IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Waitaki-Waimate Acclimatization District, comprising the Counties of Waitaki and Waimate and part of the County of Mackenzie, and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

1. RED-DEER stags may be taken or killed within the Waitaki-Waimate Acclimatization District from the 1st day of April, 1915, to the 20th day of May, 1915 (both days inclusive).
2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Oamaru, on the recommendation

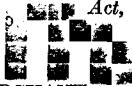

Arrivals and Departures in 1914.

Registrar-General's Office, Wellington, 19th February, 1915.

TABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1914, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The total number of persons who arrived in the Dominion during 1914 was 37,646, and the departures during the year numbered 32,506, the excess of arrivals over departures for the year being 5,140.

According to returns furnished by the Immigration officers, 8,579 persons arrived from the United Kingdom, and 2,574 persons departed therefor during the year. From the Commonwealth of Australia the arrivals are returned as numbering 25,967 persons, and the departures thereto as 26,693 persons. Arrivals and departures from and to other countries were 3,100 and 3,239 persons respectively.

Of the 37,646 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 4,266, or 11.33 per cent. of the total, were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 32,506 departures the children numbered 2,819, or 8.67 per cent.

The departures shown do not include 11,998 members of the Expeditionary Forces which have left the Dominion since the outbreak of the war with Germany.

CHINESE.—Chinese are included in the population given above. The number in New Zealand on 31st December, 1914, was estimated to be 2,466, of whom 117 were females.

REMARKS.—Excluding Maoris, the population increased by 11,334, or at the rate of 1.04 per cent., during the year. Excess of births over deaths contributed 18,192 extra persons to the total, but the departure of Expeditionary Forces for the Front caused a net migration decrease of 6,858.

The birth-rate for the Dominion in 1914 was 25.99 per 1,000 of mean population, and the death-rate 9.31, as against 26.14 and 9.47 respectively in 1913.

The deaths in 1914 (10,146) were more than the number registered in 1913 (10,119) by 27, but the rate per 1,000 fell from 9.47 to 9.31.

The number of marriages (excluding those contracted between Maoris) solemnized in 1914 is estimated at 9,275, giving a rate of 8.51 per 1,000 of the mean population, against 8,813 and 8.25, the actual number and rate in 1913.
