HEREAS it is provided by the one-hundred-and-fifty-eighth section of the Harbours Act, 1908 (herein-after called "the said Act"), that where a Harbour Board is desirous of executing or constructing upon lands vested in such Board or upon lands of the Crown any harbour-works of such a nature that the same could, but for this section, only be carried out and executed under the authority of a gregical Act, the Board may apply to the Covernor in Council. only be carried out and executed under the authority of a special Act, the Board may apply to the Governor in Council for a special order, and, if the Governor in Council thinks fit, such order may be made and granted:

Extending Close Season for Oysters between Albatross Point and the Urenui Stream.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the fifth section of the Fisheries Act, 1908, that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council make regulations for, amongst other things, prescribing a close season for oysters for a term not exceeding three years, and for further extending such close season:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-second day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the twenty-fifth day of the same month, a regulation was made prescribing a close season for oysters for a term of three years from the date of the order within all the bays, estuaries, and tidal waters on the west coast of the North Island of New Zealand lying between Albatross Point on the north and the mouth of the Urenni Stream on the south: of the Urenui Stream on the south:

And whereas it is desirable to extend such close season:

Now, therefore; His Excellency the Governor of the

Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the
hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and acting by and
with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations:

REGULATIONS.

1. The close season for oysters within all the bays, estuaries, and tidal waters on the west coast of the North Island of New Zealand lying between Albatross Point on the north and the mouth of the Urenui Stream on the south, which was made by the hereinbefore-recited Order in Council of the 22nd July, 1912, is hereby extended until the 22nd July, 1917.

2. Any person taking oysters within the area mentioned in clause I hereof during such close season is liable to a fine of not less than £1 and not more than £20.

CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. All His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

It is surmounted by a white occulting light, 16 ft. above high water, visible all round the horizon, and flashing 3/10 seconds light, followed by an eclipse for 7/10 seconds, giving 60 flashes per minute. This light, when in line with that of the northern beacon, will lead up to the centre of the deep-water channel at the entrance on a bearing of 16½° (north magnetic). Hikairo Township is situated on the left bank of the Wanganui River, about three miles up from Kakahi, on the Main Trunk line. SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NE CHRISTCHURCH. NEAR SUMNER,

Under the Control and Supervision of the Education Department.

Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

OR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :-

- 1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- 2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
- 3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
