Districts constituted under the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908.

[L.S.] LIVERPOOL, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration district known as the Wellington District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two registration districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

WELLINGTON NORTH DISTRICT.

All that area in the Wellington Land District bounded towards the north generally by Original Section No. 8 in Block III, Port Nicholson Survey District, from its westernmost corner to the Kaiwarra Stream; thence by that stream to its mouth; thence towards the south-east generally by Port Nicholson to the Thorndon Esplanade, and by the northeastern side of the said esplanade to a point in line with the northern side of Davis Street; thence to and by the northeastern side of Davis Street to Hobson Street, and by the northeastern side of that street to a point in line with the western side of Moturoa Street; thence across Hobson Street and by the northern side of Moturoa Street to Pipitea Street, and by the northern side of Mulgrave Street to a point in line with the western side of Mulgrave Street; thence to and by the northern side of Sydney Street; thence to and by the northern side of Sydney Street; thence to and by the northern side of Sydney Street; thence to and by the northern side of Tinakori Road; thence by the southeastern side of Tinakori Road and the main road to Karori to the Kaiwarra Stream; thence towards the west generally by that stream to Section VIII in Block VI, Port Nicholson Survey District; thence by the Otari Native Reserve to the westernmost corner of Section No. 8, the place of commencement.

WELLINGTON DISTRICT.

All that area in the Wellington Land District, bounded towards the north by a line running due east from the coast through the highest point of the road crossing the Paikakariki Hill to where it intersects the western boundary of Section No. 391, Akatarawa Survey District; thence towards the east generally by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 24A, Block X, Paikakariki Survey District;

thence by Section No. 28 of said block and by a road bounding the said Section No. 28 and Sections Nos. 33 and 32, passing through Sections Nos. 6, 4, 3, 11, and bounding Sections Nos. 16 and 19, all of the said Block X, and Sections Nos. 2, 6, 10, 7, 15, and 16, Block IV, Belmont Survey District, passing through Sections Nos. 59, 57, 436, 433, 345, 342, 341, 337, 334, and 332, all of Block III, the said survey district, by Sections Nos. 328, 331, 330, 329, 322, 321, 422, 423, and 22, by a road bounding the said Section No. 22 and Sections Nos. 21, 20, 16, 15, 14, 12, 11, and 9, Block VIII, Section No. 7, Block XIII, and Section No. 5, Block XIII, thence by the said Section No. 5 and by Section No. 19 of the said Block XII, Belmont Survey District, and a line across the road to Port Nicholson; thence by Port Nicholson to the mouth of the Kaiwarra Stream, and by that stream to Section No. 1 in Block VI, Port Nicholson Survey District; thence by Sections Nos. I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, and VIII, and again by the Kaiwarra Stream to the main Karori Road; thence by the southern side of that road and Tinakori Road to Sydney Street; thence by the northern side of Sydney Street and its production to Mulgrave Street, by the western side of Mulgrave Street to and across Pipitea Street; thence by the northern side of Pipitea Street and Moturoa Street to and across Hobson Street, by the northern side of Hobson Street and Davis Street and the northern side of Hobson Street and Davis Street and the northern side of the latter street produced to the eastern side of Thorndon Esplanade, and by the esplanade to Port Nicholson; thence by Port Nicholson and the ocean; and towards the south, west, and north-west by the ocean to the place of commencement, including Mana Island.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

Authorizing the Feilding Borough Council to erect Electric Lines within the Borough of Feilding and Portions of the Counties of Oroua, Manawatu, and Kairanga.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act:

in Council under that Act:

And whereas the Feilding Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") desires to erect electric lines in the Borough of Feilding and within three miles of the borough boundary in the Counties of Oroua, Manawatu, and Kairanga (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply"), and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the Council to erect and maintain, for lighting, heating, and power purposes within the said area of supply, the electric lines indicated by blue lines on the plan marked P.W.D. 34465, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District, and such further lines as may from time to time be required within the said area of supply.

SCHEDULE.

In the following conditions—
 "Consumer's wires" means any electric lines on the consumer's premises which are connected with the Council's electric lines.
 "Council" means the Feilding Borough Council.
 "Distribution line or lines" means the portion of any line from which service wires are connected for the numbers of supplying consumers.

purpose of supplying consumers.
"Earthed" applied to any conductor means that such conductor shall be so connected to the general mass of earth as to ensure at all times an immediate and

or earth as to ensure at all times an immediate and safe discharge to earth of electric energy.

"Electric line" means any wire, wires, conductor, or other means used for conveying, transmitting, or distributing electricity for power, lighting, or heating purposes, and includes any instrument, insulator, casing, tubing, pipe, covering, or post enclosing or supporting an electric line or anything connected therewith. therewith.

"Electric telegraph line" means any wire, wires, or cables belonging to the Post and Telegraph Depart-ment, or erected under authority granted by the Minister of Telegraphs.
"High pressure" means pressures from 600 up to 3,300 volts.

volts.

"Inspecting Engineer" means the engineer or other officer appointed by the Minister of Public Works for the purpose of inspecting the works to be constructed or maintained under this license.

"Low pressure" means pressures up to 600 volts.

"Minister" means the Minister of Public Works.

"Pressure" means difference of electric potential between any two conductors through which supply of energy is given, or between any part of either con-

energy is given, or between any part of either conductor and the earth.
"Street" includes road.
"Telegraph" includes telephone.

SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

2. Single-phase alternating current shall be used in the transmission of electrical energy between the generating-station and the distributing pole transformers, and in its dis-tribution within the area of supply. Current shall be generated at the power-station at a fre-quency of 50 cycles per second, and at a pressure not exceed-

ing 2,500 volts.

This shall be transformed down by pole transformers to 230 volts for low-tension distribution.

The supply to private consumers shall be at a pressure of

In addition to the above system of private supply, street lighting may be supplied on a constant-current series system at a voltage not exceeding 2,500 volts.

REGULATION OF PRESSURE.

3. The pressure shall be maintained within 4 per cent. on lighting-distributing circuits above or below the declared pressure at the consumers' terminals. The Council shall pressure at the consumers' terminals. The Council shall supply a suitable recording voltmeter for this service, and on complaint by any consumer that the variations in voltage exceed these limits, or on the instructions of the Inspecting Engineer, the Council shall connect a recording voltmeter to record the pressure between the lines at their entrance to the consumers' premises, and shall supply to the Inspecting Engineer a chart showing the variations in voltage between the lines at this point for a period of seven consecutive days. the imes at this point for a period of seven consecutive days. If the variations thus recorded exceed the above limits, the Council shall take immediate steps to comply with this regulation. If after thirty days a similar chart shows that the above limits of variation in voltage are not complied with, a breach of these regulations shall be deemed to have been committed. If the accuracy of the Council's recording voltmeter is questioned by the consumer, a standard instrument shall be sumplied by the Inspecting Engineer the reading of shall be supplied by the Inspecting Engineer, the reading of which shall be accepted as final.

SWITCHBOARDS.

4. All switchboards shall be made of and mounted on material that is not inflammable, and no switchboard conductor shall carry electric current at a density exceeding 1,000 amperes per square inch. No conductor at a pressure above 600 volts shall be exposed on the front of any switchboard, and the back of any switchboard carrying exposed conductors at a pressure over 600 volts shall be screened off

and accessible only to authorized persons.

All power-house and substation switchboards shall be provided with two efficient and independent earth connections connected in parallel, to one of which all frames, instrument cases, and other metal parts shall be connected. Means shall be provided for testing the resistance between these two connections through the earth. Such tests shall be made at least once a month and recorded.

CIRCUIT-BREAKERS.

5. All outgoing feeders and distributors shall be provided with automatic circuit-breakers or fuses set to open at 50 per cent. excess current over the rated full load of such feeder or distributor, with a time-limit not exceeding ten seconds.

OVERHEAD ELECTRIC LINES.

6. The diameter of any conductor in any electric line laid or erected for the supply of electrical energy shall not be less than $0\cdot104$ in. diameter (No. 12 S.W.G. or 7/20 S.W.G.). If the material of the conductor is aluminium the conductor shall be stranded.

The stress in overhead conductors shall not exceed 25,000 lb. per square inch for copper, 12,000 lb. per square inch for aluminium, 34,000 lb. per square inch for steel, and 22,500 lb. per square inch for iron in the extreme case of a temperature of 32° Fahr. and a wind-pressure of 18 lb. per square foot

of diametrical plane occurring simultaneously. The span between supports and the sag shall be determined to conform

with the above limiting stresses.

Where an aerial line crosses a street the angle between the line and the direction of the street at the place of crossing shall not be less than 60 degrees, and the span shall be as short as possible.

as short as possible.

Where an aerial line crosses or is in proximity to any metallic substance, precautions shall be taken by the Council against the possibility of the line coming into contact with the metallic substance by breakage or otherwise.

No overhead low-pressure electric lines shall come within 2 ft. of any aerial wires or cables belonging to another authority, except where it may be permitted to pass either set of wires between other wires at a pole or support.

Electric lines at low pressure shall be insulated throughout with triple braiding impregnated with waterproof compound;

provided that, where circumstances permit, the lines may,

with the consent of the Minister, be bare.

Electric lines at high pressure shall be covered with vulcanized rubber of at least 600-megohms grade, provided that where circumstances permit the lines may, with the consent of the Minister, be bare.

An aerial line shall not be permitted to remain erected after it has ceased to be used for the supply of energy, unless the Council intends within a reasonable time again to take

SUPPORTS FOR OVERHEAD ELECTRIC LINES.

7. All overhead electric lines at low pressure shall be carried at a minimum height of 18 ft. above the ground.

All overhead lines at high pressure shall be carried at a minimum height of 19 ft. above the ground.

An aerial wire shall not in any part thereof come within 5 ft., measured horizontally or vertically, from any part of any building or erection other than a support for the line, except where brought into a building for the purpose of

supply.

All aerial wires shall be attached to suitable insulators carried on cross-arms of suitable material and cross-section, and they shall be so attached to the insulators or guarded that they cannot fall from the support. Conductors covered with insulating material shall be so attached that their insulation shall not be impaired where they are secured to the insulator.

Every support for an aerial line shall be of durable material, and properly strengthened against forces due to wind-pressure, change of direction of line, and unequal length of span. change of direction of line, and unequal length of span. The factor of safety of such supports outside borough limits shall be such that the moment resulting from a wind-pressure of 30 lb. per square foot of plane surface and 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane upon a cylindrical surface upon the lines and supports shall not exceed one-half of the applied moment which is sufficient to cripple the support if of iron, steel, or ferro-concrete, and shall not exceed one-fourth of the breaking-stress in the case of wood. The factor of safety of supports within horough limits shall be four in the case of of supports within borough limits shall be four in the case of steel, iron, or ferro-concrete, and five in the case of wood, calculated upon the ultimate strength of material under the same conditions of wind-pressure as hereinbefore mentioned.

The distance between supports within borough limits shall not exceed 150 ft., except by approval of the Minister.

LOCATION OF OVERHEAD LINES.

8. Except by permission of the Minister of Telegraphs, or subject to an agreement between the Post and Telegraph Department and the Council, all overhead electric lines shall be placed on the opposite side of the road or street to that on which any telegraph lines exist; and where the erection of the electric lines necessitates the alteration of any telegraph lines, and such alteration is approved by the Minister of Telegraphs, the cost of the alteration shall be borne by the Council.

In running the lines authorized by this license through or along any road where no telegraph line exists the Council shall keep to one side of the road, and in running wires to the opposite side of the road the Council shall arrange so as to interfere as little as possible with the route of any future telegraph lines.

RAILWAY CROSSINGS.

9. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government railways until the Council has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto, as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).

POST AND TELEGRAPH WIRE-CROSSINGS.

10. At telegraph crossings the electric lines shall pass over or under the telegraph wires or cables as may be decided by

the Minister of Telegraphs, and shall be at least 2ft, distant. Where it is impracticable to cross above or below, the electric lines may be taken through; but when permitted to be taken through, the crossing shall be made at a pole in manner to be

through, the crossing shall be made at a pole in manner to be approved by the Minister of Telegraphs.

Where the electric lines intersect telegraph lines, the latter shall be suitably insulated if deemed necessary; and when the crossing is above and near a pole the spans on each side of the pole may be insulated. This insulation shall be effected at the expense of the Council in cases where the telegraph lines existed previously to the erection of the electric lines.

Where high-pressure electric lines intersect telegraph lines the former shall be insulated with not less than 600-megohms grade of vulcanized rubber, and the low-pressure wires with weather-proofed insulation as prescribed in clause 6.

Where deemed necessary efficient guard-wires, effectively

Where deemed necessary efficient guard-wires, effectively earthed, shall be erected in a manner to meet with the approval of the Minister of Telegraphs at all crossings or places

where electric lines intersect telegraph lines, or at any place where such protection may be considered necessary.

The Council shall bear the expense of such guard-wires in all cases where an electric line intersects any telegraph line

previously existing.

Earth wires where led down poles shall be encased for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground

ELECTRIC LINES ON TELEGRAPH POLES.

11. Where electric lines are permitted to be supported on telegraph poles all details of the supports and of the insulation shall be approved by the Minister of Telegraphs, who may, on giving to the Council reasonable notice in that behalf, require the Council to remove such electric lines at any time from such telegraph poles, and without payment of any compensation to the Council.

SERVICE CONNECTIONS FACILITIES.

12. Where electric lines are on one side of the road and electric telegraph lines on the other, and service is required to be given from either to the other side of the road, the Council and the Minister of Telegraphs shall give to each other reasonable facilities as far as possible to effect supply.

SERVICE CONNECTIONS FROM AERIAL LINES.

13. Service lines shall be taken direct from line-insulators to insulators supported and firmly attached to some portion of the consumer's premises which is not accessible to any person without the use of a ladder or other special appliance. Every portion of any service line which is outside a building and is within 7 ft. of any part of the building shall be rubber insulated.

MAINTENANCE.

14. Every aerial line, including its supports, its conductors, and their insulating covering, and all structural parts and electrical appliances and devices belonging to or connected with the line, shall be duly and efficiently maintained by the Council as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions.

TRANSFORMERS.

15. Where high-pressure transformers are attached to poles 15. Where high-pressure transformers are attached to poles they shall be placed so as to be inaccessible except by the use of a ladder or other special appliance. Where high-pressure transformers are placed in sub-stations, all high-tension conductors shall be thoroughly insulated or protected from accidental contact; and the sub-station shall be entirely inaccessible to unauthorized persons. Where high-pressure transformers are placed on consumers' premises, the whole of the apparatus shall be enclosed or rendered inaccessible except to authorized persons. The cases of all transformers shall be earthed by means of a copper conductor at least shall be earthed by means of a copper conductor at least 0.022 square inch in section.

LIGHTNING-ARRESTERS.

16. Where any portion of any electric line or support for an electric line is exposed to such a position as to be liable to injury from lightning, it shall be efficiently protected against such liability.

UNDERGROUND CONDUCTORS.

17. Underground conductors shall be thoroughly insulated, 17. Underground conductors shall be thoroughly insulated, and shall be protected from mechanical damage by steel armouring or by wooden boxing or earthenware, stoneware, concrete, iron, or fibre conduits or pipes. They shall be laid wherever possible under the footpaths and with a cover of at least 12 in. from the surface of the pavement. Where laid under any other part of the road such cover shall be increased to 2 ft.

All conduits pipes against and street boxes used.

All conduits, pipes, casings, and street boxes used as receptacles for electric lines shall be constructed of durable material, and they shall be of ample strength to prevent

damage from heavy traffic, and reasonable means shall be taken to prevent the accumulation of gas in such receptacles.

Where any underground line crosses or is in proximity to any metallic substance, special precaution shall be taken against the possibility of any electrical charging of the metallic substance from the line or from any metallic conduit pipe or casing enclosing the line.

EARTHING CONDUITS.

18. All metallic conduits, pipes, or casings containing an electric line shall be efficiently earthed, and shall be so jointed and connected across all street boxes and other openings as to make good electrical contact throughout their whole length.

STREET BOXES.

19. The covers of street cable-boxes shall be so secured that they cannot be opened except by means of a special appliance. Street boxes shall be either filled solid with cable compound or oil, or if not so filled shall be inspected from time to time for the presence of gas, and suitable action shall be taken to check its influx and accumulation.

Insulation of Electric Mains.

20. Every main, either overhead or underground, shall be tested for insulation after having been placed in position and before it is used for the purposes of supply, the testing pressures being at least 500 volts; and the Council shall duly record the results of the tests of each main or section of a

record the results of the tests of each main or section of a main, and forthwith forward a report thereon to the District Engineer of the Public Works Department at Wellington.

The insulation of every complete circuit used for the supply of energy, including all machinery, apparatus, and devices forming part of or in connection with such circuit, shall be so maintained that the leakage current shall not under any conditions exceed one - thousandth part of the maximum supply current. Every leakage shall be remedied without delay. Every such circuit shall be tested for insulation at least once in every month, and the Council shall duly record the results of the tests.

SERVICE CONNECTIONS.

21. The Council shall be responsible for all electric lines or wires, fittings, and apparatus belonging to it or under its control, which may be upon a consumer's premises, being maintained in a safe condition and in all respects fit for

supplying energy.

In delivering the energy to a consumer's terminals the Council shall exercise all due precautions so as to avoid risk

of causing fire on the premises

A suitable safety-fuse or other automatic circuit-breaker shall be inserted in each service line within a consumer's premises as close as possible to the point of entry, and contained within a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fireproof construction.

All electric wires and apparatus on a consumer's premises, except such parts as require to be earthed, shall be highly insulated and suitable for the voltage at which the supply is They shall be thoroughly protected against injury to the insulation or access of moisture. All electric wires shall be so fixed and protected as to prevent the possibility of electrical discharge to any adjacent metallic substance.

SUPPLY TO CONSUMERS.

22. The owner or occupier of any premises within the area of supply included in the license shall be entitled to a supply of electrical energy on the following conditions:

(a.) If such premises are situated within 60 ft. of the boundary of any street in which an electric distribution-line belonging to the Council exists, the service shall be made free of cost.

of cost.

(b.) If such premises are more than 60 ft. distant from such street boundary, the Council shall run the necessary service mains for a distance of 60 ft. free of charge, and the consumer shall pay the cost of the service wires for the balance of the distance.

(c.) If the plant or mains of the Council are insufficient to supply the applicant with electrical energy the service may, with the consent of the Minister, be postponed for a period not exceeding twelve months. Otherwise service shall be made within twenty-eight days of the application.

(d.) Every consumer within any part of the area included in the license shall be entitled to a supply of electrical energy on the same terms on which any other consumer in such part of the area is entitled under similar circumstances to a corresponding supply, provided that a surety or deposit may be demanded, but such security shall not exceed the cost of connection.

(e.) If the nature of the proposed consumption of energy by any applicant is such as is likely to seriously interfere

with the maintenance of a constant pressure on the lines in accordance with clause 3, the Council may, with the approval of the Minister, require the consumer to install such appa-ratus as shell enable the conditions of clause 3 to be complied

(f.) The Council may require services to be wired or installed by competent tradesmen, but no preference shall be given to services wired or installed by any individual con-

tractor or firm of contractors.

(g.) If payment by the consumer is delayed more than thirty days after the date of rendering a correct account. the supply of electricity to such premises may be cut off without notice, and need not be restored until all arrears are paid. The cost of reconnection may also be included.

INSTALLATION ON CONSUMER'S PREMISES.

23. The Council shall not connect the wires and fittings on a consumer's premises with its mains, or in the case of premises already connected continue the supply from its mains, unless it is reasonably satisfied that the requirements of this license are compiled with, that the wring and fittings are reliable for the rest with a small right of the continue of the rest of the continue of the cont are suitable for the voltage at which supply is given, that the installation is generally in accordance with the requirements of good practice, and that the connection or continuance of supply would not cause a leakage from those wires exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises.

For the purposes of satisfying itself that the requirements of this license are being observed, in so far as they apply to wires on a consumer's premises, the Council may require that notice must be served upon it of the intention to install wires, fittings, lamps, motors, or other apparatus on any such premises, and may inspect and test the same during any reasonable hours while the installation of such is in progress.

TESTING CONSUMER'S INSTALLATION.

24. If the Council is reasonably satisfied, after making all 24. If the Council is reasonably satisfied, after making all proper examination on the completion of the installation, by testing or otherwise, that the wiring and fittings are not suitable for the voltage being employed, or that a leakage exists at some part of a circuit of such extent as to be a source of danger, and that such leakage does not exist at any part of the circuit belonging to the Council, or that any other requirements of this license are not being complied with requirements of this license are not being complied with, then and in such case any officer of the Council, duly authorized by it in writing, may, for the purpose of discovering whether the leakage exists at any part of a circuit, within or upon any consumer's premises, or whether the wiring is suitable and the general requirements of the license are complied with, by notice require the consumer, at some reasonable time after the service of a notice, to permit him to inspect and test the wires and fittings belonging to the con-sumer forming part of the circuit.

If on such testing and inspection the officer discovers a

leakage from the consumer's wires exceeding one ten-thouleakage from the consumer's wires exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises, or that the requirements of this license are not properly conformed to, or if the consumer does not give all due facilities for inspecting and testing, the Council shall either not commence the supply or shall forthwith discontinue the supply of energy to the premises in question, giving immediate notice to the consumer of its reasons for not commencing or for discontinuing the supply, and in either case supply shall not be given until the Council is reasonably satisfied that the installation is in conformity with the requirements of this license.

license.

If any consumer is dissatisfied with the action of the Council in refusing to give, or in discontinuing, or in not recommending the supply of energy to his premises, the wires and fittings of that consumer may, on his application to the Minister and on payment of the cost, be inspected and tested by the Inspecting Engineer. This provision shall be endorsed on every notice given under the provisions of either of the two preceding paragraphs.

NOTICE OF COMPLETION.

25. The Council shall, prior to the completion of the said works, or any separate portion thereof, give to the Minister at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

CONTINUITY OF SUPPLY.

26. From and after the time when the Council commences to supply energy in pursuance of this license, it shall maintain continuously, during the period of the day for which it has agreed with any consumer to supply energy, sufficient power for the use of all such consumers for the time being entitled to be supplied; provided also that, for any purposes connected with the efficient working of the undertaking, the

Minister may give permission to the Council to discontinue the supply at such intervals of time and for such periods as he, the Minister, may think expedient. When the supply is so discontinued public notice shall be given, when practi-cable, of such discontinuance and of the probable duration thereof.

NOTICE OF EXTENSIONS, ETC.

27. Before proceeding to erect any electric lines herein authorized, or the extension of any line already erected, the Council shall give at least one calendar month's notice in writing to the District Engineer of the Public Works
Department at Wellington, and to the Telegraph Engineer of
the Post and Telegraph Department at Wellington, or his
deputy, of its intention so to do. Such notice shall be
accompanied by a plan showing the location of the proposed
electric lines or extension.

COMMENCEMENT OF SUPPLY.

28. The Council shall not use the said electric lines, or any portion thereof, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given to it notice in writing that he has received from the Inspecting Engineer a certificate that the works hereby authorized, or the portion as aforesaid, have been satisfactorily carried out.

Inspection of Works.

29. The Minister may at any time order an inspection to be made of the works, lines, and wires of the Council used for electric lighting and power purposes. If any defect is found to exist it must be remedied forthwith, and if such defect is, in the opinion of the Inspecting Engineer, serious the Minister may, on receipt of the report, direct the Council to at once cease transmitting energy either over the whole of the Council's lines and wires or over any specified part thereof until such defect is repaired or remedied. The cost of such inspection shall be borne by the Council.

COMPLIANCE WITH CONDITIONS.

30. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the Gouncil, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the same.

ASSIGNMENT.

31. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, 31. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the Council without the express consent in writing of the Governor in Council first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially able and suitable to carry out the works expected in this license. specified in this license.

DEFAULT AND PENALTY.

32. If the Council fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the Council within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice; but it shall not be held to have committed default for any failure to maintain power continuously if such failure is due to the breakdown of machinery or other accident, unless such breakdown or accident is proved or other accident, unless such breakdown or accident is proved to be due to negligence on the part of the Council; and if the Council fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period it shall be liable to a penalty of £20, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown. The recovery of a penalty under this license shall not affect the liability (if any) of the Council to pay or make compensation in respect of any damage or injury which may be caused by reason of the default.

REVOCATION OF LICENSE.

33. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the Council fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

PUBLIC WORKS COMPENSATION, ETC.

34. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed in any way 34. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, or the Minister, or any other person under any Act of the General Assembly authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works. Nor shall His Majesty, or the Governor, or the Minister, or any other person be liable to pay to the Council any compensation for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

By-Laws.

35. By-laws for controlling consumers' installations may be made by the Council, but such by-laws shall not be enforceable unless approved by the Minister.

ELECTRIC LINES OUTSIDE BOROUGH.

36. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Council shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric line within the Counties of Oroua, Manawatu, and Kairanga except subject to such conditions not inconsistent with the provisions of this license as may from time to time be agreed on between the Council and the Councils of the aforesaid counties respectively.

COMMENCEMENT OF LICENSE.

37. This license shall come into force on and after the date of publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

Amendment of Regulations under the Education Act, 1908. regarding the Examination and Classification of Teachers.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto the regulations in force relating to the examination and classification of teachers; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS FOR TEACHERS' CERTIFICATES.

THE regulations for the examination and classification of teachers are hereby amended as follows:-

I. As to clause 22 thereof, by adding to the schedule of the subjects included in Group IV (optional subjects), Division I, the following subject: "22, Elementary Geology." And by renumbering the remaining subjects of the group included in Division II and Division III in consecutive order accordingly.

II. As to clause 23 thereof, by deleting the proviso thereto and

substituting therefor the following:

Provided that no candidate shall be permitted to obtain credit for either Group II or Group III whose marks in any subject of the group fall more than five per cent. below the pass minimum required for an individual subject of the examination, or more than ten per cent. below the minimum percentage required for the group, whichever shall be the lower.

III. As to clauses 24 to 27 inclusive thereof, by deleting these

clauses and substituting therefor the following:—
24. Candidates may take the examination as an undivided whole or in three sections, of which the first section shall include any two of the four groups of subjects as set out in clause 22, the second section shall include either of the two other groups of subjects, and the third section shall include the remaining group Any candidate may take the first and second sections together, or the second and third sections together.

25. A candidate shall be held to have passed the first section when he has at one and the same time satisfied the requirements

of both groups of subjects included in such section.

A partial pass in the first section may be gained by a candidate who at one and the same time satisfies the requirements of one group of subjects, and fails to satisfy the requirements of the other group by reason of his weakness in one subject only; and such candidate may complete his pass for the first section at any time by passing in the subject in which he failed.

No candidate shall be given credit for any part of the examination until he has passed the first section or has gained a partial

pass therein.

A candidate who has gained a partial pass in the first section may obtain credit for a pass in the second section if he satisfies

all the requirements of the group constituting such section.

When a candidate has passed the first section (but in no other case) he may obtain credit for a partial pass in the second section if he fails to satisfy the requirements of the group forming such section by reason of weakness in one subject only; and such candidate may complete his pass for the second section at any time by passing in the subject in which he failed,

A candidate who has passed either the first or second section and has gained at least a partial pass in the other of these two sections may receive credit for a pass in the third section if he satisfies all the requirements of the group constituting that section, or may receive credit for a partial pass in the third section if he fails in one subject only of that section, in which case he may complete the section at any time by passing in that subject.

26. A candidate will be regarded as having obtained a partial pass for Class D if at any time he has fulfilled the requirements of the examination for Class D, except in respect of not more than two of the subjects prescribed; provided that any such subjects shall not include either English or Mathematics I. When a candidate has obtained a partial pass for Class D he may at any time complete the examination by taking the deficient subjects and obtaining credit for them either together or separately.

27. Except as otherwise prescribed by these regulations in connexion with records of partial success, no recognition may at any time be given in the examination to less than a complete group of subjects; provided that, in the case of a subject or subjects the examination for which is taken at a different time from the ordinary examination, or is held under special conditions not applicable to the general examination, any such subject may, at the discretion of the Inspector-General of Schools, be at any time credited to a candidate towards the requirements of the examination. In general, the unit of the examination shall be the group, not the individual subjects of the group.

IV. As to clause 29 thereof, by inserting, after the words "passes the Matriculation Examination of the University of New Zealand," the words "or is recorded as having obtained a partial pass in such examination."

V. As to clause 33 thereof, by deleting the clause and substituting therefor the following:-

33. With every application to be examined for or towards Class D the following entrance fees shall be payable by the candidate in the manner specified in clause 18 of the regulations:-

(a.) For the whole of the Class D examination taken at one time, or for the first section of Class D, or for the first and second sections taken together: A fee of £1.

(b.) For every other entry permitted by the regulations, not being an entry in a single subject as required for the completion of a section or towards the completion of the

examination: A fee of 10s.

(c.) For every entry in a single subject as permitted by the regulations: A fee of 5s.

VI. As to clause 35 thereof, by deleting the words "for the First Section of," and substituting the words "and the clauses following for.'

VII. As to clause 36 thereof, by inserting the word "or" at the end of paragraph (b), and adding the following paragraph:-

(c.) In any four subjects, if the candidate already holds a certificate of Class D, or if he has already passed the Class D examination or an examination equivalent thereto in one of the subjects of experimental science named in Group IV, Division I, of the Class D schedule.

VIII. As to clause 38 thereof, by deleting the clause and substituting therefor the following:-

38. A candidate entering for Class C, and either wholly or partially successful in Part I of the examination only, may be credited with corresponding success towards the examination for Class D as if he had originally entered for the Class D examination.

IX. As to clause 39 thereof, by deleting the words "who have obtained the First Section of Class D," and substituting therefor the following: "who have passed for the first and second sections of Class D."

X. As to clause 41 thereof, by deleting all the words after the words "Board of Education, London," and substituting therefor the following: "of an equivalent or higher standard, or the certificate of the City and Guilds of London Institute, for that subject or for a subject of cognate character that in the judgment of the Inspector-General of Schools is for the purpose of the examination equivalent thereto; provided that in cases where in the corresponding subject a certificate of practical work is prescribed by the regulations the candidate may be required in addition to furnish similar evidence."

- XI. As to clause 48 thereof, by deleting the clause and substituting therefor the following:—
- 48. (1.) Part I of the examination for Class C shall be taken by candidates on the same conditions as those applicable to the corresponding groups of the Class D schedule, and the same entrance fees for this part of the examination shall be payable, that is to say,—

(a.) For the whole of Part I taken at any one time, or for the first section thereof comprising any two groups of subjects: A fee of £1.

(b.) For every other entry permitted by the regulations, not being an entry in a single subject as required to complete a section or to complete the part: A fee of 10s.

(c.) For every entry in a single subject as permitted by the regulations: A fee of 5s.

- (2.) For subjects of Parts II and III of the Class C examination an entrance fee of £1 is payable for any section of two or more subjects taken at the same examination, or of 10s. for entry in a single subject. (For a first entry two subjects are essential, see clause 37.)
- (3.) For the whole examination for Class C, Parts I, II, and III, taken at any one time, or for any combination in the same examination of Part I with Parts II and III, or with either of these parts, the entrance fee payable is £1 10s., unless for the same subjects or parts taken separately a less sum would be payable.
 - XII. By inserting, after clause 48, a new clause as follows:—

 SPECIAL CERTIFICATES IN DRAWING: EXAMINATION IN DRAWING

 ONLY.

48a. To candidates for teachers' certificates and others who have satisfied with merit the requirements of these regulations in Drawing—namely, I. Freehand Drawing, II. Drawing with Instruments, and III. Blackboard Drawing—in accordance with such conditions as may be approved by the Minister of Education, special certificates in Drawing may on application be awarded.

For such certificates no fee shall be payable, but candidates who for the purpose of such certificates or for any purpose apart from the general conditions of the examination for the classification of teachers desire to take the examination in Drawing Only shall be admitted to the examination only on payment of an entrance fee of 5s. for each branch of Drawing so taken, or of 10s. for the three branches taken together; provided that by probationers and pupil teachers in the service of Education Boards who desire to be so examined no fee shall be payable; and the conditions of admission to the examination for teachers' certificates are hereby modified accordingly.

XIII. As to clause 51 thereof, by inserting, after the words "Class D (or Class C) examination," the following words: "and who pass with merit in at least one of the two branches of Elementary Handwork as so defined." And by substituting the words "in Elementary Handwork" for the word "therein" in the same sentence.

XIV. By inserting, after clause 52 thereof, a new clause as follows:--

ELEMENTARY KINDERGARTEN CERTIFICATES.

52A. On such terms as the Minister of Education may from time to time determine, certificates in elementary Kindergarten work may be granted to properly trained persons who comply with the conditions and satisfy the requirements of the special examination in such work. No such certificate shall be granted to any person who has not already served for a period of two years in a junior Kindergarten school and received sufficient instruction during that period in Kindergarten principles and practice, or who has not already attained a standard of attainment of general education not lower than that of the Intermediate Examination of the Education Department. Such special certificates in elementary Kindergarten work shall not be deemed to be certificates of competency for teachers within the meaning of section 172, subsec-

tion (1), of the Education Act, 1908, but may be reckoned towards the qualifications for a license to teach as prescribed by regulations.

Note.—Exemption from Drawing I or Drawing II of the Teachers' Certificate Examination may also be obtained by any person who passes with credit in the corresponding subject or branch at the Public Service Entrance or Intermediate Examination annually held in November. For the Intermediate Examination candidates may in a similar way be accepted for Drawing Only, the fee payable for those who are not probationers or pupil teachers in the service of an Education Board (for whom the examination is free) being a sum of 2s. 6d. for each of the two branches above noted. At the November examination there will be no Blackboard Drawing.

Note. — The syllabus of the examination for Elementary Kindergarten Certificates and the conditions of qualification may be obtained on application to the Inspector-General of Schools, Education Department, Wellington.

XV. By inserting, after clause 58, a new clause as follows:—58A. No duplicate certificate of a teacher's classification shall be issued to any person unless the certificate already held by him shall have been surrendered, or unless conclusive evidence to the satisfaction of the Inspector-General of Schools shall have been given that the certificate has been destroyed or irretrievably lost. For any such duplicate certificate issued a fee of 5s. shall be payable. For a duplicate of any special certificate issued under these regulations which has been mutilated and surrendered or lost, a fee of 2s. 6d. shall be payable.

XVI. As to clause 59 thereof, by inserting a new program in Elementary Geology as follows:—.

(21A.) Elementary Geology.—The composition, form, size, and heat of the earth. Divisions of rocks; igneous, sedimentary, metamorphic. Rock-structure; laminations. stratification, false bedding, cleavage, foliation, joints, columnar jointing. General characters and compositions of the following groups of minerals, with special reference to their New Zealand localities—quartz, opal, and chalcedony; feldspars; micas; hornblendes and augites; carbonates of lime and magnesia; oxides and sulphides of iron. The general characters of the following types of rocks, and a knowledge of their occurrence in New Zealand—granite; diorite; gabbro; rhyolite; site; basalt; volcanic glasses, pumice, and volcanic dust; conglomerates, sands, and sandstone; clays, shales, and slates; limestones and coals; rock-salt and gypsum; gneiss and schists. Texture of igneous and sedimentary rocks. Agents producing changes in the earth's surface; volcanoes; earthquakes. Disturbed strata; dip, strike, outcrop, contorted and overthrown strata, anticlinal and synclinal axes, faults, slickenslides, dykes. Denuding agents and their work-rain, running water above and below ground, the sea, frost and frozen water, wind, animal and vegetable agencies. Deposition of sediment. Landscape; plains, valleys, formation of escarpments, lateral and transverse streams, lakes, destruction of valleys, mountains, effects of joints and faults, dry valleys. Economic Geologywater, artesian wells, mineral and hot springs; coal and oil; building-stone, roofing-slate, sands, lime, and cement; clay; road-metal, flagstone; ornamental stone; grindstones; fuller's earth; salt, phosphate, soils, metals, lodes, and veins. Recognition of New Zealand rocks and minerals named above, from specimens or descriptions.

A candidate will be expected to show a first-hand acquaintance with the matters herein contained, and to this end will be required to forward before the date of the examination a certificate in the prescribed form that he has carried out satisfactorily a course of practical work, including work in the field, based on the above syllabus.

XVII. As to clause 60 thereof, by deleting the word "fair" in the paragraph numbered (16) relating to English Language and Literature, and inserting in lieu thereof the word "competent."

XVIII. Further, as to clause 60 thereof, by deleting the paragraph numbered (21) containing the program in Physiography, and substituting therefor the following:

- (21.) Physiography.—(a.) The earth as a globe; size, shape, and general structure; internal heat; motions of rotation and revolution; the earth as a member of the solar system; phases of the moon; eclipses; solar spectra; measurement of time; inclination of the earth's axis and its effects; meridians and parallels; latitude and longitude; the construction of maps; projections (equidistant, conical, and mercator's only); rhumb-line and great-circle sailing; terrestrial magnetism.
 - (b.) The Atmosphere: Composition; colours of the sky; winds; planetary circulation; distribution of atmospheric pressure; isobars; effects of seasonable changes of temperature; isothermals; shifting of equatorial calm-belt; trade-winds, monsoons, &c.; cyclones and anti-cyclones; clouds and cloud forms; the rainbow; dewpoint; rainfall; rainy and dry belts; climate; causes affecting climate; relation of vegetation to climate; results of irregular distribution of land and water; meteorological instruments; principles of
 - weather-predicting; interpretation of weather charts.
 (c.) The Ocean: Form of ocean basins; composition, temperature, and pressure of ocean water; ocean depths; methods of ascertaining ocean depths and conducting deep-sea observations; deposits on the ocean floor; waves, currents, and tides; influence of the ocean on climate; control over distribution of organic forms.
 - (d.) The Land: Weathering; work of rain; denudation; general features of land surface; slow changes in progress; slow movements of the earth's crust; earthquakes, seismographs; initial drainage; consequent drainage; divides; subsequent drainage. features; influence of geological structure; stratified and unstratified rocks; weak and resistant rocks; folds and faults; stream profiles; the geographical cycle, its various stages; base-level and peneplain; interruptions of cycle by crustal movements; succession of cycles; composite topography; characteristics of river valleys; flood plains; terraces; alluvial fans; deltas; glaciers; glacial erosion; forms of glaciated valleys; cirques; moraines; evidence of former glaciation; the work of wind; loess deposits; volcanic action; forms assumed by accumulation of volcanic material modified by erosion; thermal action; marine erosion; shore lines; initial forms and modified shore lines; plains of marine erosion; types of coasts depending on structure; origin of various types of mountains, valleys, plateaux, plains, lakes, and islands; the outlines of the continents; methods of representing topographic features on maps and diagrams.

A candidate in Physiography will be required to forward to the Department, before the examination, a certificate on the prescribed form that he has gone through a sufficient course of practical work in the subject as defined above occupying at least eighty hours. Generally speaking, not less than one-third of this total

must be spent in the field.

For the examination of January, 1915, candidates may at their discretion take in this subject the program hereby superseded, and the paper or papers set shall be arranged accordingly.

And whereas the Wanganui Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect electric lines from a point on Taupo Quay situated 26 chains from the power-house to the premises of the New Zealand Express Company in Nixon Place, a distance of 10 chains, all in the Borough of Wanganui (hereinafter referred to as "the said electric lines"), and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in

with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain for lighting and power purposes the said electric lines, as indicated by a red line on the plan marked P.W.D. 35671, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District.

1. The power supplied shall not exceed 9 kilowatts.

2. The supply shall be given by means of rubber-insulated copper conductors of 600-megohm grade, of 7/16 S.W.G. section, and suspended on efficient insulators at a minimum height of 18 ft. from the ground.

3. The positive line shall be provided at the point where it connects with the tramway bus bars with a switch and fuse or circuit-breaker adjusted to open the circuit at an overload of 50 per cent., and with a time limit not exceeding ten seconds. ing ten seconds.

4. The negative line shall be bonded direct to the tram-

way-rails, without switch or other means of opening the circuit.

5. A suitable safety fuse or other automatic circuit-breaker shall be inserted on the consumer's premises as close as possible to the point of entry and contained within a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fire-proof construction.

6. All electric wires placed on the consumer's premises shall be insulated with rubber of 600-megohm grade, and shall be thoroughly protected against injury to the insulation or access of moisture.

7. At telegraph crossings the conductors shall pass over or under telegraph or telephone wires as may be decided by the Minister of Telegraphs. At places where it may be deemed necessary by the Minister of Telegraphs as a protection to telegraph or telephone wires generally, approved guardwires, effectively earthed, shall be erected by or at the cost of the licenses. Such guard wires shall be considered on wh of the licensee. Such guard-wires shall be carried on sub-stantial supports at a height of 2ft. above the conductors if the telegraph or telephone wires pass over the conductors, or 2ft. above the telegraph or telephone wires if the latter pass under the conductors.

8. Earth-wires where led down poles shall be protected by a casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground. A test shall be made every three months, and oftener if required, of will earths to ensure that the earth-wire is intact and that the earth is effective.

9. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of August, 1914, and shall be completed on or before the 1st

August, 1914, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of October, 1914.

10. The licensee shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

11. The licensee shall not use the said electric lines, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the licensee that he has received from the Engineer appointed by him to inspect the works a certificate that they have been satisfactorily carried out.

12. The said electric lines, including their supports, their conductors, and their insulated covering, shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained by the licensee as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions, and shall not be permitted by the licensee to remain erected after

regards both electrical and mechanical conditions, and shall not be permitted by the licensee to remain erected after they have ceased to be used for the supply of electricity.

13. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the licensee without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this licensee.

tions specified in this license.

14. If the licensee fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the licensee within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice; and if the licensee fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period it shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.

15. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the licensee fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this

license without further notice.

16. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the licensee, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the said works and inspect the same.

N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section two hundred and thirtytwo of the Native Land Act, 1909, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations with respect to the management and control of any Native reservation set apart under the aforesaid section, and as to the use thereof by the owners.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. In these regulations, unless a contrary intention appears, the expressions following have the meanings attached there-
- "The Act" means the Native Land Act, 1909.
 "Board" means the Maori Land Board of the district
- "Committee" means the Committee of Management.

 "Trustee" means the Trustee duly appointed.

 All other terms used in these regulations have the same signification as when used in the Act, unless a contrary intention appears.

- 2. A general meeting of the beneficial owners of a Native reservation for the purpose of electing a Committee or appointing a Trustee shall be summoned by the Board on the application of a beneficial owner, and such meeting shall determine in what manner the reservation shall be administered so as to, if possible, render it revenue-producing without in any way interfering with the object of such reservation.
- 3. At such a meeting five beneficial owners present in person, or represented by proxy, shall form a quorum, of whom three must be present in person; and they shall at once proceed to elect a Chairman.
- 4. The regulations relating to meetings of assembled owners shall apply to meetings mentioned in the foregoing regulation, except in so far as they conflict or are inconsistent with these regulations.
- 5. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Rules of Court or regulations relating to Maori Land Boards now in force, no fee shall be chargeable or payable in respect of any
- 6. If at any time and place appointed for the general meeting, or within one hour thereafter, a quorum is not present, or if for any other reason the meeting cannot be held at that time, it shall stand adjourned from day to day at the same time and place until the seventh day thereafter, when the meeting, if not held, shall lapse.
- 7. The meeting shall, if properly constituted, then proceed to determine under which of the undermentioned bodies it shall recommend the Governor in Council to vest the control and management of the reservation, viz.:—
 (a.) The Maori Land Board.

 - (b.) The Public Trustee.
 - (c.) Committee of Management. (d.) Trustee or Trustees.
- If the meeting recommends such vesting in the Maori Land Board or in the Public Trustee, a resolution to that effect shall immediately be forwarded to the Board.
- 9. If the meeting resolves to elect a Committee or appoint a Trustee or Trustees, then it shall, before entering on the election, determine the number of persons to be so elected. In the case of a Committee the number of members shall be not less than three and not more than five. In the case of Trustees, not more than two shall be appointed.
- 10. The Chairman shall then call for nominations of persons whom it is desired to elect or appoint. Each person so nominated shall be proposed by one of the owners, and seconded by another owner.
- 11. If the number of persons nominated is not more than the number required to be elected or appointed, the Chairman shall declare them to be so elected or appointed.
- 12. If the number of persons nominated exceeds the number required to be elected or appointed, the Chairman shall call upon the meeting to elect or appoint from among the persons nominated the number required; and may appoint one or more scrutineers for the purpose of counting the votes recorded. The votes may be given by a show of hands, or in such other manner as the meeting determines.
- 13. In the case of equality of votes, the Chairman shall
- 13. In the case of equality of votes, the charman shall have a casting-vote in addition to his deliberative vote.

 14. The Chairman shall declare those persons (not being more than the number of persons required to be elected or appointed) who have received the highest number of votes to be duly elected as the Committee or appointed as Trustee or Trustees.
- 15. A list of the names of the persons so elected or appointed shall forthwith be prepared by the Chairman, and signed by him, and countersigned by an owner, and shall be forwarded to the Board.
- 16. The Committee so elected, or Trustee or Trustees appointed, shall remain in office for three years from the date of election, when another election shall take place.

 17. In the event of a vacancy occurring on the Committee, such vacancy shall be filled by the Board on the recom-
- such vacancy shall be filled by the Board on the recommendation of the members remaining on the Committee at the time the vacancy occurs; provided, however, if the Committee through any circumstance should become defunct the powers and authorities of the Committee shall vest in the Board. In the event of the death of a Trustee the powers vested in such Trustee, if he is a single Trustee, shall vest in the Board, but if there are two Trustees the Board can fill the vacancy.

 18. Any revenue derived shall be expended in the upkeep of the reservation and the improvement thereof and the expenses of such as stationery, stamps.
- payment of incidental expenses (such as stationery, stamps,
- printing, and actual travell'ng expenses) pertaining thereto.

 19. No allowance or payment shall be made for the control or management of any such reservation, except as pro-
- vided by the foregoing regulations.

 20. The members of the Committee shall meet together for the despatch of business at the times and places as the Chairman of the Committee considers expedient.

- 21. Minutes of the proceedings of the Committee shall be recorded in a minute-book, and the minutes of any meeting shall be read and confirmed at the next succeeding meeting. The minute-book shall be in the custody of the Chairman, who shall forward same to the President or Board whenever
- required so to do.
 22. Until such time as the beneficial owners have duly elected a Committee or appointed a Trustee or Trustees the management and control of any Native reservation shall be deemed to be and is vested in the Board.
- 23. For every reservation vested in the Board or the Public Trustee there shall be an Advisory Committee consisting of two persons, each of whom shall be a beneficial
- owner.

 24. The powers of an Advisory Committee are hereby limited to advising the Board or the Public Trustee on any matter that may be referred to it.
- 25. The regulations foregoing relating to the election, term of office, and the filling of a vacancy of the Committee of Management shall apply to the election, term of office, and filling of a vacancy of an Advisory Committee.

Additional Regulations made by the Public Service Commissioner for Draughtsmen's Examination.

N pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make the additional regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto with respect to the examination of draughtsmen for a certificate of competency

Such additional regulations shall have effect from and after the

date of publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

SCHEDULE.

Draughtsmen's Examination, Lands and Survey Department.

1. An examination for a certificate of competency as a draughtsman shall be held at such times and places as may from time to time be appointed by the Commissioner.

2. The Examiner or Examiners shall be such officer or officers of the Lands and Survey Department as the Commissioner shall from

time to time determine.

3. Each candidate for examination must comply with the following conditions:

(a.) He must be an officer of the Public Service; and

(b.) Have been engaged for not less than four years on draughting and computation work; or not less than ten years on draughting-work.

4. The following shall be the requirements and scope of the examination and the maximum marks assigned to the several subjects:

(A.) At the examination each candidate shall produce-

(1.) A trig. map drawn by himself, according to regulations, on a scale of 40 chains to the inch, and covering not less than twenty-five square miles of country.

(2.) A topographical map, drawn according to regulations, covering not less than twenty-five square miles of country.

- (3.) A working plot of rural sections, drawn to a scale of 10 chains to an inch, not less than two square miles in area.
- (4.) A town plan, illustrating standard and Land Transfer work, not less than a scale of 1 or 2 chains to an inch.
- (5.) A plan of a railway and road (or water-race), according to regulations, representing a plan of land to be taken under the Public Works Act.
- (6.) A computation-book to contain trig., traverse, area, and road calculations, &c.

Maximum marks, 30.

The subjects for examination shall be,-

(B.) Computations:

(1.) Trigonometry, right- and oblique-angled triangles.

(2.) Heights and distances.

- (3.) Road-sides and intersections of section-lines.
- (4.) Problems in computation of areas, and subdivision of lands.
- (5.) Problems in computation of land-values, rents, loading, &c.
- (6.) Taking out quantities, engineering.
- (7.) Reduction of a short traverse on meridian and perpendicular of an initial station.

Maximum marks, 35.

(C.) Theory, adjustment, and use of drawing instruments, scales, &c., also of pantograph, eidograph, and planimeter, with short, graphic description of theory and use of logarithms.

Maximum marks, 20.

(D.) Plotting:

- (1.) Preparation of sheets for plotting, laying off of trig. stations, meridian, and perpendicular lines.
- (2.) Plotting from co-ordinates and field-books.

(3.) Compilation of maps and reduction of plans.

Maximum marks, 20.

(E.) Knowledge of survey regulations applicable to maps, and duties of draughtsmen.

Maximum marks, 15.

- (F.) Preparation of and recording of titles :-
- (1.) On official plans.
- (2.) On titles.
- (3.) Technical descriptions of boundaries of districts, &c.

Maximum marks, 20.

(G.) Quality of drawing and handwriting.

Maximum marks, 30.

- 5. In order to pass the examination a candidate must gain not less than 50 per cent. in each of the subjects "A to G," and not less than 70 per cent. of the total possible maximum of marks assignable. If the failure to obtain a pass is due to failure in not more than two of the subjects "A to G," the candidate may, after six months from the date of his last examination, come up again for examination in these subjects.
- 6. Each candidate that passes the examination shall be entitled to a certificate of competency as a draughtsman issued under the hand of the Commissioner.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 608, against 572 in May—an increase of 36. The deaths in June were 258—an increase of 33 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 142, females 116. Forty-nine of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 18.99 per cent. of the whole number; 39 of these were under one year of age.

There were 90 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 74 in May. The following table shows the classification:—
