3. Earth-wires where led down poles shall be protected by a casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground. A test shall be made every three months, and oftener if required, of all earths to ensure that the earth-wire is intact and that the earth is effective.

4. The licensee shall not use the said electric lines, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the licensee that he has re-ceived from the Engineer appointed by him to inspect the works a certificate that they have been satisfactorily carried out.

5. The said electric lines, including their supports, their conductors, and ther insulated covering, shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained by the licensee as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions, and shall

not be permitted by the licensee to remain erected after they have ceased to be used for the supply of electricity. 6. This license, and the benefits and obligations here-under, shall not be assigned by the licensee without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the trans-teree is funancially and otherwise able to corres out the ch

proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the trans-fere is financially and otherwise able to carry out the ob-ligations specified in this license. 7. If the licensee fails to comply with any of the con-ditions of this license the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the licensee within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice; and if the licensee fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period it shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown. 8. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause

8. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the licensee fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this

9. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the licensee, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the said works and inspect the same.

10. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use the electric lines except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Port Chalmers Borough Council.

11. #### COUNTY OF TARANAKI.

WHEREAS pursuant to section 34 of the Counties Amendment Act, 1913, a portion of the Moa Road District of the Moa Riding of the County of Taranaki, as described in New Zealand Gazette of 24th September, 1914, has been annexed to the outlying district of the Mangorei Riding of the County of Taranaki, and doubt exists as to the boundary of such ridings when such annexation takes place on the 31st March, 1915 : And whereas it is expedient to describe the boundaries of the Moa and Mangorei Ridings and to redefine the boundaries of the Moa Road District as from the 1st of April, 1915 : Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in the Council by section 23 of the Counties Act, 1908, the Council of the County of Taranaki doth hereby declare that the area described in the First Schedule here to shall, from the 1st day of April, 1915, comprise the Mangorei Riding. #### GENERAL NOTICES.

**CAUTION.**—MINES IN THE NORTH SEA.—The Admiralty wish to draw attention to their prev. warning to vessels of the dangers of traversing the North Sea owing to mines. In the dangers of traversing the North Sea owing to mines. In the circumstances the Admiralty desire to impress not only upon British but on neutral shipping the vital importance of touching at British ports before entering the North Sea, in order to ascertain, according to the latest information, the routes and chans. which the Admiralty are keeping swept and along which these dangers to shipping are reduced as far as possible. SPECIAL NOTICE TO MARINERS.—CREWS OF MERCHANT SHIPS CAPTURED BY A BELLIGERENT.—The following are the regs. regarding the crews of enemy merchant ships captured by a belligerent, which form part of the convention relative to certain restrictions on the exercise of the right of capture in maritime war, annexed to the Final Act of the Second Peace Conference held at the Hague in 1907 :---

# Chapter III. Regs. regarding the Crews of Enemy Merchant Ships captured by a Belligerent.

Article 5. When an enemy merchant ship is captured by a belligerent, such of its crew as are subjects or citizens of a neutral State are not made prisoners of war. The same prinneutral State are not made prisoners of war. The same prin-ciple applies in the case of the captain and officers, likewise or citizens of a neutral State, if they give a formal undertaking in writing not to serve on an enemy ship while the war lasts.

Article 6. The captain, officers, and members of the crew if subjects or citizens of the enemy State, are not made prisoners of war, provided that they undertake, on the faith

prisoners of war, provided that they undertake, on the faith of a written promise, not to engage while hostilities last in any service connected with the operations of the war. Article 7. The names of the persons retaining their liberty under the conditions laid down in Article 5, in the second paragraph, and in Article 6, are notified by the belligerent captor to the other belligerent. The latter is forbidden

knowingly to employ the said persons. Article 8. The provisions of the three preceding Articles do not apply to ships taking part in hostilities. Sept.

WIRELESS TEL.-1. The use of wireless tel. is prohibited in the harbs. and territorial waters of the United Kingdom and Channel Isls. 2. On entering any port or harb. or on directions being given to that effect by any naval, military, exam. service, Customs, or police officer, the aerial wire or antenna is to be at once lowered, disconnected from its halliards and from the operating-room, and is not to be rehoisted while the ship remains in British territorial waters. 3. Any breach of these regs. renders the masters of offending ships liable to penalties and to the confiscation of the wireless apparatus of their ships. NoTE.—These regs. do not apply to ships owned (not chartered) by the Admiralty, whether they fly the blue or the red Ensign. Admiralty, Sept.

#### GOVERNMENT WAR INSURANCE SCHEME.

It is an essential feature of the Government War Risks Insurance Scheme that all insured ships must obey implicitly all orders and directions given by the Admiralty as to routes, ports of call, stoppages, &c. To avoid misapprehension on this point, the Board of Trade wish it to be clearly understood that this provision is intended to secure the safety of both ship and cargo, and that any deviation which may be rendered necessary in consequence of Admiralty orders or directions is in the interest of the cargo as well as of the ship. It is important that this fact should be borne in mind by all parties concerned in the shipment or carriage of goods on insured ships, and that in contracts of carriage the ship-owner's obligation to comply with the Admiralty requirements should be fully recognized. Oct.

#### SWEEPING OPERATIONS.

CAUTION.—H.M. vessels are frequently engaged in sweeping operations off ports in the United Kingdom or Canada. Whilst so engaged they work in pairs, connected by a wire hawser, and are consequently hampered to a very considerable extent in their manœuvring powers. With a view to indic. the nature of the work on which these vessels are engaged, they will show the following sigs. : A black ball at the fore-mast head and a similar ball at the yardarm, or where it can best be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous for vessels to ness. For which store where the present to pass. For mutual safety, other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, should ondeavour, without violating the Rule of the Road, to keep out of the way of vessels flying this sig., and should especially remember that it is dangerous to pass between the vessels of a pair. ADMIRALTY ORDER.-The use of the Blue Ensign by ADMIRALTY URDER.—The use of the *Blue Ensign* by merchant vessels is prohibited, and no vessel will be allowed to fly the *Blue Ensign* except under special Admiralty warrant issued subsequently to the 24th Aug., 1914. All outstanding warrants are therefore to be regarded as non-effective. Oct.

All incoming vessels flying foreign flags and all British vessels from all foreign and colonial ports must call at the new pilot-station now established in the vicinity of the Tongue Light-vessel, or at one of the established pilot-stations—viz., the Sunk Light-vessel, Margate, Deal, and Dover, and be conducted to their destination by a licensed

pilot. All outgoing vessels of the same description must before sailing obtain the services of a licensed pilot to conduct them to sea

All incoming vessels not included in the above, before leaving their port of departure for the Thames, and all similar outgoing vessels, must obtain instructions from the

nearest Customs authorities as to the channels to be used. These arrangements are to take effect from noon, Monday, the 14th September.

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### SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

### Director : Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :--

- 1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- 2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
- 3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
