Educational Bursaries.

Has within the six months immediately preceding completed his term of service as a pupil teacher or probationer in some education district in accordance with regulations and to the satisfaction of the Education Board and of the Senior Inspector of that district, and declares his intention of entering a recognized training college on the completion of the tenure of his bursary;

(ii.) Has satisfactorily completed his course of training at a recognized training college and gained a trained teacher's certificate; or

(iii.) Has otherwise gained a teacher's certificate of a class not lower than Class C.

2. There shall be paid to or on behalf of each holder of an Educational Bursary the amount of the fees payable by him to the university college in respect of such classes as the Director of Education, after consultation with the Professorial Board, shall approve for him, and, in addition, the university fees for the degree examinations for which he sits:

Provided that if the college fees payable by any holder in any one year be more than £20 in all, the sum of £20 only shall be paid to or for such

holder in respect of such fees.

3. An application for an Educational Bursary, made in due form and accompanied by the necessary certificates, must be addressed to the Senior Inspector of Schools of the dist ict, to be forwarded by him, with any recommendation that he may have to make, to the Director of Education. Such application must reach the Senior Inspector by the 1st day of April in any year.

4. An Educational Bursary shall not be tenable with a University Junior Scholarship, a University National Scholarship, or a University Bursary, or with any other scholarship, exhibition, or bursary, or combination thereof, the value or combined value of which, exclusive of any

lodging allowance received, exceeds £20 a year.

5. An Educational Bursary may be held at any university college or at a school of agriculture recognized by the University. The classes taken must be of such as would form part of a course in arts, science, or agriculture.

6. A bursary shall become vacant by failure on the part of the holder to satisfy such conditions as the Professorial Board and the Director of Education may deem necessary. Generally, such conditions shall include the passing of the college examination in the subject or subjects approved for him as described in clause 2 hereof, or the passing of a section of a university degree examination in arts, science, or agriculture, or the attainment of success in connection with the Teachers' Class B or Class A Examination.

7. The term of an Educational Bursary shall in general be three years, if the holder so long fulfils the prescribed conditions; but under special circumstances, on the recommendation of the Senior Inspector, the bursary may be extended for a further term: Provided that the whole period of

the bursary so extended shall not exceed five years.

8. The Educational Bursary must be held continuously, except in case of illness or special circumstances approved by the Minister.

9. On the receipt of an unfavourable report on the holder of an Educational Bursary from the Professorial Board or from the Council of the university college attended, the tenure of the bursary shall be forthwith determined, and the holder shall, if the Minister so directs, be required to refund the fees paid during the current year on his behalf.

10. All university bursaries granted under clause 1 (c), 1 (d), or 1 (e) of the conditions hitherto in force shall be regarded for the balance of their period of tenure as Educational Bursaries issued under these regulations.

ing the same, and of all other powers and provisions enabling it in this behalf, the Porangahau Road Board doth hereby make and ordain the following by-laws, that is to say:

1. Between the 1st day of April and the 31st day of August in any year the width of tires and the maximum number of horses or bullocks to be used in the several classes of vehicles mentioned hereunder shall be as follows,—

(a.) A two-wheeled dray, with or without springs, with tires of 4 in. or more in width, to be drawn by not more than three horses or four bullocks.

(b.) A four-wheeled wagon, with or without springs, with tires of 4 in. or more in width, to be drawn by not more than four horses or four bullocks.

(c.) A four-wheeled goods-brake or express on steel springs or thorough-braces, with tires of 3 in. or more in width, to be drawn by not more than three horses.

(d.) A four-wheeled passenger-coach on steel springs or thorough-braces, with tires of 2½ in. or more in width, to be drawn by not more than five horses.

The above regulations will take effect on the following roads, viz.:—

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1915.

The aggregate rainfall for February was considerably below normal over the North Island, but in the south, with the exception of portions of the East Coast district, it was nearly everywhere in excess. In Westland the percentage above was greatest, several stations recording over 100 per cent. in excess of the mean of previous years. This was owing to the character of the disturbances being chiefly of the westerly type, with centres passing in higher latitudes and accounting for a prevalence of north-west to south-westerly winds.

On the 2nd a small atmospheric depression passed off East Cape, and some beneficial rains fell at this time in most parts of the Hawke's Bay and Gisborne districts.

Although many days were cloudy and frequently threatening in the North Island, beyond a few showers the weather remained dry and generally warm. In and southwards of Cook Strait dull weather was also very prevalent, and in the West Coast and southernmost districts often very unsettled. The wettest days were generally between the 3rd and 6th and the 21st and 28th. These periods, and also about the 14th, were notable for strong winds over the South Island, and on the latter date stormy conditions ruled in many parts.

My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having taken into consideration the fact that it may be necessary to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire referred to in Part III of this notice, a sharp look-out should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (5), Part II, of this notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them.

In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.

(2.) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three red vertical lights by night, or three red vertical balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the pressels indicated in

hibited in some conspicuous position in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (5), Part II, of this notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must either proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

(3.) At all the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III of this notice, search-lights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing moveable search-lights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above when search-lights are observed to be working.

PART II. EXAMINATION SERVICE.

(4.) In certain circumstances it is also necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III of this

notice.

(5.) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the ports and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor. If Government vessels, or vessels belonging to the local port authority, are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels with a view to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the Examination Anchorage. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.

(6.) As the institution of the Examination Service at any

(6.) As the institution of the Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun or sound rocket.

In entering by night any of the ports mentioned in Part III, serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient altround lamps, two red and two white, are kept available for use.

(7.) By day the distinguishing flags of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border) and a blue ensign.

(8.) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any of these ports when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions given to them by the Examination Steamer. In the absence

given to them by the Examination Steamer. In the absence of any instructions from the Examination Steamer they must proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

Whilst at anchor in the Examination Anchorage, masters are warned that they must not lower any boats (except to avoid accident), communicate with the shore, work cables, move the ship, or allow anyone to leave the ship, without permission from the Examination Steamer.

(9.) In case of fog, masters are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the Examination Anchorage itself should be approached with caution.

(10.) Merchant vessels when approaching ports are especially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description, either by day or night; the use of them will render a vessel liable to be fired on.

(11.) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

1. ATTENTION is invited to the 13th, 14th, and 15th paragraphs of Executive Order of July 9, 1914, providing "Rules and Regulations for the Operation and Navigation of the Panama Canal and Approaches thereto, including all Waters under its Jurisdiction," reading as follows:—

(13.) Pilotage for vessels in transit through the Canal will be free, nor will they be charged pilotage for entering or leaving a terminal port when it is for the sole purpose of passing through the Canal; but should any such vessel, while in Canal waters, discharge or receive freight or passengers, or take on board supplies, provisions, stores, or fuel, or remain for the purpose of effecting repairs, or make either terminal a port of call, she may be liable for entrance or departure pilotage, as the Canal authorities may direct.

for entrance or departure pilotage, as the Cahai authoraties may direct.
(14.) Pilotage in and out of the Atlantic and Pacific terminals of the Cahai is compulsory, and all vessels, unless otherwise exempted, will be compelled to take a regular Government pilot upon entering or leaving. The fact that the master or any officer of any vessel holds a pilot's license for any of the waters of the Cahai Zone will not authorize the vessel to enter without taking a Government pilot. Government pilot.

(15.) No person, steamer, company, or corporation will be allowed to maintain or employ pilots in Canal waters for the exclusive use of their own or any other vessels; all pilots, without exception, must be duly authorized and licensed by the Canal authorities and be in the employ of the Canal. This shall not be interpreted to mean that the Canal authorities shall be prohibited from issuing restricted pilot licenses for small craft in Canal waters, or any other that they may see fit.

2. The charge for pilotage will be based upon the maximum draft of the vessel, and will be at the rate of \$1 per foot or fraction thereof, but no fraction will be considered unless it equals or exceeds six inches, in which case the full charge for one foot will be imposed for such fraction.

3. In case a pilot be taken outside the Atlantic breakwaters, an additional fee of \$10 will be charged. Pilots will board vessels just inside the Atlantic breakwaters, and at the seaward end of the buoyed channel on the Pacific end.

POR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

necessity) :-

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing

Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
 Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
 Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
 The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
