A PROCLAMATION. W HEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administra-tion of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be per-manently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation: Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a scenic reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

#### SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1914.

With the exception of the southernmost districts of the South Island, where the aggregate rainfall was above the average for the month, warm and dry conditions were generally experienced, and a considerable deficiency resulted. In some portions of the East Coast districts the total fall was less than 10 per cent. of the average. Between the 5th and the 22nd an extensive anti cyclone held sway, and fair weather was the predominating feature, with frosts often occurring at inland stations. On the 18th the barometer attained the high reading of 30.65 in. at Wellington, but after this date the high pressure gradually gave way, and was succeeded by an intense westerly area of low pressure which brought unsettled and in parts stormy weather between the 23rd and 27th. At 7 p.m. on the 25th the barometer fell to 28.65 in. at the Bluff. It afterwards rose rapidly, and on the two closing days of the month fair weather again prevailed. weather again prevailed.

the said Wanganui Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one shilling in the pound upon the rateable value (on the basis of the annual value) of all rateable pro-perty of the Borough of Wanganui, comprising the whole of the Borough of Wanganui, the boundaries whereof are defined in the New Zealand Gazette of the 19th day of December, 1912, number 92, at page 3618. And that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable half-yearly on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty years from the first day of November, 1914, or until the loan is fully paid off.
