WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), George Peters (hereinafter called "the licensee") has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore of Porirua Harbour, in order to erect and maintain a house and outbuildings thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 4419), showing the area of foreshore intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the said house and outbuild-

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Go-

vernor in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the license as aforesaid: and, in further pursuance and exercise of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore on which the said house and outbuildings are to be erected, as shown on the the plan so deposited as aforesaid, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

# SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the rest of the concessions.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister an annual sum of £2 payable in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council plied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into,

5. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned house

and outbuildings in good order and repair.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said house and outbuildings and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such house or outbuildings, requiring him within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or eause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written authority of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

10. In case the licensee shall-

10. In case the licensee shall—

 Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
 Cease to use or occupy the said house and outbuildings for a period of thirty days;
 Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
 Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

 then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and

and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

License under the Trading with the Enemy Act, 1914.—Cargo of S.s. "Wismar."

# LIVERPOOL, Governor.

WHEREAS the steamship "Wismar" is an enemy ship now in refuge in the territorial waters of the Dutch East Indies:

And whereas there are on board that ship certain goods laden before the commencement of the present war and being the property of divers of His Majesty's subjects in New Zealand:

And whereas delivery of these goods cannot be obtained without payment to the owners of the said ship of certain charges by way of freight and otherwise:

And whereas such charges cannot lawfully be paid save under the authority of a license in that behalf under the Royal Proclamations relative to trading with the enemy:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in consideration of the premises and in pursuance of the authority conferred upon me by His Majesty's Proclamation of the eighth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, relative to trading with the enemy, do hereby license and permit all holders in New Zealand of bills of lading of any part of the cargo of the said steamship "Wismar," laden thereon before the commencement of the present war, to pay to the owners of the said steamship or their agents all to pay to the owners of the said steamship or their agents all charges by way of freight or otherwise payment of which is necessary to procure the delivery of the said cargo. And for all payments so to be made by the holders of such bills of lading these presents shall be sufficient warrant, anything to the contrary in the Trading with the Enemy Act, 1914, or the Proclamations therein mentioned notwithstanding Proclamations therein mentioned notwithstanding.

For the purpose of carrying on the ice observations and ice patrol service provided for by the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea, London, 1913–1914, the U.S. Coastguard Cutter "Seneca" left New York on 15th February, to proceed to the Grand Banks of Newfoundland, to locate the icefields and icebergs, and make such observations as practicable on the quantity of ice, its kind, extent and drift, and obtain any other information that may seem to be of value. to be of value.

The object of the patrol is primarily to ascertain the location and progressive movement of the limiting lines of the regions in which icebergs and field ice exist in the vicinity of the Grand Banks of Newfoundland, and to disseminate this information for the guidance and warning of Mariners. Co-ordinately with these primary duties the "Seneca" will make such oceanographical and meteorological observa-tions as will contribute toward an explanation of the causes why the limiting lines assume their observed locations. During the period of ice observations the "Seneca" will be the only vessel employed on this duty; but when the ice has moved southwards so as to make a constant patrol

necessary, an additional vessel will be detailed for that pur-

The experience of previous years has shown that a continuous ice patrol should be established about 1st April annually, and continued throughout the season of dangerous ice conditions.

Upon getting in touch with the ice the "Seneca" will send a report daily to the Branch Hydrographic Office, New York City, at 4 a.m., 75th meridan time, addressed "Hydrographic, New York." An endeavour will be made to communicate direct with coast wireless-telegraph stations, but should the "Seneca" be unable to communicate with any of these stations the message will be relayed through any vessel within reach.

The ice information will be given in as plain and concise a form as practicable, and will state the following: (a) Ice (berg or field), (b) date, (c) time (75th meridian), (d) latitude, (e), longitude, (f) other data as may be necessary.

While on this duty, the patrol vessel will endeavour by means of daily wireless messages to keep ships at sea advised of the limits of the icefields, &c.

The "Seneca's" call letters are NRE, and she uses wavelengths of 300, 600, and 750 metres.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby direct that a poll shall be taken on the proposal that the area described in the Schedule hereto may be constituted a borough under the Municipal Gorporations Act, 1908; and, further, doth hereby make the following appointments and arrangements for the purpose of taking the said poll:—

1. Walter Waters, of Paeroa, to be the Returning Officer for the purpose of taking the said poll, and also to be the person authorized to prepare a voters roll of the persons entitled to vote at the said poll.

2. The voters roll prepared and signed by the said Walter Waters shall be the voters roll to be used at the said poll.

3. Each person on such roll shall have and may exercise

3. Each person on such roll shall have and may

one vote, and no more.

4. The said poll shall be taken on Thursday, the twentieth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and shall close at six o'clock in the afternoon of that day.

5. Except as herein provided, the said poll shall be taken as nearly as may be in the manner provided by the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1908, and the Returning Officer hereby appointed shall be deemed to be a Returning Officer appointed for the purposes of that Act.
