N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities A pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Footwear Regulation Act, 1913 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act; and doth hereby declare that the said acqualations shall come into force on the Gard that the said regulations shall come into force on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen.

REGULATIONS.

Where a statement of the material or materials composing the soles of any boots or shoes is required, pursuant to section 4 of the said Act, to be stamped on or impressed into the outer surface of the soles of those boots or shoes, the following

outer surface of the soles of those boots or shoes, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a.) The said statement shall be stamped in indelible ink on the soles of such boots or shoes, and shall be in bold type of such size and distinctness that the statement may be read with ease by any person of normal sight at a distance of at least 5 ft.; or

(b.) The said statement shall be impressed into the soles by means of sunk or branded lettering of such size and distinctness that the statement may be read with ease by any person of normal sight at a distance of at least 5 ft., or shall be embossed on the soles in lettering of like size and distinctness.

2. Every person who manufactures for sale, or sells, offers, or exposes for sale, or has in his possession for sale, any boots or shoes the soles of which are required to be stamped or impressed in the manner prescribed by the last preceding regulation, but which are not so stamped or impressed, shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £10.

3. Nothing in these regulations shall be deemed to limit or

restrict the provisions of subsection (3) of section 4 of the said

GUATEMALA EXTRADITION ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1914. (Amendment of Article 10 of Treaty of July 4, 1885.) At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 1st day of September, 1914.

THEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it Was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any Foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such Foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions,

and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the 4th day of
July, 1885, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the President of the Republic of Guatemala for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, in the case of which Treaty the Extradition Acts of 1870 and 1873 were applied by Order in Council of the 26th November, 1886:

And whereas a Protocol was concluded on the 30th day of May, 1914, between the British and Guatemalan Governments amending the provisions of Article 10 of the said Treaty, which Protocol is in the terms following:—

Additional Protocol to the Treaty of Extradition between Great Britain and Guatemala.

The Government of His Britannic Majesty and the Government of the Republic of Guatemala, being desirous of rendering more efficacious the provisions of Article 10 of the Treaty of Extradition between Great Britain and Guatemala of the 4th July, 1885, the undersigned, duly authorized to that effect by their respective Governments, have agreed as follows :-

ARTICLE 1.

The text of Article 10 of the Extradition Treaty of the 4th July, 1885, is amended by the substitution of the words "sixty days" for the words "thirty days" in the last sensaxly days for the words thirty days in the last sentence of paragraph 1.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present Protocol and have affixed thereto their seals.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 678, against 572 in September—an increase of 106. The deaths in October were 268—a decrease of 1 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 149, females 119. Forty-one of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 15.30 per cent. of the whole number: 29 of these were under one year of age.

There were 116 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 97 in September. The following table shows the classification:—

IOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :-

- 1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- 2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
- 3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
