A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a scenic reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

April, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting under the authority conferred on him by section thirty-three of the Copyright Act, 1913 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), has extended the said Act, *inter alia*,—

- (a.) To works first published in Italy, in like manner as if they had been first published within New Zealand;
- (b.) To literary, dramatic, musical, and artistic works the authors whereof were at the time of the making of the works subjects or citizens of Italy, in like manner as if the authors had been British subjects;
- (c.) In respect of residence in Italy, in like manner as if such residence had been residence in New Zealand,—subject to the provisions set out in the said Order:

And whereas it is, *inter alia*, provided in the first proviso to clause (2) of the said Order that paragraph (d) of subsection two of section three and section twenty-five of the said Act, and such other provisions thereof as confer upon the owner of the copyright in a literary, dramatic, or musical work the exclusive right of making any record, perforated roll, cinematograph film, or other contrivance by means of which the work may be mechanically performed, and such other part or parts thereof as confer copyright in any record or perforated roll, shall not apply in the case of any work of which the country of origin is Italy:

And whereas it is desired to vary the said Order in Council in manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section twenty-nine of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby vary the said Order in Council in the manner hereinafter set forth, and doth hereby declare that—

- (1.) The provisions of the first proviso to clause (2) of the said Order are hereby revoked so far as they relate to works of which the country of origin is Italy.
- (2.) In the application of the provisions of clause (3) of the said Order to works of which the country of origin is Italy, the reference to the commencement of the said Act shall be deemed to be a reference to the commencement of this Order.
- (3.) In the application to works of which the country of origin is Italy of paragraph (d) of subsection two of section three and section twenty-five of the said Act, the references to the commencement of the said Act in subsections seven and eight of the said section twenty-five shall be deemed to be references to the commencement of this Order.
- (4.) Where any person has, before the date of this Order, taken any action whereby he has incurred any expenditure or liability in connection with the reproduction or performance of any work at a time when such reproduction or performance would, but for the making of this Order, have been lawful, nothing in this Order shall diminish or prejudice any rights or interest arising from or in connection with such action which are subsisting or valuable at the said date, unless the person who by virtue of this Order becomes entitled to restrain such reproduction or performance agrees to pay such compensation as, failing agreement, may be determined in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.
- (5.) This Order shall come into operation on the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, which date is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

Special Order made by the Eden Terrace Road Board making By-laws.

THE following special order, made by the Eden Terrace Road Board, is published in accordance with the provisions of the Road Boards Act, 1908.

EDEN TERRACE ROAD BOARD.
Sanitary By-laws No. 6.

BY-LAWS of the Eden Terrace Road Board made in pursuance of the powers and provisions contained in the Road Boards Act, 1908, and the Public Health Act, 1908, and in pursuance of all and every other power in that behalf contained enabling the said Board in that behalf.

The Eden Terrace Road Board doth hereby by special order ordain as follows:—

1. These by-laws shall be read with and as extending and amending the "Sanitary and other By-laws" of the Eden Terrace Road Board made on the 8th day of April, 1908; and the words used herein and defined in the said by-laws shall have the same meaning and be interpreted in the same way as the same words when used in the said by-laws.

2. No person shall hereafter in any manner erect or establish a water-closet without having first obtained a permit so to do from the Clerk of the Eden Terrace Road Board. Such permit will be issued upon application to the Clerk at the office of the Board during office hours.

3. No person, unless duly registered under the Plumbers Registration Act as a plumber, shall execute any plumbing-work in connection with any sanitary convenience or appliance erected, altered, repaired, taken down, or removed.

4. Before erecting or fitting up any water-closet or laying on any water-service to a closet or connecting any water-closet to a drain, the person so engaged shall give forty-eight hours' previous notice in writing, to the Clerk at the office of the Board, of his intention before proceeding to carry out the work.

5. It shall be the duty of any person engaging a plumber or drain-connector to carry out any work or sanitary plumbing on his property, or in the district, to insist that the person so engaged has first obtained a permit from the Clerk before proceeding with any such work.

6. No person shall do any plumbing-work to any sanitary fitting or appliance on any property within the district unless he shall have engaged to conform to and comply with these by-laws.

7. The registered plumbers employed on any work in the district shall carry their licenses with them, and shall produce them when required to do so by the person for whom the work is being performed, or by the Inspector, or any member or official of the Board.

8. Any person making use of a license which does not belong to him, or allowing his license to be used by any other person, shall be guilty of an offence; and, in addition, the offence shall be reported to the Plumbers' Board to be dealt with.

9. Every licensed plumber shall give forty-eight hours' notice in writing to the Clerk that the work in connection with the fitting-up of a water-closet, fixing vents, or any sanitary appliance is ready for inspection, and no licensed plumber or any other person shall cover up, enclose, or connect such work or any part thereof until it shall have been inspected and approved of.

10. Where the closet basin is enclosed, such enclosure shall be so constructed as to be easily removable, and the basin shall be so placed that every joint in connection therewith can be easily inspected.

11. It shall not be lawful for any person other than a licensed plumber to execute any works hereinafter specified, viz.:—

- (a.) To affix or repair any cistern in connection with a water-closet.
- (b.) To connect any cistern to or disconnect any cistern from any water-closet.
- (c.) To affix or repair, or remove any ventilation-pipe in connection with a water-closet, or to do any work relating to the ventilation of traps in connection with any water-closet.
- (d.) To connect a water-closet with or disconnect a water-closet from the soil-pipe thereof.
- (e.) The performance of any work in connection with the trapping of water-closets.
- (f.) The affixing, repairing, or removing of lead and other safes under water-closets or other sanitary conveniences.

12. The licensed drain-layer shall lay the private drain to the point where the connection is to be made to the soil-pipe of a water-closet. This connection shall be made by the licensed plumber. The licensed drain-layer shall put in the junction and lay all stoneware pipes required for the ventilation-shaft, and the licensed plumber shall make the connection.

13. It shall be the duty of every owner or occupier of any house or premises within 100 ft. of a sewer to provide a water-closet, or a sufficient number of water-closets, when the Board by notice in writing requires the owner and occupier thereof so to do; and no person shall construct, alter, or repair any water-closet unless all works in connection therewith be done in accordance with the following specifications and conditions:—

- (a.) Every detached building used for the purposes of a water-closet shall be either a new building or shall be in a perfectly clean and sound condition, and must, if wood floored, be raised so as to allow 6 in. of air-space between the ground and such floor, and the studs from the floor to eaves-level must be at least 7 ft. 6 in. high.

(b.) Every water-closet erected in a building shall be constructed in such a position that at least one of its sides shall be an external wall, and such external wall shall be provided with a window having an area, exclusive of frame, of not less than 2 square feet opening directly on to the open air.

In the case of a fully detached water-closet, or one attached to an outhouse, light and ventilation shall be provided for as above, or by shortening the door at the top so as to leave an opening of 2 square feet.

(c.) No water-closet shall be connected with any water-service directly, but shall be provided with a separate cistern of approved material and construction containing and delivering at each flush at least three gallons, fitted with an efficient ball cock; and such closet shall be connected with an efficient and properly constructed earthenware-pipe drain approved by the Inspector, leading as direct as possible to the Board's sewer. There shall also be provided a high-pressure stop-cock to regulate the flow of water into every such cistern. The service pipe from the cistern to the closet basin or pan shall be not less than $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. internal diameter, and shall be made of 6 lb. lead, or of galvanized screwed iron, or screwed galvanized-steel pipe. The bottom of the supply cistern shall be placed at least 5 ft. above the closet seat, unless otherwise specified. The cistern must be provided with an overflow-pipe of stout lead or screwed iron pipe not less than $\frac{1}{2}$ in. internal diameter, discharging into the open air, at least 1 in. from side of building.

(d.) The soil-pipe of every water-closet shall be not less than $3\frac{1}{2}$ in. internal diameter, made of 6 lb. lead or cast iron; it shall be fixed on the outside of the building, be properly supported, and must have airtight joints. The soil-pipe shall be in all cases without traps, and shall be extended from the highest branch closet connection to a point at least 3 ft. above the eaves, with an internal diameter for such extension equal to that of the soil-pipe, and this extension shall be formed of 6 lb. drawn lead, cast iron, screwed wrought iron, or galvanized iron jointed to the cast iron with sleeve joint protruding at least $\frac{1}{2}$ in. above cast-iron collar of soil-pipe, and made with at least two rings of spun-iron and molten lead poured in gently and battered home evenly all round with caulken tool and hammer, taking care not to leave any hollow in the top of the joint for water to lodge in. It shall then be properly supported and carried in a suitable manner free from avoidable angles or bends, being finished with a wire basket or other approved cowl, and terminating not less than 6 ft. from any chimney or other opening, and not less than 3 ft. from any other ventilator, and not less than 20 ft. from any window in an adjoining building which may be above the level of such outlet.

(e.) Where lead pipe is used for water or vent pipes such pipes must not be lighter than 6 lb. lead, but where in the opinion of the Inspector a heavier weight may be required the instructions of the Inspector shall be complied with. Lead pipes must be seamless.

(f.) The basin or pan of every water-closet shall be made of glazed stoneware of a pattern approved of by the Board, and so formed as to be thoroughly cleansed at each flush. It shall be properly trapped with a glazed stoneware trap. Such trap shall be ventilated by an airtight pipe of not less than 2 in. in diameter made of 6 lb. lead or galvanized screwed iron piping, for such length as is within the building, and external thereto of similar material or of 24-gauge galvanized iron. This ventilation-pipe shall be carried either up to a point of 2 ft. above the eaves, or connected to the extension of the soil-pipe at a point not less than 3 ft. above the highest closet connection. Where two or more closets connect with the same soil-pipe the ventilation-pipe from their traps shall be connected to a single ventilation-pipe of 3 in. diameter for one or two closets, and of 4 in. diameter for three or more. The joint between the vent horn of the closet-pan and the ventilation-pipe shall be made in accordance with the model to be seen at the office of the Road Board.

(g.) When a closet is constructed in a detached building, the trap ventilation-pipe shall terminate above the closet ridge, but not within a distance of 6 ft. from the boundary of any adjoining land, buildings, public or private streets, or public place.

(h.) No person shall erect or put up any closet inside a building, except in the case of a closet fully detached, or one attached to an outhouse, or a closet with open seat, unless he shall provide the same with a safe, or where any person shall provide a safe under any closet. He shall also provide and fix an overflow-pipe of lead not less than $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. diameter discharging into the open air through the nearest external wall.

14. No person after 1st July, 1915, shall use or permit or allow to remain on his premises, after having been served with a notice from the Clerk or Inspector, any closet for the reception of nightsoil other than a water-closet.

15. Any and all works connected in any way with the sanitary drainage of any premises in the district shall be executed in a thoroughly workmanlike manner, and all such work shall be inspected by the Inspector, and every facility shall be offered for such inspection.

16. All work done and materials used by licensed plumbers must strictly accord with the specifications set out.

17. In every case in which there shall be on any premises a water-closet which does not comply with the provisions of these by-laws, the Clerk may serve a written notice upon the owner of such premises, or the occupier thereof, or upon both the owner and occupier as he the Clerk may think fit, calling upon the person or persons so served either to cause such water-closet to conform in every way with the provisions of these by-laws, or to have connected therewith all the appliances required by these by-laws, within one calendar month from the time of such notice.

(a.) If the building is erected, the said notice shall be complied with within one calendar month from service thereof. But if the building is in course of erection, then within such reasonable time as shall be stated in that behalf in such notice.

(b.) Within the time within which any water-closet is required to be provided and affixed, the owner of the premises shall cause to be removed from the said premises every privy or earth or other such closet being thereon.

18. The owner or occupier of any premises on which any water-closet is situated shall keep such water-closet, building, or appurtenances in a good state of repair, and in a thoroughly clean and sanitary condition to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Nuisances.

19. If any person fails or refuses to do anything required by this by-law to be done, observed, or performed, or in any manner obstructs, impedes, or interferes with the doing of anything enjoined or required to be done, or does anything prohibited by these by-laws, every such person in any case so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

20. If, in the opinion of the Board, a full compliance with these by-laws, or any provision thereof, would needlessly or injuriously affect or be attended with great loss and inconvenience to any person, without a corresponding benefit to the community, the Board may, on special application, relax the strict observance of any provision or modify the same, provided that such other terms as they may impose be complied with by the applicant.

SCHEDULE.

SPECIFICATION FOR PLUMBERS.

Cast-iron Pipes.—Cast-iron pipes for soil and ventilation to be not less than five-sixteenths of an inch thick, and to be

large enough in the socket to allow of three-sixteenths of an inch caulking all round.

Lead Pipes and Traps.—Lead soil-pipes, wastes, traps, vents, bends, and other fittings to be drawn (not seamed), approved by the Inspector, and to be formed of lead weighing not less than 6 lb. per superficial foot.

Joints.—Joints in cast-iron pipes to be made with not less than two rings of spun yarn, and then soft lead run in and caulked. Joints between lead and cast iron to be made in a similar manner, but to have a brass ferrule wiped on to end of lead first. All lead to lead or to screwed-iron joints in any portion of main building to be wiped-soldered. When a closet is bedded on a wooden floor the bedding should be made with genuine red and white lead putty; joints for cast-iron pipes of three-sixteenths of an inch thickness shall be made of lead as above, or of such other material as the Inspector shall approve. The joint between the soil-pipe and the closet basin shall be of cement compo and shall be perfectly airtight.

Galvanized Iron.—Galvanized iron for vents, wastes, and cisterns to be not less than 24-gauge B.W.G. Galvanized-iron piping shall be made with double-lopped, grooved, and soldered longitudinal joints, and the transverse joints shall not be less than 2 in. in length slipped-socketed, and to be made up as per samples in the Road Board Office.

AWAKINO COUNTY COUNCIL.

Special Order redividing the County into Ridings.

NOTICE is hereby given that at a special meeting of the Awakino County Council held on Saturday, the 9th day of May, 1914, the following resolution was passed, and was confirmed at a subsequent meeting of the Council held on Saturday, the 6th day of June, 1914:—

In exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 23 of the Counties Act, 1908, the Awakino County Council resolves, by way of special order, as follows,—

1. The present division of the County of Awakino into three ridings is revoked, and in lieu thereof the said county shall be divided into six ridings, to be called respectively Awakino Riding, Mahoenui Riding, Waikawau Riding, Puketiti Riding, Mangaohae Riding, Marakopa Riding, which said ridings are respectively described in the Schedule hereto.

2. The said Awakino County Council shall consist of six members, who shall be elected as follows: The electors of the Awakino Riding, the Mahoenui Riding, the Waikawau Riding, the Puketiti Riding, the Mangaohae Riding, and the Marakopa Riding shall each elect one Councillor.

The alteration hereby made shall come into full force and effect at the next county election in November, 1914, except in so far and to such extent as may be necessary for preparing any rolls or otherwise providing for such election.

SCHEDULE.

Awakino Riding.

Comprising that portion of the Awakino County lying south of a line commencing at the north-west corner of Section 5, Block V, Awakino North; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of the said section to the north-east corner thereof; thence to the north-west corner of Section 1, Block VI, Awakino North; thence along the northern boundary of Sections 1 and 3, Block VI, Awakino North, and Section 1, Block IX, Awakino North, to the north-east corner of the last-named section; thence to the north-west corner of Mahoenui No. 6, thence by the northern boundary thereof to the north-east corner of the said section, thence following the east boundary of the same section and of Mangaawakino No. 1A to the eastern corner of this section, thence along the northern boundary of Mangapapa B No. 2 to the county boundary.

Mahoenui Riding.

westerly direction to the western corner thereof, thence follow the boundary of the Awakino Riding to the south-west corner of Section 4, Block V, Awakino East; thence in a northerly direction to the north-east corner of Section 3, Block IV, Awakino North; thence to the south-west corner of Section 1, Block II, Awakino North; thence to the north-west corner of Section 2, Block I, Awakino East; thence to the north-east corner of the said section, to the south-west corner of Section 1, Block I, Awakino East; thence following the northern boundaries of Sections 5 and 1, Block V, Awakino East, and Mahoenui No. 1B Section 1, Mahoenui No. 1B, to the northern corner of Mahoenui No. 2B; thence to the eastern corner of the said section, thence along the northern boundary of Crown land to the county boundary, thence following the county boundary in a southerly direction to the starting-point.

Puketiti Riding.

All that part of the county enclosed in a line commencing at the north-east corner of Section 4, Block X, Maungamangero; thence to the north-west corner of the same section, to the northern corner of Section 7, Block IX, Maungamangero, to the northern corner of Section 8, Block IX, Maungamangero; thence to the western corner of the same section; thence to the northern corner of Section 12, Block IX, Maungamangero; thence following the western boundaries of the same section and of Section 2, Block XIII, Maungamangero, and of the forest reserve, Block I, Awakino East, till it meets the northern boundary of the Mahoenui Riding; thence following this boundary in an easterly direction to the county boundary, thence following the county boundary in a northerly direction to the starting-point.

Waikawau Riding.

That portion of the county enclosed in a line commencing at the north-west corner of Kinohaku West H No. 2B No. 2c; thence in a straight line to the north-east corner of the same section, to the south-east corner thereof, to the north-east corner of Kinohaku West H No. 2B No. 2B, to the south-east corner of the same section, to the north-east corner of Kinohaku West G No. 1A No. 2, to the south-east corner of the same section; thence to the north-east corner of Kinohaku West G Section 1c No. 2B; thence to the northern corner of Section 2, Block VIII, Whareorino; thence following the northern boundaries of Sections 2, 2A, 3, 4A, 6, 7, Block VIII, Whareorino, and of Section 11, Block IX, Maungamangero, to the north-east corner of this section; thence following in a southerly direction the western boundary of the Puketiti Riding and of the Mahoenui Riding as far as the south-east corner of Section 3, Block IV, Awakino North; thence following in a westerly direction the northern boundary of the Awakino Riding to the coast, thence following the coast to the starting-point.

Mangaohae Riding.

All that part of the county enclosed in a line commencing at the north-west corner of Section 7, Block X, Kawhia South; from thence to the eastern corner of Kinohaku West No. 4; from thence to the western corner of Section 1, Block XIV, Kawhia South, to the eastern corner of Section 1, Block XIII, Kawhia South, to the south-west corner of Section 2, Block XIV, and thence to the north-west corner of Section 7, Block I, Maungamangero; following the western boundaries of Sections 7 and 8 and 1, Block I, Maungamangero, to the south-east corner of Section 6, Block I, Maungamangero; and following in a westerly direction the boundary of the forest reserve, Block V, Maungamangero, to the south-west corner thereof; thence following the western boundaries of Section 2, Block V, Maungamangero, and Section 4, Block VIII, Whareorino, till it meets the boundary of the Waikawau Riding; thence following this boundary till it meets the boundary of the Puketiti Riding; thence following this boundary in an easterly direction to the boundary of the county, and following the county boundary in a northerly direction to the starting-point.

Marakopa Riding.

That part of the county bounded on the eastern side by the Mangaohae Riding as before described, and on the southern side by the Waikawau Riding as before described.

WHANGAREI COUNTY COUNCIL.

Special Order altering Riding Boundaries and fixing Representation therein.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Counties Act, 1908, the Whangarei County Council hereby resolves by way of special order as follows:—

1. That the number of ridings within the County of Whangarei and the representation of the same remain as at present.

2. That the boundaries of the Ridings of Waipu and Manaia of the County of Whangarei remain as at present.

3. That the boundaries of the Otonga, Hikurangi, Kiripaka, Wairua, Maunu, and Mangapai Ridings be altered, and be as shown on the map of the County of Whangarei prepared for the purpose, and marked A, deposited at the office of the County Council at Whangarei.

4. That the dividing-line between the Ridings of Kiripaka and Otonga (that is, between the Road District of Marua and the Road District and the Outlying District of Otonga) be as follows: Commencing at a point at the southern boundary corner of Section 9, Block XVI, Hukerenui Survey District; thence north-east along the south-eastern boundary-line of the said Section 9 to road by Trig. B; thence north along the said road bounding the east of Section 9 to the north-western corner of Section 3; thence east along the northern boundary-line of Section 3 to its junction with road; thence by a short line to the south-western boundary corner of Section 13; thence east along the block-line to the south-western boundary corner of Section 28, Block VII, Opuawhanga Survey District; thence north along the boundary-line of Section 28 to the north-western corner; thence north-east by a straight line through the Opuawhanga K.G.R. to the north-western boundary corner of Section 27; thence easterly along the northern boundary-line of Section 27 to its meeting with the western boundary-line of Section 34; thence north and east along the boundary-line of Section 34 to intersection with block-line; thence north by the said block-line to its intersection with road; thence north along the said road-line to the south-eastern boundary corner of Section 12, Block VII, Opuawhanga Survey District; thence easterly along road-line to its meeting with the reaches of the Whananaki Inlet at the north-eastern boundary corner of Section 12, Block VIII, Opuawhanga Survey District.

5. That the dividing-line between the Otonga Road District, the Marua Road District, and Hikurangi Outlying District be as follows: Commencing at a point on the southern boundary corner of Section 9, Block XVI, Hukerenui Survey District; thence north along the boundary-line of Section 9 to the eastern boundary corner of Section S.E. 38; thence south-west along the boundary-line of Section S.E. 38 to intersection with main road at the northern corner of Section N.E. 36; thence northerly along the main road by the western boundary-lines of Sections S.E. 38, N.W. 38, S.E. 37, M. 37, N.W. 37, and South 32; thence by the same main road through Sections M. part 32, 16, and 2 to where the said main road meets with the Whakapara Stream at the north-west of Section 2; thence north-west by the present boundary-line between the Otonga and Hikurangi Ridings to the county boundary.

6. One-fifth on the committee reporting favourably of the discovery;

One-fifth on delivery of the first 200 tons to purchasers;

The remaining three-fifths by equal payments on delivery of each additional 150 tons to purchasers.

- (3.) Frequency of periodicity (if alternating).
- (4.) Manner in which the electricity is generated—i.e., whether by water-power, oil-engine, &c.
- (5.) In cases where the applicant is not a local authority, or if a local authority desires to operate beyond its own boundaries, the consent of the local authority concerned must be obtained and forwarded with the application.
- (6.) In cases where the applicant is a private individual, the full name, occupation, and address must be supplied.

NOTE.—In order to standardize the conditions as far as possible throughout the Dominion, it is suggested that when convenient the three-phase four-wire system be adopted for distribution at a frequency of 50 cycles per second, and a voltage of 230 between each phase and a neutral for lighting purposes and small motors, and 400 volts between phases for supply to large motors.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1914.

The atmospheric disturbances prevailing during the month were more remarkable for their frequency than for their intensity. On the 8th a cyclone passed in the south, and from then on until the 16th a low barometer ruled in the southern districts, culminating in boisterous conditions on the 16th and 17th. On the 21st, and again between the 27th and 29th, a depression passed in the northern districts, causing dull and wet conditions, especially along the eastern coast. Heavy rain fell at isolated stations in conjunction with electrical disturbances between the 24th and 27th, and also in the mountainous country between Canterbury and Westland during the first half of the month. Usually, however, frequent showers formed the striking feature of the month, but fair and mild weather was also prevalent. With the exception of the extreme north and south of the North Island, nearly the whole of New Zealand had more than the average rainfall.
