*Union of Boroughs of City of Auckland and Grey Lynn.*

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS the respective Councils of the City of Auckland and of the Borough of Grey Lynn, by petitions under the respective common seals of the Corporations of such city and borough, as provided by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, have prayed the Governor that such city and borough (forming one continuous area) be constituted one united borough :

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, do hereby proclaim that the said City of Auckland and the said Borough of Grey Lynn are hereby constituted one united borough, and also that the said borough so constituted is a city by the name of the City of Auckland, and also that the boundaries of the said city so constituted and named shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto :

And I do also proclaim and declare that the said borough shall be an undivided borough, and that the number of Councillors to be elected to the Council thereof shall be eighteen, exclusive of the Mayor :

And I do hereby appoint Henry William Wilson (the Town Clerk to the existing City of Auckland) to be the Town Clerk and George Robert Hogan to be the Returning Officer temporarily of the said united borough :

And I do also proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

SCHEDULE.

BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF AUCKLAND.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-west and north generally by Waitemata Harbour from Motion's Creek to Cox's Creek; thence by Cox's Creek to and by the road and bridge across that creek; thence by the northern side of Cox's Creek and by Waitemata Harbour to a point on the north-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 15 of Section No. 8, Suburbs of Auckland, as defined in the Schedule of the Proclamation extending the

boundaries of the City of Auckland in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 85, of the 27th October, 1904; thence by right lines 2930, 2274, 3000, 3092, 945, 182, 163, 196, 410, 563, 364, 155, 76, 316, 76, 1490, 758, 184, 577, 241, 802, 913, 1168, 1064, and 1767 links respectively, and thence by the high-water mark of the said Waitemata Harbour to Resolution Point; thence towards the east by the shore of Hobson Bay, in Waitemata Harbour, to the middle of Slaughterhouse Creek; thence towards the south and south-west generally by the southern and south-western boundaries of the Borough of Parnell as it existed at the time when described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 35, of the 19th April, 1877, page 415, to the southern corner of Section No. 11, City of Auckland, and thence by the south-west boundary of that section to Stanley Street; thence again towards the east generally by the east side of said Stanley Street, by the Government Domain, and by the Hospital Reserve to the road known as Park Road; thence by the northern side of the said road to a point in line with the eastern boundary-line of Allotment No. 22 of Section No. 3, Suburbs of Auckland, now the middle of Park Avenue; thence by a right line to and by the said boundary-line, and by its production to the south side of Carlton Gore Road; thence by the south side of that road to the western boundary-line of subdivisional Lot No. 37 of Original Allotment No. 4 of Section No. 3, Suburbs of Auckland; thence by the said Lot No. 37 and Lots Nos. 55, 56, 65, 66, 75, 76, 85, 86, 95, 96, 105, 106, 115, 116, and 13 of Allotment 4 aforesaid, and by the production of the western boundary-line of the last-mentioned lot to the southern side of Kyber Pass Road; thence by the southern side of that road to the eastern side of Boston Road; thence towards the south-east and south generally by the south-eastern side of the said Boston Road to its junction with Mount Eden Road; thence by the western side of Mount Eden Road to Symonds Street; thence by a right line across Symonds Street to and by the north side of Basque Road to Allotment No. 1 of Section No. 5, Suburbs of Auckland; thence by Allotment No. 1 aforesaid and Allotments Nos. 3 and 4 of Section No. 5 aforesaid to the northernmost corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by the south-eastern and southern boundary-lines of Section No. 7, Suburbs of Auckland, to a point in line with the north-western boundary-line of Allotment No. 20 of Section No. 7 aforesaid; thence by a right line to and by that boundary-line to the southern side of the Great North Road, and by the

southern side of that road to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 17 of Section No. 9, Suburbs of Auckland; thence towards the south-west generally by a right line across the Great South Road to the south-eastern corner of Allotment No. 17 aforesaid; thence by that allotment and Allotment No. 13 to Motion's Creek, and by that creek to Waitemata Harbour, the place of commencement.

*Constituting the Town District of Tuakau in the County of Franklin.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Town Boards Act, 1908, that the Governor may declare that any locality outside a borough wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said area shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908, by the name of the Tuakau Town District; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of seven members.

SCHEDULE.

TUAKAU TOWN DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north by Allotment No. 34, Pukekohe Parish, from the north-eastern corner of Allotment No. 5, Tuakau Parish, to the road forming the western boundary of Allotment No. 41, Tuakau Parish; thence to and along the middle of that road to a point in line with the northern boundary of a subdivision of Allotments Nos. 41, 60, and 44, shown on plan numbered 3990A, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence to and by the northern, north-western, and north-eastern boundaries of the said subdivision to the road forming the south-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence to and along the middle of that road to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Allotment No. 62, Parish of Tuakau; thence to and by that allotment, a public road, and Allotment No. 79A, Tuakau Parish, to a point on the south-eastern boundary of that allotment, distant 700 links from its southernmost corner; thence towards the east generally by a right line parallel to the western boundary of Allotment No. 79 and that line produced across a road and through Allotment No. 19 to the railway reserve, and by the railway reserve to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence across and by the railway reserve to the westernmost corner of Allotment No. 17, Tuakau Parish, and by the south-western boundary of that allotment for a distance of 800 links; thence by a right line to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 29A, Suburbs of Tuakau, and across a road to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 30, Suburbs of Tuakau, by that section, Section No. 30A, Suburbs of Tuakau, Allotment No. 59, Tuakau Parish, and Section No. 153, Suburbs of Tuakau, to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence across a road to the north-western corner of Section No. 23, Suburbs of Tuakau, and by that section to its south-western corner; thence towards the south generally by the road forming the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 45, Suburbs of Tuakau, to the south-western corner of Section

No. 142; thence across a road to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 46, by the road forming the south-eastern boundary of that section, by Sections Nos. 46A and 56, Suburbs of Tuakau, and the northern boundary of the last-mentioned section produced to the middle of the road at its north-western corner; thence towards the west generally by a line along the middle of the road forming the eastern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 103 and 49, Tuakau Parish, to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 5, Tuakau Parish; and thence to and by the south-eastern boundary of that section to Allotment No. 34, the place of commencement.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a scenic reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

SCHEDULE.

KAKEPUKU MOUNTAIN SCENIC RESERVE.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, containing 210 acres 3 roods 3 perches, more or less, being Section 1A, Block IX, Puniu Survey District. Bounded towards the south-east and north-east by Section 2A, Block IX, Puniu Survey District, and a public road, 1530-5, 425, 1255, and 3921-7 links; towards the south-west and again towards the north-east by Section 6A of the aforesaid block, 1725 and 1050-1 links; again towards the south-west by Sections 5, 4, and 3 of the aforesaid block, 5457-2 links; and towards the north-west generally by Kakepuku No. 9 Block and Kakepuku No. 1 Block, 4840, 240-2, and 2313-7 links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less: as the same is delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 724/8, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon edged red. Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereunder shall be scenic reserves under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

TARAKAIPA ISLAND SCENIC RESERVE.

ALL that area in the Marlborough Land District, containing by estimation 90 acres, more or less, being Section 5, Block VII, Tennyson Survey District, and known as Tarakaipa Island. Bounded towards the north, east, south, and west by the waters of Tennyson Inlet; as the same is delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 729/1A, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

TAWHITINUI ISLANDS SCENIC RESERVE.

All those areas in the Marlborough Land District, containing by estimation 54 acres and 3 acres, being Sections 6 and 7, respectively, Block VII, Tennyson Survey District. *Revoking Part of a Proclamation taking Land for a Portion of the East Coast Main Trunk Railway (Gisborne Southwards), and for Road-diversions in connection therewith and for a Road Approach thereto.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, it is enacted that if at any time after the issue or making of any Proclamation taking land under the Public Works Act, 1908, and before the payment or award of any compensation in respect to the taking thereof, it is found that the land, or any part thereof, is not required for the purpose for which it was taken, or that any error in form or substance exists in or in relation to that Proclamation, or the making or gazetting thereof, the Governor may, by a subsequent Proclamation gazetted, revoke the former Proclamation, either wholly or so far as he thinks necessary:

And whereas it is found that the Proclamation taking land for a portion of the East Coast Main Trunk Railway (Gisborne Southwards), and for road-diversions in connection therewith and for a road approach thereto, made under the Public Works Act, 1908, and dated the twenty-first day of

November, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen (hereinafter termed "the said Proclamation"), and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 85, page 3526, of the twenty-seventh day of the same month, contains an error in substance, in that the piece of land hereinafter mentioned is incorrectly described: And whereas compensation in respect of the taking of the land incorrectly described in the said Proclamation has not been paid or awarded:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as affects twelve (12) perches, being described therein as portion of Okahuatui 1A, situated in Block XV, Waikohu Survey District (shown coloured blue on sheet twelve of the plan marked P.W.D. 34326, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington), being the whole of the land lastly mentioned in the Schedule to the said Proclamation of the land taken for railway purposes.

*Declaring Land taken for a Public Work, and not required for such Public Work, to be Crown Land.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty of the Public Works Act, 1908, that if it is found that any land held, taken, purchased, or acquired at any time under this or any other Act or Provincial Ordinance, or otherwise howsoever, for any public work, is not required for such public work, the Governor may, by an Order in Council publicly notified and gazetted, cause the same to be sold under the conditions therein mentioned:

And whereas it is further provided by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, that in the case of any land so taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work and not required for that purpose, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without complying with any other requirements of the aforesaid section thirty, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto was taken for the purposes of a pilot and signal station: And whereas the said land is not now required for such purpose, and it is desirable to declare the said land to be Crown land: And whereas a plan has been prepared, and the Minister has recommended the Governor to declare such land to be Crown land:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the above-in-part-recited Acts, and of all other powers in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and that such land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section seventeen of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, declare any bay or portion of a bay, estuary, or tidal waters in New Zealand in the neighbourhood of any Maori pa or village, to be an oyster-fishery where Maoris only may take oysters for their own food at all times, irrespective of any of the provisions of the said Act: and

may prescribe regulations for preventing the sale by Maoris of any oysters from such beds, and for protecting any such bay, estuary, or tidal waters from trespassers and the oysters therein from destruction:

And whereas it is desired to declare a portion of the foreshore of Arapaoa River, in Kaipara Harbour, as hereinafter defined, to be an oyster-fishery where Maoris only may take oysters for their own food, and to prescribe regulations as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that part of the foreshore of Arapaoa River, Kaipara Harbour, between Te Kopua Point and Wakaiti, as shown outlined in red on plan marked M.D. 4282, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, the boundaries of such area being marked by posts painted red and marked "Maori oyster boundary," to be an oyster-fishery where Maoris only may take oysters for their own food at all times, and doth hereby make the following regulations.

The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

5. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall



be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company in New Zealand.

6. In case the company shall—
  - (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
  - (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said site for a period of thirty days;
  - (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
  - (4.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council, without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

7. The occupation of the said site shall be deemed to be an acceptance by the company of the conditions of this Order in Council.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council grant to any person or body corporate a license to use water from any fall, river, stream, or other source for the purpose of generating electricity for electric light, mechanical power, or other uses, and to exercise in respect of that license any of the powers and authorities specified in that behalf in the said section :

And whereas it is by subsection five of the said section also provided that the license shall be deemed to constitute a contract between the licensee and His Majesty the King, and shall be enforceable by and against either party accordingly :

And whereas the Eltham Co-operative Dairy Factory Company (Limited), having its registered office in the Borough of Eltham, in the Provincial District of Taranaki, and incorporated and registered under the Companies Act, 1908 (which company with its successors and assigns is hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), has applied for a license under the said section to take and use water from the Waingongoro River, in the Provincial District of Taranaki (hereinafter referred to as "the said stream"), for the purpose of generating electricity for mechanical power and for lighting its premises and the premises of the Eltham Bacon Factory (Limited), upon the terms and subject to the conditions hereinafter appearing, and it is expedient to issue such license accordingly :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power conferred upon him as aforesaid, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to the licensee, subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, a license to take, divert, and use from the Waingongoro River aforesaid, for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding twenty sluice heads at any one time, for lighting and power purposes on the premises of the licensee and on the premises of the Eltham Bacon Factory (Limited), (hereinafter called "the said premises").

TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

1. In this license the following words and phrases shall have the meanings hereby attached to them respectively :—

"Minister" means the Minister of Public Works.

"Public Works" means any public work as defined in the Public Works Act, 1908, and its amendments, and includes any work authorized, constructed, or maintained under Division 2 of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908.

"Inspecting Engineer" means and includes any Inspecting Engineer appointed by the Minister to inspect works to be constructed or maintained by virtue of electric-line licenses, or any water-power licenses, or any combined water-power and electric-line licenses, issued under the Public Works Act, 1908, and any or all of its amendments, or under any one or more of such amendments only, or any Act or Acts passed in amendment thereof or substitution thereof.

2. The said water shall be used for the purpose of generating electricity or electrical energy for power purposes.

3. The said water shall be taken by the licensee from the point in the said stream marked "intake," and shown on the plan marked P.W.D. 34423, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington and hereinafter referred to as the said plan, and such water shall be conducted by a race or pipe over or along the route shown on the said plan for a distance of 40 chains to the power-house erected on the bank of the said stream at the site marked "Power-house Site" on the said plan, and all water diverted from the said stream shall be returned by the licensee to the said stream at or near the power-house.

4. The licensee shall pay to the Under-Secretary of Public Works, Wellington, or at such other place as the Minister may from time to time require, for the privileges herein bestowed a rent of £5 sterling per annum, payable in advance, as from the 1st day of October, 1913.

5. The term for which this license is granted is a period of fourteen years, commencing as from the 1st day of October, 1913, unless such term is sooner revoked, determined, or surrendered in accordance with or in pursuance of the provisions hereinafter contained; and upon the expiry of the term of the license hereby granted or upon the sooner revocation, determination, or surrender of the same, all rights granted to the licensee shall thereupon absolutely cease and determine; but such revocation, determination, or surrender shall not relieve the licensee of any burden, condition, or liability contracted under this license.

6. The Inspecting Engineer shall have free access to and liberty at any time to inspect the works so as to insure that the provisions of this license are being given due effect to.

7. The power-works shall be maintained continuously in proper working-order during the continuance of such license, so as to effectually serve the purposes of this license.

8. Nothing in this license shall be held to cast upon or imply any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

9. The conditions stated in this license to be observed and performed by the licensee may be altered or modified from time to time if found necessary, and if duly agreed upon between the licensee and the Governor in Council, in which case particulars of such alteration or modification shall be endorsed upon this license and signed by the licensee and the Governor in Council, whereupon all the terms and conditions in this license contained (save and except as they may have been so altered or modified by any such alterations) shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to such alterations as if the latter had formed part of this license as originally issued.

10. Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said stream except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said stream.

11. The Minister may at any time order an inspection to be made of the works and lines of the licensee used for power purposes. If any defect is found to exist it must be remedied forthwith, and if such defect is, in the opinion of the Inspecting Engineer, serious the Minister may, on receipt of the report, direct the licensee to at once cease transmitting energy either over the whole of the licensee's lines and wires or over any specified part thereof until such defect is repaired or remedied. The cost of such inspection shall be borne by the licensee.

12. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the licensee without the express consent in writing of the Governor in Council first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Governor that the transferee is financially able and suitable to carry out the works specified in this license.

13. If the licensee fails—

- (a.) To observe, perform, fulfil, or keep any of the requirements, conditions, and provisions of the Public Works Act, 1908, or its amendments, to the full intent of the same, or of any part thereof; or

(b.) To observe any of the conditions or obligations herein imposed upon the licensee, then in any such case it shall be lawful for the Governor by Order in Council either to revoke this license or to impose upon the licensee a fine not exceeding £100 for every week or part of a week of such default, such fine to be recovered summarily in accordance with the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908.

14. The powers of revocation or infliction of fines by this license vested in the Governor shall not be exercised unless and until the Governor has first caused to be given to the licensee, or left at its registered office, or placed upon some principal or conspicuous part of the works, a notice in writing of the intention to exercise the same, and of the specific breach or breaches in respect of which the aforesaid powers are intended to be exercised, and default has been made by the licensee (after the giving or leaving of such notice) in repairing or remedying the breach complained of for the following spaces of time:—

(a.) For any breach of the conditions of this license which, in the opinion of the Governor, can be met by a fine, thirty days after the giving or leaving of such notice.

(b.) For any breach of the conditions of this license which, in the opinion of the Governor, is of such a nature as to require the revocation of this license, ninety days after the giving or leaving of such notice.

15. The Governor shall be the sole judge of the fact whether the requirements of this license have been complied with, and he may from time to time cause inquiry to be made into any matter connected therewith or arising hereunder in such manner as he thinks fit, and his decision shall be final; provided always that this clause shall not affect the rights of any person, corporate body, or local authority in cases of damage or injury for which an action by such person, corporate body, or local authority may lie against the licensee.

16. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, or the Minister, or any other person under any Act of the General Assembly authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works. Nor shall His Majesty, or the Governor, or the Minister, or any other person be liable to pay to the licensee any compensation for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

17. This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensee and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced as a contract by and against His said Majesty or the licensee accordingly.

18. The charge to be made by the licensee for the sale or supply of electricity, in pursuance of this license, shall not exceed 1s. per unit for light and 6d. per unit for power. A refund of 3d. per unit for light and 2d. per unit for power shall be made if accounts are paid within fourteen days from the date of rendering such accounts by the licensee.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this sixteenth day of June, 1914.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE W. F. MASSEY, P.C., PRESIDING  
IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Fruit-preserving Industry Act, 1913 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act; and doth hereby declare that the said regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. "FRUIT-PRESERVING works" means any cold-store for fruit, or any fruit-canning works or other works used in connection with the preservation of fruit.

2. Advances under the said Act may be made only for the purposes of erecting, equipping, and adding to fruit-preserving works, or for any of those purposes, and may be made only to—

- (a.) *Bona fide* fruitgrowers; or
- (b.) Fruitgrowers' associations incorporated under the Agricultural and Pastoral Societies Act; or
- (c.) Companies registered under the Companies Act.

3. In addition to (but not in substitution for) the security of a first mortgage of a freehold interest in the site of the proposed fruit-preserving works, the following classes of security may be accepted by the Minister as security for an advance under the said Act:—

- (a.) A first mortgage of any other property;
- (b.) The uncalled capital of a company applying for an advance;
- (c.) A joint and several guarantee from the applicants for an advance;
- (d.) A bond, with approved sureties, for the amount of the advance or any part thereof.

4. (1.) Every application for an advance under the said Act shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto.

(2.) Every application from an association of fruitgrowers for an advance must be accompanied by a certified copy of a resolution passed at a special meeting of the association called to consider the matter, and authorizing the borrowing of the sum applied for, or such less sum as the Minister may consent to lend. The copy of the resolution shall be certified by the chairman of the meeting at which the resolution was passed and by the secretary of the association.

(3.) Every application from a registered company shall be accompanied by a copy of the memorandum and articles of association of the company, showing that it is authorized to borrow money on the security of its assets (including its uncalled capital), and also by a copy of a special resolution duly passed by the company authorizing the directors to borrow under the said Act the sum applied for, or such less sum as the Minister may consent to lend.

5. Before any advance is made under the said Act, the site of any building to be erected, and the plans and specifications of the work to be undertaken or the equipment to be installed, must be approved by the Minister.

6. On receipt of an application for an advance the Minister shall obtain expert reports in order to satisfy himself that the supply of fruit in the district is or is likely to be adequate, and that there are reasonable prospects of fruit-preserving

works of the kind proposed to be established being profitably operated.

7. The Minister may also require from the applicant for an advance any particulars deemed necessary to determine the adequacy of the security offered for the advance.

8. Before any payment is made on account of an advance under the said Act a first mortgage shall be executed by the applicant over the site of the proposed works, and such other security shall be provided as is agreed upon with the Minister pursuant to these regulations.

9. (1.) All mortgages or other security shall be executed in favour of His Majesty the King.

(2.) The mortgage shall be in such form, and shall contain such covenants, stipulations, and conditions, not inconsistent with the said Act or these regulations, as the Minister thinks fit.

10. (1.) Where an advance is to be applied to the erection of a building, payment shall be made to the applicant by progress-payments from time to time, as the work of erecting the building advances.

(2.) During the erection and equipment of a building for which an advance is being made, facilities shall at all times be afforded for an inspection to be carried out by any person appointed in that behalf by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture, Industries, and Commerce. The person so appointed shall ascertain whether the plans and specifications approved are being adhered to. Payment of progress-payments will be dependent on a satisfactory report being obtained from the inspecting officer.

11. (1.) Repayment of advances made under the said Act shall be by half-yearly instalments of principal extending over periods of fifteen, twenty, or twenty-five years, according to the discretion of the Minister.

(2.) Interest at the rate agreed on shall be paid half-yearly on the amount for the time being outstanding, on such dates as may be determined in the mortgage.

(3.) The term of the loan shall commence on the date of the payment thereof to the borrower, or on the date of the first progress-payment in respect thereof; and the first half-yearly instalment of principal shall be repayable on such later date as may be agreed on, being not later than five years after the payment of the advance or after the payment of the first progress-payment, as the case may be.

12. Any person to whom an advance under the said Act is made may, if he thinks fit, at the date of any half-yearly payment, pay off, in addition to the instalment of principal then payable, the whole or any part of the principal then outstanding.

13. All documents to be drawn up, or any action that requires to be taken in connection with the making of an advance under the said Act or the repayment of any such advance shall be drawn up or taken, at the charge in all things of the borrower.

14. The mortgagor shall keep fully insured, with an insurance company to be approved by the Minister, all buildings or plant over which a mortgage has been given as security for any advance. The policy shall be in the name of His Majesty during the currency of the mortgage.

15. All fruit-preserving works in respect of which an advance has been made under the said Act shall, during the currency of the mortgage, be maintained in good order and repair, and shall at all times be open to inspection by any officer of the Department of Agriculture, Industries, and Commerce appointed in that behalf by the Secretary.

*Regulations under the Midwives Act, 1908.*

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-third day of June, 1914.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Midwives Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made under the Midwives Act, 1904, on the seventeenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and five, and published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and five, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act.

## REGULATIONS.

## EXAMINATION OF PUPIL NURSES.

1. THE examination of pupil nurses shall be partly oral and practical and partly written, and the subjects of examination shall be as follows :—
  - (a.) The elementary anatomy of the female pelvis and generative organs.
  - (b.) Pregnancy and its principal complications, including abortion.
  - (c.) The symptoms, mechanism, course, and management of natural labour.
  - (d.) The signs that a labour is abnormal.
  - (e.) Hæmorrhage: its varieties, and the treatment of each.
  - (f.) Antiseptics in midwifery, and the way to prepare and use them.
  - (g.) The management of the puerperal patient, including the use of the clinical thermometer and of the catheter.
  - (h.) The management (including the feeding) of infants, and the signs of the important diseases which may develop during the first ten days.
  - (i.) The duties of a midwife and of a monthly nurse.
  - (j.) Obstetric emergencies, and how the midwife should deal with them until the arrival of a doctor.
  - (k.) Puerperal fever: its nature, causes, and symptoms.
  - (l.) The elements of house-sanitation. The disinfection of person, clothing, and appliances.
2. Any candidate who during the examination shows a want of acquaintance with the ordinary subjects of elementary education may be rejected on that ground alone.
3. The examination shall be held half-yearly at such times and places as are from time to time notified by the Registrar.
4. Candidates for the examination must give notice to the Registrar at least three weeks before the date so notified.
5. No pupil nurse shall present herself for examination if she has during her period of training missed three or more of the lectures hereinafter provided for.

## CONDUCT OF STATE MATERNITY HOSPITALS.

6. (1.) Every State maternity hospital shall be under the charge of a Matron appointed under the said Act, who shall have full control of the institution, subject to the directions of the Minister.
- (2.) No person shall be appointed as Matron of a State maternity hospital unless she is registered under the Nurses Registration Act, 1908, and also under the Midwives Act, 1908.
7. The Matron shall deliver lecture to the nurses, and shall, if necessary, teach and train the pupil nurses in general hospital duties as well as in the special duties of midwife and monthly nurse.
8. Every Matron shall keep a register of patients admitted, in the form supplied by the Registrar, and a cash-book for

fees received. A copy of all entries made in these books during each month shall be sent to the Registrar within the first week of the next succeeding month.

9. Not more than twenty pupil nurses shall be entered on the roll of a State maternity hospital at one time, and of these not more than ten may be nurses registered under the Nurses Registration Act, 1908.

10. (1.) For each State maternity hospital the Governor shall appoint one or more registered medical practitioners, who shall be required to attend all abnormal cases of labour, and cases which require the administration of an anaesthetic; to prescribe for and attend any cases needing medical or surgical treatment; and to deliver a course of lectures (not less than twelve in each term of six months) to the pupil nurses attending the hospital.

(2.) Such practitioners shall, when practicable, take pupil nurses out to cases of labour.

(3.) The appointment of such medical practitioners may be terminated at any time by notice under the hand of the Minister.

## CERTIFICATES.

11. No pupil nurse shall be entitled to a certificate under the said Act unless she has conducted not less than twenty cases of labour, and has also nursed twenty lying-in women during the ten days following labour.

## FEES.

12. The fees payable under the said Act shall be as follows :—

- (a.) In-door patients: At the rate of one pound a week for the time the patient is in the hospital before labour, and at the rate of one pound ten shillings a week from the time of confinement. (For free patients, see regulation 14.)
- (b.) Out-patients: One pound; such fee to cover delivery of the patient, and daily visits for the subsequent ten days.
- (c.) Pupil nurses: If registered under the Nurses Registration Act, 1908, ten pounds for six months' training; in all other cases, twenty pounds for twelve months' training.
- (d.) Midwives, on registration:
  - (i.) If trained outside New Zealand and registered under paragraph (a) of section 4 of the said Act, ten shillings in the case of persons registered under the Nurses Registration Act, 1908, and one pound in all other such cases.
  - (ii.) If registered under paragraph (b) of section 4 of the said Act, after training in New Zealand in any institution (other than a State maternity hospital), one pound.
  - (iii.) No fee for registration shall be payable by any person who has been trained as a pupil nurse in a State maternity hospital, and who has paid the fee prescribed by paragraph (c) hereof.

13. Pupil nurses undergoing a course of practical training in midwifery in any hospital or institution approved by the Registrar (other than a State maternity hospital) may, upon payment of a fee of £3 3s., attend the course of lectures delivered at a State maternity hospital. Notwithstanding anything in subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (d) of the last preceding regulation, no further fee shall be charged on the registration of a person to whom this regulation applies.

14. When on application for admission as a patient to a State maternity hospital it is alleged by any woman or by her husband that they are unable to pay the prescribed fees, the Matron shall forward a report of the circumstances of the case to the Minister, and on consideration of such report the Minister may either reduce such fees or remit them altogether, as he thinks fit.

## MALPRACTICES.

15. No midwife shall make use of any instrument to aid delivery, or administer chloroform or any other anæsthetic, except in the presence of and under direction of a medical practitioner.

16. Any midwife who makes use of an instrument to aid delivery, or who administers chloroform or any other anæsthetic, except as aforesaid, or who procures or attempts to procure abortion by any means (chemical or mechanical), shall be deemed guilty of a malpractice.

## DONATIONS.

17. Any society or person making a donation of £50 or giving an annual subscription of £10 to a State maternity hospital shall have the right annually to nominate a patient at such hospital free of charge.

## ANNUAL NOTICES TO BE GIVEN BY PRACTISING MIDWIVES.

18. The notice to commence the practice of midwifery or to continue such practice, required to be given by section 9 of the said Act, shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto.

19. (1.) If any registered midwife fails to give such notice for two years in succession, the Minister may order her name to be removed from the register.

(2.) Any midwife whose name has been removed from the register pursuant to the last preceding subclause may apply to the Registrar to have her name restored to the register, and on satisfying the Registrar that she is entitled to registration, her name shall be restored accordingly.

20. The last preceding regulation shall not apply to any midwife employed in the Government service so long as she continues in that service, or to any midwife attached to the staff of any public hospital and not engaged in midwifery work, or to the Matron or staff nurses of any maternity hospital training school, or to the licensee of any private hospital in which midwifery cases are not received.

*Commission to inquire into and report as to the Provision made for Landless Natives in the South Island and in the Waikato-Maniapoto Native Land Court District.*

To all to whom these presents shall come, and to MICHAEL GILFEDDER, Esquire, of Wellington, Judge of the Native Land Court, and HENRY DOUGLAS MORPETH HASZARD, Esquire, of Hokitika, Commissioner of Crown Lands: Greeting.

WHEREAS it is expedient that inquiry should be made with regard to the existing reserves for landless Natives in the South Island and in the Waikato-Maniapoto Native Land Court District, and as to the disposition thereof: Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby constitute and appoint you the said

MICHAEL GILFEDDER, and  
HENRY DOUGLAS MORPETH HASZARD

to be a Commission to inquire into and report upon the following matters:—

- (1.) What Crown lands not vested in the Public Trustee have been (a) set apart to make provision for landless Natives in the South Island prior to the passing of the South Island Landless Natives Act, 1906; or (b) permanently reserved by Proclamation for the purpose of providing land for the landless Natives of the South Island, under the provisions of the said South Island Landless Natives Act, 1906; or (c) since the repeal of that Act, set apart or reserved in the South Island for such purposes.
- (2.) Whether the lands so set apart or permanently reserved, or any and which of them, have been duly applied for the purposes for which they were so set apart or permanently reserved.
- (3.) Whether by any process or system of consolidation of reserves or interests or other means, or by exchange for other more suitable or conveniently situated lands, the purposes for which the lands set apart or permanently reserved can be better provided.
- (4.) Whether the purposes can be better provided by reserves for hapus or families rather than by the appropriation of separate areas to individual Natives.
- (5.) Whether the said purposes could be best provided by leasing the lands so set apart or permanently reserved, or any and which of them, on leases of long tenure, and by applying the rents and profits for the said purposes.
- (6.) Whether any and, if so, what lands not vested in the Public Trustee have been set apart or reserved in the Waikato-Maniapoto Native Land Court District for the benefit of landless Natives, and in what manner and by what means such lands may be best made applicable for the purposes for which they were so set apart or reserved.

(7.) Generally to inquire into and report upon the nature and conditions of the lands not vested in the Public Trustee, and set apart or permanently reserved for landless Natives in the South Island, and of the lands (if any) not vested in the Public Trustee set apart or reserved for landless Natives in the said Waikato-Maniapoto Native Land Court District, and the best methods for dealing with such lands so that the lands or the rents and profits thereof may be applied to the best advantage for the purposes for which they were reserved or set apart.

Provided that as the subject-matter of the inquiry hereby required to be made is the existing reserves and the disposition thereof, and not the persons entitled to the benefit thereof or the sufficiency of the reserves, it is hereby declared that all matters as to the non-inclusion of persons entitled or claiming to be entitled to the benefit of any such lands so reserved or set apart, and all requests or claims that additional lands should be reserved or set apart, are excluded from the scope of this inquiry.

And, with the like advice and consent, I do further appoint you the said

MICHAEL GILFEDDER

to be the Chairman of the said Commission.

EXTRACT FROM THE LONDON *Gazette* OF THE 24TH APRIL, 1914.

Downing Street, April 20th, 1914.

I, LEWIS HARCOURT, Secretary of State for the Colonies, do hereby certify, pursuant to section 25, subsection (2), of the Imperial Copyright Act, 1911, that the Dominion of New Zealand has passed legislation (that is to say, the New Zealand Copyright Act, 1913, and Orders in Council made thereunder and dated the 27th March, 1914) under which works, the authors whereof were at the date of the making of the works British subjects resident elsewhere than in the Dominion of New Zealand, or (not being British subjects) were resident in the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Imperial Act extends, enjoy within the Dominion of New Zealand rights substantially identical with those conferred by the said Imperial Act.

[NOTE.—Section 25, subsection (2), of the Imperial Copyright Act above referred to is as follows:—

(2.) If the Secretary of State certifies by notice published in the London *Gazette* that any self-governing dominion has passed legislation under which works, the authors whereof were at the date of the making of the works British subjects resident elsewhere than in the dominion or (not being British subjects) were resident in the parts of His Majesty's dominions to which this Act extends, enjoy within the dominion rights substantially identical with those conferred by this Act, then, whilst such legislation continues in force, the dominion shall, for the purposes of the rights conferred by this Act, be treated as if it were a dominion to which this Act extends and it shall be lawful for the Secretary of State to give such a certificate as aforesaid, notwithstanding that the remedies for enforcing the rights, or the restrictions on the importation of copies of works, manufactured in a foreign country, under the law of the dominion, differ from those under this Act.]

British Legation, Berne, March 30th, 1914.

MONSIEUR LE PRESIDENT,—With reference to Mr. Clive's note of June 14th, 1912, in which he had the honour to communicate to the Federal Government the Ratification of His Majesty the King to the International Copyright Convention signed at Berlin on November 13th, 1908, I have the honour to inform Your Excellency, in compliance with instructions from His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, that the Dominion of New Zealand now desire to accede to the Convention.

I have the honour at the same time to state that it is desired that the accession of the Dominion of New Zealand shall take effect from April 1st, 1914.

While notifying the above accession to Your Excellency I have received instructions to state that it is subject to the same reservation as that made by His Majesty's Government at the time of the deposit of the Ratification of His Britannic Majesty.

I avail myself of this opportunity, Monsieur le President, to renew to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.

[NOTE.—The following is a copy of the Berlin Copyright Convention above referred to.]

BERLIN CONVENTION.

CONVENTION for the purpose of revising the Convention of Berne of the 9th September, 1886, the Additional Article and the Final Protocol attached to the same Convention, and the Additional Act and the Interpretative Declaration of Paris of the 4th May, 1896; made on the 13th day of November, 1908, between His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Emperor of India; His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia; His Majesty the King of the Belgians; His Majesty the King of Denmark; His Majesty the King of Spain; the President of the French Republic; His Majesty the King of Italy; His Majesty the Emperor of Japan; the President of the Republic of Liberia; His Royal Highness the Grand Duke of Luxemburg, Duke of Nassau; His Serene Highness the Prince of Monaco; His Majesty the King of Norway; His Majesty the King of Sweden; the Federal Council of the Swiss Confederation; His Highness the Bey of Tunis.

[The following is an English translation of the Convention, with the omission of the formal beginning and end.]

Article 1.

The Contracting States are constituted into a Union for the protection of the rights of authors over their literary and artistic works.

Article 2.

The expression "literary and artistic works" shall include any production in the literary, scientific or artistic domain, whatever may be the mode or form of its reproduction, such as books, pamphlets, and other writings; dramatic or dramatico-musical works, choreographic works and entertainments in dumb show, the acting form of which is fixed in writing or otherwise; musical compositions with or without words; works of drawing, painting, architecture, sculpture, engraving and lithography; illustrations, geographical charts; plans, sketches, and plastic works relative to geography, topography, architecture or science.

Translations, adaptations, arrangements of music and other reproductions in an altered form of a literary or artistic work as well as collections of different works, shall be protected as original works without prejudice to the rights of the author of the original work.

The contracting countries shall be bound to make provision for the protection of the above-mentioned works.

Works of art applied to industrial purposes shall be protected so far as the domestic legislation of each country allows.

Article 3.

The present Convention shall apply to photographic works and to works produced by a process analogous to photography. The contracting countries shall be bound to make provision for their protection.

Article 4.

Authors who are subjects or citizens of any of the countries of the Union shall enjoy in countries other than the country of origin of the work, for their works, whether unpublished or first published in a country of the Union, the rights which the respective laws do now or may hereafter grant to natives as well as the rights specially granted by the present Convention.

The enjoyment and the exercise of these rights shall not be subject to the performance of any formality; such enjoyment and such exercise are independent of the existence of protection in the country of origin of the work. Consequently, apart from the express stipulations of the present Convention, the extent of protection, as well as the means of redress secured to safeguard his rights, shall be governed exclusively by the laws of the country where protection is claimed.

The country of origin of the work shall be considered to be: in the case of unpublished works, the country to which the author belongs; in the case of published works, the country of first publication; and in the case of works published simultaneously in several countries of the Union, the country the laws of which grant the shortest term of protection. In the case of works published simultaneously in a country outside the Union and in a country of the Union, the latter country shall be considered exclusively as the country of origin.

By published works must be understood, for the purposes of the present Convention, works copies of which have been issued to the public. The representation of a dramatic or dramatico-musical work, the performance of a musical work, the exhibition of a work of art, and the construction of a work of architecture shall not constitute a publication.

#### Article 5.

Authors being subjects or citizens of one of the countries of the Union who first publish their works in another country of the Union shall have in the latter country the same rights as native authors.

#### Article 6.

Authors not being subjects or citizens of one of the countries of the Union, who first publish their works in one of those countries, shall enjoy in that country the same rights as native authors, and in the other countries of the Union the rights granted by the present Convention.

#### Article 7.

The term of protection granted by the present Convention shall include the life of the author and fifty years after his death.

Nevertheless, in case such term of protection should not be uniformly adopted by all countries of the Union, the term shall be regulated by the law of the country where protection is claimed, and must not exceed the term fixed in the country of origin of the work. Consequently the contracting countries shall only be bound to apply the provisions of the preceding paragraph in so far as such provisions are consistent with their domestic laws.

For photographic works and works produced by a process analogous to photography, for posthumous works, for anonymous or pseudonymous works, the term of protection shall be regulated by the law of the country where protection is claimed, provided that the said term shall not exceed the term fixed in the country of origin of the work.

#### Article 8.

The authors of unpublished works, being subjects or citizens of one of the countries of the Union, and the authors of works first published in one of those countries shall enjoy, in the other countries of the Union, during the whole term of the right in the original work, the exclusive right of making or authorizing a translation of their works.

#### Article 9.

Serial stories, tales, and all other works, whether literary, scientific, or artistic, whatever their object, published in the newspapers or periodicals of one of the countries of the Union may not be reproduced in the other countries without the consent of the authors.

With the exception of serial stories and tales, any newspaper article may be reproduced by another newspaper unless the reproduction thereof is expressly forbidden. Nevertheless, the source must be indicated; the legal consequences of the breach of this obligation shall be determined by the laws of the country where protection is claimed.

The protection of the present Convention shall not apply to news of the day or to miscellaneous information which is simply of the nature of items of news.

#### Article 10.

As regards the liberty of extracting portions from literary or artistic works for use in publications destined for educational purposes, or having a scientific character, or for chrestomathies, the effect of the legislation of the countries of the Union and of special Arrangements existing or to be concluded between them is not affected by the present Convention.

#### Article 11.

The stipulations of the present Convention shall apply to the public representation of dramatic or dramatico-musical works, and to the public performance of musical works, whether such works be published or not.

Authors of dramatic or dramatico-musical works shall be protected during the existence of their right over the original work against the unauthorized public representation of translations of their works.

In order to enjoy the protection of the present Article, authors shall not be bound in publishing their works to forbid the public representation or performance thereof.

#### Article 12.

The following shall be specially included among the unlawful reproduction to which the present Convention applies: Unauthorized indirect appropriations of a literary or artistic work, such as adaptations, musical arrangements, transformations of a novel, tale, or piece of poetry into a dramatic piece and *vice versa*, &c., when they are only the reproduction of that work, in the same form or in another form without essential alterations, additions, or abridgments, and do not present the character of a new original work.

#### Article 13.

The authors of musical works shall have the exclusive right of authorizing (1) the adaptation of those works to instruments which can reproduce them mechanically; (2) the public performance of the said works by means of these instruments.

Reservations and conditions relating to the application of this Article may be determined by the domestic legislation of each country in so far as it is concerned; but the effect of any such reservations and conditions will be strictly limited to the country which has put them in force.

The provisions of paragraph 1 shall not be retroactive, and consequently shall not be applicable in any country of the Union to works which have been lawfully adapted in that country to mechanical instruments before the coming into force of the present Convention.

Adaptations made in virtue of paragraphs 2 and 3 of the present Article, and imported without the authority of the interested parties into a country where they would not be lawful, shall be liable to seizure in that country.

#### Article 14.

Authors of literary, scientific or artistic works shall have the exclusive right of authorizing the reproduction and public representation of their works by cinematography.

Cinematograph productions shall be protected as literary or artistic works, if, by arrangement of the acting form or the combinations of the incidents represented, the author has given the work a personal and original character.

Without prejudice to the rights of the author of the original work the reproduction by cinematography of a literary, scientific or artistic work shall be protected as an original work.

The above provisions apply to reproduction or production effected by any other process analogous to cinematography.

#### Article 15.

In order that the authors of works protected by the present Convention shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be considered as such, and be consequently admitted to institute proceedings against pirates before the Court of the various countries of the Union, it will be sufficient that their name be indicated on the work in the accustomed manner.

For anonymous or pseudonymous works the publisher, whose name is indicated on the work, shall be entitled to protect the rights belonging to the author. He shall be, without other proof, deemed to be the legal representative of the anonymous or pseudonymous author.

#### Article 16.

Pirated works may be seized by the competent authorities of any country of the Union where the original work enjoys legal protection.

In such a country the seizure may also apply to reproductions imported from a country where the work is not protected, or has ceased to be protected.

The seizure shall take place in accordance with the domestic legislation of each country.

#### Article 17.

The provisions of the present Convention cannot in any way derogate from the right belonging to the Government of each country of the Union to permit, to control, or to

prohibit, by measures of domestic legislation or police, the circulation, representation, or exhibition of any works or productions in regard to which the competent authority may find it necessary to exercise that right.

*Article 18.*

The present Convention shall apply to all works which at the moment of its coming into force have not yet fallen into the public domain in the country of origin through the expiration of the term of protection.

If, however, through the expiration of the term of protection which was previously granted, a work has fallen into the public domain of the country where protection is claimed, that work shall not be protected anew in that country.

The application of this principle shall take effect according to the stipulations contained in special Conventions existing, or to be concluded, to that effect between countries of the Union. In the absence of such stipulations, the respective countries shall regulate, each in so far as it is concerned, the manner in which the said principle is to be applied.

The above provisions shall apply equally in case of new accessions to the Union, and also in the event of the term of protection being extended by the application of Article 7.

*Article 19.*

The provisions of the present Convention shall not prevent a claim being made for the application of any wider provisions which may be made by the legislation of a country of the Union in favour of foreigners in general.

*Article 20.*

The Governments of the countries of the Union reserve to themselves the right to enter into special arrangements between each other, provided always that such arrangements confer upon authors more extended rights than those granted by the Union, or embody other stipulations not contrary to the present Convention. The provisions of existing arrangements which answer to the above-mentioned conditions shall remain applicable.

*Article 21.*

The International Office established under the name of the "Office of the International Union for the Protection of Literary and Artistic Works" shall be maintained.

That Office is placed under the high authority of the Government of the Swiss Confederation, which regulates its organization and supervises its working.

The official language of the Office shall be French.

*Article 22.*

The International Office collects every kind of information relative to the protection of the rights of authors over their literary and artistic works. It arranges and publishes such information. It undertakes the study of questions of general interest concerning the Union, and by the aid of documents placed at its disposal by the different Administrations, edits a periodical publication in the French language on the questions which concern the objects of the Union. The Governments of the countries of the Union reserve to themselves the power to authorize by common accord the publication by the Office of an edition in one or more other languages, if experience should show this to be requisite.

The International Office will always hold itself at the disposal of members of the Union with the view to furnish them with any special information which they may require relative to the protection of literary and artistic works.

The Director of the International Office shall make an annual Report on his Administration, which shall be communicated to all the members of the Union.

*Article 23.*

The expenses of the Office of the International Union shall be shared by the contracting States. Until a fresh arrangement be made they cannot exceed the sum of 60,000 francs a year. This sum may be increased, if necessary, by the simple decision of one of the Conferences provided for in Article 24.

The share of the total expense to be paid by each country shall be determined by the division of the contracting and acceding countries into six classes, each of which shall contribute in the proportion of a certain number of units, viz. :-

1st class	..	..	..	..	25 units.

These coefficients are multiplied by the number of countries of each class, and the total product thus obtained

gives the number of units by which the total expenses is to be divided. The quotient gives the amount of the unit of expense.

Each country shall declare, at the time of its accession, in which of the said classes it desires to be placed.

The Swiss Administration prepares the Budget of the Office, superintends its expenditure, makes the necessary advances, and draws up the annual account which shall be communicated to all the other Administrations.

*Article 24.*

The present Convention may be submitted to revisions in order to introduce therein amendments calculated to perfect the system of the Union.

Questions of this kind, as well as those which are of interest to the Union in other respects, shall be considered in Conferences to be held successively in the countries of the Union by delegates of the said countries. The Administration of the country where a Conference is to meet prepares, with the assistance of the International Office, the programme of the Conference. The Director of the Office shall attend at the sittings of the Conferences, and shall take part in the discussions without the right to vote.

No alteration in the present Convention shall be binding on the Union except by the unanimous consent of the countries composing it.

*Article 25.*

States outside the Union which make provision for the legal protection of the rights forming the object of the present Convention may accede thereto on request to that effect.

Such accession shall be notified in writing to the Government of the Swiss Confederation, who will communicate it to all the other countries of the Union.

Such accession shall imply full adhesion to all the clauses and admission to all the advantages provided by the present Convention. It may, nevertheless, contain an indication of the provisions of the Convention of the 9th September, 1886, or of the Additional Act of the 4th May, 1896, which they may judge necessary to substitute, provisionally at least, for the corresponding provisions of the present Convention.

*Article 26.*

Contracting countries shall have the right to accede to the present Convention at any time for their Colonies or foreign possessions.

They may do this either by a general Declaration comprising in the accession all their Colonies or possessions, or by specially naming those comprised therein, or by simply indicating those which are excluded.

Such Declaration shall be notified in writing to the Government of the Swiss Confederation, who will communicate it to all the other countries of the Union.

*Article 27.*

The present Convention shall replace, in regard to the relations between the Contracting States, the Convention of Berne of the 9th September, 1886, including the Additional Article and the Final Protocol of the same date, as well as the Additional Act and the Interpretative Declaration of the 4th May, 1896. These instruments shall remain in force in regard to relations with States which do not ratify the present Convention.

The Signatory States of the present Convention may declare at the exchange of ratifications that they desire to remain bound, as regards any specific point, by the provisions of the Conventions which they have previously signed.

*Article 28.*

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications exchanged at Berlin not later than the 1st July, 1910.

Each Contracting Party shall, as regards the exchange of ratifications, deliver a single instrument, which shall be deposited with those of the other countries in the archives of the Government of the Swiss Confederation. Each party shall receive in return a copy of the *procès-verbal* of the exchange of ratifications signed by the Plenipotentiaries who took part.

*Article 29.*

The present Convention shall be put in force three months after the exchange of ratifications, and shall remain in force for an indefinite period until the termination of a year from the day on which it may have been denounced.

Such denunciation shall be made to the Government of the Swiss Confederation. It shall only take effect in regard to the country making it, the Convention remaining in full force and effect for the other countries of the Union.

Article 30.

The States which shall introduce in their legislation the duration of protection for fifty years contemplated by Article 7, first paragraph, of the present Convention, shall give notice thereof in writing to the Government of the Swiss Confederation, who will communicate it at once to all the other States of the Union.

The same procedure shall be followed in the case of the States renouncing the reservations made by them in virtue of Articles 25, 26, and 27.

- (1.) A cyclone affecting the region north-west of Madagascar or the Mosambique Channel: The signal, coming from the Tananarive Observatory, will be made at every even hour, between 6 hours and 24 hours (inclusive), by the stations at Mayotta and Mojanga alternately.

Storm-signals established.

A system of storm-signals, to indicate the localities threatened by a cyclone, is established at the following ports: Tamatave, Andovoranto, Vatomantri, Mahanoro, Mananzari, Farafangana, Fort Dauphin, Tulléar, Ambohibé, Morondava, Maintirano, Namela, Mojanga, Analalava, Nosi Bé, Diego Suarez, Vohemar, Maroantsetra, and St. Mary.

## SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
