WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty of the Public Works Act, 1908, that if it is found that any land held, taken, purchased, or acquired at any time under this or any other Act or Provincial Ordinance, or otherwise

howsoever, for any public work, is not required for such public work, the Governor may, by an Order in Council publicly notified and gazetted, cause the same to be sold under the conditions therein mentioned :

And whereas it is further provided by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, that in the case of any land so taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work and not required for that purpose the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without complying with any other requirements of the aforesaid section thirty, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly :

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto was taken for the purposes of roads : And whereas such roads have been stopped, and it is desirable to declare the land contained therein to be Crown land : And whereas a plan has been prepared, and the Minister has recommended the Governor to declare such land to be Crown land :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the above-in-part-recited Acts, and of all other powers in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and that such land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly.

Authorizing the Auckland Harbour Board to reclaim Land at St. George's Bay, Auckland Harbour.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.**

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-first day of June, 1915.

Present :
HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by the one-hundred-and-fifty-eighth section of the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that where a Harbour Board is desirous of executing or constructing upon lands vested in such Board or upon lands of the Crown any harbour-works of such a nature that the same could, but for this section, only be carried out and executed under the authority of a special Act, the Board may apply to the Governor in Council for a special order, and, if the Governor in Council thinks fit, such order may be made and granted :

And whereas the Auckland Harbour Board (hereinafter called "the Board") is desirous of reclaiming from the sea certain land at St. George's Bay, in Auckland Harbour, and the said harbour-works are of such a nature as aforesaid, and the Board has applied to the Governor in Council for a special order authorizing the execution of the said harbour-works :

And whereas the conditions precedent to the granting of a special order prescribed by the said Act have been duly performed and observed, and it appears expedient that such order should be made :

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize and empower the Board to reclaim from the sea in Auckland Harbour all the lands shown edged in red on plan marked M.D. 4420, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, such reclamation to be carried out and constructed in accordance with plan marked M.D. 4420, subject to the provisions of the said Act.

Extending Close Season for Oysters between Albatross Point and the Urenui Stream.

**LIVERPOOL, Governor.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.**

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-first day of June, 1915.

Present :
HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the fifth section of the Fisheries Act, 1908, that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council make regulations for, amongst other things, prescribing a close season for oysters for a term not exceeding three years, and for further extending such close season :

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-second day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the twenty-fifth day of the same month, a regulation was made prescribing a close season for oysters for a term of three years from the date of the order within all the bays, estuaries, and tidal waters on the west coast of the North Island of New Zealand lying between Albatross Point on the north and the mouth of the Urenui Stream on the south :

And whereas it is desirable to extend such close season :
Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The close season for oysters within all the bays, estuaries, and tidal waters on the west coast of the North Island of New Zealand lying between Albatross Point on the north and the mouth of the Urenui Stream on the south, which was made by the hereinbefore-recited Order in Council of the 22nd July, 1912, is hereby extended until the 22nd July, 1917.

2. Any person taking oysters within the area mentioned in clause 1 hereof during such close season is liable to a fine of not less than £1 and not more than £20.

WHEREAS by section seventeen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1912, it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council, on the recommendation of the Native Land Court, declare any Native to be a European:

And whereas William Sullivan, of Takapuna, Auckland, being a Native within the meaning of the Native Land Act, 1909, applied in the prescribed form for a recommendation of the Court that he might be declared a European: And whereas the said Court, having duly inquired into the said application, has recommended that an Order in Council be issued declaring the said William Sullivan to be a European: And whereas it is expedient that such declaration should be made:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority conferred on him by section seventeen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1912, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare the said William Sullivan, of Takapuna, Auckland, to be a European.

ON the recommendation of the Native Land Purchase Board, referred to in section three hundred and sixty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon him by that section, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prohibit, for the period of one year from the date of this Order in Council, all alienations of the Native land specified in the Schedule hereto other than alienations in favour of the Crown.

Revoking Order in Council licensing Thomas Crocket to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore of Half-moon Bay.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the thirtieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 1, of the thirteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten, His Excellency the Governor in Council did, in pursuance of the provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, license Thomas Crocket, of Bluff, to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Half-moon Bay for a shed for fish-curing purposes, in accordance with plan marked M.D. 2061, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, and upon and subject to the terms and conditions therein set forth: And whereas the said Thomas Crocket having ceased to use or occupy the said shed for a period of thirty days, it is desirable that the said license should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Harbours Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke and determine the said-mentioned Order in Council of the thirtieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred.

Vesting Management of Fishermen's Wharf at Helensville in the Helensville Town Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-first day of June, 1915.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section eleven of the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may vest the management of any wharf the property of His Majesty in any local governing body or person, upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit:

And whereas it is thought desirable to vest in the Helensville Town Board (hereinafter called "the Board") the

management of the wharf at Helensville, known as the Fishermen's Wharf, on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said eleventh section of the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest the management of the wharf at Helensville aforesaid in the Board, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.
CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. All His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.
3. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.
4. The Board shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf, and all erections on or in connection with the wharf, in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.
5. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf by the Board shall be applied to keeping the said wharf, and all erections on or in connection with such wharf, in good order and repair.
6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf, and any buildings erected on the wharf or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon his leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Board a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Board within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Board shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be remedied or such repairs to be made.
7. The Board shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf any buildings or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister.
8. The Board shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the 31st day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account, when balanced, to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.
9. The Board shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the wharf.
10. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.
11. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Board shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.
12. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor on giving to the Board three calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Board. No compensation or allowance shall be payable in such case.
13. The Board shall be liable for any injury which may be caused at the said wharf to any vessel or boat through any default on the part of the Board.
14. In case the Board shall—
 - (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
 - (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days—

then and in either of the said cases every right, power, or privilege hereby conferred may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without notice to the Board or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Board, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

Every person carrying on business as a farmer, grain-merchant, or grain-miller, or any other person holding stocks of wheat, flour, or oats, shall on request, within such time or times as he may be required by the Statistician so to do, furnish particulars as to stocks of wheat, flour, and oats held by him on a date or dates to be specified by the Statistician.

3. In order to comply with the last preceding regulation every such person shall fill up and supply to the Statistician, or to any officer authorized by him in writing, the particulars specified in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, in accordance with the instructions accompanying that form, and shall sign the form certifying to the correctness of the particulars entered therein.

4. These regulations shall apply to all managers and others who may for the time being be in charge of the farm, warehouse, or mill in the owner's absence.

REFERRING to Notices to Mariners No. 116, of the 28th November, 1913, and No. 13, of the 17th February, 1915, the Wellington Harbour Board have notified that both these lights have now been completed, and it is proposed to light same on and after the 15th day of July, 1915.

The northern beacon, which is already lighted (see Notice No. 13 of 1915), is an open steel tower structure, painted white, supported by a concrete foundation, and is erected on the western edge of the Hope Shoal, off Ward Island, in 9 ft. of water, and vessels are cautioned not to approach closer than 2 cables on the western side. The light, which is an unwatched one, is 55 ft. above high water. It is occulting, showing white from 20½° (N. 4° E. magnetic) round by north to 354½° (N. 22° W. magnetic), red from 354½° (N. 22° W. magnetic) round by west and south to 120° (S. 76½° E. magnetic), and obscured from 120° (S. 76½° E. magnetic) to 20½° (N. 4° E. magnetic), and flashes light for 2 seconds, followed by darkness for 2 seconds, giving 15 flashes per minute.

The southern beacon is a pile structure erected 1 mile 3½ cables due south (magnetic) from the northern beacon, in 35 ft. of water. It is surmounted by a white occulting light, 16 ft. above high water, visible all round the horizon, and flashing 3/10 seconds light, followed by an eclipse for 7/10 seconds, giving 60 flashes per minute. This light, when in line with that of the northern beacon, will lead up to the centre of the deep-water channel at the entrance on a bearing of 16½° (north magnetic). Vessels must pass to westward of

this pile beacon. The temporary lighted buoy showing a white occulting light, visible all round the horizon, that marked approximately the position of the southern pile beacon will be removed after the above-mentioned date—viz., the 15th day of July, 1915.

Removal of Falcon Shoal Buoy.

On and after the 15th day of July, 1915, the buoy which carries a fixed red light, and which marks the eastern edge of the Falcon Shoal, opposite Karaka Bay, will be removed.

Removal of Hope Shoal and Hope Shoal Extension Buoys.

The red conical buoy which marks the western edge of the Hope Shoal off Ward Island, and the similar buoy 9 cables due south of it, will be removed on and after the 15th day of July, 1915.

Hikairo Township is situated on the left bank of the Wanganui River, about three miles up from Kakahi, on the Main Trunk line. At this spot the Egmont Box Company is establishing a large timber-milling plant for the purpose of milling the timber from the bush on Taurewa Block of 28,860 acres. 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SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
