A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of section thirteen of the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1913, a petition was presented to the Governor praying that the area described in the Schedule hereto be constituted a new borough: And whereas the provisions of the said section thirteen have been complied with in respect thereto, and the result of the poll taken on the proposal contained in the said petition was in favour thereof:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, as amended by the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1913, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be constituted a borough under the said Acts on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen; that the name of such borough shall be the Borough of Te Awamutu; that the said borough shall be an undivided borough; and that the number of Councillors to be elected thereto shall be eight, exclusive of the Mayor:

And I do further proclaim and declare that Dudley Bockett, of Te Awamutu, shall be the Returning Officer to conduct the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough; and that the said Dudley Bockett shall be the Town Clerk and the person to prepare the district electors roll for the purposes of the said first election:

And, lastly, I do proclaim and declare that the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough shall be held on Wednesday, the twenty-eighth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen; and that the first meeting of the Council of the said borough shall be held on Wednesday, the fifth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, at half past seven o'clock in the afternoon, at the Town Board Office, Te Awamutu.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north generally by the southern side of the Mangapiko Stream from the easternmost corner of Allotment No. 317, Mangapiko Parish, to the western boundary-line of Allotment No. 250, Puniu Parish, by that boundary-line and the western and northern boundary-lines of Allotment No. 249, Puniu Parish aforesaid, to its north-eastern corner; thence towards the north-east generally by a right line to the north-westernmost corner of Allotment No. 267, Puniu Parish aforesaid, by that allotment, the crossing of a road, by Allotments

Nos. 274 and 275, Puniu Parish aforesaid, across and by the southern side of a road to the north-western corner of Allotment No. 125, Puniu Parish aforesaid, and by the last-mentioned allotment to the northernmost corner of Allotment No. 129, Puniu Parish aforesaid; thence towards the south-east generally by said Allotment No. 129 to its westernmost corner; thence by a right line to the northernmost corner of Allotment No. 139, Puniu Parish aforesaid, by Allotments Nos. 136 and 138 of the said Puniu Parish, the crossing of a road, and by the north-western boundary-line of Allotment No. 142 of the aforesaid Puniu Parish for a distance of 1000 links; thence towards the south generally by a right line to the easternmost corner of Allotment No. 144A, Puniu Parish aforesaid, by the north-eastern boundary-line of that allotment for a distance of 670 links; thence by a right line to the south-western boundary-line of Allotment No. 145, Puniu Parish aforesaid, at a point distant 1000 links from its westernmost corner; thence towards the south-west generally by Allotment No. 322, Mangapiko Parish, by the south-eastern side of Otorohanga Road to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary-line of Allotment No. 232, Mangapiko Parish aforesaid, by a right line to and by the last-mentioned boundary-line to the northernmost corner of the said Allotment No. 232, by a right line to peg No. VIII in the North Island Main Trunk Railway Reserve (as shown on plan hereinafter mentioned) intersecting Allotment No. 230 of the said Mangapiko Parish; thence by a right line bearing 264° 30' in a south-westerly direction, a distance of 3700 links; and thence by a right line to the south-eastern corner of Allotment No. 243, Mangapiko Parish aforesaid; and thence towards the north-west generally by the said Allotment No. 243, by Allotment No. 242, of Mangapiko Parish aforesaid, and by a right line to and by Allotment No. 317 first mentioned to the point of commencement: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less: as the same is more particularly delineated on plan marked I.A. 19/45, deposited in the office of the Department of Internal Affairs at Wellington, and thereon edged red.

*Proclaiming Native Land to be Crown Land under Section 368 of the Native Land Act, 1909.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the Native Land Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Crown may purchase any Native land in pursuance of a resolution of the assembled owners passed and confirmed in accordance with Part XVIII of the said Act, and on the resolution being adopted by the Native Land Purchase Board it shall become a contract of purchase as between the Crown and all persons who are the owners of the land; and the Governor may by Proclamation, at any time after the contract of purchase has been so made, declare that the land so purchased is vested in His Majesty the King, and it shall vest accordingly, and shall become Crown land:

And whereas a resolution was passed by a meeting of assembled owners, and duly confirmed by the Ikaroa District Maori Land Board, that the land set out in the Schedule hereto be sold to the Crown:

And whereas the Native Land Purchase Board duly considered and adopted the resolution:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the said Act, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare the land set out in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908.

*Defining the Middle-line of a Further Portion of the East Coast Main Trunk Railway—namely, Te Maunga Section.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the further portion of the East Coast Main Trunk Railway from Te Maunga junction to the right bank of the Wairoa River in Block IX, Tauranga Survey District (hereinafter termed "the said railway"), is a railway the construction of which is authorized by the Railways Authorization Act, 1911: And whereas it has been determined to construct and maintain a portion of the same:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Public Works Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

*Revoking a Proclamation taking Land for the Purposes of a Road in Block V, Waiawa Survey District.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, it is enacted that if at any time after the issue of any Proclamation taking land under the Public Works Act, 1908, and before the payment or award of any compensation in respect of the taking thereof, it is found that the land or any part thereof is not required for the purpose for which it was taken, or that any error in form or substance exists in or in relation to that Proclamation, or the making or gazetting thereof, the Governor may, by a subsequent Proclamation gazetted, revoke the former Proclamation either wholly or so far as he thinks necessary:

And whereas it is found that the land in Block V, Waiawa Survey District, taken for the purposes of a road by a Proclamation made under the Public Works Act, 1908, dated the thirty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen (hereinafter termed "the said Proclamation"), and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 76, page 3052, of the sixth day of the following month, is not required for the purpose for which it was taken: And whereas compensation in respect of the taking of the said land has not been paid or awarded:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the

Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this nineteenth day of January, 1915.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section two of the Mining Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time declare that any of the provisions of the Mining Act, 1908, shall apply to prospecting and mining for and the storage of petroleum and other mineral oils and of natural gas, and also define the districts within which any such Order in Council shall take effect:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the provisions of the Mining Act, 1908, set out in the First Schedule hereto shall apply to prospecting and mining for and the storage of petroleum and other mineral oils and of natural gas within the district described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

THE Mining Act, 1908.—Part II: Section 11, subsection (a); sections 76 to 85, both inclusive; and section 165. Part V: Sections 261 to 276, both inclusive.

Regulations under Mining Act, 1908.—Nos. 1, 33, 91, 102, 147 to 150 (both inclusive).

*Licensing Messrs. Albyn Walter Cheeseman, Murdoch Munro, and Henry Norman (as Trustees) to use and occupy a Portion of the Foreshore at Te Hapua, Parengarenga Harbour, as a Site for a Wharf.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this nineteenth day of January, 1915.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), Albyn Walter Cheeseman, Murdoch Munro, and Henry Norman, as trustees for the inhabitants of the district (hereinafter called "the licensees"), have applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto,

at Te Hapua, Parengarenga Harbour, in order to erect and maintain a wharf thereon, and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, have deposited plans marked M.D. 4352 in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, showing the place where it is intended to erect such wharf, the area of foreshore and land below low water to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect such wharf :

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council without modification or addition :

And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the licensees on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid ; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, on which the wharf is to be erected, as shown on the plans marked M.D. 4352, so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seaman Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore, and land below low water-mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the construction of the wharf as shown on plans marked M.D. 4352.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensees shall pay to the Minister an annual sum of 1s., payable on demand.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at their own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels ; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof ; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring them, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority ; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or

privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part.

13. In case the licensees or either of them shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them ; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days ; or
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy ; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council, without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever. The publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. The erection of the wharf shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensees of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

*Making Provision with respect to the Representation of the Borough of Waipukurau and the County of Waipukurau on the Napier Harbour Board.*

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this nineteenth day of January, 1915.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section twelve of the Harbours Amendment Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the creation, abolition, merger, division, or other alteration of any constituent or combined district shall not in itself have any operation so as to affect the then existing membership of the Board, and that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council, whenever in his opinion it becomes necessary or expedient so to do, make such provision with respect to the representation of any part of any constituent or combined district as he thinks fit :

And whereas by the said Act the Waipukurau Town District and the Waipukurau County were made a combined district for the election by the electors thereof of one member of the Napier Harbour Board :

And whereas the said Waipukurau Town District has been constituted a borough, under the name of the Borough of Waipukurau, and it is necessary to make provision with respect to the representation of such borough and the County of Waipukurau on the Napier Harbour Board :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke regulations numbered 11 and 23 in the Schedule to the above-recited Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall be read as part of the hereinbefore-mentioned regulations, and shall have effect as from the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*, but so that such regulations shall not operate to prevent compliance with a requisition signed by a two-thirds majority of subscribers to a telephone exchange, for business and private connections taken together, to revert from lengthened to shortened periods of attendance at such exchange if the hours of attendance were lengthened before the date of this Order in Council.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1914.

With the exception of the Taranaki district, and also the west coast and southernmost portions of the South Island, the rainfall was again generally much below normal. From the beginning until about the 25th, strong north-westerly to south-westerly winds prevailed, and the weather was very changeable. During this period the winds occasionally attained gale force, particularly between the 7th and 21st, when westerly low-pressure areas passed frequently in the south. From the 26th until the close of the month, anticyclonic conditions, with fair and warm weather, were experienced.
