A copy of every regulation made by the Council under the powers hereby conferred shall be forwarded to the Minister of Internal Affairs within seven days after the making of the same; and the Minister of Internal Affairs may, at any time within six months of the making of such regulation, disallow the same.

Licensing the Otamatea County Council to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore at Mapau, in Kaipara Harbour, as a Site for a Wharf.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Otamatea County Council (hereinafter called "the Council") has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Mapau, in Kaipara Harbour, in order to erect and maintain a wharf thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 4369), showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the said wharf: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the Council under the said Act for the purpose last aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the Council as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Council to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said wharf is to be erected, as shown on the plan M.D. 4339 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf; such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the erection of the said wharf, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 4369.

3. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

4. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

5. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit from the wharf and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at

or posting to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date thereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceedings whatever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said wharf is to be erected, as shown on the plan M.D. 4392 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

5. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit from the wharf, and maintain at their own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand, a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring them, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date thereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceedings whatever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

Educational Bursaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this twelfth day of April, 1915.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE W. F. MASSEY, P.C., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authority conferred upon him by the Education Act, 1914, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations contained in the Schedule hereto for the award and tenure of Educational Bursaries; and doth further provide that these regulations shall be deemed to have effect from and after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen.

SCHEDULE.

1. An Educational Bursary may, on the recommendation of the Senior Inspector of an education district, be awarded to any person of either sex who, being a matriculated student of the University of New Zealand and being resident in New Zealand for one year immediately preceding the date of application for a bursary,—

- (i.) Has within the six months immediately preceding completed his term of service as a pupil teacher or probationer in some education district in accordance with regulations and to the satisfaction of the Education Board and of the Senior Inspector of that district, and declares his intention of entering a recognized training college on the completion of the tenure of his bursary; or
- (ii.) Has satisfactorily completed his course of training at a recognized training college and gained a trained teacher's certificate; or
- (iii.) Has otherwise gained a teacher's certificate of a class not lower than Class C.

2. There shall be paid to or on behalf of each holder of an Educational Bursary the amount of the fees payable by him to the university college in respect of such classes as the Director of Education, after consultation with the Professorial Board, shall approve for him, and, in addition, the university fees for the degree examinations for which he sits:

Provided that if the college fees payable by any holder in any one year be more than £20 in all, the sum of £20 only shall be paid to or for such holder in respect of such fees.

3. An application for an Educational Bursary, made in due form and accompanied by the necessary certificates, must be addressed to the Senior Inspector of Schools of the district, to be forwarded by him, with any recommendation that he may have to make, to the Director of Education. Such application must reach the Senior Inspector by the 1st day of April in any year.

4. An Educational Bursary shall not be tenable with a University Junior Scholarship, a University National Scholarship, or a University Bursary, or with any other scholarship, exhibition, or bursary, or combination thereof, the value or combined value of which, exclusive of any lodging allowance received, exceeds £20 a year.

5. An Educational Bursary may be held at any university college or at a school of agriculture recognized by the University. The classes taken must be of such as would form part of a course in arts, science, or agriculture.

6. A bursary shall become vacant by failure on the part of the holder to satisfy such conditions as the Professorial Board and the Director of Education may deem necessary. Generally, such conditions shall include the passing of the college examination in the subject or subjects approved for him as described in clause 2 hereof, or the passing of a section of a university degree examination in arts, science, or agriculture, or the attainment of success in connection with the Teachers' Class B or Class A Examination.

7. The term of an Educational Bursary shall in general be three years, if the holder so long fulfils the prescribed conditions; but under special circumstances, on the recommendation of the Senior Inspector, the bursary may be extended for a further term: Provided that the whole period of the bursary so extended shall not exceed five years.

8. The Educational Bursary must be held continuously, except in case of illness or special circumstances approved by the Minister.

9. On the receipt of an unfavourable report on the holder of an Educational Bursary from the Professorial Board or from the Council of the university college attended, the tenure of the bursary shall be forthwith determined, and the holder shall, if the Minister so directs, be required to refund the fees paid during the current year on his behalf.

10. All university bursaries granted under clause 1 (c), 1 (d), or 1 (e) of the conditions hitherto in force shall be regarded for the balance of their period of tenure as Educational Bursaries issued under these regulations.

Approving the Canterbury Patriotic Fund under the War Contributions Validation Act, 1914 (No. 2).

(a.) For the relief of distress occasioned by the war in which His Majesty is at present engaged, whether such distress exists in New Zealand or elsewhere in the British Dominions, or in any country allied to His Majesty;

(b.) For any patriotic objects approved for the purposes of this Act by the Governor:

Provided that every such contribution is paid either—

(i.) Into a public fund, established by the Government, or by any local authority, for the purposes of such relief of distress, or patriotic objects; or

(ii.) Into a fund established by persons other than the Government or a local authority, where such fund and the conditions of control and expenditure thereof are approved for the purposes of this Act by the Governor:

And whereas certain persons in the Provincial District of Canterbury have formed themselves into a body for the following purposes, namely:—

(a.) To dispel any misgivings that members of the New Zealand Expeditionary Forces for the war in which His Majesty the King is at present engaged, domiciled in the North Canterbury District (meaning thereby all that part of the Provincial District of Canterbury lying to the north of the River Rakaiā), may have in leaving their dependents unprovided for should sickness, partial or total disablement, or death overtake them as a result of service in such forces;

(b.) To assist any member of such forces domiciled in the said district who may return to the Dominion unfit for work, until he is restored to health;

(c.) To relieve distress occasioned by the war in which His Majesty the King is at present engaged, whether or not distress exists in New Zealand or elsewhere in the British Dominions, or in any country allied to His Majesty, but not that occasioned by or arising from unemployment:

And whereas the said body of persons has established a fund known as the Canterbury Patriotic Fund, for the promotion of the objects hereinbefore expressed, and has submitted the said fund and the conditions of control and

expenditure thereof for approval, as required by the hereinbefore-quoted provisions of the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby approve for the purposes of the said Act—

- (1.) The Canterbury Patriotic Fund hereinbefore referred to, established by the said body of persons; and
- (2.) The conditions of control and expenditure of the said fund, as set out in the rules adopted by the said body of persons.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1915.

The aggregate rainfall for February was considerably below normal over the North Island, but in the south, with the exception of portions of the East Coast district, it was nearly everywhere in excess. In Westland the percentage above was greatest, several stations recording over 100 per cent. in excess of the mean of previous years. This was owing to the character of the disturbances being chiefly of the westerly type, with centres passing in higher latitudes and accounting for a prevalence of north-west to south-westerly winds.

On the 2nd a small atmospheric depression passed off East Cape, and some beneficial rains fell at this time in most parts of the Hawke's Bay and Gisborne districts.

Although many days were cloudy and frequently threatening in the North Island, beyond a few showers the weather remained dry and generally warm. In and southwards of Cook Strait dull weather was also very prevalent, and in the West Coast and southernmost districts often very unsettled. The wettest days were generally between the 3rd and 6th and the 21st and 28th. These periods, and also about the 14th, were notable for strong winds over the South Island, and on the latter date stormy conditions ruled in many parts.

PART I.
CLOSING OF PORTS.

Former Notice.—No. 1 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

(1.) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having taken into consideration the fact that it may be necessary to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire referred to in Part III of this notice, a sharp look-out should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (5), Part II, of this notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.

(2.) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three red vertical lights by night, or three red vertical balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (5), Part II, of this notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must either proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

(3.) At all the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III of this notice, search-lights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing moveable search-lights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above when search-lights are observed to be working.

PART II.
EXAMINATION SERVICE.

(4.) In certain circumstances it is also necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III of this notice.

(5.) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the ports and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor. If Government vessels, or vessels belonging to the local port authority, are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels with a view to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the Examination Anchorage. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.

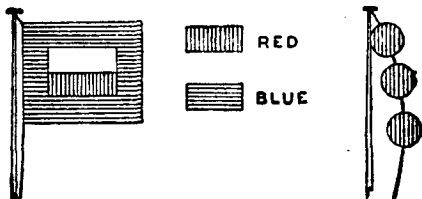
(6.) As the institution of the Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun or sound rocket.

In entering by night any of the ports mentioned in Part III, serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient all-round lamps, two red and two white, are kept available for use.

(7.) By day the distinguishing flags of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border) and a blue ensign.

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is closed.

SPECIAL FLAG THREE RED BALLS



By night the steamer will carry—
(a.) Three red vertical lights if the port is closed.
(b.) Three white vertical lights if the port is open.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

(8.) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any of these ports when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions given to them by the Examination Steamer. In the absence of any instructions from the Examination Steamer they must proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

Whilst at anchor in the Examination Anchorage, masters are warned that they must not lower any boats (except to avoid accident), communicate with the shore, work cables, move the ship, or allow anyone to leave the ship, without permission from the Examination Steamer.

(9.) In case of fog, masters are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the Examination Anchorage itself should be approached with caution.

(10.) Merchant vessels when approaching ports are especially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description, either by day or night; the use of them will render a vessel liable to be fired on.

(11.) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

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PART IV.

SWEEPING OPERATIONS.

H.M. vessels are constantly engaged in sweeping operations off ports in the United Kingdom.

Whilst so engaged, they work in pairs connected by a wire hawser, and are consequently hampered to a very considerable extent in their manœuvring powers.

With a view to indicating the nature of the work on which these vessels are engaged, they will show the following signals:—

A black ball at the foremast head and a similar ball at the yardarm, or where it can best be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous for vessels to pass.

For the public safety, all other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, must keep out of the way of vessels flying this signal, and should especially remember that it is dangerous to pass between the vessels of a pair.

PILOT SERVICE.

1. ATTENTION is invited to the 13th, 14th, and 15th paragraphs of Executive Order of July 9, 1914, providing "Rules and Regulations for the Operation and Navigation of the Panama Canal and Approaches thereto, including all Waters under its Jurisdiction," reading as follows:—

(13.) Pilotage for vessels in transit through the Canal will be free, nor will they be charged pilotage for entering or leaving a terminal port when it is for the sole purpose of passing through the Canal; but should any such vessel, while in Canal waters, discharge or receive freight or passengers, or take on board supplies, provisions, stores, or fuel, or remain for the purpose of effecting repairs, or make either terminal a port of call, she may be liable for entrance or departure pilotage, as the Canal authorities may direct.

(14.) Pilotage in and out of the Atlantic and Pacific terminals of the Canal is compulsory, and all vessels, unless otherwise exempted, will be compelled to take a regular Government pilot upon entering or leaving. The fact that the master or any officer of any vessel holds a pilot's license for any of the waters of the Canal Zone will not authorize the vessel to enter without taking a Government pilot.

(15.) No person, steamer, company, or corporation will be allowed to maintain or employ pilots in Canal waters for the exclusive use of their own or any other vessels; all pilots, without exception, must be duly authorized and licensed by the Canal authorities and be in the employ of the Canal. This shall not be interpreted to mean that the Canal authorities shall be prohibited from issuing restricted pilot licenses for small craft in Canal waters, or any other that they may see fit.

2. The charge for pilotage will be based upon the maximum draft of the vessel, and will be at the rate of \$1 per foot or fraction thereof, but no fraction will be considered unless it equals or exceeds six inches, in which case the full charge for one foot will be imposed for such fraction.

3. In case a pilot be taken outside the Atlantic breakwaters, an additional fee of \$10 will be charged. Pilots will board vessels just inside the Atlantic breakwaters, and at the seaward end of the buoyed channel on the Pacific end.

4. The above charges will become effective August 1, 1914.
