WHEREAS by an Order in Council made under the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1909, on the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the tenth April idem, an apportionment was made in regard to the representation of the contributory districts on the Hospital and Charitable Aid Boards: And whereas under such apportionment provision was not made for representation of the Havelock North Town District upon the Hawke's Bay Hospital and Charitable Aid Board: And whereas it is desirable that such provision should be made:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, doth hereby determine that the Havelock North Town District shall be combined with the Hawke's Bay County, the Napier South Town District, and the Taradale Town District to elect five representatives to the Hawke's Bay Hospital and Charitable Aid Board, and the Hawke's Bay County shall be deemed to be the principal local authority of the combined districts; and doth also declare that this Order in Council shall be read with and be deemed to form part of the said Order in Council made on the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and thirty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, it is enacted that the rent, purchase-money, or other proceeds of any alienation of land made by a body corporate under that Part of that Act shall not, except with the consent of the Governor in Council, be paid to the committee of management or directly to the incorporated owners, but to the Maori Land Board of the district in which the land or the greater part thereof is situated, or, in the case of land situated in the South Island or in any place not forming part of a Maori land district, to the Public Trustee:

And whereas application has been made by the proprietors of Mangahauini No. 7 and adjoining blocks for the consent of the Governor in Council to the payment of the proceeds of the alienations by the said corporate body by way of lease being made to the incorporated owners direct: And whereas the Tairāwhiti District Maori Land Board, after due inquiry, recommends that the consent of the Governor in Council be granted to the payment of the proceeds arising out of the alienations set out in the Schedule hereto to the committee of management of the said corporate body:

And whereas it is expedient that such consent should be granted:

WHEREAS by section three hundred and thirty-five of the Native Land Act, 1909, and by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1912, it is provided that, with the precedent consent of the Governor in Council, a body corporate under Part XVII of the Native Land Act, 1909, may, on the security of a mortgage or charge of the land vested in it, borrow money from a State Loan Department, or from any person or body corporate :

And whereas the proprietors of Marangairoa No. 1B 4 Block, being a body corporate duly constituted under the said Act, have applied under the said sections for the precedent consent of the Governor in Council to borrow money from a State Loan Department, or from any person or body corporate, on security of a mortgage of the land vested in it, for the purposes set out in the aforesaid section three hundred and thirty-five :

And whereas the Tairāwhiti District Maori Land Board recommends the application : And whereas it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor in Council should issue :

WHEREAS subsection one of section fifty of the Native Land Act, 1909, enacts that at any time and from time to time, on application made *ex parte* or otherwise by any person interested, the Chief Judge may, if he thinks fit, on being satisfied that the applicant has shown a *prima facie* case of error, whether of fact or law, in any final order of the Native Land Court, grant leave to the applicant to appeal to the Appellate Court against that order, notwithstanding the fact that, owing to lapse of time or for any other reason, the applicant has no appeal as of right to that Court :

And whereas subsection two of that section further enacts that, save with the precedent consent of the Governor in Council, leave to appeal shall not be granted by the Chief Judge under this section unless application for same is made within five years after the making of the order appealed from :

And whereas application has been made to His Honour the Chief Judge of the Native Land Court to grant leave to appeal against the decision of the Native Land Court, dated the fourteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in respect of the succession to the interest of Wi Pepene, deceased, in Sections 34 and 25, Block IV, Waitara, and Section 2 of Block III, Waitara (Grant 5238) : And whereas it is expedient that such leave to appeal should be granted :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by subsection two of section fifty of the Native Land Act, 1909, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby consent to the Chief Judge granting the applicant leave to appeal as aforesaid. And it is hereby declared that this Order in

Council is made under the provisions in that behalf of the Native Land Act, 1909, and shall operate accordingly as a consent of the Governor in Council to the proceedings hereby authorized.

WHEREAS by the Public Works Act, 1908, it is, in section fifteen thereof, *inter alia*, enacted that, except for the purpose of a railway or defence purposes, or for the purposes of any other work to be made under the authority of a special Act, nothing in this Act contained shall authorize the taking of any land occupied by any building, yard, garden, or vineyard, or in *bona fide* occupation as an ornamental park or pleasure-ground, without the previous consent of the Governor in Council :

And whereas part of the land described in the Schedule hereto is occupied by buildings and orchard, and the Minister of Public Works has recommended the Governor to issue an Order in Council under the said Act consenting to the taking of the said land for the purposes of a prison :

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of October, 1914.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act :

And whereas the Tokomaru Farmers' Co-operative Company (Limited), (hereinafter referred to as "the said licensee") desires to erect electric lines from the power-house situated in Section 4, Block II, Township of Tuatini, across Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 of Block II, and Sections 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, gravel reserve, and Section 19 of Block IV, all in the Township of Tuatini (hereinafter referred to as "the said electric lines"), and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the said licensee to erect and maintain the said electric lines for the purpose of supplying electricity to the premises marked on the plan P.W.D. 35615, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District, such electric lines being indicated by a broken blue line on the said plan.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS.

1. In this license—

"Minister" means Minister of Public Works :

"Inspecting Engineer" means the Engineer or other officer appointed by the Minister for the purpose of inspecting the work to be constructed or maintained by the said licensee hereunder.

"Telegraph" includes telephone.

2. The conductors shall be at a minimum height of 18 ft. above the surface of the ground and may be uninsulated. At road crossings this height shall be increased to 20 ft.

3. The diameter of any conductor in any electric line laid or erected for the supply of electrical energy shall not be less than 0.104 in. diameter (No. 12 S.W.G. or 7/20 S.W.G.). If the material of the conductor be aluminium the conductor shall be stranded.

4. The potential difference between the two wires or between either wire and the earth shall not exceed 110 volts direct current.

5. The main switchboard shall be made of and be mounted on material that is non-inflammable.

6. All outgoing feeders and distributors from the generating-station shall be provided with automatic circuit-breakers or fuses, set to open circuit at 50 per cent. excess current over the rated full load of such feeder or distributor with a time-limit not exceeding ten seconds.

7. Every support for an aerial line shall be of durable material, and properly strengthened against forces due to wind-pressure, change of direction of the line, and unequal length of span. The factor of safety of such supports shall be at least four, taking into consideration all possible stresses, including wind-pressure at 30 lb. per square foot on plane surfaces and 18 lb. per square foot on cylindrical surfaces. The stress in the aerial conductors shall not exceed 25,000 lb. per square inch for copper and 12,500 lb. per square inch for aluminium in the extreme case of a temperature of 12° F. and a wind-pressure of 18 lb. per square foot of diametral plane occurring simultaneously.

8. The said electric lines shall occupy the other side of the road to that taken by the existing telegraph and telephone lines, and all future extensions shall be run on one side only of roads or streets.

9. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government Railways until the said licensee has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).

10. Where lead-covered telephone-cables or any open telegraph or other aerial wires are crossed above or beneath

by the said electric lines, the latter wires shall be insulated with not less than 300-megohms-per-mile grade of vulcanized rubber throughout the crossing-span, and over every such span they shall be suitably suspended from effectively earthed steel bearer-wires, if the Minister of Telegraphs shall so require. If required by the Minister of Telegraphs, efficient guard-wires or other protective devices shall be erected at crossings and places where the said electric lines intersect telegraph wires, or wherever such protection is deemed necessary. The licensee shall bear the cost of carrying out such protection.

Earth-wires, where led down poles, shall be protected by casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground.

11. All aerial wires shall be attached to suitable insulators, carried on cross-arms of suitable material and cross-section, and they shall be so attached to the insulator, or guarded, that they cannot fall away from the support. Conductors covered with insulating-material shall be so attached that their insulation will not be impaired where they are secured to the insulator.

12. An aerial line shall be removed so soon as it has ceased to be used for the transmission of electricity, unless the said licensee intends within a reasonable time again to take it into use.

13. Where an aerial line crosses or is in proximity to any metallic substance, precautions shall be taken against the possibility of the line coming into contact with the metallic substance or of the metallic substance coming into contact with the line by breakage or otherwise.

14. Every aerial line, including its supports, its conductors, and their insulating covering, and all the structural parts and electrical appliances and devices belonging to or connected with the said electric line, shall be duly and efficiently maintained as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions.

15. Service lines from aerial lines shall be taken from insulators, and shall not be tapped off between insulators. They shall be led as directly as possible to insulators firmly attached to some portion of the consumer's premises which is not accessible to any person without the use of a ladder or other special appliance. Every portion of any service line which is outside a building and within 7 ft. of any part of the building shall be rubber-insulated.

16. All metal pipes or coverings containing any electric line or wires shall be efficiently connected with earth, and shall be so jointed as to make good electrical connection throughout their whole length.

17. The said licensee shall be responsible for all electric lines, fittings, and apparatus belonging to him, or under his control, which may be upon a consumer's premises, being maintained in a safe condition and in all respects fit for supplying energy.

18. In delivering the energy to a consumer's terminals the said licensee shall exercise all due precautions so as to avoid risk of causing fire on the premises.

19. All electric lines and apparatus on a consumer's premises, excepting such parts as are required to be connected to earth, shall be highly insulated and be suitable for the voltage at which supply is being given. They shall be thoroughly protected against injury to the insulation and against the access of moisture, and any metal forming part of the electric circuit shall not, unless efficiently connected with earth, be exposed so that it can be touched. All electric lines shall be so fixed and protected as to prevent the possibility of electrical discharge to any adjacent metallic substance.

20. A suitable safety-fuse or other automatic circuit-breaker shall be inserted in each service line within a consumer's premises as close as possible to the point of entry, and contained within a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fireproof construction.

21. The wiring shall be done from distributing-boards which shall be of incombustible material. Suitable fuses at each pole, fitted to engage in spring clips, shall be placed on these boards so that it shall be possible to disconnect any or all circuits from the supply. If double-pole switches are used on the distributing-board circuits, fuses need not then be of the type to engage in spring clips.

22. There must be an approved porcelain bridge or other efficient insulation between the terminals of lamp-holders, and where lamp-holders are liable to be handled by persons making good earth contact they shall be provided with non-conducting covers.

23. Insulation of conductors used for interior wiring shall be of vulcanized rubber of not less than 600-megohms-per-mile grade.

24. The said licensee shall not connect the wires and fittings on a consumer's premises with its mains, or, in the case of premises already connected, continue the supply from its mains, unless it is reasonably satisfied that the requirements of this license, as far as applicable, are being complied with, that the wiring and fittings are suitable to the voltage at

which supply is being given; and that the connection or continuance of supply would not cause a leakage from those wires and fittings exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply of current to the premises; and where the said licensee declines to make such connection or to continue to supply it shall serve upon the consumer a notice stating the reasons of so declining.

25. If the said licensee is reasonably satisfied, after making all proper examinations by testing or otherwise, that the wiring and fittings are not suitable for the voltage being employed, that a leakage exists at some part of the circuit of such extent as to be a source of danger, and that such leakage does not exist at any part of the circuit belonging to the said licensee, or that any other requirements of this license, so far as they apply to the consumer's premises, are not being complied with, then and in such case any officer of the said licensee duly authorized in writing may, for the purpose of discovering whether the leakage exists at any part of the circuit within or upon any consumer's premises, or whether the wiring is suitable, and the general requirements of this license are complied with, by notice require the consumer at some reasonable time after the service of the notice to permit inspection of the wires and fittings belonging to the consumer and forming part of the circuit.

26. If on such testing and inspection the officer discovers a leakage from the consumer's wires exceeding one ten-thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises, or that the requirements of this license are not properly conformed to, or if the consumer does not give all due facilities for inspection and testing, the said licensee shall forthwith discontinue the supply of energy to the premises in question, giving immediate notice of the discontinuance to the consumer, and shall not recommence the supply until it is reasonably satisfied that the cause of leakage has been remedied, and that the installation is in conformity with these conditions.

27. If any consumer is dissatisfied with the action of the said licensee in refusing to give, or in discontinuing, or in not recommencing the supply of energy to his premises, the wires and fittings of that consumer may, on his application to the Minister and on payment of the cost of such inspection, be inspected and be tested for the existence of leakage by the Inspecting Engineer.

This provision shall be endorsed on every notice given under the provisions of either of the two last preceding clauses hereof.

28. From the time when the said licensee commences to supply energy through any distributing-main, and during the continuance of this license, it shall maintain continuously sufficient power for the use of all the consumers for the time being entitled to be supplied from such main; provided that for any purposes connected with the efficient working of the undertaking the Minister may give permission to the said licensee to discontinue the supply at such intervals and at such periods as he thinks expedient. When the supply is so discontinued, public notice shall be given when practicable of such discontinuance and of the probable duration thereof.

29. The variation of pressure at any consumer's terminals shall not under any conditions exceed 4 per cent. above or below the normal pressure at which he is being supplied.

30. The said licensee shall not use the said electric lines, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the said licensee that he has received from the Inspecting Engineer a certificate that the work hereby authorized has been satisfactorily carried out.

31. The Minister may at any time order an inspection to be made of the lines and wires of the said licensee. If any defect is found to exist it must be remedied forthwith, and if serious in the opinion of the Inspecting Engineer the Minister may, on the receipt of the report, direct the said licensee to at once cease transmitting energy either over the whole of the said electric lines and wires, or any part thereof, as to him may seem fit, until such defect is repaired or remedied. The cost of such inspections shall be borne by the said licensee.

32. After the supply of energy has begun, not less than fourteen days' notice in writing shall be given to the Resident Engineer of Public Works at Gisborne, and to the Telegraph Engineer for the district, his deputy, or such other officer as the Minister from time to time directs, of each alteration or further extension that the said licensee is about to make.

33. The said licensee shall, upon the receipt of an application from an occupier of any premises, within 60 ft. of any of the said licensee's public-supply lines, furnish such premises with electric energy upon the same terms and conditions on which any other consumer is entitled under similar circumstances to a corresponding supply.

34. The said licensee shall, before erection or construction of any part of the work hereby authorized is begun, submit

for the approval of the Minister such plans and other information showing and describing such work as he may require.

35. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of November, 1914, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of February, 1915.

36. The said licensee shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

37. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the said licensee without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

38. If the said licensee fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license, the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the licensee within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice, and if the said licensee fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period, he shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.

39. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the said licensee fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

40. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the said licensee, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the same.

41. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works, nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the said licensee for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

42. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the said licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use the said electric lines except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license, as may from time to time be agreed on between the said licensee and the Waiapu County Council.

43. This license shall come into force on and after the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

Regulations for Trout-fishing, Rotorua Acclimatization District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of October, 1914.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the Rotorua Acclimatization District and the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, supersede all regulations at variance therewith, and such regulations are hereby revoked.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout in all waters within that district or part of the North Island known as the Rotorua Acclimatization District, described in the First Schedule hereto, and comprising the Counties of Rotorua, Whakatane, and East Taupo, and parts of the Counties of Wairoa, West Taupo, and Matamata, may be issued under the hand of the General Manager of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, or any one authorized in writing by the said General

Manager in that behalf; provided that the General Manager, or his appointee, may refuse to issue a license to any person who within the previous two years has been convicted of any breach of the provisions of any Act relating to fishing for trout, or of any regulation made thereunder.

2. The fee to be charged for a license as aforesaid to each male person over the age of sixteen years shall be £1. Licenses may also be issued to boys attending school or under the age of sixteen, or to women, at a reduced fee of 5s. for each license so issued; provided that it shall be lawful for the said General Manager, or his appointee, in any case where application is made for a license on or after the 1st February in any year, to issue a license to any man for the sum of 12s. 6d., but so that such license shall extend only from the time of granting the same until the termination of the then trout-fishing season. No license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent. The General Manager, or his appointee, may issue to any one applying for the same a monthly license on payment of a fee of 12s. 6d. for each month's fishing, a weekly license on payment of a fee of 7s. 6d. for each week's fishing, or a day license on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d. for each day's fishing.

3. Any holder of a license may fish for trout in the above-named waters from the 1st November in any year to the 31st May in the following year, both inclusive; but every such license shall be for one season only, and shall expire on the 31st May following the date on which it was issued, subject, however, to the special limitations and restrictions hereinafter mentioned.

4. Trout shall not be fished for, taken, or killed otherwise than with one rod and line; but a landing-net or gaff may be used to secure any trout caught with such rod and line. No lures or baits shall be used other than the natural or artificial fly, natural or artificial minnow, any small indigenous fish, insect, grasshopper, beetle, or spider, and any form of spoon bait, and such lures or baits shall only be used upon a running line attached to a rod and reel. No set rod or line shall be used for taking trout in any of the waters aforesaid. The use of the shell-fish koura, worms, the creeper, and the huhu or matai grub as baits shall be a breach of the regulations.

5. No person shall use any bait or lure other than artificial fly in any of the streams following—namely, the Kaituna Stream from Lake Rotoiti to the electric power station at the Okere Falls, the Waimakariri, Waitahanui, and Tahana-ara Streams, and the Ohau Channel.

6. No person shall spin or troll in any stream, spring, or river flowing into or from Lakes Rotorua, Rotoiti, Rotoehu, Rotoma, Rotokakahi, Tarawera, and Taupo, nor within a radius of 300 yards, shore to shore, from the centre of the said streams or outlets or inlets of any of them, all of such being reserved for fly fishing only.

7. No person shall use any bait or lure other than artificial fly within a radius of 300 yards from Te Ngae sunken reef in Lake Rotorua, as indicated by posts in the water.

8. No license shall be transferable, or be deemed to authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish.

9. No person shall take, fish for, or catch any *Salmonidae* or trout, or in any way injure or disturb the same, between the 1st June and the 31st October in any year, which period is hereby appointed a close season for all such fish. No person shall have in his possession any *Salmonidae* or trout between the 5th June and the 1st November following, except as provided for by the regulations regarding keeping trout in freezing or cool chambers after close of season, which were made by the Governor in Council on the 6th October, 1908, on the 6th September, 1909, and on the 8th June, 1914, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 8th October, 1908, the 16th September, 1909, and the 11th June, 1914, respectively. Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the General Manager, or his appointee, or officers of the Marine Department, or officers of the Department of Internal Affairs, for purposes of acclimatization.

10. No person shall cast or throw into any stream or waters, or shall allow to flow into or place near the bank or margin of any stream or waters, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flax-mill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poisonous, or injurious to fish; provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to prohibit the depositing in such stream of debris from any mining claim.

11. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

12. No person shall fish for trout without a license; and every person fishing shall, on the demand of any Ranger, constable, officer of the Department of Tourist and Health

Resorts, or of any person producing a license, give his true name and place of residence, and, on the like demand, produce and show to such Ranger, officer, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout.

13. Every trout not exceeding 10 in. in length from nose to tip of tail taken or caught by any person shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

14. No cross-line or hand-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout; nor shall any of the above mentioned baits be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

15. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net, or any instrument, or device, or means for taking *Salmonidae* or trout in any lake, river, or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream; provided that nothing contained in this clause shall apply to the Under-Secretary of the Department of Internal Affairs, or to any person authorized in writing by the said Under-Secretary to net fish on behalf of the Department.

16. Nothing herein contained, or contained in any license issued under these regulations, shall be deemed to authorize any person to fish for or take *Salmonidae* or trout from the Wairoa Stream between the waterfalls and Lake Tarawera.

17. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any trout, or any part thereof; provided always that it shall be lawful for any person to buy and sell fresh trout and smoked trout taken and branded by or under the direction of the Department of Internal Affairs.

18. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than £1 or more than £50.

19. If any person shall be convicted of an offence against these regulations, the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void and shall be returned to the General Manager.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ROTORUA ACCLIMATIZATION DISTRICT.

ALL that area bounded towards the north generally by Tauranga County from the north-eastern boundary of Matamata County to the sea; thence by the sea to the north-western corner of Opotiki County; thence towards the east by Opotiki County to its south-western corner; thence towards the north-east by Waikohu and Cook Counties to the sea; thence towards the east and south-east generally by the sea to Moeangiangi; thence towards the south generally by the leading spur and the southern watershed of the Waikare River to the summit of Taraponui Mountain; thence by the leading spur to the confluence of the Mohaka River and the Waipunga River; thence by a right line to Tatarakino Mountain; thence by the eastern watershed of the Mokomokonui Stream to the summit of Pohokura Mountain; thence by a line running due east to the Pukahunui Stream; thence by the leading spur and the western watershed of the Te Hoe River to Maungatauiwha Trig. Station; thence by the north-eastern boundary of Heruwi No. 4 Block to the northern boundary of Wairoa County; thence by the Wairoa County to the Napier-Taupo Road; thence by Hawke's Bay, Rangitikei, Waimarino, and Kaitieke Counties to the confluence of the Wanganui and Ongarue Rivers; thence towards the west generally by Ohura and Waitomo Counties to the summit of Rangitoto Mountain; thence by a right line to the summit of Puwhenua Mountain; and thence by Matamata County to the southern boundary of Tauranga County, the place of commencement.

Suspending certain Provisions of the Wellington District Bookbinders, Paper-rulers, and Cutters Award.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this nineteenth day of October, 1914.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section twenty-five of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, it is provided that at any time while His Majesty is at war with any foreign Prince or State the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council, if satisfied that such a course is necessary in the public interest, modify or suspend wholly or partially, and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit, all or any of the provisions of any industrial award or industrial agreement under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments: And whereas the Governor is satisfied that it is necessary in the public interest to suspend certain of the provisions of the industrial award hereinafter referred to, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section twenty-five of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby suspend those provisions of the Wellington District Bookbinders, Paper-rulers, and Cutters Award (Book of Awards, Vol. XIV, page 464), made by the Court of Arbitration on the twentieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, providing for or relative to weekly employment and providing for the payment of a full weekly wage to journeymen and apprentices; provided that such suspension shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(1.) Payment shall be made for time actually worked according to the rates set out in the said award, but computed at per hour.

(2.) An apprentice shall make up time lost by him owing to the operation of this Order in Council before entering into his next year of apprenticeship, and the total period of his apprenticeship shall be extended for a period equal to such lost time.

WHEREAS the Port Chalmers Borough Council lately proposed to raise a loan of one thousand two hundred pounds, under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, for the purpose of improving and extending the Corporation waterworks by the purchase of land and otherwise:

And whereas irregularities or defects have occurred in the steps taken to raise such loan, inasmuch as the voting-paper and the notices of the intention to raise the said loan which were published in accordance with section nine of the said Act state that the loan is to be repaid by half-yearly instalments extending over a period of thirty-six years, instead of over a period of thirty-six years and a half:

And whereas one notice only of the date on which the poll was to be taken was published in the newspaper circulating in the district, instead of not less than four of such notices as required by section ten, subsection two, of the said Act:

And whereas the notice hereinbefore mentioned of the date of the poll was published by the Returning Officer instead of by the Mayor of the borough, as required by section ten, subsection two, of the said Act:

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Port Chalmers has passed a resolution striking and levying a rate to secure the above loan, and published a copy of such resolution on page 3691 of the *New Zealand Gazette*, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen:

And whereas the period of repayment is therein stated as thirty-six years and a half, or until the loan is fully paid off:

And whereas it appears that the ratepayers have not been misled by the above-recited irregularities, and it is expedient to validate the same:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section one hundred and eleven of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that the steps taken to obtain the loan shall be valid to all intents and purposes as though the currency of the loan had therein been stated as thirty-six years and a half, and as though the public notices herein referred to had been given at least four times, in accordance with the said section ten, subsection two; and, further, as though the publication of the date of the poll had been made in the proper manner; and that the proceedings relative to such loan shall not be called in question by reason only of the irregularities aforesaid.

Animals Protection Act.—Declaring Reserve for Native and Imported Game, Hawksbury Domain.

Special Regulations affecting H.M. Prisons and the Officers employed therein, together with Exemptions from the Regulations made by the Public Service Commissioner.

WHEREAS by section thirty-four of the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Public Service Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor in Council, is authorized to make special regulations for the carrying-out of the provisions of the said Act, and such regulations may be made either generally or with respect to any particular case or class of cases :

Now, therefore, the Commissioner, in pursuance and exercise of the said authority, and with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make the special regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto to apply to every officer employed in His Majesty's prisons.

Nothing in these regulations shall affect the regulations made on the 14th day of January, 1913, under the Prisons Act, 1908, and the Prisons Amendment Act, 1912, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 23rd January, 1913, at page 149.

SCHEDULE.

EXEMPTIONS.

1. THE prisons and the officers employed therein are hereby exempted from the operation of the undermentioned general regulations made on the 31st day of March, 1913 :—

Part II : General Duties of Officers.—Regulations Nos. 8 to 16.

Part VIII : Admission to and Promotion in the Public Service.

APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTION.

2. All recommendations of appointments of probationary warders shall be made by the Permanent Head from the Commissioner's list of applicants filed in the Department of Justice. The names and such particulars as may be required of all probationers so recommended shall forthwith be submitted to the Commissioner. No person shall be recommended who does not conform to the requirements of Nos. 137 and 138 of the Regulations under the Prisons Act, 1908.

If at any time it shall appear that any probationer is for any reason unfitted for the Prison service, the Permanent Head shall so report, stating the reasons therefor, and the services of such probationer may be dispensed with by the Commissioner.

On or before the expiration of the period of probation the Permanent Head shall forward to the Commissioner his recommendation as to the suitability or otherwise of a probationer for permanent appointment.

The subsequent promotion of warders and prison officers shall be governed by the conditions contained in the Prisons Regulations Nos. 140 to 146.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR RECREATION.

3. All prison officers of more than one year's service in either a permanent or temporary capacity, other than probationary officers, may be granted leave of absence not exceeding four weeks in each year.

Probationary officers, after they have served their twelve months' probation and been permanently appointed, may be granted three weeks' leave of absence.

The granting of any such leave of absence shall be subject to the express conditions—

(a.) That the behaviour of the officer has been in every way satisfactory ;

(b.) That the total sick or special leave during the previous twelve months has not exceeded fourteen days ; and

(c.) That his official duties have been satisfactorily performed.

All the days of absence in excess of the number of days allowed for sick or special leave shall be deducted from the annual leave of absence granted for recreation ; but in special cases the Commissioner, on the recommendation of the Permanent Head, may grant further leave.

4. If for any cause the Permanent Head thinks leave of absence ought not to be granted he may refuse the same, subject to the right of appeal to the Commissioner.

5. An officer failing to avail himself of the annual leave provided for will not on that account be entitled to a more lengthened leave in any subsequent year, unless under special circumstances approved by the Permanent Head.

ANNUAL-LEAVE SCHEDULE.

6. Immediately after the 1st December in each year the Gaoler or officer in charge of each prison shall prepare a schedule in duplicate showing a list of officers entitled to leave of absence under these regulations for the ensuing calendar year; the total length of absence of each officer during the twelve months preceding the 1st December; and such other particulars as may be necessary. Officers should be required to indicate the time of the year in which they desire to take their annual leave, and in the event of more officers than can be spared asking for leave at or about the same time the responsible officer will advise the Permanent Head of the times at which, in his opinion, leave can conveniently be granted in each case. As far as possible, the leave of the staff should be spread over the year where it is not convenient to make any other arrangement.

Unless an officer applies for special leave it will not be necessary for him to make a written application.

It shall be the duty of the Gaoler or officer in charge who draws up the leave schedule to bring under the notice of the Permanent Head any case in which the conduct of the officer during the preceding year has been such as to warrant the annual leave being withheld or reduced. Special attention must be called to any case in which there has been irregularity of attendance during the hours set out in the "Routine of Duties," Prison Regulation No. 164. If the Permanent Head is satisfied that the leave entered in the schedule is due under these regulations he will approve the schedule and return it to the responsible officer as his authority to grant the leave at the most convenient dates. A duplicate copy shall be kept as a record in the Head Office, and entries made therein as the leave is granted.

7. In special cases special leave may be granted on such terms or conditions as the Commissioner may approve.

SHORT LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

8. The Permanent Head, or such officer as may be authorized by him, may, in case of pressing necessity, grant any permanent or temporary officer leave of absence not exceeding three working-days. A schedule of such leave shall be furnished to the Permanent Head every two months, and the leave granted shall be shown in the annual-leave schedule.

9. The Permanent Head may at any time grant an officer leave of absence without pay for any period not exceeding one month if, in his opinion, there are special circumstances justifying such a course. The grant of such leave shall be reported to the Commissioner. Where more than one month's leave is desired, application shall be made through the Permanent Head to the Commissioner.

FURLOUGH.

10. The Commissioner may grant to any officer of at least ten years' continuous service twelve months' leave of absence, and to any officer of lesser period of service any time not exceeding six months' leave of absence, in each case on half-salary. Any annual increment becoming due during such absence shall not be payable until the officer resumes duty; but when he resumes the increment shall commence and be payable as from the date of resumption of office and shall be added to his salary, and the next increment shall be payable one year after the date on which the increment in the ordinary course would have become due if no leave of absence had been granted.

SICK-LEAVE.

11. Where sick-leave is applied for for more than three months the application must be referred to the Commissioner.

Sick-leave when granted by the Permanent Head shall not exceed the periods or rate of pay set out in the following schedule;

and a report of all leave granted under this regulation shall be submitted every two months for the approval of the Commissioner :—

Pay during sick-leave shall not be granted where an officer receives compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

Where in case of illness any officer who has received leave of absence for three months is not so far recovered as to be able to resume his duties, further extensions of leave may be provisionally granted by the Commissioner in accordance with the following schedule; provided that on each extension of leave the applicant shall be subjected to an examination by a medical practitioner approved by the Commissioner :—

If any officer is absent from duty on account of illness, and such absence has extended beyond three months, he shall not be permitted to return to duty until some medical practitioner approved by the Commissioner has certified that he is fit to resume work.

When extended leave is granted other than on full pay the rate paid for Sundays and holidays shall be the same as that allowed for the period of leave.

Sick-leave allowed under this regulation may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave provided for in the schedules is intended to cover a period of three years, dating from the first absence on sick-leave.

The second or any subsequent triennial period will commence on the date of the first absence on sick-leave following the date upon which the previous triennial period expired; and for the three years thus commencing the full amount of leave provided in the schedules according to length of service may again be allowed.

LEAVE TO ATTEND EXAMINATIONS.

12. No deduction shall be made from annual leave in respect of leave granted for the purposes of attending examinations referred to in these regulations.

SICK-LEAVE FOR TEMPORARY EMPLOYEES.

13. The Permanent Head may, on satisfactory evidence that the leave is necessary on account of sickness or ill health, grant to any person temporarily employed leave of absence on full pay for a period not exceeding one week.

PENALTY FOR IMPOSITION.

14. Any person practising imposition under the plea of sickness shall be subject to instant dismissal, disratemnt in rank, or reduction in salary, as the Commissioner may determine.

ILL HEALTH RESULTING FROM MISCONDUCT.

15. No leave on account of illness shall be granted with pay if the sickness or ill health has been caused by the misconduct of the officer. In order to satisfy himself on that point the Permanent Head may obtain a report from the Medical Officer of the Prison, or, in prisons where there is no Medical Officer, may arrange for a medical practitioner to attend on and examine such officer at his

residence. A fee not exceeding £1 1s. shall be made to the medical practitioner, other than the medical officer of the prison, for his attendance and report; and if such report is, in the opinion of the Permanent Head, not favourable to the officer concerned, the amount of the fee so paid shall be deducted from any money which is or becomes payable to the said officer, by the Government. The same practice may be followed where an officer is suspected of absenting himself from duty without sufficient cause.

INEFFICIENCY THROUGH ILLNESS.

16. If in the opinion of the Permanent Head any member of the staff is inefficient through repeated illness, such inefficiency shall be reported to the Commissioner, who may take steps to have such person examined under the provisions of the Public Service Superannuation Act, with a view to his retirement from the Public Service as being medically unfit for further duty.

SPECIAL LEAVE ON RETIREMENT.

17. Special leave of absence will be granted to officers retiring from the Prison service, on the following conditions: Provided that the sick or other leave in the twelve months preceding retirement has not exceeded three months, and that the interval between the ordinary and special leave is at least three months:—

- (a.) Officers retiring on superannuation, or compensation in lieu of superannuation, three months.
- (b.) Officers of under ten years' service retiring for their own purposes, other than medical unfitness, no leave.
- (c.) Officers of ten years' service and under twenty years' service retiring for their own purposes, other than medical unfitness, one month.
- (d.) Officers of at least twenty years' service retiring for their own purposes, other than medical unfitness, six weeks.
- (e.) Officers retiring on medical certificate, three months.
- (f.) Officers dispensed with through no fault of their own before reaching the retiring-age: If under five years' continuous service, one month; if five years' and under ten years', two months; if ten years' or over, three months.
- (g.) "Officers" shall include Matrons, Assistant Matrons, and female warders or attendants.
- (h.) Women retiring to be married: Over five years' service, one month; over ten years' service, two months; over fifteen years' service, three months.

HOLIDAYS.

18. Where possible officers shall receive, in addition to annual leave, the following holidays:—

Christmas Day.
New Year's Day.
Good Friday.
Labour Day.
Birthday of the reigning Sovereign.

Where it is not possible to grant an officer leave on any or all of these days he shall be allowed equivalent leave at such time as may be convenient.

TRAVELLING-ALLOWANCES.

19. All salaried officers shall receive travelling-allowance for personal expenses at the following rates:—

20. The allowance shall be for each day of twenty-four hours, and the day shall be deemed to commence at the hour of departure from headquarters. For any portion of a day the rate shall be one twenty-fourth of the full daily rate for each hour's absence: Provided that when the absence does not exceed six hours, actual and reasonable expenses only shall be paid.

In computing the time of absence, a fraction of an hour, if less than half an hour, shall not be taken into account; but half an hour or more shall be reckoned as one hour.

In any case special arrangements may be made by the Commissioner as to the allowance to be made to any person.

Whenever the Permanent Head is satisfied that a lower travelling-allowance than the scale should suffice, he may direct accordingly.

21. An officer travelling by train from Wellington to Auckland or *vice versa* may claim, in lieu of the ordinary travelling-allowance, a refund of actual and reasonable payments made by him. Such claim may include the cost of a sleeping-berth, but if made shall cover a period of twenty-four hours from the time of departure, or the whole period occupied in travelling if such period is less than twenty-four hours.

22. Nothing in these regulations shall preclude the Commissioner from authorizing temporary special rates or amounts for travelling, to meet special cases.

23. The cost of transport by land or sea will be paid by the Government, or, when paid by the officer travelling, the same will be refunded to him on production of vouchers; but no vouchers for such expenses will be required for sums of 5s. and under, and vouchers for railway fares will not be required if the railway travelled upon and the extent of the journey is stated.

24. All vouchers for travelling allowances or expenses must be made out in detail on the proper Treasury form, signed and certified by the claimant, and certified as correct by the Permanent Head or other authorized authority.

25. The nature of the duty on which the officer is travelling and the amount of his salary shall be stated on the voucher.

26. No officer shall leave his headquarters without the authority of the Permanent Head or of some officer authorized by him.

27. When an officer temporarily stationed at any place and receiving a travelling-allowance has to visit any other place, and thereby necessarily incurs extra personal expenses, he may be permitted to draw such additional allowance for the visit as the Permanent Head directs.

All Prison officers holding rank above that of warder, including Matrons and Assistant Matrons, shall be allowed first-class fares by train and steamer when travelling on the service of the Department, except when escorting prisoners, when they must travel second class unless otherwise directed by the Permanent Head. Warders, probationary warders, and other officers of lower rank will be allowed second-class fares.

MEAL ALLOWANCES.

28. When no other general provision is made officers required to attend sittings of the Supreme Court, or who are detailed for other duty entailing absence from their homes during meal-hours, may be granted an allowance to cover the cost of their meals at the following rates: Gaolers, 2s.; all other officers of prisons, 1s. 6d. per meal.

CONVEYANCE OF OFFICERS TRANSFERRED.

(Where cost borne by officers.)

29. Officers who are transferred from one locality to another solely at their own request or by exchange (except as provided for in the next regulation) must bear the whole cost of their removal. When transferred on account of misconduct the cost must be borne by officers in fault, unless otherwise determined by the Commissioner prior to removal.

(Where cost borne by Department.)

30. When officers are transferred—

(a.) In the public interest;

(b.) To meet the convenience of the Department, or in the ordinary course of promotion;

the actual cost of conveyance of such officers, and of their family, will be paid by the Department.

31. With respect to the expression "cost of conveyance," it must be distinctly understood that officers are not empowered to engage vehicles at greater cost where there are public conveyances plying; but in places where public vehicles do not ply, or do not run at convenient hours, a mileage rate to cover the cost of conveyance may be allowed, not exceeding 6d. per mile; or, in any special circumstances, such rate or allowance not exceeding actual expenses as the Permanent Head may deem adequate, it being understood that the most rigid scrutiny shall be exercised in the matter of special rates or allowances.

32. In exceptional cases the Permanent Head may allow an officer travelling in his own conveyance on the public service a mileage rate not exceeding 6d. per mile, or, where the circumstances justify it, such rate or allowance as may be determined as above prescribed; but such exceptional rate or allowance shall only be allowed where the Permanent Head considers that a saving will be effected by the officer so travelling in preference to his using a public conveyance.

33. Unless specially authorized by the Permanent Head, cab fares shall not be allowed where the distance can be traversed by the ordinary manner of conveyance—i.e., by rail, tram, or omnibus.

34. The maximum period for which personal expenses may be allowed by the Permanent Head to an officer on transfer from one district to another shall be—

REMOVAL OF FURNITURE

35. Reimbursement of cost of removing furniture shall be subject to the following limitations:—

36. In providing for cost of removal only necessary household furniture and effects shall be taken into consideration.

37. Cost of removal shall not be allowed on the effects set out hereunder:—

- Dog-kennels.
- Plants in boxes or pots.
- Wood and coal.
- Horses, vehicles, harness, except when such are portion of equipment in connection with official work.
- Live-stock—poultry, cows, &c.
- Clothes-props, garden-seats, timber or material connected with outside structures.
- Aviaries and beehives.
- Boats.

38. Before removal is undertaken the officer shall, where practicable, obtain offers from at least two carriers and submit them to the Permanent Head, who may authorize the acceptance of the more suitable, provided that the maximum amount above stated is not exceeded.

39. The Permanent Head may, in lieu of the actual cost of removal, authorize payment of a lump sum not exceeding the maximum prescribed for removal expenses.

40. Vouchers must be produced for all sums paid over 5s.

41. Where exceptional circumstances can be shown to exist, a reasonable amount in excess of the maximum under these regulations may be authorized by the Commissioner.

42. In the case of a new appointment the Commissioner may allow such sum as in his opinion is reasonable to cover the cost of conveyance of the officer to his destination.

higher position, payment in addition to salary at a rate equal to the difference between his salary and the minimum salary of the class or grade of the higher position, or £10 per annum, whichever is the higher: Provided that in no case shall the payment in addition to salary exceed the rate of £150 per annum.

PAYMENT OF SALARY AFTER SUSPENSION.

52. Unless it shall be otherwise specially ordered by the Commissioner, if any officer be suspended pending the investigation of any complaint or accusation against him, and he be afterwards dismissed from the Service, he shall receive no salary or pay from the date of his suspension; if he be reduced, the reduced rate of salary or pay shall take effect from the date of his suspension; but if he be fully acquitted of the charges made against him he shall receive arrears of pay in full from the date of his suspension.

BICYCLE ALLOWANCE.

53. An allowance not exceeding £5 per annum (to be fixed by the Permanent Head) may be made for the use by an officer of his own bicycle on official business.

MISCELLANEOUS.

NOTICE TO OFFICERS.

54. Whenever notice is by the said Act required to be given to an officer of any decision or of any other matter, it shall be sufficient if notice of such decision or matter is sent to such officer by a post-letter addressed to him at the office in which he is employed.

OFFICERS ON LEAVE.

55. Every officer passing through Wellington should, if time permits, report himself at the Head Office of his Department.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF REGULATIONS.

56. Any officer or temporary employee committing a breach of any of these regulations for which no specific penalty is provided is liable to a fine not exceeding £10. If the Commissioner so directs, such fine shall not be enforced for three months, and, if the officer's conduct has been satisfactory in the meantime, it may then be remitted. If enforced, it shall be deducted from the salary or wages payable to such officer or employee and paid into the Public Service Superannuation Fund. A record of all such fines shall be kept.

Amendments in the Stores Regulations made under the Public Service Act, 1912.

WHEREAS by section thirty-four of the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor in Council, is authorized to make regulations for the carrying-out of the provisions of the said Act:

Now, therefore, the Commissioner, in pursuance and exercise of the said authority, and with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby, in respect of the Stores Regulations made under the authority of the said Act on the eighteenth day of April,

one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the nineteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and the amendments thereof, make the further amendments set forth in the schedule hereto, and doth order that such amendments shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

PARAGRAPH (k) of Regulation No. 4 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

“(k.) Every person, firm, or company submitting a tender to the Stores Tender Board must either—

“(1.) Forward with each tender a deposit in the form and for the amount described in the general or special conditions of the contract, or—

“(2.) With the approval of the Stores Tender Board, place upon fixed deposit in the name of the Chairman of the Stores Tender Board in some bank in New Zealand approved by the said Chairman, the sum of £100 to cover all deposits required to accompany tenders submitted by the person, firm, or company tendering; which sum shall, whenever the Board directs that a deposit shall be forfeited, be drawn upon by the Chairman of the Board to the extent of the deposit specified in the general or special conditions of the contract:

“Provided that the Stores Tender Board may at any time by resolution recorded in its minutes require, in respect of the tender for any particular contract, a special deposit, apart from the said sum of £100, in the form and for the amount described in the general or special conditions of the contract.

“Except in those cases where a fixed deposit as aforesaid has been made, any tender received without a deposit, or with a deposit in any form other than that described in the said general or special conditions of contract, is liable to be declared informal and rejected on that ground.”

“All entries in respect to matters affecting stores transactions must be made only in the books or forms prescribed, and the use of scraps of paper liable to be mislaid or lost is strictly forbidden.”

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
