A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Land Act, 1908, the land enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto was temporarily reserved as an endowment for primary education, upon the date specified in the second column of the said Schedule:

And whereas notices of such reservation were laid before both Houses of Parliament: And whereas the two Houses have passed resolutions, upon the dates specified in the third column, approving, in terms of the three-hundred and twenty-fourth section of the Land Act, 1908, of the land being permanently set aside as an endowment for primary education:

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a scenic reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

WHEREAS by section twenty-five of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, it is provided that at any time while His Majesty is at war with any foreign Prince or State, the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council, if satisfied that such a course is necessary in the public interest, modify or suspend wholly or partially, and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit, all or any of the provisions of any industrial award or industrial agreement under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments : And whereas the Governor is satisfied that it is necessary in the public interest to suspend certain of the provisions of the industrial award hereinafter referred to, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section twenty-five of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby suspend those provisions of the Auckland Grocers' Assistants and Drivers Award (Book of Awards, Volume XIII, page 673) made by the Court of Arbitration on the twelfth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, providing for or relative to weekly employment, and providing for the payment of a full weekly wage to grocers' assistants and drivers ; provided that such suspension shall be subject to the following conditions :—

(1.) Payment shall be made for time actually worked according to the rates set out in the said award, but computed at per hour ; provided further, however, that not less than thirty hours shall be paid for in any week.

(2.) That those married men or single men with dependants who are members of the Auckland Grocers' Industrial Union of Workers shall have preference of employment so far as is practicable in the discretion of the employer.

(3.) That no overtime shall be worked by any assistant or driver (unless under unforeseen or unavoidable circumstances)

when such assistant or driver has been employed for less than a full week immediately preceding such overtime.

(4.) That no deduction shall be made for the holidays therein provided for.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1914.

With the exception of the southernmost districts of the South Island, where the aggregate rainfall was above the average for the month, warm and dry conditions were generally experienced, and a considerable deficiency resulted. In some portions of the East Coast districts the total fall was less than 10 per cent. of the average.

Between the 5th and the 22nd an extensive anti cyclone held sway, and fair weather was the predominating feature, with frosts often occurring at inland stations. On the 18th the barometer attained the high reading of 30.65 in. at Wellington, but after this date the high pressure gradually gave way, and was succeeded by an intense westerly area of low pressure which brought unsettled and in parts stormy weather between the 23rd and 27th. At 7 p.m. on the 25th the barometer fell to 28.65 in. at the Bluff. It afterwards rose rapidly, and on the two closing days of the month fair weather again prevailed.

on drainage-works during the then current year; (2) construction of tar macadam surfaces on portions of the roadway of Victoria Avenue, and ordinary macadam surfaces on other portions of Victoria Avenue, Taupo Quay, and Ridgway Street, and contingencies; (3) completion of kerbing of footways and formation of same in Glasgow Street, London Street, Wicksteed Street, Campbell Street, Bell Street, Harrison Street, Keith Street, Niblett Street, Ball Street, Alexander Street, Halswell Street, Gloucester Street, Argyle Street, Louther Street, Barrack Street, and along Heads Road, in all about 600 chains, and refund to the General Account of moneys expended on such works during the then current year:
