction shown on the approved plan, it shall submit for the Minister's approval plans showing such type of construction as it is proposed to adopt, and with such approval the alterations may be carried out.

#### *Notice regarding Extensions, &c.*

29. Before commencing the erection of any part of the lines hereby authorized, or the extension of any line already

erected, the Board shall give at least seven days' notice in writing to the Resident Engineer of the Public Works Department at Napier, and also to the District Engineer of the Post and Telegraph Department at Wellington, or his deputy, of its intention to carry out the work, and shall forward to the Minister a locality plan showing the route of any extension.

#### *Time for Construction.*

30. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the first day of July, 1914, and shall be completed on or before the first day of July, 1915.

#### *Notice of Completion.*

31. The Board shall, prior to the completion of the said works or any separate portion thereof, give to the Minister at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

#### *Commencement of Supply.*

32. The Board shall not use any portion of the electric lines authorized by this license, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose, until the Minister has given notice in writing to the Board that he has received from the Inspecting Engineer a certificate that the said work, or any portion thereof, has been satisfactorily carried out.

#### *Inspection of Works.*

33. The Minister may at any time order an inspection to be made of the works, lines, and wires of the Board used for electric lighting and power purposes. If any defect is found to exist it must be remedied forthwith; and if, in the opinion of the officer or person inspecting, such default is serious the Minister may, on receipt of the report, direct the Board to at once cease transmitting energy either over the whole of the Board's line and wires, or over any specified part thereof, until such defect is repaired or remedied. The cost of such inspection shall be borne by the Board.

#### *Compliance with Conditions.*

34. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the Board, the Minister, or any person appointed by him on that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the land and works and inspect the same.

#### *Assignment.*

35. This license and the benefits and obligations hereunder shall not be assigned by the Board without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained, but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

#### *Default and Penalty.*

36. If the Board fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the Board within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice, but it shall not be held to have committed default for any failure to maintain power continuously if such failure is due to breakdown of machinery or other accident, unless such breakdown or accident is proved to be due to negligence on the part of the Board; and if the Board fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period, it shall be liable to a penalty of £20, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown. The recovery of a penalty under this license shall not affect the liability (if any) of the Board to pay or make compensation in respect of any damage or injury which may be caused by reason of the default.

#### *Revocation of the License.*

37. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause hereof, if the Board fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

#### *Public Works Compensation.*

38. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any right or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works; nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the Board for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

*Electric Lines in Hawke's Bay County.*

39. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric line within the Hawke's Bay County except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, as may from time to time be agreed on between the licensee and the Hawke's Bay County Council.

*Commencement of License.*

40. This license shall come into force on and after the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by section twenty of the Land and Income Assessment Amendment Act, 1912, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations as to the institution, hearing, and determination of proceedings in the Magistrates' Courts relative to objections to assessments of land-tax and income-tax

#### REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the term "appeal" means a proceeding in a Magistrates' Court under section 19 of the Land and Income Assessment Amendment Act, 1912, for the determination of an objection made under that Act to an assessment of land-tax or income-tax, and the term "appellant" means the person by whom such objection has been made.

2. Every appeal shall be instituted in such Magistrates' Court as the Commissioner selects, having due regard to the convenience of the appellant.

3. The parties to the appeal shall be the appellant and the Commissioner as respondent.

4. For the purpose of every appeal the Commissioner shall state and sign a case setting forth the facts as alleged by him, the nature of the assessment made by him, the ground of objection thereto, and the question for the determination of the Court.

5. The case so stated and signed shall be filed by the Commissioner in the Magistrates' Court so selected by him, and the filing of the case shall be deemed to be the institution of the appeal.

6. A copy of the case so filed shall be sent by the Commissioner to the appellant, either through the post-office or otherwise.

7. Within fourteen days after the filing of the case by the Commissioner, or within such further time as the Commissioner may allow, the appellant may, if he thinks fit, file an answer to the case. Such answer shall set forth the facts as alleged by the appellant and the grounds of his appeal.

8. The case as stated and filed by the Commissioner shall not be conclusive as to the matters set forth therein, either against the appellant or the Commissioner, except so far as agreed to in writing by or on behalf of the Commissioner and the appellant.

9. After the filing of the case by the Commissioner a Magistrate or the Clerk of the Court in which the case is filed shall, on the application of the Commissioner or of the appellant, appoint a time and place for the hearing of the appeal, such time not being earlier (save with the consent of the Commissioner and the appellant) than twenty-one days after the date of the filing of the case.

10. Reasonable notice by post or otherwise of the time and place so appointed shall be given by the person on whose application such appointment has been made to the other party to the appeal.

11. At the time and place so appointed a Magistrate, or in the absence of a Magistrate the Clerk of the Court, may adjourn the hearing to any other time or place, and so from time to time.

12. If either party fails to appear at the hearing, the Court shall either adjourn the hearing or determine the appeal in the same manner as if both parties were present.

13. The procedure at the hearing of the appeal shall be the same, with all necessary modifications, as if the appeal was an action in which the appellant was the plaintiff and the Commissioner was the defendant.

*Regulations for Auditing of Solicitors' Trust Accounts.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-second day of May, 1914.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section fourteen of the Law Practitioners Amendment Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby make the following regulations providing for an annual audit of the trust accounts of every solicitor, and for a report of the results of such audit; and doth declare that such regulations shall be published in and shall come into force upon the date of their publication in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. IN these regulations—

"Year" means a year ending on the 31st day of March:

"Solicitor" means a solicitor of the Supreme Court of New Zealand:

"Trust Account" includes an account of all moneys which are, when received by a solicitor, subject to the provisions of section 47 of the Law Practitioners Act, 1908, and an account of all trust-moneys received or held by a solicitor, whether in his capacity as a solicitor or otherwise.

2. Within three months after the end of each year, commencing with the year ending on the 31st day of March, 1915 every solicitor who was in practice during the whole or any part of that year shall cause his trust account for that year to be audited by a qualified accountant, who shall forthwith send a report of the result of such audit to the Solicitor-General, verified by the statutory declaration of the auditor in the form set out in the Schedule hereto. The auditor shall at the same time deliver a signed copy of his report to the solicitor to whose account it relates.

3. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing regulations, if any solicitor desires that his trust account should be audited as at any date other than the 31st day of March, and gives notice to that effect to the Solicitor-General, the Solicitor-General may, if he thinks fit, authorize and require that solicitor to substitute such other date for the 31st day of March.

4. At all times thereafter, so long as such authority remains in force, the foregoing regulations shall, in their application to that solicitor, be read as if such other date was substituted for the 31st day of March wherever the last-mentioned date is referred to therein.

5. When any authority is so given by the Solicitor-General to substitute any date for the 31st day of March, he shall at the same time determine the period in respect of which the first audit shall be made in pursuance of that authority, and the time within which such audit and the report thereof shall be made and delivered under these regulations; and these regulations shall be construed and shall have effect, with all necessary modifications, as if such determination formed a part thereof.

6. When any date has been so substituted for the 31st day of March, no change in the date so substituted shall thereafter be made without the authority of the Solicitor-General in accordance with the foregoing regulations.

7. No accountant shall be deemed to be qualified within the meaning of these regulations unless he is a member of the New Zealand Society of Accountants approved by the Solicitor-General, or if he is, or at any time within twenty-four months before the date of his report has been, a clerk, servant, or partner of the solicitor whose accounts are so audited by him, or if he is a clerk or servant of any other practising solicitor, or if he is himself a practising solicitor.

8. For the purpose of every such audit and report every solicitor shall, as and when required, produce to the auditor all books, papers, accounts, documents, and securities in any way relating to his trust account, and give such information as may reasonably be required by the auditor.

9. It shall be the duty of every solicitor to keep his trust account in such a manner as to disclose to the auditor the position of the funds therein, and to enable the same to be conveniently and properly audited.

10. If any auditor in the course of auditing a solicitor's trust account discovers that the said account is not kept in such a manner as to enable it to be properly audited, or discovers any matter which appears to him to involve dishonesty or any breach of the law on the part of that solicitor

or discovers any loss or deficiency of trust-moneys, or any failure to pay or account for any such moneys, he shall fully set out the facts so discovered by him in the aforesaid report delivered to the Solicitor-General, and shall also send a confidential report on that matter addressed to the Secretary of the Council of the District Law Society in the district in which that solicitor practised during the year to which the audit relates.

11. In all other cases the auditor's report shall consist merely of a general certificate that the solicitor's trust account has been duly kept and is in order in all respects.

12. In addition to making the aforesaid report, the auditor of a solicitor's trust account shall at the same time prepare and certify under his hand a statement setting forth in detail the particulars of all moneys held by that solicitor for or in trust for any other person on the last day of the year to which the audit relates, together with particulars of the investments thereof at that date, and shall deliver such statement to the solicitor. The statement so delivered shall be retained by the solicitor and produced on demand to the auditor making the next succeeding audit of the solicitor's trust account, together with the aforesaid signed copy of the report of the last preceding audit of that account.

13. In the case of the first audit of any solicitor's trust account under these regulations, and in any other case in which no such certified statement as is referred to in the last preceding clause is available for the purpose of an audit, the solicitor shall, in lieu thereof, make out and deliver to the auditor before the making of his report a statement containing the like particulars as to moneys held and the investments thereof on the first day of the year to which the audit relates. Such statement shall be verified by the statutory declaration of the solicitor, or in the case of a firm of solicitors by the statutory declaration of one of the partners.

14. If any report is forwarded to the Secretary of a District Law Society, in pursuance of clause 10 hereof, it shall be the duty of the said Secretary to lay that report before the next meeting of the Council of the said society, and the Council may investigate the matter, and, if necessary, institute proceedings against the solicitor concerned.

15. For the purpose of such investigation the District Law Society Council shall have power to examine the auditor who made the report, and to examine all books, papers, accounts, documents, and securities held by the solicitor concerned relating to the matter reported on; and it shall be the duty of such solicitor, if required, to produce to such Council all such books, papers, accounts, documents, and securities, and to give such information as may be reasonably required.

16. No member of any District Law Society Council shall, save for the purpose of any legal proceedings which may arise out of such investigation, disclose to any person any information which he has obtained from any such confidential report or in the course of any such investigation.

17. Save in the report so to be delivered to the Solicitor-General, or in any report which may be forwarded to the Secretary of a District Law Society, or in or for the purpose of any legal proceedings which may arise out of such report or otherwise in relation to the trust account of the solicitor concerned, no auditor shall, save with the previous consent in writing of the Solicitor-General, disclose to any person any information which he has obtained in the course of any audit; and every auditor who commits a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £100, and shall, in addition, be subject to the like liability in damages to any client of that solicitor damaged by the disclosure of such information as the solicitor would be if the solicitor had disclosed such information.

18. The reports of auditors under these regulations shall, so far only as they relate to moneys or securities in which any person is interested, be available, in the hands of the Solicitor-General, for inspection by that person, or by any solicitor authorized by him in that behalf.

19. The report of an auditor in respect of any year shall be available, in the hands of the Solicitor-General, for inspection by the auditor appointed to audit the account of the same solicitor for the next succeeding year.

20. It shall be the duty of the banker of every solicitor, on the request of any auditor engaged in the audit of that solicitor's trust account under these regulations, to supply that auditor with all such information as to the bank account or accounts of that solicitor during the year to which the audit relates as may be reasonably required for the purposes of such audit.

21. Every person who commences practice as a solicitor shall, within two months thereafter, give written notice of the fact to the Solicitor-General.

22. Every solicitor, auditor, banker, or other person who commits any breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £100.

23. If two or more solicitors or other persons in partnership commit any breach of these regulations, each of those persons shall be severally liable to a fine not exceeding £100.

24. The auditor by whom any such audit and report is to be made shall be selected and employed for that purpose by the solicitor whose accounts are so audited.

25. The fees payable by a solicitor to any such auditor in respect of his audit and report shall be such as are agreed upon between the solicitor and the auditor.

26. Subject to any written agreement to the contrary between a solicitor and any person for or in trust for whom any moneys are received or held by the solicitor, the cost of auditing his trust account shall be borne by the solicitor.

27. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing regulations, if any trust-moneys are held by a solicitor jointly with any co-trustee who is not a solicitor, and if the accounts of such trust are regularly and properly kept by any person appointed in that behalf by the trustees, and not being a solicitor or a person employed in the office of a solicitor, and if such accounts are regularly and properly audited by an auditor appointed by the trustees, such trust-moneys shall not be deemed to be included within the trust account of that solicitor, or subject to audit under these regulations, except so far as any such moneys may come in the course of any year to the hands of that solicitor or pass through his accounts in the course of his business.

WHEREAS it is provided by section sixty-five of the Harbours Amendment Act, 1910 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that in any case in which either before or after the passing of the said Act anything is or has been omitted to be done by or on behalf of any Board, or has been done without such Board having previously obtained the proper authority from the Governor or the Governor in Council or by Order in Council, or in any case in which anything cannot be done by or on behalf of any Board at the time required by the said or any other Act, or is done after such time, or is otherwise irregularly or incorrectly done, or sufficient provision is not made by the said Act, the Governor may, by Order in Council gazetted, at any time before or after the time within which such thing is required to be done, extend such time, or may validate anything so done after the time required, or make other provision for such case as he thinks fit:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the third day of



April following, a regulation was made providing that public notice of any election to fill any vacancy on any Harbour Board for a combined district shall be given not less than twenty-one clear days before such election, and the date for the nomination of candidates shall be not less than fourteen clear days before such election :

And whereas public notice of an election of one member of the New Plymouth Harbour Board, as a representative of the combined district of those parts of the Counties of Eltham and Hawera included in the New Plymouth Harbour District, was given within the time prescribed in the said regulation, but through an error the date of the nomination of candidates for the said election was given by the Returning Officer for the election as ten days, instead of fourteen days, before the date of such election :

And whereas Jacob Marx, being the only candidate for the said election nominated within the time prescribed by the Returning Officer, was declared by the Returning Officer to be duly elected to be a member of the said Board as a representative of the said combined district, and it is desirable to validate such election :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby validate the election of Jacob Marx to be a member of the New Plymouth Harbour Board, as a representative of the combined district of those parts of the Counties of Eltham and Hawera included in the New Plymouth Harbour District.

*Commission to inquire into and report as to a System of Canals and Inland Waterways and other Transport Improvements in the Auckland District.*

To all to whom these presents shall come, and to WILLIAM FERGUSON, Esquire, of Wellington, Civil Engineer; EVAN PARRY, Esquire, of Wellington, Electrical Engineer; and JAMES ERSKINE WATSON, Esquire, of Invercargill, Merchant: Greeting.

WHEREAS it is expedient that inquiry should be made into the necessity or expediency of having a system of canals and inland waterways and otherwise improving the means of transport in the Auckland District:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, and all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby constitute and appoint you the said

JAMES ERSKINE WATSON

to be a Commission to inquire into and report as to the establishment of a system of canals and inland waterways and otherwise improving the means of transport in the Auckland District, and with special reference to the following matters:—

1. What should be the route or routes of one or more canals.
2. The dimensions of these canals and the class of vessels to navigate them.
3. The character and quantity of probable traffic thereon and the revenue to be derived therefrom.
4. The estimated cost of works considered necessary.
5. The working-expenses thereof, including maintenance, interest, and sinking fund.
6. What effect the construction of a canal or canals will have upon the revenue of the Government railways.
7. The contingent works necessary to enable the canals to be fully developed and used, such as roads, railways, wharves, and stores.
8. As to the form of control or management of any such works as the Commission may recommend.
9. As to the finance, construction, and maintenance thereof.
10. As to whether any concession should be granted by the General Government or local governing authorities.
11. As to whether the adjacent districts should be subject to rating to provide a guarantee for loans which might be necessary to provide funds for construction purposes, and as to whether those districts should be rated to provide for losses in working.
12. Whether a bridge should be constructed across Waitemata Harbour to connect the City of Auckland with the northern districts.

And generally to inquire into and report upon such other matters arising thereout as may come under your notice in the course of your inquiries, and which you consider require to be investigated in connection therewith.

And with the like advice and consent I do further appoint you the said WILLIAM FERGUSON to be the Chairman of the said Commission.

And for the better enabling you the said Commission to carry these presents into effect, you are hereby authorized and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry under these presents at such times and places in the said Dominion as you deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and place to place as you think fit, and to call before you and examine on oath or otherwise, as may be allowed by law, such person or persons as you think capable of affording you information in the premises; and you are also hereby empowered to call for and examine all such books, papers, plans, writings, documents, or records as you deem likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject-matter of the inquiry hereby directed to be made, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all lawful means whatsoever.

And using all diligence you are required to report to me, under your hands and seals, not later than the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, your opinion as to the aforesaid matters.

And it is hereby declared that these presents shall continue in full force and virtue although the inquiry is not

regularly continued from time to time or from place to place by adjournment.

And, lastly, it is hereby further declared that these presents are issued under and subject to the provisions of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908.

(3.) The alteration hereby made shall take effect on and after the 11th day of November, 1914, being the day upon which the triennial election of Councillors is to be held.

#### RODNEY COUNTY.

##### GENERAL BY-LAWS.

##### I. AUTHORITY.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in the Rodney County Council by the Counties Act, 1908, the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, the Public Health Act, 1908, the Acts amending the same, and all and every other power contained in any other Act, the Rodney County Council doth hereby make and ordain these by-laws to have full force and effect within the whole of the Rodney County.

##### II. DEFINITIONS.

In these by-laws, if not inconsistent with the context, words importing the masculine include the feminine, words importing the singular include the plural, and *vice versa*.

"Council" means the Rodney County Council; "Chairman" the Chairman for the time being of the Rodney County Council.

"Clerk" means the Clerk of the said County Council, or the Acting Clerk in the absence of the Clerk.

"Office" means the office of the Rodney County Council.

"Officer" includes the Clerk or any other person appointed by the Council to carry out any duties connected with the administration of the by-laws for the time being in force in the county.

"Inspector" means an officer appointed by the Council to carry out the duties hereinafter set forth as requiring his oversight or action; and in case of no such appointment being made, or in the absence of the Inspector, it shall mean the Clerk.

"Owner," as applied to land, includes the person for the time being entitled to the rack-rent thereof. As applied to all kinds and descriptions of vehicles, "owner" shall include every person who, either alone or in partnership with any other person, shall keep a vehicle or vehicles otherwise than as a driver or attendant.

"Occupier," as applied to land, includes the person in actual possession thereof; and in respect of any premises means the person either actually or apparently in charge.

"Person" includes a body of persons, whether incorporate or unincorporate.

"Public place" includes and applies to every road, street, footpath, footway, court, alley, and thoroughfare of a public nature, or open to or used by the public as of right, and every place of public resort or place to which the public have access so open or used.

SECTION 1.

Regulating Traffic.

For the purpose of these by-laws the number or quantity mentioned in the following Schedule shall represent one ton avoirdupois in each of their several kinds :—

1. Kauri timber, sawn or log .. 700 superficial feet.
2. Sawn timber or logs other than kauri .. .. 500 superficial feet.
3. Firewood .. .. 60 cubic feet.
4. Boulders, gravel, or broken stone .. 4/5 of 1 cubic yard.
5. Squared stone .. .. 1/2 of 1 cubic yard.
6. Bricks .. .. 300.
7. Barley (4-bushel sacks) .. .. 11 sacks.
8. Oats (4-bushel sacks) .. .. 14 sacks.
9. Wheat (4-bushel sacks) .. .. 10 sacks.
10. Maize (4-bushel sacks) .. .. 10 sacks.
11. Chaff (4-bushel sacks) .. .. 27 sacks.
12. Potatoes, carrots, and turnips .. 12 sacks.
13. Wool .. .. 5 bales.
14. Basic slag .. .. 16 bags.
15. Bonedust, or other artificial manures other than basic slag .. 10 sacks or 16 bags.
16. Fruit .. .. 40 bushel cases or 80 1/2-bushel cases.
17. Shell lime .. .. 15 sacks.
18. Hydraulic lime .. .. 20 bags.
19. Cement .. .. 12 bags.

SECTION 2.

SECTION 3.

Traction-engines.

Pace-limit.

1. No person shall drive a traction-engine at a pace exceeding four miles an hour on any road within the county, or at a pace of more than one and a half miles an hour whilst crossing any culvert or bridge.

Person in charge to give name when required.

2. Every person in charge of a traction-engine on a road shall give his name and that of the owner whenever required so to do by any person riding, driving, or leading a horse, or by any officer of the Council.

Driver required to give notice of any damage done.

3. The driver in charge of a traction-engine or bullock wagon shall give immediate notice to the Clerk, Engineer, or riding member of the Council of any damage or injury done by such engine or bullock wagon, or any carriage or machine attached thereto, to any road, bridge, fence, culvert, watercourse, drain, or any other thing forming part of or appertaining to any road; and if such damage has rendered

such road, bridge, culvert, or appurtenances thereof dangerous to traffic or public safety the owner of the engine or wagon shall, in addition to giving such notice as aforesaid, place and maintain in such position, and for such time as the Clerk, Engineer, or riding member may direct, such signals as shall be sufficient to give warning to all persons using such road, bridge, or culvert by day and by night of such danger.

Crossing bridges.

4. The driver of a traction-engine drawing any carriage, machine, or wagon shall not take the same on or across any bridge of more than 10 ft. span unless and except planks are laid crosswise upon the decking of such bridge, and each such engine, carriage, machine, or wagon is at all times when crossing such bridge separated by the full length of such bridge from any other engine, carriage, machine, or wagon.

Not permitted to attach grippers or studs to wheels.

5. No person shall drive upon any road any traction-engine to the wheels of which are attached (permanently or temporarily) studs, grippers, or other pieces of iron so placed, shaped, or constructed as to sink into or break the surface of the road.

Not permitted to remain stationary on bridge.

6. No driver in charge of a traction-engine shall permit the same to stand upon a bridge for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose, unless compelled to do so by accident or other unavoidable circumstance.

Disposal of cinders or ashes.

7. No person shall discharge any ashes, cinders, or other refuse from a traction-engine upon any bridge or culvert, or upon any road within 20 ft. of the centre of such road, or unless such ashes, cinders, or refuse shall have been completely extinguished and spread out so as not to in anywise injure such road or any fence or anything thereon or adjacently thereto.

Must stop when required by persons riding or driving.

8. The driver of a traction-engine, when travelling upon a road, shall so drive and manage his engine as to cause as little obstruction or annoyance as possible to any person using such road, and shall stop the engine when required so to do by any person desiring to ride, drive, or lead any horse or other animal past the engine, whether such person be meeting or overtaking the engine; and for the purpose of requiring a driver to stop the engine as aforesaid it shall be sufficient if the person requiring the engine to stop signify the same to the driver by holding up one hand.

Going round bends, curves, or through cuttings.

9. The driver of a traction-engine upon any road shall stop the engine before going round any bend in the road where his view of the road may be obstructed, and before entering any cutting or narrow part of the road where it would be difficult for a vehicle to pass the engine, unless and until the look-out man reports that the road through such bend, cutting, or narrow part is clear of traffic.

Engines not to be left standing.

10. No person shall leave a traction-engine standing upon a road in such a position as to frighten or be calculated to frighten horses passing along the road.

Walking-pace over bridges.

11. No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal, or other engine, machine, or other vehicle on or over a bridge at other than a walking-pace.

SECTION 4.

Motors.

In this Part of these by-laws, if not inconsistent with the context,—

“Motor” shall have the meaning assigned to the word “motor” by section 2 of the Motor Regulation Act, 1908; and shall include a motor-car or motor-cycle (with or without a side car attached).

Must not obstruct traffic.

2. No person in charge of a motor while on a road shall cause or permit or allow such motor to be driven or operated or to remain or stand on a road or bridge or culvert so as to unnecessarily obstruct or unduly interfere with the traffic thereon.

Precautions to be taken when leaving car.

3. No person in charge of a motor-car when on a road shall quit such car without having taken due precautions against its starting in his absence.

## Car not to be driven backwards.

4. No person driving a motor-car when on a road shall cause such motor-car to travel backwards for a greater distance than shall be requisite for the purposes of safety.

## Driver must give warning of his approach.

5. The person in charge of a motor on any road shall, when within a reasonable distance from and before overtaking any foot passengers who shall be in sight, and when within a reasonable distance from and before meeting or overtaking any vehicle or motor or horseman or cyclist or any person leading or driving a horse or other animal which or who shall be in sight, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach or position of the motor by sounding the bell, motor-horn, or other instrument which he is by law required to carry attached thereto.

When view is interrupted the driver to slow down and give warning.

6. When a motor is being driven or propelled on any road, if owing to a bend, corner, or crossing, or junction in such road, or to any similar cause, it becomes impossible for the driver of such motor to have an uninterrupted view of the traffic on such road or on any road junctioning therewith for at least 50 yards ahead, such driver or person in charge shall slow down to a speed of not more than four miles an hour, and by sounding the said bell, motor-horn, or other instrument give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such motor.

When about to turn off or stop, driver must signify his intention to persons approaching.

7. If the driver of any motor on a road is about to turn off from or come to a stop on such road he shall, when reasonably necessary, signify his intention so to do by signalling with his hand to any motor, vehicle, cyclist, or horseman following or approaching such first-mentioned motor.

## When meeting restive horses.

8. The person driving a motor on any road shall on meeting any person driving, riding, or having charge of a restive horse on such road cause such motor to stop and remain stationary so long as shall be reasonable to enable such person to pass the motor with the vehicle or horse he is driving, riding, or in charge of.

## When overtaking or meeting cattle being driven.

9. The driver of any motor on any road shall, when meeting or overtaking any horses, cattle, sheep, or pigs being driven along a road, slow down the motor, and take all reasonable care to avoid any injury to such animals.

## When on dangerous part of road.

10. No driver of any motor shall pass or attempt to pass any vehicle, horse, or other animal in charge of any person whilst such vehicle, horse, or other animal is on a dangerous part of the road.

## Not to enter upon bridge unless clear.

11. No driver of any motor shall enter upon any bridge having less than 16 ft. roadway whilst any vehicle, or person riding, leading, or driving a horse or other animal, is on or whilst any horses are being driven on such bridge and coming towards such motor.

## Level crossing.

12. Every road crossed on the level by a Government railway is deemed and is hereby declared by the Council to be dangerous to the use of motors for a distance of 20 yards on each side of such railway.

## Bridge or road may be declared dangerous to motors.

13. If at any time the Council is satisfied that the use of motors upon any bridge, road, or part of a road would be attended with risk of damage to the bridge or danger to the public, it may, by resolution publicly notified, declare such bridge, road, or part of road to be dangerous for the use of motors.

## Dangerous roads indicated by triangles.

14. Every bridge, road, or part of a road hereby or hereafter declared as aforesaid by the Council to be dangerous for the use of motors shall be indicated by triangles with 2 ft. base, a red triangle marking the point where the danger is deemed to begin, and a white triangle marking the point where it ends.

## Slow down when approaching triangles.

15. Every driver of a motor on a road shall, when approaching a red triangle, if such triangle is visible or its existence is known to such driver, slow down the motor so as to be at a safe speed until after passing a white triangle, or in the case of a level crossing until after passing over the railway.

## Brakes.

16. No motor shall be driven or operated on any road unless such motor is fitted with at least two efficient brakes.

## Muffler or silencer.

17. No motor shall be driven or operated on any road unless such motor is fitted with an efficient muffler or silencer, and no such muffler or silencer shall be disconnected from the exhaust or be opened or removed while such motor is being driven or operated within 50 yards of any horse or vehicle on any road.

## No intoxicated person allowed to drive.

18. No person shall drive or operate, or attempt to drive or operate, a motor-car on a road whilst intoxicated or otherwise incapable or incompetent to control and direct its use and movement.

## Must leave room for other vehicles.

19. Every driver of a motor on any road shall leave a fair proportion of such road to any vehicle, horseman, cyclist, or other motor that may be passing him, and shall not turn a motor sharply into the centre of any road immediately after passing a vehicle drawn by a horse or horses.

## Driver to show his intention to leave room.

20. Every driver of a motor on any road, when meeting any vehicle, horseman, cyclist, or other motor that shall be in sight, shall show his intention of leaving a fair proportion of the road to any such vehicle, horseman, cyclist, or other motor at least 50 yards distant from such vehicle, horseman, cyclist, or other motor, or so soon as it comes in sight.

## Speed-limit.

21. Motor-cars and motor-cycles shall not travel at a greater speed than four miles an hour round corners and sharp curves, where the view is obstructed for at least 50 yards ahead.

The speed-limit for motor cars and cycles shall not exceed fifteen miles an hour.

## Driver must give room for cattle being driven or led.

22. The driver of any motor-car, or the rider of any motor-cycle, when meeting or overtaking any horse or horses, cattle, or sheep being driven or led, shall take the outside of the road until they pass.

## SECTION 5.

*Regulating Traffic on Roads and Bridges.*

Bullock teams prohibited from 1st May to 31st October.

1. No bullock team shall be taken or driven with a load or vehicle on any road within the county between the 1st day of May and the 31st day of October in each and every year without a permit from the Council.

## Locks or brakes.

2. The owner and driver of every vehicle, while the same is being drawn along any road or bridge within the county, shall not fasten or lock, or cause, suffer, or permit to become fastened or locked, in order that such fastening or locking may act as or serve the purpose of a brake on any wheel of such vehicle.

## Rule of the road.

3. Every person driving, drawing, or propelling any vehicle, or leading or riding any animal, when meeting any other vehicle or animal or any foot passenger in any road, shall, when practicable, keep on the left or near side of the road or place; and when passing any other vehicle or animal or any foot passenger going in the same direction shall pass, when practicable, on the right or off side of such other vehicle or animal or foot passenger; and in case of bicycles, when overtaking any vehicle, horse, or foot passenger, the rider shall give audible and sufficient notice of his approach by sounding a bell.

## Lights required.

4. No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, drive any vehicle saving cycles along any road unless such vehicle shall carry two sufficient lights, one on each side of the vehicle.

## Lights on cycles.

5. All cycles ridden between sunset and sunrise in any road shall carry a light in a conspicuous place in front, and shall also carry an alarm bell; and the riders thereof shall ring such bell when approaching any vehicle or person on horseback, and when approaching any one crossing any road, whether on foot or horseback.

## Vehicle must be left secure.

6. No person shall leave any vehicle, other than a cycle, in any road or public place without some person in charge thereof, unless he shall effectually lock one of the wheels of such vehicle with an iron chain or other secure fastenings.



## Driving round corners or over bridges.

7. No person shall ride or drive any animal or vehicle round a corner or over a bridge or culvert faster than a walking-pace.

## Closing bridges to heavy traffic.

8. The Council may from time to time close any bridge for traffic exceeding  $1\frac{1}{2}$  tons in weight by placing in some conspicuous place at each end of such bridge a board having painted thereon the words "Closed for engines and vehicles exceeding  $1\frac{1}{2}$  tons in weight," in letters not less than 3 in. in length; and so long as such bridge is closed to such traffic as aforesaid no person shall take or drive on or across such bridge any vehicle, engine, or machine which shall itself or together with any thing or things transported thereon weigh more than  $1\frac{1}{2}$  tons avoirdupois.

## Number of cattle over bridges.

9. No person shall drive any number of great cattle or horses exceeding twenty-five in number over any bridge at any one time.

## Furious riding.

10. No person shall furiously or negligently ride or drive any animal, vehicle, or conveyance on any road or public place.

## Animals to be made secure before being left.

11. No person shall leave unattended on any road or public place any horse or other animal harnessed to any vehicle, unless such animal shall be secured by some efficient means to prevent such animal from bolting or wandering on or along a road.

## Rule of the road.

12. The driver of any vehicle shall keep to the left-hand side of the road when meeting any other vehicle or a motor-car, or any horseman or cyclist, and shall drive to the right-hand side of the road when overtaking any other vehicle or a motor-car, or any horseman or cyclist, and shall in all cases leave a reasonable portion of the road for any vehicle, motor-car, person, or animal passing him.

## Private crossings.

13. Where vehicle<sup>or animal</sup> traffic to or from any private premises usually takes place, the Council may, by fourteen days' notice delivered to the occupier or sent to him through the ordinary course of post, require him to construct crossing accordingly.

## Private crossings to be made.

14. Every crossing from the formed or the metalled portion of any road to give access to any private gateway or private road shall be kept in good order and repair to the satisfaction of the County Engineer or Inspector by the occupier of the premises in connection wherewith such crossing shall be used.

## Culverts or drainpipes on crossings.

15. All culverts or drainpipes placed in connection with any such crossing shall be laid to the satisfaction of the Engineer or Inspector, and shall be kept in good order and repair by the occupier for the time being of such premises.

## SECTION 6.

## Offences on Public Roads and Places.

1. Any person shall be guilty of an offence who—  
Being in charge of any bull, stallion, or other entire animal, permits it to cover within sight of any public place.
2. Allows any horse, sheep, pig, goat, or other cattle under his charge to be at large or to loiter in any road or public place.
3. Leaves, without reasonable excuse, upon any public road any carriage, cart, plough, harrow, or other vehicle or implement without any horse or other animal of burden harnessed thereto, or plays any game to the annoyance of any persons upon any road or footpath, or obstructs any road or footpath, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across the same, or by placing or leaving upon such road or footpath any machine, article, material, or goods, or carries upon his shoulders or otherwise upon any footpath any implements, tools, materials, or load projecting in such a manner as to be to the danger or obstruction of persons using such footpath, or otherwise obstructs any road or footpath.
4. Throws or places any glass, orange-peel, filth, dirt, tins, sawdust, rubbish, or any other matter of a similar nature upon any road, court, alley, or public place whatsoever.
5. Blasts any rock, stone, or timber on or near any road or public place without the permission of the Council, or does not attend to any directions in regard thereto given by the Council.
6. Leaves any hole, excavation, or dangerous formation in, upon, or near any road or public place without fencing or

enclosing the same, or keeping a light burning upon such enclosure from sunset to sunrise.

7. Cuts, marks, breaks, or defaces any bridge, tree, notice-board, mile-post, finger-post, or other county property or any county building.

8. Without first having obtained permission of the Council, writes or paints any sign on any road, bridge, or public place, or on any structure thereon respectively erects any scaffolding or telephone or electric-light wire, constructs or places any culvert or water-pipe on or in any road or public place, or removes any posts, trees, plants, grass-seed, soil, gravel, or other material from, or lights any fire on a road or public place, or places any timber, brick, stone, or other building-material on a road so as to obstruct or endanger persons using the road.

9. Leaves any dead, dying, or diseased beast or animal on any road or public place, or throws or leaves any dead animal or any part thereof on any road or public place, or throws or leaves the same on any private property within 10 chains of any road or public place, whereby a nuisance from offensive smell or otherwise is occasioned to persons using the road or public place.

10. Leaves any tree or other obstruction fallen from property in his occupation upon any road for a longer period than is reasonably necessary to remove the same.

11. Keeps any pigs or other animals herded near any road so as to be offensive or dangerous to travellers along the road.

12. Keeps any entire animal in any paddock adjacent to any road unless secured by a strong and sufficient fence.

13. No person shall wilfully or unlawfully extinguish any road lamp, or wilfully injure any road post or lamp.

14. No person shall in any way impede or obstruct the free flow of water through any culvert or drainpipe or along any channel or watertable constructed in connection with any public road or any footpath.

15. No person shall damage any watertable on any road, or drive with a wheel in any such watertable.

16. It shall be an offence to use any catamarans or wheeled sledge on any roads within the county.

## PENALTIES.

Any person committing a breach of any of these by-laws shall be liable to such penalty, not exceeding £5, as the Court in its discretion may see fit to impose; and in case of a continuing offence to a further and like penalty for each day or part of a day on which such breach shall be continued after conviction or after written notice of such breach shall be given by or on behalf of the Council to the offender; provided always that the penalties to be recovered in any one proceeding or any continuing breach shall in no case exceed £100.

If default be made in the carrying into effect of the Council required to be made or done by these by-laws the Council may cause the same to be made or done, and all expenses incurred by the Council in so doing shall be recoverable from any person who under these by-laws should have made or done the same.

These by-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of May, 1914, and shall apply to the whole County of Rodney.
