Exchange of Land in Annan Settlement, Canterbury Land District, for other Land.

 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and twenty-nine of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1913, it is enacted that on the transfer to His Majesty of the land described in the First Schedule hereto, free from incumbrance, the Governor shall by Proclamation declare that the land described in the Second Schedule hereto shall, as from the date of the said Proclamation, cease to be land comprised in a lease in perpetuity granted on the twenty-seventh day of November, one thousand nine hundred and three, and that the land described in the said First Schedule shall be deemed to be land comprised in the said lease:

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the lands described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said lands should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereunder shall be scenic reserves under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 20, of the third day of March following, the Kauri Timber Company (Limited), of Auckland (hereinafter called "the company"), was licensed to use and occupy parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Te Kopuru, in Kaipara Harbour, as shown on plans marked M.D. 2038, 2179, and 2420 respectively, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to erect thereon wharves, as shown on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for a term of five years, computed from the twenty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine:

And whereas the said license having expired, the company has made application for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a term of five years, computed from the expiry of the term of the above-mentioned license, and it is expedient to grant the same for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed, and to prescribe the dues and rates to be charged and taken for the use of the said wharves:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy those parts of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto, which are particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the aforesaid wharves in connection therewith, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall, as from the twenty-first day of De-

ember, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, be charged and taken for the use of the said wharves, or any of them.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore occupied by the said wharves, as shown on plans marked M.D. 2038, 2179, and 2420.

In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £6 in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharves, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharves without payment.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharves in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. The company shall clear all trucks and trollies off the tramways on the wharves at the close of each day's work.

8. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharves and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharves, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

10. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharves shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

11. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for five years from the twenty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

12. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand.

13. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharves, or either of them, may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

14. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharves for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), Elizabeth Josephine Cooper (hereinafter called "the licensee") has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore at Horeke, in Hokianga Harbour, in order to erect and maintain a store thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 4347), showing the area of foreshore intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the said store:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore on which the said store is to be erected, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said store thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the erection of the store as shown on the plan marked M.D. 4347.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £4 payable in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said store without payment.

5. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned store in good order and repair.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said store and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such store, requiring her within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, she shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written authority of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

10. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said store may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on her part.

11. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said store for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. The erection of the said store shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten, regulations were made under the authority of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), *inter alia* prescribing the treatment to be accorded to short-paid or irregularly posted printed or commercial papers: And whereas it is desirable to add to such regulations in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulation set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth order that the regulation hereby made shall be read as part of the regulations made under the heading "Short-paid or Irregularly Posted" by the hereinbefore-mentioned Order in Council of the seventeenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and shall come into force from the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

ARTICLES OF VALUE.

23. No articles of value such as coupons, tickets, scrip, or similar articles are allowed to be enclosed in a packet of printed or commercial papers. Should any such article be detected enclosed in a printed or commercial paper the packet will be charged double deficiency at letter rate of postage.

WHEREAS by subsection one of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, it is, *inter alia*, provided that the said section shall not apply in any case where the local authority having control of any road or street by resolution declares that the provisions thereof shall not apply to any specified road or street, or any specified part thereof, and such resolution is approved by the Governor in Council:

And whereas by subsection two of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, it is provided that such approval may be either absolute or subject to such conditions with respect to the building-line as the Governor, by Order in Council, thinks fit to impose:

And whereas the Portobello Road Board, being the local authority having control of the portion of road described in the Schedule hereto, did, by resolution, declare that the provisions of the said section one hundred and seventeen should not apply to the said portion of road:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that such resolution should be approved:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the above-in-part-recited Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the said resolution in so far as it affects the said portion of road described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that portion of road in the Portobello Road District, Otago Land District, adjoining Sections 1 and 2, Block I, Portobello Bay District, being a distance of 30 chains, more or less; as the said portion of road is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 36486 and deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District, and thereon coloured brown.

The Education Act, 1914.—Payments to Education Boards; Grading of Schools; Staffs, Salaries, and Allowances; Training Colleges; Probationers; Pupil-teachers.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this twenty-first day of December, 1914.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE W. F. MASSEY, P.C., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke all regulations in force on the coming into operation of this Order relating to—

- (I.) Payments to Education Boards;
- (II.) Attendance Registers and Returns;
- (III.) Grading of Public Schools, Staffs, and Salaries of Teachers;
- (IV.) Training Colleges;
- (V.) Probationers; and
- (VI.) Pupil-teachers;

and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen.

REGULATIONS.

I. PAYMENTS TO EDUCATION BOARDS.

1. ON the 1st January in each year the schools in each education district shall be grouped in the five groups named in the Eighth Schedule to the Act, according to the yearly average attendance for each school for the year immediately preceding.

2. The general grants named in paragraph (c) (iii) of subsection (1) of section 6 of the Act for any education district in any year shall be calculated in accordance with the yearly average attendance of the year for which the payments are made: Provided that interim payments shall be made monthly, based on the grouping made on the 1st January of such year and on the yearly average attendance for the year immediately preceding: Provided, further, that in the case of a new school opened during the year payment shall be made at the rate determined by the average attendance for that year, and that in respect of every such new school and of each school closed during the year payment shall be made for every quarter during which the school was open not less than half the number of school days.

3. The sums payable to Boards under section 6 of the Act for the salaries and allowances of teachers, pupil-teachers, and probationers shall be paid to the Board in monthly instalments.

4. The moneys payable to the Boards for scholarships under sections 101 to 106 of the Act shall be paid to the Boards in quarterly instalments.

5. Any other moneys appropriated by Parliament as grants to the Boards shall be paid to the Boards in such proportions and at such times as shall be determined by the Minister.

6. Grants for special purposes shall be applied by Boards solely and exclusively to those purposes for which such grants have respectively been made, and the Minister may from time to time require from Boards statements showing in detail the application of any such special grants.

II. ATTENDANCE REGISTERS AND RETURNS.—AVERAGE ATTENDANCE.

I. Attendance Registers and Returns.

1. (1.) THE head teacher of every public school shall enrol in an admission register, in the form provided by the Department, the name of each child in the school, with such other particulars as are required by the register.

(2.) Such register may consist of a record card for every pupil in the form provided; but in such case this form of record must be consistently adopted throughout the school, a proper receptacle must be provided therefor, and due precautions must be taken to secure the completeness and permanence of the record.

2. The head teacher of every registered school shall keep a register of attendance in the form provided by the Department, and all the teachers in the school shall assist in keeping the register and in making up weekly and quarterly summaries of attendance.

3. The attendance of scholars in every school shall be registered every morning and every afternoon; provided that in no case shall the register be marked later than one hour and a half before the close of morning or afternoon school, as the case may be. The register shall be marked and kept in accordance with the directions printed thereon.

4. The attendance of a child at morning school shall be reckoned as one attendance, and the attendance of a child at afternoon school shall be reckoned as one attendance, and a school open in the morning and open in the afternoon shall be deemed to have been open twice. The school shall be held to be open any morning or afternoon if at least one child is present before the first half-hour of the ordinary school time has passed. The average attendance for any quarter or any lesser period shall be ascertained by first throwing out of account what shall be called "excepted" half-days—that is, every morning and every afternoon on which the attendances have numbered less than one-half of the number of pupils belonging at the time to the school—and by throwing out of account the attendances also of every such morning and such afternoon, and then by dividing the remaining number of attendances by the remaining number of half-days.

5. If any child whose name is entered upon the register of attendance of any school shall be duly attending at an examination conducted by the Department, or the Education Board, or the University of New Zealand, or at a recognized class for manual instruction, then the time necessarily spent by such child at such examination or class, or in travelling thereto, shall be reckoned as time spent in attendance at such school; and the head teacher thereat, upon receipt of a certificate under the hand of the Secretary to the Education Board or upon being otherwise sufficiently satisfied as to the number of half-day attendances to be recorded for such child on account of such examination or class as aforesaid, shall add the total of such attendances to the total of those previously entered in the register of attendance belonging to the said school. Every such certificate when received shall be fastened into the said register, and shall not be removed.

6. On the day on which the head teacher of a school first knows that a pupil has been definitely removed from his school, such head teacher shall record the removal in the admission register and in the register of daily attendance. He shall record also that a pupil has left the school when such pupil has been absent for any period of sixty-five consecutive school days. Such pupils shall forthwith be considered as ceasing to belong to the school, and in any computation of average attendance for any period thereafter their names shall not be taken into account in any way.

7. The head teacher of every school shall, as soon as possible after the end of each quarter, send to the Education Board, on the form provided by the Department, a return of attendance for such school for the quarter.

8. The Education Board of each district shall send to the Director of Education, as soon as possible after the end of each quarter, on the form provided by the Department, a statement of the quarterly attendances for all the schools in the district.

II. Average Attendance.

9. The yearly average attendance for any school or department thereof shall be the mean of the quarterly average attendances thereat for the four quarters ending 31st December:

Provided that if the average attendance at any school or department for any one quarter is such as to make the yearly average attendance less than the minimum of the grade or subgrade in which the school or department would be placed if it were graded on the mean of the quarterly average attendances for the other three quarters of the year, then the mean of such last-named three quarterly average attendances shall be deemed to be the yearly average attendance for such school or department.

Provided further that if it is shown to the satisfaction of the Minister, on the certificate of the District Health Officer, that an infectious disease of an epidemic character has during one or two quarters been locally prevalent to the extent of affecting 10 per cent. or more of the children in any school or department, then the mean of the quarterly average attendance for the remaining three or two quarters of the year shall be deemed to be the yearly average attendance for such school or department.

10. (1.) The quarterly average attendance for any education district shall be the total of the quarterly average attendances of all the schools in such district.

(2.) The yearly average attendance for any district shall be the mean of the quarterly average attendances for such district for the four quarters ending 31st December.

11. In the case of a new school the mean of the quarterly average attendances for the year in which the school has been open continuously for not less than one quarter immediately preceding the end of such year shall be deemed to be the yearly average attendance for such year; but the average attendance for any period before the quarter during the whole of which the school is open shall not be taken into account in calculating the quarterly or yearly average attendance. A school that is reopened shall be deemed to be a new school if it has been closed for more than six months immediately preceding such reopening.

12. In the case of the opening of a new school, or in the case of the closing of a school, if such school is open for less than half the number of school days in the first or last quarter (as the case may be) in which the school is open, then in computing the quarterly average attendance for the district for such quarter the average attendance at the said school shall not be taken into account.

13. (1.) When during any year—

(a.) A side school is separated from a main school and established as a mixed or separate school:

(b.) A side school is attached to a main school:

(c.) Two or more full-time schools are established as a group of part-time schools:

(d.) A part-time school is established as a full-time school:

(e.) A public school is established as a district high school:

then in any of these cases the school or group of schools so established shall be deemed to be a new school.

(2.) In the case of a main school from which during any year a side school has been separated, the yearly average attendance for that year shall be the mean of the quarterly average attendances of the main school for the several quarters of the year; but the yearly average attendance for any previous year or years shall not be affected by the separation.

14. The average attendance of a side school or of a part-time school shall be calculated for all purposes for which it is required under the Act in the same way as the average attendance of a mixed or separate school.

III. GRADING OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS, STAFFS, AND SALARIES OF TEACHERS.

1. (1.) On the 1st January in each year the schools in each education district shall be classified by the Board in the grades and subgrades named in the Fifth Schedule to the Act, according to the yearly average attendance for each school for the year immediately preceding.

(2.) The grade of a school, however, shall not be reduced unless such attendance, or the mean of the attendance for the two years or for the three years immediately preceding the said 1st January, is as low as is indicated in Table A hereto.

2. (1.) On the 1st January in each year the number of teachers and pupil-teachers in any school other than a district high school or in the primary department of any district high school shall be determined by the yearly average attendance for the year immediately preceding:

Provided that if at the beginning of any subsequent quarter it appears that the attendance in any such school or department has increased so that the mean of the quarterly average attendance for the three quarters, or for the two quarters, or the attendance for the quarter immediately preceding is as high as that shown in column (2), or column (3), or column (4), as the case may be, of Table B hereto, the Board may make such addition to the Staff as is required to bring the number of teachers and pupil-teachers for that quarter up to the number prescribed for a school having the average attendance shown in column (5) of that table: Provided also that if at the beginning of any quarter it appears that the average attendance in any such school or department has decreased so that—

- (i.) The mean of the average attendance for the three quarters immediately preceding, *and*
 - (ii.) The mean of the average attendance for the two quarters immediately preceding, *and*
 - (iii.) The average attendance for the quarter immediately preceding have fallen as low as indicated in columns (2), (3), and (4), respectively, of Table C hereto, then the staff shall be reduced to that prescribed for a school having the average attendance shown in column (5) of that table.
- In the case of any one of the events referred to in the last preceding paragraphs (i), (ii), (iii), the Board may, at its discretion, reduce the staff accordingly.

(2.) Nothing in this clause shall be deemed to affect the grade in which a school is placed, or to affect the salary of any teacher.

3. (1.) In any school placed on the 1st January in Grade 0 the yearly average attendance on which the amount payable for or on account of the salary for any quarter shall be paid shall be the yearly average attendance for the year ended 31st December preceding, or the mean of the average attendance for the four quarters immediately preceding, whichever is the higher.

(2.) If, however, a school in Grade 0 has an average attendance for the preceding quarter of 16, or for two, three, or four quarters immediately preceding of 14, or 12, or 9 (as the case may be) the school shall be placed in Grade I.

4. In the case of a new school the staff, salaries, and allowances of such school shall be in accordance with the average attendance, as follows:—

- (i.) For the period from the date of opening until the end of the quarter in which the school was opened, as for the average attendance for such period;
- (ii.) For the first quarter during the whole of which the school is open, as for the average attendance for that quarter; *and*
- (iii.) Thereafter, as for the mean of the quarterly average attendances for the several quarters until the 31st December next ensuing.

5. In the case of a main school from which during any year a side school has been separated, such separation shall not affect the grade of the school for that year; but the staff of the school shall, from the date of the separation, be determined in accordance with the yearly average attendance of the main school for the preceding year.

6. The teacher of a part-time school which has been established as a full-time school shall, if he was the head teacher of a group of part-time schools, be considered for the purposes of subsection (7) of section 79 of the Act as remaining in the same position.

7. As soon as, under the provisions of the Act and of these regulations, a reduction in the staff of a school is imminent, it shall be the duty of the Board to give notice to every teacher whom it may deem necessary to discharge in order to carry out such reduction.

8. (1.) In the case of a reduction in the staff of a school, or in the case of the closing of a school, such amount shall be paid to the Board in respect of the teachers whose services are dispensed with as will enable the Board to comply with section 82 of the Act; but, with the exceptions set forth in subclause (2) hereof, on no account will payment be made to the Board for the salary of any teacher for a longer period than four months after the end of the quarter in which the school ceases to be entitled to the services of such teacher; nor, in the case of the closing of a school, for a longer period than four months after the closing.

(2.) In any school in which under the Act or these regulations a reduction in the staff is to be made, if at the beginning of any subsequent quarter it is found that the average attendance of the school for the quarter immediately preceding has increased so that the number in column (2) of Table B has been reached, then payment of the salary or salaries of the teacher or teachers prescribed in column (5) of that table may be continued for such period as the Board may decide, being not more than four months after the beginning of the quarter first named; and so on from quarter to quarter until the 1st January next ensuing.

9. On the 1st January in each year the secondary department of any district high school shall be staffed, as provided in Part V of the Fifth Schedule to the Act, according to the yearly average attendance for such secondary department for the year immediately preceding:

Provided that, notwithstanding that the yearly average attendance for the year immediately preceding is less than twelve, the average attendance of such secondary department shall be deemed to be twelve if the mean of the average attendance for the three years immediately preceding is not less than twelve, and for the two years immediately preceding is not less than ten, and for the year immediately preceding not less than eight, or if the mean of the average attendance for the three quarters immediately preceding is not less than fourteen, or for the two quarters immediately preceding not less than sixteen, or if the average attendance for the quarter immediately preceding is not less than eighteen.

10. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause, if at the beginning of any quarter it appears that the average attendance in such secondary department has increased so that the mean of the quarterly average attendance for the three quarters, or for the two quarters, or the average attendance for the quarter immediately preceding, is as high as that shown in column (2), or column (3), or column (4) (as the case may be) of Table D hereto, the Board may, at its discretion, make such addition to the staff as is required to bring the number of teachers up to the number prescribed for a secondary department with the average attendance shown in column (5) of that table.

(2.) If at the beginning of any quarter it appears that the average attendance in such secondary department has decreased so that the mean of the quarterly average attendance for the three quarters immediately preceding is as low as that shown in column (2) of Table E hereto, and that the mean for the two quarters immediately preceding is as low as that shown in column (3), and that the average attendance for the quarter immediately preceding is as low as that shown in column (4), then the Board shall reduce the staff so as to make it accord with the staff prescribed for a secondary department having the average attendance shown in column (5) of that table.

11. Clause 10 shall affect the staff of the secondary department only during the quarter prescribed and any subsequent quarter in the same year. On the 1st January following such department shall (in accordance with clause 9 hereof) be staffed in accordance with the yearly average attendance thereat; and nothing in the said clause shall be deemed to affect the salary of any member of the staff of such department who shall not have been appointed or removed thereunder.

12. In no case shall any school established during any year as a new district high school be placed for that year in a grade lower than that in which it would have been placed had the district high school not been established.

IV. TRAINING COLLEGES.

Control and Organization.

1. For the purpose of the following regulations the "University district" means the University district in which a training college is situated, and the "University college" means the University college in such University district.

2. The Board of any district in which any training college is situated shall have the entire control and management of such college, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained.

3. (1.) For every training college there shall be a Committee of Advice, consisting of the Chairman or other member of the Board, the Senior Inspector of the education district, a representative of the Professorial Board of the University college, and a representative of the Boards of such other education districts as are situated wholly in the University district, to be chosen, if there be more than one other such district, in such manner as the Minister of Education shall determine.

(2.) The Committee of Advice shall meet at least twice in each year. The first meeting shall be called by the Chairman of the Board, and shall be held not later than the month of March. Any subsequent regular meeting shall be at a time to be fixed by the Committee, but other meetings may at any time be called on the joint request of two members of the Committee, or on the initiative of the Chairman. The Principal of the training college shall be present at all meetings of the

Committee of Advice, except when questions affecting his personal or professional status are under discussion.

4. (1.) Every training college shall have a normal or practising school connected with it. The total number of children on the roll of any such school, including the model schools attached thereto, shall not at any time exceed 750. Every such normal school shall include—

- (a.) A "main school," organized as a "mixed school," having children of all classes from Class P to Class S6; and
- (b.) Such "model schools" as may be approved by the Minister, each model school being of one of the following types, namely,—
 - (i.) A rural public school of Grade II under a sole teacher, with not more than forty children on the roll;
 - (ii.) A junior school under one teacher, with not more than forty-five children of Classes P to S2 on the roll;
 - (iii.) A class or classes organized as the secondary department of a district high school, with not more than fifty-five pupils on the roll;
 - (iv.) A class of backward children of school age, with not more than forty children on the roll;
 - (v.) A junior kindergarten class or classes, with not more than forty children between the ages of three and five on the roll; but children so enrolled shall not be reckoned in computing the average attendance of the normal school:

~~Provided that in any case the "model schools" shall include at least one model school of type (i), one of type (ii), one of type (iii), and one of type (iv) or type (v).~~

(2.) For the purpose of the wider observation by students of teaching methods, the Board, after consultation with the Committee of Advice, may appoint, subject to the approval of the Minister, selected teachers of public schools, secondary schools, or technical high schools within convenient distance of the normal school to supervise and report upon the work of such students as are sent by the Principal of the training college with the consent of the governing bodies concerned to observe the classes under the charge of the said teachers. Teachers so appointed shall be recognized as associated normal teachers, and the classes as associated normal classes.

5. (1.) The organization of normal schools and the salaries of the staffs shall be approved by the Minister of Education, but in no case shall the salaries be less than those payable under the Act.

(2.) No uncertificated teacher shall be appointed on the staff of a normal school unless he possesses special qualifications approved by the Minister, and in such latter case no deduction from salary shall be made under the note appended to the Fourth Schedule to the Act.

(3.) No pupil-teacher shall be employed on the staff of a normal school, nor shall any probationer be assigned thereto.

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6. ~~Subject to the approval of the Minister, the members of the staff of the training college and normal school shall be appointed by the Board after consultation with the Committee of Advice, which may (except in regard to the appointment of the Principal of the training college and the headmaster of the normal school) delegate its functions in this respect to the Senior Inspector.~~

7. (1.) In addition to the staff of the normal school, the following shall be the staff of the training college:—

- (a.) Principal of the training college, who shall also have control of the normal school, and shall receive a salary of £550 a year: Provided that, if he is also Professor or Lecturer on Education at the University College, he shall be paid such additional sum by way of salary as shall, together with the class fees (if any) received by him at the University College, make up his salary to £650 a year.
- (b.) Assistant Lecturer, who shall also act as Assistant Supervisor of Students and deputy head teacher of the normal school, and shall receive a salary as for a head teacher of Grade VI under Part I of the Fourth Schedule to the Act, but without house allowance.
- (c.) Tutor and librarian, who shall receive a salary as for an assistant teacher of Grade 7.

(2.) The following shall be the staff of the "main school" of the normal school:—

- (i.) Headmaster, who shall also be Lecturer on Method and Supervisor of Students, and shall receive a salary of £475 a year, and a house allowance of £50 a year.

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- (ii.) First assistant, with a salary as for a head teacher of Grade V, but without house allowance.
- (iii.) Kindergarten mistress, with a salary as for an assistant of Grade 7.
- (iv.) Other assistants, with the following grades of salary as payable under Part IV of the Fourth Schedule to the Act—namely, one assistant with salary of Grade 7, two assistants with salary of Grade 6, one assistant with salary of Grade 5.
- (v.) Such additional assistants of Grade 4 as are required to make up the total number of assistants to the number named in column (4) of Part I of the Fifth Schedule to the Act.
- (3.) The following additional assistants shall be appointed to such "model schools" as are approved by the Minister, namely—
- (i.) Sole teacher, with salary as for an assistant of Grade 7.
- (ii.) Assistant mistress, with salary as for assistant of Grade 4.
- (iii.) First secondary assistant, with salary as for head teacher of Grade V, but without house allowance; and, if there be more than thirty pupils on the roll of the secondary department, an assistant teacher with a salary as for an assistant of Grade 5.
- (iv.) Assistant teacher, with a salary as for an assistant of Grade 5.
- (v.) Assistant teacher, with a salary as for an assistant of Grade 4.
- (4.) All the members of the staff of the normal school shall be deemed to be also members of the staff of the training college, and shall take such part in the tuition, training, and supervision of the students as the Principal may direct; in general, it shall be the duty, *inter alia*, of the staff of the training college as thus defined to conduct the various courses of the curriculum as defined in clause 23 hereof.
- (5.) Every associated normal teacher shall, in addition to all other salary and allowances receivable by him, receive by way of salary under these regulations such sum not exceeding £30 per annum as the Minister shall approve.

8. (1.) There shall be paid annually to the Board for the incidental expenses of the normal school a grant calculated as provided in the Eight Schedule to the Act on the total yearly average attendance of the normal school.

(2.) By way of additional provision the Minister may in any year approve of grants amounting to £350 in all for the instruction of the students in subjects of manual and physical instruction, in elocution, in drawing, and in singing, in cases where expert assistance not provided by the regular staff is found to be required, and for the incidental expenses of the training college. Out of such grants a part not exceeding £125 may be allocated to the incidental expenses of the training college (the library grant included). No part of any such grants may be paid to any of the staff named above, nor may the whole of the grants under this subclause in any case exceed the total of £350.

(3.) Every training college shall be open at all times to the visits of the Director or Assistant Director or of any Inspector, or of any member of the Committee of Advice, or of any other officer appointed by the Minister to visit such training college.

Entrance to Training Colleges and Allowances to Students.

9. In regard to admission to any training college, no distinction shall be made between applicants residing within the education district in which such training college is situated and applicants residing outside such district.

10. Subject to these regulations, students may be admitted as holders of two-year studentships in Division A or B, or as holders of one-year studentships in Division C, or as holders of short-period studentships in Division D.

Two-year Studentships, Division A.

11. (1.) Except as hereinafter provided, to be admitted in Division A a student must satisfy all of the following conditions—namely, he must—

- (a.) Have within two years and six months immediately preceding completed his course as a pupil-teacher or a probationer in some education district in accordance with regulations and to the satisfaction of the Education Board of that district:
- (b.) Have passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of New Zealand, or have gained a lower leaving certificate, or have gained a "partial pass" in accordance with regulations in the Class D Certificate Examination:
- (c.) Give satisfactory evidence of his ability to teach (*e.g.*, by a certificate to that effect signed by an Inspector of Schools):

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- (d.) Give satisfactory evidence as to moral character, and produce a satisfactory certificate of health from a medical officer approved by the Board:
 - (e.) Make a declaration of his intention to complete his course at the training college and thereafter to become a teacher in a registered school:
 - (f.) Enter into a bond as prescribed in clause 16 hereof.
- (2.) The allowances payable to a student in Division A shall be at the rate of £40 a year, together with the fees of the University college classes attended by the student with the approval of the Principal, with the further addition at the rate of £25 a year in the case of any student who is obliged to live away from home to attend a training college, or of the actual cost of travelling (not exceeding £10 per annum) in the case of a student who lives at home but is obliged to travel more than four miles daily each way to attend the training college.

Two-year Studentships, Division B.

12. (1.) To be admitted in Division B a student must satisfy all of the following conditions—namely, he must—
- (a.) Be not less than seventeen years of age, and have passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of New Zealand, or obtained a higher leaving certificate:
 - (b.) Comply within six months of the date of admission with such conditions as to probation in teaching as the Principal of the training college, with the approval of the Committee of Advice, may require:
 - (c.) Satisfy conditions (d), (e), and (f) as for students in Division A.
- (2.) The allowances payable to a student in Division B shall be at the rate of £20 a year, together with the fees of the University college classes attended by the student with the approval of the Principal, with the further addition at the rate of £25 a year in the case of any student who is obliged to live away from home to attend the training college, or of the actual cost of travelling (not exceeding £10 per annum) in the case of a student who lives at home but is obliged to travel more than four miles daily each way to attend the training college.

One-year Studentships, Division C.

13. (1.) To be admitted in Division C a student must satisfy all of the following conditions—namely, he must—
- (a.) Be a graduate of a recognized university, or have, as a matriculated student, satisfactorily completed a two-years course at a recognized agricultural college or at a school of home science recognized by the University of New Zealand:
 - (b.) Give such evidence of teaching ability or promise as the Principal with the approval of the Committee of Advice may require:
 - (c.) Undertake to devote his whole attention to subjects of professional study and practice under the direction of the Principal:
 - (d.) Satisfy conditions (d), (e), and (f) as for students of Division A.
- as for a student in Division A.
- (2.) The allowances payable to a student in Division C shall be at the same rate as for a student in Division A.

Short-period Studentships, Division D.

14. (1.) To be admitted in Division D a student must satisfy all of the following conditions—namely, he must—
- (a.) Have passed the Intermediate Examination, or be the holder of an intermediate certificate:
 - (b.) Have been, for not less than two years immediately preceding his admission, regularly employed in teaching in a registered school or schools:
 - (c.) Be deemed, on the certificate of an Inspector of Schools, worthy of further training in professional work:
 - (d.) Satisfy conditions (d) and (e) as for a student of Division A.
- (2.) The course for a student of Division D shall be for such period, being not less than three months or more than one year, as the Principal with the approval of the Committee of Advice shall determine, and shall be wholly professional or partly academic and partly professional, at the discretion of the Principal.
- (3.) The allowances payable to a student of Division D shall be at the annual rate of the allowances payable to a student of Division B.

15. Notwithstanding anything in the above provisions the Principal may, on the recommendation of an Inspector of Schools, admit to the training college, for such period not exceeding three months as he may determine, any teacher of a registered school for the purpose of

observation of the methods of teaching. No allowances shall be payable in such cases.

General.

16. (1.) Every student to or for whom any of the allowances above mentioned are payable (save only such allowances as are payable in respect of short-period studentships) shall enter, by his parent or guardian, or by some other person approved by the Board and the Minister, into a bond to return the amount paid in allowances and fees in case he shall fail to complete his course, or be dismissed on the grounds named in subclause (1) of clause 30 hereof, or fail to complete within the time required such term of service as is prescribed in a public school, in a secondary or technical school, or in any endowed school or other registered school, or in a University college, in New Zealand. The bond shall be on the form supplied by the Department, and shall provide—

(a.) In the case of a male student, for a teaching service of not less than five years, to be completed within eight years after the close of the training-college course; and

(b.) In the case of a woman, for a teaching service of not less than three years, to be completed within the six years next following the close of such course.

(2.) No allowances shall be paid to or for any student of Division A, B, or C until the said bond has been executed.

17. (1.) A studentship shall not be tenable with a Junior Scholarship of the University, or a Senior National Scholarship, or any other scholarship, if the value of any such scholarship added to that of the studentship exceeds £60 per annum in any one year.

(2.) None of the allowances named in clauses 11 to 14 hereof shall be payable in the case of any student for a greater period than two years; nor shall any allowance be payable to a student for any period during which he has been in receipt of salary as a teacher or pupil-teacher, or of allowance as probationer.

18. The allowances to any student shall not include University college fees in respect of any classes at which the student's attendances and progress have not been satisfactory, or, if such fees have been paid, the amount shall be deducted from any allowances due to him, or be otherwise recoverable from him by the Board.

19. In no case shall the number of students admitted in any year under Divisions B, C, and D conjointly be so great as thereby to make the total number of all students in attendance at the training college more than 125, or such larger number as the Minister may decide.

20. All allowances to students shall, subject to the restrictions named in these regulations, be paid monthly, save that the first payment of a student's allowance may be a quarterly payment.

21. Students receiving allowances shall in all cases be admitted for the full period of the respective studentships under which they are entered and for no other period, and shall be required to complete in all respects the course of training allotted thereto: Provided that until the Minister otherwise determines students of Division A to a number not exceeding twenty-five in any one year may at the discretion of the Board be admitted for one year of training only.

Curriculum.

22. The curriculum of each training college shall provide for a two-years course of training, and shall be subject to the approval of the Director of Education.

23. (1.) Every training college shall make provision for the following:—

(a.) Instruction in the principles and history of education (including elementary psychology) in schools, and personal hygiene (inclusive of ambulance work), and in methods of teaching.

(b.) Courses in elementary practical science as suited to the requirements of public schools, namely,—

(i.) Elementary physical measurements;

(ii.) Elementary practical agriculture, including the management of school gardens;

(iii.) Home science;

(iv.) Nature-study; and, if possible,

(v.) Dairy-work.

[It is to be understood that the main purpose of the courses named in paragraph (b), and to a material extent the purpose of the courses named in paragraphs (c) and (d), is to train the students in the methods of teaching the subjects named.]

- (c.) Courses in—
- (i.) Kindergarten work;
 - (ii.) Elementary handwork, especially modelling in plasticine or clay, paper-work, and bricklaying;
 - (iii.) Elementary woodwork;
 - (iv.) Modelling in cardboard.
- (d.) Courses in—
- (i.) Physical instruction (including swimming), which may be arranged with the Director of Physical Instruction;
 - (ii.) Singing;
 - (iii.) Drawing;
 - (iv.) Needlework (for women).
- (e.) Opportunities for observation of the child and of the methods of teaching and school-management.

(f.) Sufficient, regular, and co-ordinated practice in teaching.

(2.) The opportunities for observation of the child and of the methods of teaching referred to in paragraph (e) shall be provided at the normal school, or in any class or classes of a school or schools within convenient distance of the training college, if the teacher or teachers of such class or classes are approved for this purpose in terms of clause 4 hereof.

24. In the arrangement of the curriculum special regard shall be paid to the opportunities of instruction presented by the lectures given at the University college, and, where possible, the general education of the student shall in the main be so continued; but no student shall be permitted to take University classes that are, in the judgment of the Principal, inconsistent with the requirements of his professional course, nor shall a student be permitted to take classes forming a recognized step towards a University degree unless his capacities and attainments are of a character to fit him therefor without detriment to the interests of his training as a teacher.

25. With the limitations and exceptions hereinafter mentioned, no course of training for any student shall be deemed complete that does not include attendance at at least one course of lectures in a subject other than education at the University college, together with the following:—

- (a.) The subjects named in paragraph (a) of clause 23 hereof.
- (b.) A course of nature-study, and at least one other of the courses named in paragraph (b) of clause 23 hereof; such courses in elementary science occupying two hours a week, half of which must be devoted to individual practical work: Provided that any student who completes, to the satisfaction of the Principal, a course in science in a University college may be excused from all elementary science except nature-study.
- (c.) At least two of the courses named in paragraph (c) of clause 23, the total time devoted to elementary science and handwork together being not less than four hours a week.
- (d.) All the courses named in paragraph (d) of the clause, two hours a week being given to physical instruction.
- (e.) Observation of the child and of methods of teaching and practice in teaching as prescribed in paragraphs (e) and (f) of clause 23, the time devoted to observation and practice being, in general, not less than two hundred hours in each year. It is important that the observation should be such as to form a basis for the work in elementary psychology and the principles of education, and that the practice should be regular and co-ordinated.

26. (1.) Students who are University graduates, or who have satisfactorily completed an approved course of not less than two years at an agricultural college or at a school of Home Science recognized by the University, or who have already satisfied the requirements of the examination for Class C, may be excused from attendance at University lectures; such students, together with those who have already passed in the subject for Class D or for Class C, may also be excused from needlework. Exemption from attendance at science may also be granted in the case of graduates who have taken a science subject in their degree course, and of students who have completed an approved course of two years at an agricultural college.

(2.) A student who is taking a science course at the University college may be exempted from attendance at a science class at the training college during the year in which he is so attending.

(3.) Students having no ear for music may be excused from attendance at singing and musical theory if an approved equivalent therefor is taken as an extra subject or subjects, selected from amongst those named in paragraphs (b) and (c) of clause 23 hereof, and occupying not

less than two hours a week throughout the period of training, the total requirement under these paragraphs being thus raised to six hours a week in all.

27. The observation of methods of teaching for which provision is made shall include particularly observation of the methods of teaching English, arithmetic, drawing, singing, nature-knowledge, geography, civics, as prescribed for public elementary schools. It shall also include either (a) methods of teaching as specially adapted to the requirements of infant classes; or (b) the methods of teaching the following subjects in secondary classes—English, elementary mathematics, and the elementary stages of a foreign language; or (c) the methods adopted in teaching two or more branches of elementary science and handwork as suited to the requirements of the higher primary classes. The practice in teaching shall correspond thereto.

Certificates.

28. At the close of their period of training, students duly admitted under these regulations as students of Division A or Division B who have satisfactorily completed the prescribed course of work during the two years of their attendance at the training college, or, in the case of students of Division C or previously certificated students, during a period of not less than one year's attendance, and who are favourably reported upon in respect both of professional promise and of educational progress, may, on the recommendation of the Principal of the college and with the concurrence of the Director of Education, receive without further examination, subject to compliance with the necessary conditions of service, age, and health, as prescribed by the regulations for the time being in force for the Examination and Classification of Teachers, a trained teacher's certificate, which shall rank in respect of attainment with certificates of Class C or with certificates of Class D, as may in each case be determined.

General.

29. (1.) Subject to the general control and management of the Board, the Principal shall have full control of the staff of the normal school and training college and of the students; he shall also have power to arrange for the several courses of instruction in accordance with the requirements named above, to allot to himself and the other members of the staff such subjects of instruction as he may find convenient and the Committee of Advice may approve, to choose text-books, and to determine the course of study and training of each student.

(2.) A statement shall be furnished to the Professorial Board giving the names of all training-college students in attendance at the University college, and the classes approved by the Principal for each student, in order that the Professorial Board may be in a position to report to the Principal on the progress made by the students.

30. (1.) The Board may at any time, on the receipt of a report from the Principal, dismiss a student, or direct him to cease attendance at the training college, on the ground of repeated neglect of duty or gross misbehaviour, and all allowances to such student shall thereupon cease.

(2.) A studentship may also be terminated at any time if it shall appear to the Board and the Minister that the holder does not possess sufficient aptitude for the teaching profession to warrant further expenditure in training.

31. The Principal shall make an annual report to the Board of the work of the training college, and the Board shall forward that report, with such other report as it may desire to make, to the Minister of Education before the 31st January in each year.

32. The Director of Education shall inspect each training college from time to time, and shall report annually to the Minister.

V. PROBATIONERS.

1. On the 1st January or as soon after as may be in each year, but not later than the 1st day of April in any year, the Board may appoint one probationer for each seven hundred or part of seven hundred children in yearly average attendance in the district.

2. (1.) The Board shall select the most suitable candidates in the district irrespective of their place of residence, if they possess the qualifications hereinafter prescribed; and shall appoint every candidate so selected to the nearest convenient school of Grade III or a higher grade, provided that not more than three probationers shall be appointed in any year to the same school.

(2.) In general, not less than one-half of the probationers selected in any year shall be appointed to schools of Grades III and IV.

3. (1.) No one shall be appointed as a probationer unless—

- (a.) He has passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of New Zealand, or has gained a "partial pass" as defined by regulations in the Class D Certificate Examination, or has gained a lower leaving certificate or some higher qualification; or
- (b.) Has passed the Intermediate Examination, or has gained an intermediate certificate.

(2.) No one shall be appointed as a probationer unless he has reached the age of sixteen years, is of good moral character, of sound health and good constitution, and free from all such physical defects as are incompatible with efficiency in teaching.

4. The term of employment shall be two years for all probationers. For the purposes of this regulation, a year means a year beginning on 1st January and ending on 31st December.

5. It shall be the duty of the head teacher in any school to direct the studies and the professional training of the probationers in that school in such manner as the Board determines in accordance with rules approved by the Minister.

6. (1.) The remuneration payable to probationers qualified under paragraph (a) of clause 3 (1) hereof shall be as follows: £35 per annum with a boarding-allowance of £25 per annum if obliged to live away from home, or with an allowance of actual travelling-expenses not exceeding £10 per annum if obliged to travel more than four miles daily each way to prosecute their duties.

(2.) The remuneration payable to probationers qualified under paragraph (b) of clause 3 (1) hereof shall be as follows: First year, £30 with a boarding-allowance of £25 if obliged to live away from home, or with an allowance of actual travelling-expenses not exceeding £10 per annum if obliged to travel more than four miles daily each way to prosecute their duties; second year, £35 with a boarding-allowance of £25, or with a travelling-allowance not exceeding £10, on the same conditions as for the first year.

7. No one who is at the same time the holder of a University Junior Scholarship, or of a Senior National Scholarship, or of a Taranaki Scholarship, shall be appointed as a probationer or act as a probationer in any school.

8. Probationers during their period of service or subsequently shall not be eligible for appointment as pupil-teachers.

9. Subject to the Act and these regulations, the Board of each education district may make rules relating to probationers, and such rules shall come into operation as soon as they have received the approval of the Minister.

10. Every probationer who has completed his course in accordance with the regulations and to the satisfaction of the Board shall be eligible for admission to a training college as a student in Division A on the same conditions as if he had completed a course as pupil-teacher.

VI. PUPIL-TEACHERS.

1. Subject to the provisions of these regulations, the Board of each education district shall make rules for the employment, maintenance, education, and examination of pupil-teachers, and shall submit such rules to the Minister of Education; and such rules shall come into operation as from the date of the Minister's approval or from such other date as may be specified therein, and shall not be altered or amended without his authority.

2. Any agreement already entered into between any Board and any pupil-teacher shall not be affected by these regulations or by such rules as any Board may hereafter make in pursuance of these regulations.

3. The rules to be made by any Board shall include provisions to the effect that a young person of either sex, to be eligible for appointment as a pupil-teacher, must be at least fifteen years of age, of good character, of good constitution, and free from any bodily or other defect or infirmity detrimental to usefulness or efficiency as a teacher, and must have obtained a certificate of proficiency in the examination prescribed for the Sixth Standard or some higher qualification.

4. The rules to be made by any Board shall also deal with the matters following:—

- (a.) The nature of the agreement with pupil-teachers, whether indenture of apprenticeship or otherwise, and method of determination of engagement.
- (b.) The term of service, which is to be dated from the 1st January nearest to the date of appointment.
- (c.) The number of hours to be spent each day in teaching.

- (d.) The number of hours to be devoted to the instruction of pupil-teachers by head teachers and assistant teachers.
- (e.) The program of examinations.
- (f.) The transfer of pupil-teachers in cases where, owing to a decline in the attendance, it is rendered necessary by the operation of the scale of staffs and salaries.
5. (1.) In the appointment of pupil-teachers a Board shall, *ceteris paribus*, give preference to those who have passed two years in a secondary school, or in the secondary classes of a district high school, or in the Seventh Standard of any other public school.
- (2.) A Board may, if it see fit, test by examination the qualifications of candidates for pupil-teacherships.
- (3.) (a.) A candidate that has passed the Intermediate Examination, or has obtained an intermediate certificate, shall be entitled to rank on appointment as a second-year pupil-teacher.
- (4.) A candidate that has passed the Matriculation Examination of any British University, or has obtained a "partial pass" as defined by regulations in the Class D Certificate Examination, or has gained a lower leaving certificate, shall be entitled to rank on appointment as a third-year pupil-teacher.
6. (1.) There shall be an examination for all pupil-teachers of the third or fourth year in any education district, which shall be either the Matriculation Examination of the University of New Zealand or the examination for the certificate of Class D.
- (2.) A pupil-teacher that has passed the examination for a teacher's certificate shall be exempt from further examination during his pupil-teachership if he shows to the satisfaction of the Board that he is pursuing his studies.
- (3.) Notwithstanding anything in this clause, a Board may, if it see fit, hold other examinations at the end of the first, second, or third year, viz., in such subjects as methods of teaching, singing, drawing, nature-study, needlework, and other branches of handwork.
- (4.) A pupil-teacher who during the first or second year of his pupil-teachership passes the Matriculation Examination of the University of New Zealand or otherwise obtains the qualification set out in subclause (4) of clause 5 hereof shall be entitled to rank as a third-year pupil-teacher as from the nearest 1st January.
- (5.) A pupil-teacher who at any time after his appointment has passed the Intermediate Examination, or has been granted an intermediate certificate, shall be entitled to rank as a second-year pupil-teacher as from the nearest 1st January.
7. No one who is at the same time the holder of a University Junior Scholarship, or of a Senior National Scholarship, or of a Taranaki Scholarship, shall be appointed as a pupil-teacher or act as pupil-teacher in any school.
8. Pupil-teachers during their period of service or subsequently shall not be eligible for appointment as probationers.

Regulations for netting and taking Trout in Lake Hawea, Otago Acclimatization District.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made under the Fisheries Act, 1908, dated the twenty-second day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 83 of the twenty-ninth day of the same month, regulations were made for the taking of trout by means of nets in Lake Hawea: And whereas by Order in Council made under the said Act, dated the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 131 of the third day of the same month, the regulations of the twenty-second day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eight, were revoked, and regulations authorizing the issue of licenses to fish for trout in the said lake by means of rod and line were made in lieu thereof: And whereas it is desirable to revoke the regulations made on the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and to make other regulations in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the aforesaid regulations made on the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and doth hereby make the following regulations; and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall have effect on and in the waters of Lake Hawea in the Provincial District of Otago, hereinafter referred to as "the said lake."

REGULATIONS.

1. THE season for netting trout shall extend from the 1st day of November in any one year to the 30th day of April in the following year, both days inclusive.
2. No net of a smaller size in the mesh than 7 in. in diameter when wetted and stretched for the taking of trout shall be used in any portion of the said lake.
3. No person shall be permitted to use a net for the purpose of fishing therewith unless he holds a valid license so to fish issued by the Otago Acclimatization Society (hereinafter called "the society").
4. It shall be lawful for the holder of every license issued as aforesaid to use one net for the purpose of fishing for trout in the said lake.
5. No person shall be permitted to use a net on any portion of the said lake other than the following:—
All that area from a point one mile below the mouth of the Timaru Creek on the south-east side to a point one mile below the Long Valley Creek on the south-west side.

6. Any person holding a trout-fishing license under the trout-fishing regulations for the Otago Acclimatization District may fish with rod and line in the said lake, anything contained in these regulations to the contrary notwithstanding, and any *bona fide* resident of Lake Hawea may fish with rod and line at a fee of 5s. for the season.

7. The society, through its officers, rangers, inspectors, constables, or other person duly authorized, shall have full power at any time to inspect, examine, and search for any net, tackle, engine, boat, or any utensil or instrument used or employed for the taking of trout within the said lake, and to seize and appropriate in the interests of the society all and every net, tackle, engine, or any utensil or instrument so used and employed in contravention of these regulations; and also to seize and appropriate as aforesaid all and every fish caught and in the possession of any person who cannot or who does not produce at the time of catching or disposing of such fish a license under the hand of the secretary of the society empowering him in that behalf.

8. The fee for every such annual license to net trout in the said lake shall be the sum of £1 for each person so licensed, such fee to be paid to the secretary or other duly authorized officer of the society.

9. It shall be the duty of every holder of a license to net trout at the close of the fishing season to furnish to the secretary of the Otago Acclimatization Society a return giving the number, weight, and breed of the fish taken during the season.

10. It shall be the duty of the chairman of the society to forward to the Department of Internal Affairs, on or before the 15th day of May in every year, a statement, certified by such chairman, showing in detail the number and particulars of all licenses to net granted by the society as up to the 30th day of April previous.

11. It shall be unlawful for any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, to sell trout taken under these regulations.

12. Any person offending against any of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £50.

Regulations for Deer-shooting, Westland.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Westland Acclimatization District, exclusive of all sanctuaries, and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

1. RED-DEER stags may be taken or killed in that part of the Westland Acclimatization District known as the Haast, Wills, Landsborough, and Clarke Valleys, South Westland, from the 25th day of March, 1915, to the 30th day of April, 1915 (both days inclusive), and in the remainder of the said district from the 1st day of April, 1915, to the 31st day of May, 1915 (both days inclusive).
2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Hokitika, and the Postmasters at Kumara, Ross, and Okarito, on payment of a license fee of £2, in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations; provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.
3. No licensee shall take or kill more than two stags, and no stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than ten points.
4. No hind or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.
5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
6. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

CHINA, EAST COAST.—YANG-TSE-KIANG APPROACH.

AMHERST ROCKS.—OBSTRUCTION REPORTED NORTH-WESTWARD OF.—*Position*: At a distance of about 2 miles north-westward from Amherst Rocks. Lat. $31^{\circ} 11' 10''$ N., long. $122^{\circ} 20' 40''$ E., on Chart No. 1602. *Details*: The s.s. "Tain Maru" is reported to have struck a submerged obstruction, possibly a wreck, with a depth of about 6 ft. over it. *Note*: A depth of 1 fathom, surrounded by a danger line, has been placed on the charts in the position given above and marked "Obstruction (1914)." *Charts affected*: No. 1602, Approaches to the Yang-tse-kiang; No. 1199, Kue Shan Islands to the Yang-tse-kiang; No. 2412, Amoy to Nagasaki.

CANADA, NOVA SCOTIA.—BEAVER HARBOUR.

BEAVER POINT.—ALTERATION IN CHARACTERISTICS OF LIGHT.—*Position*: Lat. $44^{\circ} 52\frac{1}{2}'$ N., long. $62^{\circ} 23\frac{1}{2}'$ W. *Details*: The fixed red light has been replaced by a light having the undermentioned characteristics: Character—a fixed white light. Elevation—49 ft. Visibility—12 miles. Order—5th. Structure—red octagonal lantern on white square dwelling, 38 ft. in height.

NORTH SEA.

CAUTION WITH REGARD TO MINED AREAS.—In confirmation of the public notice which has already been issued to the Press, the following information is now promulgated:—

Caution.—H.M. Government have authorized a mine-laying policy in certain areas, and a system of mine-fields has been established and is being developed upon a considerable scale. It is dangerous henceforth for ships to cross the area between the parallels of $51^{\circ} 15'$ and $51^{\circ} 40'$ north latitude and the meridians of $1^{\circ} 35'$ and 3° east longitude. The southern limit of the area in the North Sea in which mines have been laid by the enemy is, so far as is known at present, the fifty-second parallel of north latitude.

Remarks.—Although these limits are assigned to the danger areas, it must not be supposed that navigation is necessarily safe in any part of the southern waters of the North Sea.

UNITED KINGDOM.

CAUTION WITH REGARD TO EXTINCTION OF LIGHTS AND DISCONTINUANCE OR REMOVAL OF AIDS TO NAVIGATION.—*Former Notice*: No. 1493 of 1914; hereby cancelled. *Caution*: Mariners are hereby warned that it may be necessary to extinguish certain lights and to discontinue or remove any aids to navigation on the coasts of the United Kingdom without further notice.

TABLE BAY.—ALTERATION IN EXAMINATION ANCHORAGE.—

SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

DANGER ISLANDS.—HYDROGRAPHIC INFORMATION.—The master of the British steamer "Dawn" reports as follows concerning the Danger Islands:—

The Sand Cay shown on B.A. Chart No. 1022 was washed away by a tidal wave 8th January, 1914, and nothing now remains above water. The disappearance of this cay is a source of danger to ships westward bound that may make Puka Puka for the purpose of checking chronometers, as there is now nothing to show the north-western limit of shoal water.

The sunken reef shown on the chart between Motu Kavata and the Sand Cay is not a clearly defined reef, but consists of a number of detached shoals, with depths varying from 8 ft. to 30 ft., none of which break in fine weather.

In rough weather the sea breaks incessantly on some of the shoals, but only at intervals on others.

The width of the shoal water in a north-northeast-south-southwest direction is estimated to be about 600 yards.

Approx. position: Lat. $10^{\circ} 53' S.$, long. $165^{\circ} 45' W.$

ADMIRALTY ISLANDS.—PONAM ISLAND.—REEF EXTENDED.—A coral reef, with a breadth of 1 mile, extends for a distance of 6.75 miles in a 274° direction from the north-western extremity of Ponam Island.

Approximate position of Ponam Island: Latitude $1^{\circ} 54' 15'' S.$, longitude $146^{\circ} 53' E.$

SOCIETY ISLANDS.—TAHITI.—LIGHTS EXTINGUISHED.—BEACONS DISCONTINUED.—Information dated 8th September, 1914, has been received through the American Consul at Tahiti that all lights and beacons on the coasts of the Island of Tahiti have been discontinued indefinitely.

WASHINGTON.

JUAN DE FUCA STRAIT.—HEIN BANK.—BELL-BUOY REPLACED BY GAS AND BELL BUOY.—On 2nd October, 1914, Hein Bank bell-buoy was replaced by a cylindrical light and bell buoy, painted red and black in horizontal stripes, exhibiting 12 ft. above the water a flashing red light of about 40 candle-power every 3 seconds—thus, flash 0.3 second, eclipsed 2.7 seconds.

Approx. position: Lat. $48^{\circ} 21' N.$, long. $123^{\circ} 3' W.$

HAWAIIAN ISLANDS.

OAHU.—HONOLULU HARBOUR ENTRANCE.—GAS-BUOYS MOVED.—On 1st September, 1914, the following changes were made in the buoyage of Honolulu Harbour:—

Entrance Gas-buoy 1 was moved 35 yards 90° and re-established in $5\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms of water, on the bearings—

TARGET BUOYS TO BE ESTABLISHED.—BUOYS CARRIED AWAY.—Information has been received that about 21st September, 1914, three target buoys would be established off the entrance to Honolulu Harbour, located as follows:—

First buoy, nearest to the harbour entrance, on the bearing—Quarantine Island flagstaff, 21° distant 2,285 yards.

Second buoy, 2,000 yards 273° from first buoy.

Third buoy, 3,000 yards 273° from first buoy.

These buoys will be spars, painted yellow, carrying small red and white flags, moored in from 12 to 20 fathoms of water, and will replace the six barrel buoys previously established and which have been carried away.

HAWAII.—NORTH-WEST COAST.—KAWAIHAE LIGHT-STATION.—NEW STRUCTURE.—On 7th October, 1914, Kawaihae light was exhibited from a pyramidal concrete tower erected within the old skeleton tower, which was dismantled on the same date.

Approx. position: Lat. $20^{\circ} 2' 39'' N.$, long. $155^{\circ} 50' 6'' W.$

PANAMA.

COLON HARBOUR.—WEST BREAKWATER LIGHT ESTABLISHED.—LIGHT-BUOY DISCONTINUED.—About 15th August, 1914, the red lights shown from a pole at the seaward end of the West Breakwater at Colon Harbour were discontinued, and a new flashing red light, showing 1 group of 2 flashes every 2 seconds—thus, 2 flashes in 1 second, eclipsed 1 second—visible 8 miles, was established 30 ft. above the sea, on a permanent concrete structure with a square base and cylindrical column.

The structure is erected in the elbow of the breakwater, on the inshore side, and vessels should give it a berth of at least 250 yards when entering.

On 1st September, 1914, the gas-buoy showing a flashing white light off the seaward end of the West Breakwater was discontinued.

LIMON BAY.—CRISTOBAL HARBOUR.—BUOYS ESTABLISHED.—DIRECTIONS.—The third-class red can buoy marking the westerly edge of the shoal making out from the end of the mole off Cristobal Point has been replaced by a black gas-buoy showing a fixed white light, moored in 32 ft. of water, 310 yards 283° from the end of the mole.

Vessels entering or leaving Cristobal Harbour are warned to keep to the southward of a line drawn between this buoy and the end of the trestle of Pier No. 7, under construction, and not to pass between the buoy and the end of the mole.

A third-class spar buoy moored in 16 ft. of water marks the riprap off the end of the mole off Cristobal Point, and marks a small channel for launches; and all small boats and launches are cautioned not to pass between this buoy and the mole.

CANAL ZONE.—BALBOA.—DUMPING-GROUNDS.—BUOYS TO BE ESTABLISHED.—CAUTION.—Owing to dredged material from the canal being dumped to the southward and westward of the Pacific entrance, causing a less depth of water than is shown on the charts, mariners are warned to keep to the northward and eastward of the extension of the axis of the Panama Canal and to the eastward of a line running north and south through San José Rock and Taboguilla Island.

The dumping-grounds will be marked by a line of unnumbered black buoys moored 0.5 mile apart and moved from time to time without further notice. These buoys may show fixed white lights, but are not to be depended upon by vessels, as they are intended for towboats engaged on dredging operations.

The first buoy will be located $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to the seaward of the dumping-ground and on a line bearing $173^{\circ} 30'$ joining entrance buoy No. 1 and Taboguilla Island and 0.5 mile from entrance buoy No. 1.

The second buoy will be located 0.5 mile from the former buoy and 1 mile $173^{\circ} 30'$ from entrance buoy No. 1. The remainder of the buoys will be located on a line passing through this second buoy with Commission Rock and Melones Island in line bearing 235° .

NORTH COAST.—LAGARTO.—REEF REPORTED TO NORTHWARD.—The commanding officer of the U.S.S. "Leonidas" reports a reef with a least depth of 6 fathoms over it, about 1 mile long in a northeast-southwest direction northward of Lagarto, and about 2 miles off shore.

This ledge is not marked by breakers in ordinary weather. Approximate position of Lagarto: Latitude $9^{\circ} 13' N$, longitude $80^{\circ} 8' W$.

NEW CHART.—The Governor of the Panama Canal has caused to be prepared a chart of the Panama Canal. This chart, printed in two sheets by the United States Lake Survey Office of the War Department, is now on sale by the Hydrographic Office and its agents, the price being \$0.20 for each sheet.

URUGUAY.

PLATA RIVER.—ENGLISH BANK.—LIGHT-BUOY CARRIED AWAY.—TEMPORARY LIGHT-BUOY ESTABLISHED.—The submarine bell and whistle buoy, showing a flashing white light, moored on English Bank has been carried away by storms. A light-buoy showing a flashing white light, visible 9.5 miles, but without the bell or whistle, has been temporarily established to replace this buoy.

JAVA.

NORTH COAST.—BATAVIA ROADSTEAD.—LIGHT-BUOY TEMPORARILY REPLACED BY UNLIGHTED BUOY.—The Netherlands Government has given notice that the light-buoy exhibiting a flashing white light marking the north-eastern edge of Van Dorth Reef, in (approximately) latitude $6^{\circ} 4' 6'' S$, longitude $106^{\circ} 52' 36'' E$, has been replaced by a conical buoy with a ball topmark, painted white and black in horizontal bands.

NORTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

GILBERT ISLANDS.—ROCK REPORTED.—Capt. I. R. Handley, master of the schooner "Polonia," reports under date of 17th July, 1914, having observed what was apparently a pinnacle rock about 70 ft. in extent with the sea lifting over it eastward of Tarawa Island, in (approximately) latitude $1^{\circ} N$, longitude $174^{\circ} 44' E$.

The vessel was brought to the wind and the mate sent away to sound, but was unable to locate from the small boat. From aloft the discolouration and lift of the sea was plainly visible.

NEW SOUTH WALES.

ALTERATION IN THE CHARACTER OF THE LIGHT AT CORRIE CREEK, DUCK HOLE, PORT STEPHENS.—It is hereby notified, for the information of masters and others interested in the navigation of vessels, that on and after the 1st day of November, 1914, the character of the fixed red light established at Corrie Creek, Duck Hole, Port Stephens, in 1913 will be changed to a fixed light, red and white sectored.

The northern side of the light will be the white sector, and when steered directly for from the westward it will lead clear of Ballast Point and into Corrie Creek Channel.
