- upon which subsidy is paid, and the subsidies thereon, shall be utilized solely and without deduction for such purposes of the aforesaid college or institution as are defined by the immediately space of the sole of the sol
- diately succeeding clause hereof.

 3. Subsidies shall be payable on voluntary contributions to any such college or institution only on condition that these contributions are made available for one or other of the following purposes:
 - (a.) The provision of sites and buildings as approved by the Minister, and the maintenance and improvement thereof.
- (b.) The provision of necessary equipment of a more or less permanent character for the work of the college classes, including the establishment, maintenance, and improvement of college libraries, or (as approved by the Minister) for the physical training of students.

(c.) The establishment of scholarships and bursaries, and the reduction or remission of fees.

(d.) The payment of salaries in whole or in part for professors or lecturers in subjects approved by the

Minister.

(e.) The establishment and maintenance of college hostels or residential houses for the accommodation of students attending the college; provided that any such hostel or residential house is vested in the college authorities and is wholly under their control, and that the conditions of admission thereto and residence thereat are approved by the Minister for the purpose of subsidies.

4. All claims for the payment of subsidy must be made on the form supplied by the Education Department for the purpose, and must be accompanied by a statutory declaration of essential particulars as provided by the form.

Rules with regard to the Citation of Parties to Industrial Disputes, &c.

THE following rules for the guidance of Clerks of Awards and parties to industrial disputes are made by the Court of Arbitration, by virtue of section 104 of the Indus-

trial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908:—

1. No person, firm, or company shall be cited or named as a party to an industrial dispute unless the occupation and full postal address of such person, firm, or company be also given; and if the party cited or named be an individual, his correct initial or initials shall also be given.

2. If any person, firm, or company duly cited shall appear before the Court at the hearing of a dispute, either in person or by representative duly appointed, and shall make objection to being cited or named as a party to the dispute on the grounds that he or it is not engaged in the industry, the onus shall be upon the union of proving that such person, firm, or company is so engaged.

3. If any person firm or company duly cited shall appear

Hikairo Township is situated on the left bank of the Wanganui River, about three miles up from Kakahi, on the Main Trunk line. At this spot the Egmont Box Company is establishing a large timber-milling plant for the purpose of milling the timber from the bush on Taurewa Block of 28,860 acres. This bush is a very valuable and extensive one, and will be a source of employment for a large number of hands for many years. The railway-line connecting the mill-site

for many years. The railway-line connecting the mill-site with the Main Trunk line is now well under construction. On the opposite bank of the Wanganui River there is also a large area of milling-timber at present untouched, but when access is provided by the railway to Hikairo that bush will no doubt soon give way to axe and saw. The timber will have to come out via the proposed township. The land in this locality (other than the river-flats, which are pumice) is good, strong soil, with clay subsoil, and when cleared will develop into good dairying land.
