License authorizing the Wellington City Corporation to erect Electric Lines from the Overhead Trolley-wire in Adelaide Road to the Premises of the Denhard Automatic Baking Company (Limited).

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act :

And whereas the Wellington City Corporation (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect electric lines from the trolley-wire in Adelaide Road to the premises of

the Denhard Automatic Baking Company (Limited), situated on Town Acre 906, in the City of Wellington (hereinafter referred to as "the said electric lines"), and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain the said electric lines for the purpose of supplying electrical energy to a $7\frac{1}{2}$ horse-power motor on the aforesaid premises, such electric lines and the position of the premises being indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 35968, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS.

1. The conductors shall be supported at a minimum height of 20 ft. above the surface of the ground.

2. The positive lines shall consist of 7/16 S.W.G. copper wires, insulated with vulcanized indiarubber of 600-megohm grade, and the negative lines of 7/16 S.W.G. copper wires, which may be bare. The lines shall be insulated by means of porcelain insulators, carried on substantial hardwood poles placed not more than 200 ft. apart.

3. A fuse cut-out shall be placed on the positive conductor where it leaves the tramway trolley-wire, to operate at 50 per cent. above the maximum load of the circuit. A switch and a fuse that will operate with 50 per cent. excess current over the full load of the circuit shall be inserted at the distribution-box on the positive conductor in each lighting circuit, and for a motor circuit a switch and circuit-breaker set to operate with an overload of 50 per cent. excess current, and with a no-load release, shall be inserted in the positive conductor and placed near each motor respectively.

4. The negative conductor shall be continuous throughout its length from the distribution-box or the motor terminal to the tramway-rail, to which it shall be effectively bonded.

5. The conductors shall be carried on substantial supports, which shall be designed to have a factor of safety of five under a wind-pressure of 30 lb. per square foot.

6. At crossings the conductors shall pass over or under the telegraph wires, as may be decided by the Minister of Telegraphs. Where the conductors cross telegraph or telephone wires, or if any telegraph or telephone wire is hereafter installed so as to cross the conductors, and at such other points as may be deemed necessary by the Minister of Telegraphs, substantial guard-wires effectively earthed shall be erected by or at the cost of the licensee. Such guard-wires shall consist of two-stranded galvanized-steel wires carried on substantial supports at a height of 2 ft. above the conductors if the telegraph or telephone wires pass over the conductors, or 2 ft. above the telegraph or telephone wires if they pass under the conductors. Earth-wires where led down poles shall be protected by a casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground.

7. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government Railways until the licensee has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto, as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).

8. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of September, 1914, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of October, 1914.

9. The licensee shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

10. The licensee shall not use the said electric lines, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the licensee that he has received from the Engineer appointed by him to inspect the works a certificate that they have been satisfactorily carried out.

11. The said electric lines, including their supports, their conductors, and their insulated covering, shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained by the licensee as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions, and shall not be permitted by the licensee to remain erected after they have ceased to be used for the supply of electricity.

12. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the licensee without the expressed consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained ;

but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

13. If the licensee fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license, the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the licensee within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice ; and if the licensee fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period, the licensee shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.

14. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the licensee fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

15. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the licensee, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect same.

16. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works ; nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the licensee for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public works as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

17. This license shall come into force on and after the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

Regulations in respect of Motions for Apportionment of Compensation-moneys under Section 9 of the Workers' Compensation Amendment Act, 1913.

1. WHERE any sum of money by way of compensation in respect of the death of a worker shall have been paid to the Public Trustee under the provisions of section 9, subsection (1), of the Workers' Compensation Amendment Act, 1913, and no judgment or order of the Court of Arbitration has been delivered or made disposing of or apportioning the same, an order of the Court may, upon motion in that behalf, be obtained apportioning the said sum among the dependants of the deceased.

2. If the Public Trustee shall move for an order under Rule 1 hereof the following rules shall apply:—

(a.) The Public Trustee shall file in the office of the Clerk of Awards at Wellington a notice of motion in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto.

(b.) Such notice of motion shall be supported by an affidavit by the solicitor to the Public Trust Office, or by some other person having a knowledge of the facts, setting out the names of the dependants in full, and in the case of children the respective ages of such children, and their earnings (if any), together with such other facts as he shall deem relevant to the motion.

(c.) Such motion may be made *ex parte*, and it shall be the duty of the Clerk of Awards to forward the file to the Court forthwith.

(d.) If the matter is one of simple apportionment, and the facts are clear, the Public Trustee may file with such notice of motion an order in terms of the motion for the signature of the Judge of the Court, together with so many copies thereof as shall be required, and upon such order having been made the file shall be returned to the Clerk of Awards.

3. If within one month after the receipt by the Public Trustee of such compensation-moneys application be made for an order of apportionment by any person claiming to be a dependant of the deceased worker, the following rules shall apply:—

a.) The person so applying, or his solicitor, shall file in the office of the Clerk of Awards for the district in which the deceased worker resided immediately prior to his death a notice of motion, *mutatis mutandis*, in the said form, and shall file therewith an affidavit as to the facts in terms of Rule 2 (b) hereof, together with such further affidavits as he shall deem necessary, and shall endorse upon such notice of motion references to any decided cases which he may desire to cite in support thereof, and shall, at the time of filing such notice of motion and affidavit or affidavits, serve upon the nearest District Manager or Deputy Public Trustee a true copy of every document so filed.

(b.) Within fourteen days after the service upon such District Manager or Deputy Public Trustee of such notice of motion as aforesaid, the Public Trustee shall file in the office of the said Clerk of Awards a memorandum of his consent to such motion, or otherwise his objections thereto with legal argument thereon (if any), and such objections may be supported by such affidavit or affidavits as he shall deem necessary in support of such objections. It shall be the duty of the said Clerk of Awards to forward to the Court forthwith such memorandum and affidavit or affidavits (if any). The Court may make such order thereon as to it shall seem fit, and the file shall be returned to the Clerk of Awards.

THE Auckland Harbour Board have notified that beacons have been erected at the eastern and western ends of the rock in mid-channel of the Tamaki River off the Panmure Wharf.

The outer or easternmost beacon is diamond in shape and red in colour, and bears 150° (S. 45° E. magnetic) from the end of the wharf and distant 140 ft. The inner or westernmost beacon is triangular in shape and red in colour, and bears 251° (S. 56° W. magnetic) from the eastern beacon and distant 320 ft. The beacons mark the extreme east and west points of the rock which shows just awash at L.W.S.T.

Suspending certain Statutory and other Provisions prohibiting the Employment of Workers for Extended Hours.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twentieth day of August, 1914.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section twenty-five of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, it is provided that at any time while His Majesty is at war with any foreign Prince or State the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council, if satisfied that such a course is necessary in the public interest, modify or suspend wholly or partially, and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit, all or any of the provisions of any industrial award or industrial agreement under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments, and all or any of the provisions of the Shops and Offices Act, 1908, and the Factories Act, 1908, and their amendments:

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that it is necessary in the public interest to suspend certain of the above-recited provisions, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section twenty-five of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby suspend those provisions of the Shops and Offices Act, 1908, and the Factories Act, 1908, and their amendments, and of any award or industrial agreement under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments, which prohibit the employment of workers, shop-assistants, or office assistants on holidays or half-holidays, or after or beyond the hours of employment specified therein (whether ordinary time or overtime) or after the closing-hours for offices; provided that such suspension shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(1.) In the case of all females employed in factories, shops, and offices, and in all cases where the consent of an Inspector of Factories is ordinarily required under any of those provisions to enable extended hours to be worked, the suspension shall have effect only if the consent of an Inspector of Factories has been obtained for the working of any additional extended hours under the authority of this Order in Council, and such consent shall not be granted unless the Inspector is satisfied that the extension of hours is rendered necessary by a demand for goods or supplies which are urgently required in consequence of the war; and also, in giving or withholding his consent, the Inspector shall have regard to the health of the workers concerned.

(2.) All extended hours, including those worked on holidays and half-holidays, worked under the authority of this Order in Council, shall be paid for at the rate for extended hours specified in the Act, or award, or industrial agreement applicable thereto, not being less than at the rate of time and a quarter, or, if a rate for extended hours is not specified therein, then at the rate of time and a quarter, otherwise the aforesaid suspension shall not have effect.
