Certain Lands included in City of Wellington.

 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS a petition, publicly notified, has been presented to me under section one hundred and nineteen of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, by the Council of the City of Wellington, praying me to alter the boundaries of the City of Wellington so as to include therein the pieces of land described in the Schedule hereto, being lands that ought reasonably to be included in the said city, and in respect of which there are no electors:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said city are hereby altered so as to include within the limits of the said city the lands described in the said Schedule hereto, being lands that ought reasonably to be included in the said city, and in respect of which there are no electors.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area covered by the waters of Port Nicholson and surrounding concrete walls adjoining Clyde Quay, City of Wellington, and containing approximately 1 acre, known as the Te Aro Baths.

Also all that area covered by the waters of Port Nicholson adjoining Thorndon Esplanade, City of Wellington, and containing approximately 2 roods, known as the Thorndon Baths.

Districts constituted under the Marriage Act, 1908.

 A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage district known as the Pukekohe District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

PUKEKOHE DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north generally by the northern boundaries of Puni, Pukekohe, and Mangatawhiri Parishes, from the Mauku Stream to the junction of roads at the eastern corner of Allotment No. 51, Mangatawhiri Parish; thence by the road forming the southern boundary of that allotment, the road forming part of the eastern boundary of Allotment No. 73, and the eastern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 25, 24, and 23, to the northernmost corner of Allotment No. 22; thence by Allotments Nos. 22, 46, 45, 44, 43, 42, and 41, Mangatawhiri Parish, to the western boundary of that parish; thence by the said Mangatawhiri Parish to and across the Waikato River and by the left bank of that river to the mouth of the Opuatia Stream; thence by the said Opuatia Stream to the northern boundary of Allotment No. 8, Opuatia Parish; thence towards the south generally by the said Allotment No. 8 to the Opuatia Stream, and by that stream to its confluence with the Mangatea Stream; thence by the Mangatea Stream to the northern boundary of Whangape Parish, and by that boundary to the north-eastern corner of Allotment No. 104, Whangape Parish, in Block XIV, Onewhero Survey District; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that allotment and the southern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 108, 103, and 106, Whangape Parish, to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a right line running due west to the sea; thence towards the north-west by the sea to the mouth of the Waikato River and by the left bank of that river to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Waiuku East Parish; thence by

a right line across the Waikato River and by the said Waiuku East Parish to the place of commencement.

MERCER DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north generally by the northern boundaries of Mangatawhiri and Koheroa Parishes, from the junction of roads at the eastern corner of Allotment No. 51, Mangatawhiri Parish, to the Mangatangi Stream; thence towards the south-east generally by that stream to its confluence with the Maramarua River; thence by the said Maramarua River to its confluence with the Whangamarino River, and by that river to its confluence with the Waikato River; thence by a line running due west across the Waikato River, and by its left bank to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Tuakau Parish; thence towards the west generally by a right line across the Waikato River and by Tuakau and Pukekohe Parishes to the southernmost corner of Allotment No. 38, Mangatawhiri Parish; thence by Allotments Nos. 38, 37, 36, 35, 34, and 23, Mangatawhiri Parish, and the road forming the eastern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 23, 24, 25, and part of 73, and the road forming the southern boundary of Allotment No. 51, Mangatawhiri Parish, to the junction of roads at the eastern corner of that allotment, the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section thirty-nine of the Harbours Amendment Act, 1910 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that in the case of lands between high- and low-water marks which belong to the Crown, and on which at high-water spring tides the depth of water is not sufficient for purposes of navigation, the Governor in Council may grant occupation licenses for periods not exceeding twenty-one years, at such rent and on such conditions as he thinks fit, and any such lease may contain a provision authorizing the lessee to reclaim the land the subject of the lease without complying with the requirements of section forty-one of the said Act :

And whereas it is desirable to license William Russek, of Waiwera, to occupy a part of the land between high- and low-water marks, belonging to the Crown, on the Puhoi River on which at high-water spring tides the depth of water is not sufficient for purposes of navigation :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby license William Russek, of Waiwera (hereinafter called "the licensee"), to occupy the piece of land between high- and low-water marks of spring tides on the Puhoi River inside the red line shown on plan marked M.D. 4319, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington ; and doth also authorize the said licensee to reclaim the land subject to this license by constructing a wall over it as shown by the red line on the said plan, without complying with the requirements of section forty-one of the said Act, this license to be subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. THE licensee shall pay to the Marine Department an annual rent of 10s., the first of such payments to be made on the issue of this Order in Council, and subsequent payments to be made on the 1st day of September in each year.
2. If the Marine Department considers that there is undue delay in constructing the wall it may, by notice in writing, require the licensee to complete its construction within such time as may be specified in the license, and failure to do so shall be deemed to be a breach of the conditions of the license.
3. The licensee shall keep any retaining-wall which he may construct for the purpose of reclaiming the land included in this license in good order and condition, and shall provide and maintain all necessary outlets for storm-water.
4. The licensee shall keep the land included in this license free from noxious weeds.
5. The licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any right, power, or privilege granted by this license without the previous written consent of the Minister of Marine.
6. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for twenty-one years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.
7. If the licensee commits or suffers a breach of any of the conditions of this license, the license may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council ; and publication of a notice of such revocation in the *New Zealand Gazette* shall be sufficient notice thereof to the licensee, and all persons concerned or interested in this license, that it has been revoked and determined.

Powers delegated to the Whangarei Borough Council under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908.

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Second Schedule hereto (being land reserved under the said Act), for the period of three years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned body, namely,—

THE WHANGAREI BOROUGH COUNCIL,

which is hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Whangarei Scenic Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

MEETINGS.

1. THE Board shall meet for the transaction of business at the Borough Council office after the conclusion of business at the ordinary meeting of the Council on the fourth Monday in each month, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held during the month of September, 1914.

2. The Mayor shall be the Chairman of the Board, and may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any five members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the 31st day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

8. The Board shall not lease any portion of the reserve, or permit any grazing thereon, without the permission of the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation having been previously obtained.

OFFENCES.

9. Every person is liable to a penalty of £100 who, without the written consent of the Minister of Lands first obtained,—

- (a.) Lights a fire within the limits of a reserve; or
- (b.) Cuts or removes any timber or bush thereon; or
- (c.) In any way interferes with or damages the scenic or historic features thereof.

10. No person shall, within the limits of a reserve, without the written consent of the Board first obtained,—

- (a.) Take, carry, or use firearms, or any fireworks, or any explosive, or any weapon or instrument of a dangerous nature.
- (b.) Shoot, snare, or destroy any bird, or take or destroy the nests or eggs of any birds.
- (c.) Shoot, kill, or injure any animal, or remove any animal therefrom.

- (d.) Introduce any dog to follow him within the limits of a reserve; and any dog found within the limits of a reserve may be destroyed by any person authorized by the Board, either generally or in any particular case.

(e.) Damage any fence, gate, or barrier, or other property belonging to or in the custody of the Board.

(f.) Destroy, deface, or injure any inscription, or any label attached to or connected with any article, or tree, or shrub, or other plant, or copy of these regulations hung up or affixed at any entrance to or in any part of a reserve.

11. No horses, donkeys, sheep, goats, or cattle shall be allowed within the limits of a reserve without the written consent of the Board thereto being first obtained by the owners of such animals.

12. Any Inspector or person authorized for that purpose by the Board may drive any animal or animals trespassing in a reserve to the nearest public pound and there impound the same, and any such animal or animals shall not be released therefrom except upon payment of the usual driving-fees and poundage-charges. Nothing in this regulation contained shall be deemed to limit or prevent the taking of any proceedings for the recovery of any penalty or otherwise in respect of the trespass of such animal.

13. Wild cattle or horses trespassing within the limits of a reserve shall only be destroyed by persons authorized by the Board to do so, and such persons may be authorized to use firearms for that purpose.

14. No person shall, within the limits of a reserve, use any obscene or profane language, or commit any breach of the peace, act of indecency, or other impropriety, or insult or annoy any person.

15. No persons of bad repute, disorderly persons, or vagrants shall be allowed within the limits of a reserve.

16. Every person who commits any breach of Regulations Nos. 9 to 15 is liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER,
CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION
DEPARTMENT.

Director : Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
